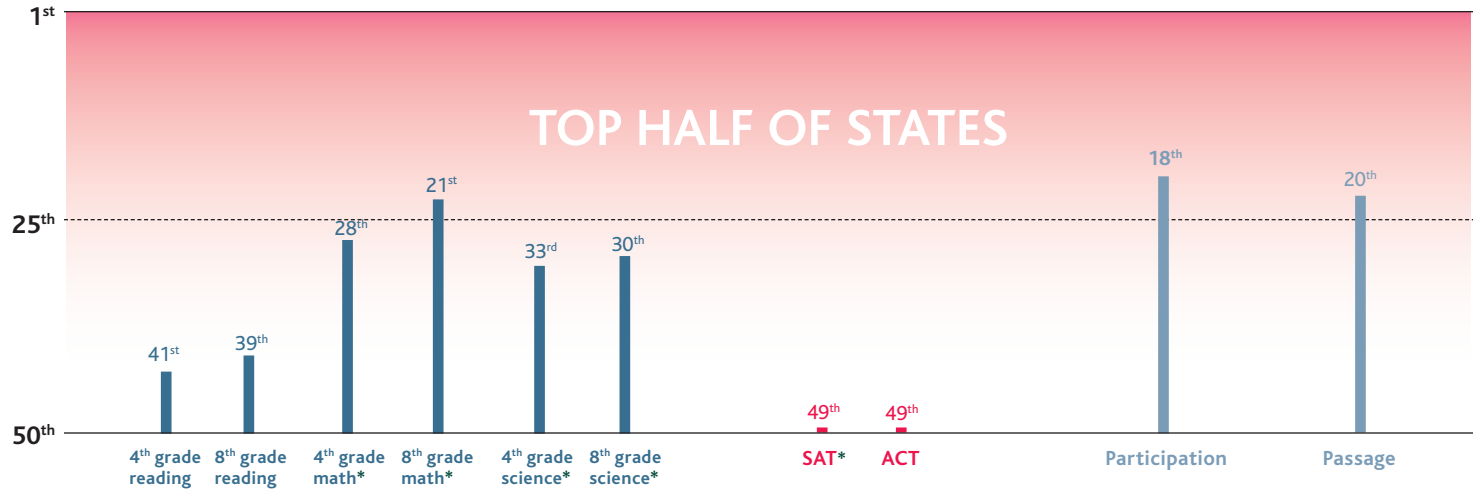


SOUTH CAROLINA EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE
