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South Carolina's Employment Situation **December 2014**

Unemployment Rate Drops; New Records Set in Employment and Labor Force

The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate declined to 6.5 percent in December from November's rate of 6.7 percent. The estimated number of South Carolinians working rose by 7,243 people to set a new record of 2,058,657.

The state's labor force continued to expand with an increase of 4,459 people in December, setting another all-time high of 2,202,017. The estimated number of unemployed people decreased by 2,784 to 143,360.

Since December 2013, the labor force has increased by an estimated 33,793 people with 32,770 of them having found work. Also, the state's unemployment rate has declined by 0.1 percentage points over the year.

Nationally, the December unemployment rate declined to 5.6 percent from November's rate of 5.8 percent.

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted¹)

December's seasonally adjusted, non-farm payrolls increased by 2,900 over November's total, to reach the level of 1,968,000.

- Industries with gains included Professional and Business Services (+3,300); Construction (+1,100); Manufacturing (+800); Education and Health Services (+600); and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+500).
- Declines were reported in Leisure and Hospitality (-2,300); Other Services (-500); Financial Activities (-300); Information (-200); and Government (-100).

Compared to December 2013, seasonally adjusted non-farm jobs were up 46,500.

- Noticeable gains were found in Professional and Business Services (+18,200); Manufacturing (+8,900); Leisure and Hospitality (+7,100); Education and Health Services (+5,100); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+4,200); Government (+3,600); and Construction (+2,100).
- The Other Services industry saw a decline (-2,500) as did Financial Activities (-200).

Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Not Seasonally Adjusted²)

Not-seasonally adjusted, non-farm payroll employment decreased by 4,500 from November to December, reaching a total of 1,969,600. Growth was reported in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+2,800); Construction (+1,200); Manufacturing (+900); and Education and Health Services (+600). Industries reporting declines were Leisure and Hospitality (-6,600); Government (-1,300); Professional and Business Services (-1,100); Other Services (-700); Financial Activities (-200); and Information (-100).

From December 2013 to December 2014, not-seasonally adjusted non-farm jobs were up 46,400 overall in South Carolina's workforce. Strong annual gains came from Professional and Business Services (+18,000); Manufacturing (+9,000); Leisure and Hospitality (+6,900); Education and Health Services (+5,100); Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (+4,400); Government (+3,500); and Construction (+2,100). The industries showing losses over the year were in Other Services (-2,400) and Financial Activities (-200).

¹**Seasonally Adjusted:** Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

²**Not Seasonally Adjusted:** Effects of regular or seasonal patterns have not been removed from these data.
