
South Carolina Governor's Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention Council

The Governor's Prescription Drug Abuse Prevention Council was charged with the following: 1) to analyze available data to determine the extent of prescription drug abuse in South Carolina; 2) to develop a comprehensive state plan (Plan) to proactively combat and prevent drug abuse in South Carolina; 3) to assist and encourage local communities to engage existing coalitions or to establish new coalitions to combat prescription drug abuse; and, finally 4) to continue to meet as a Council and at least annually report the progress of the Council's efforts. This plan is a culmination of those goals.





This review was predicated upon FY 2013-2014 Legislative Proviso 117.38, which required each agency to produce a past due debt report, known as the Annual Debt Collection Report, summarizing agency receivables in excess of 60 days. SIG determined a few agencies were exceptional, characterized by a very pro-active approach to policies, debt collection procedures, and metrics for results to drive continuous improvement, while others were complacent. Most agencies landed between these two extremes creating an overall bell curve of how state agencies managed accounts receivables, particularly collecting past due debt.



The South Carolina General Assembly passed legislation in early June 2008 requiring all state agencies to develop energy conservation plans to reduce their energy consumption by one percent per year during fiscal years 2009-2013 and by a total of a 20 percent reduction in energy use by 2020. This legislation requires that each of these entities develop an energy conservation plan that addresses how it will meet energy use reduction goals and submit it to SCEO. It also requires that each entity report its progress in meeting the energy use reduction goals on an annual basis. This is that report for 2014.





This project represents the first phase of research to identify a proposed process improvement that, if implemented, would establish a systematic way of priming projects for production, using a three-pronged approach: 1.
