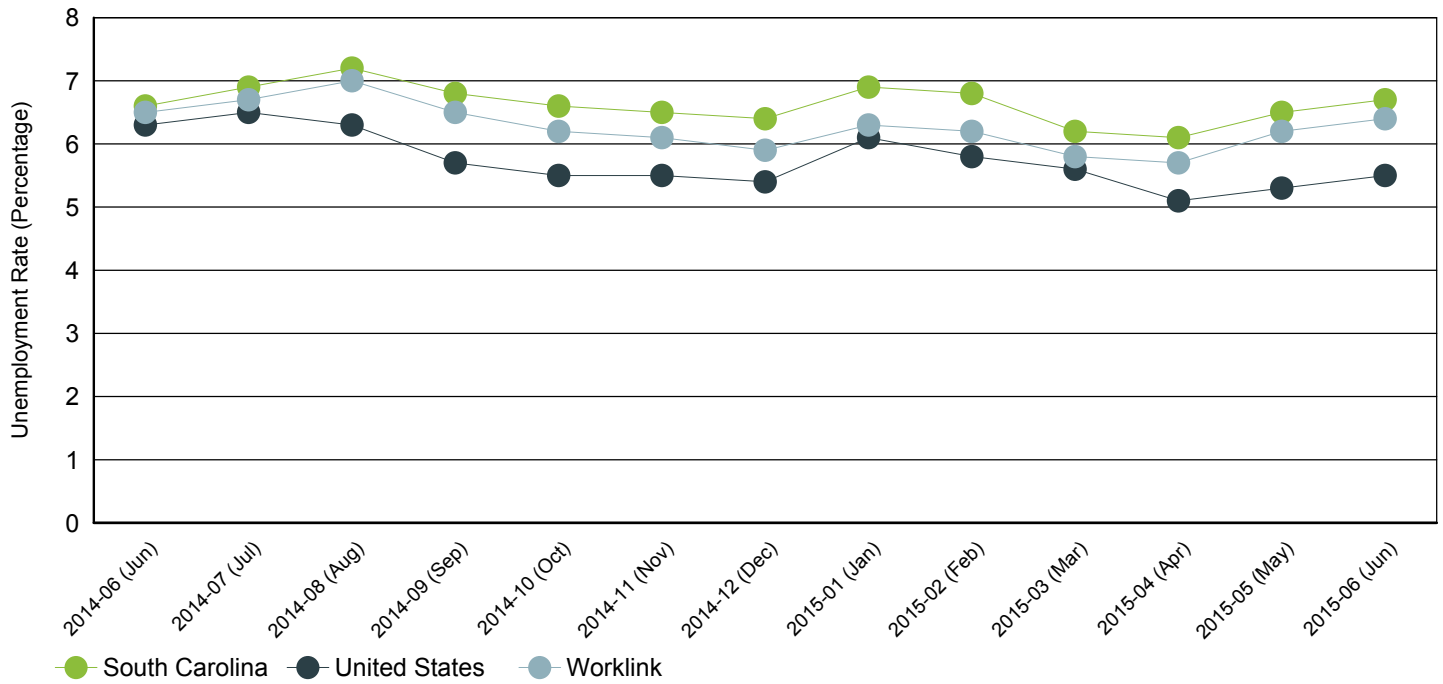

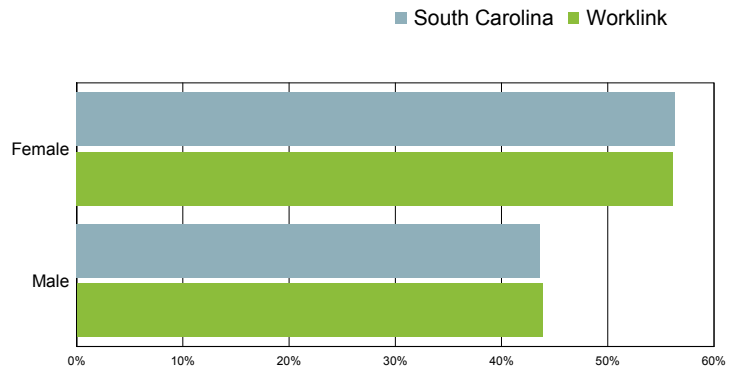

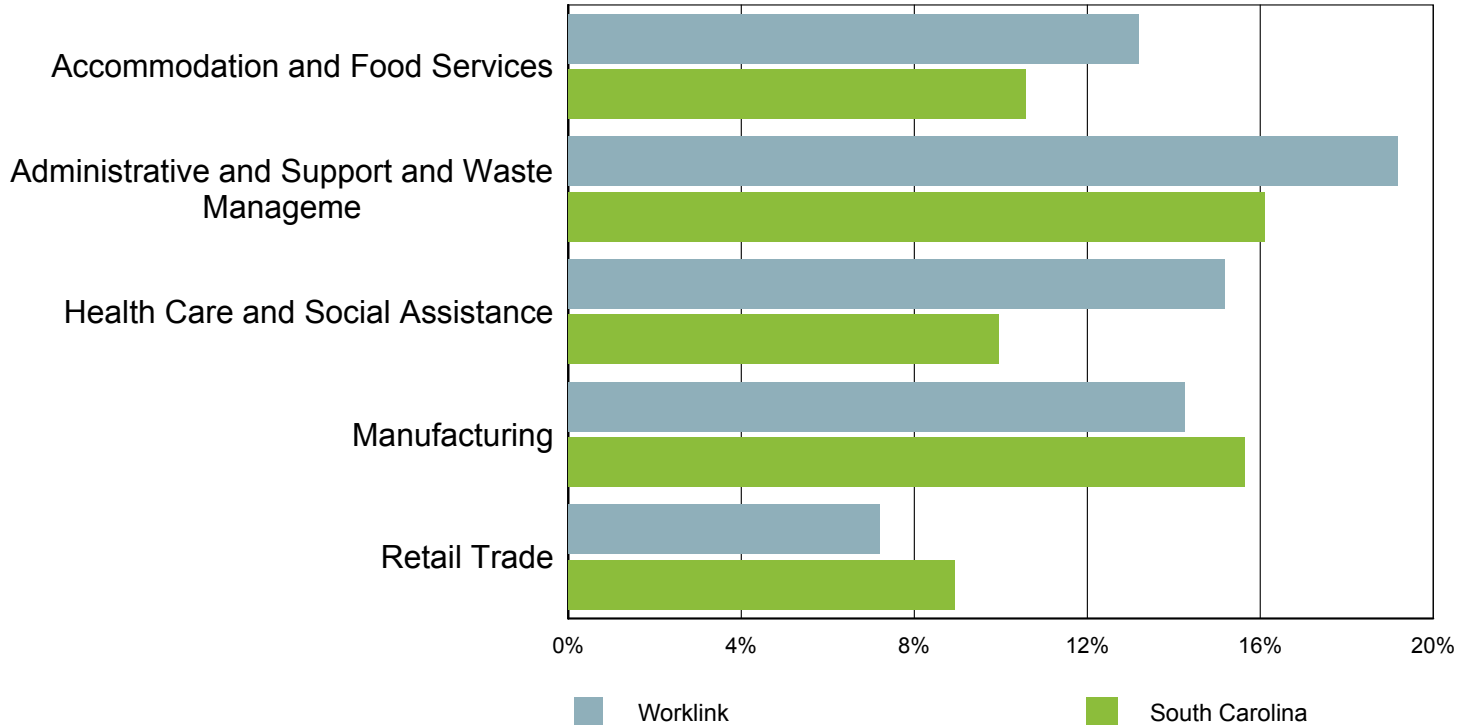

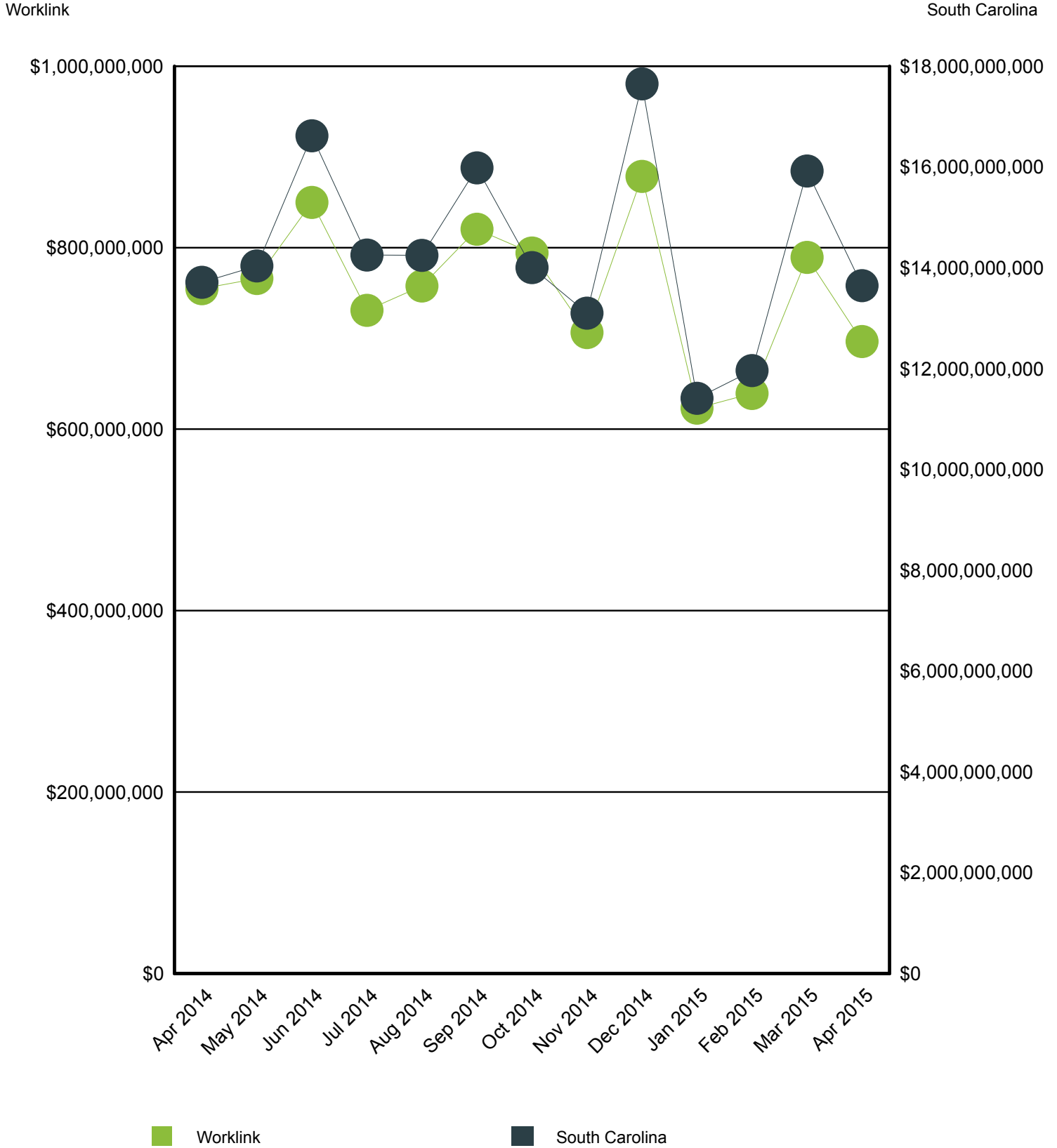

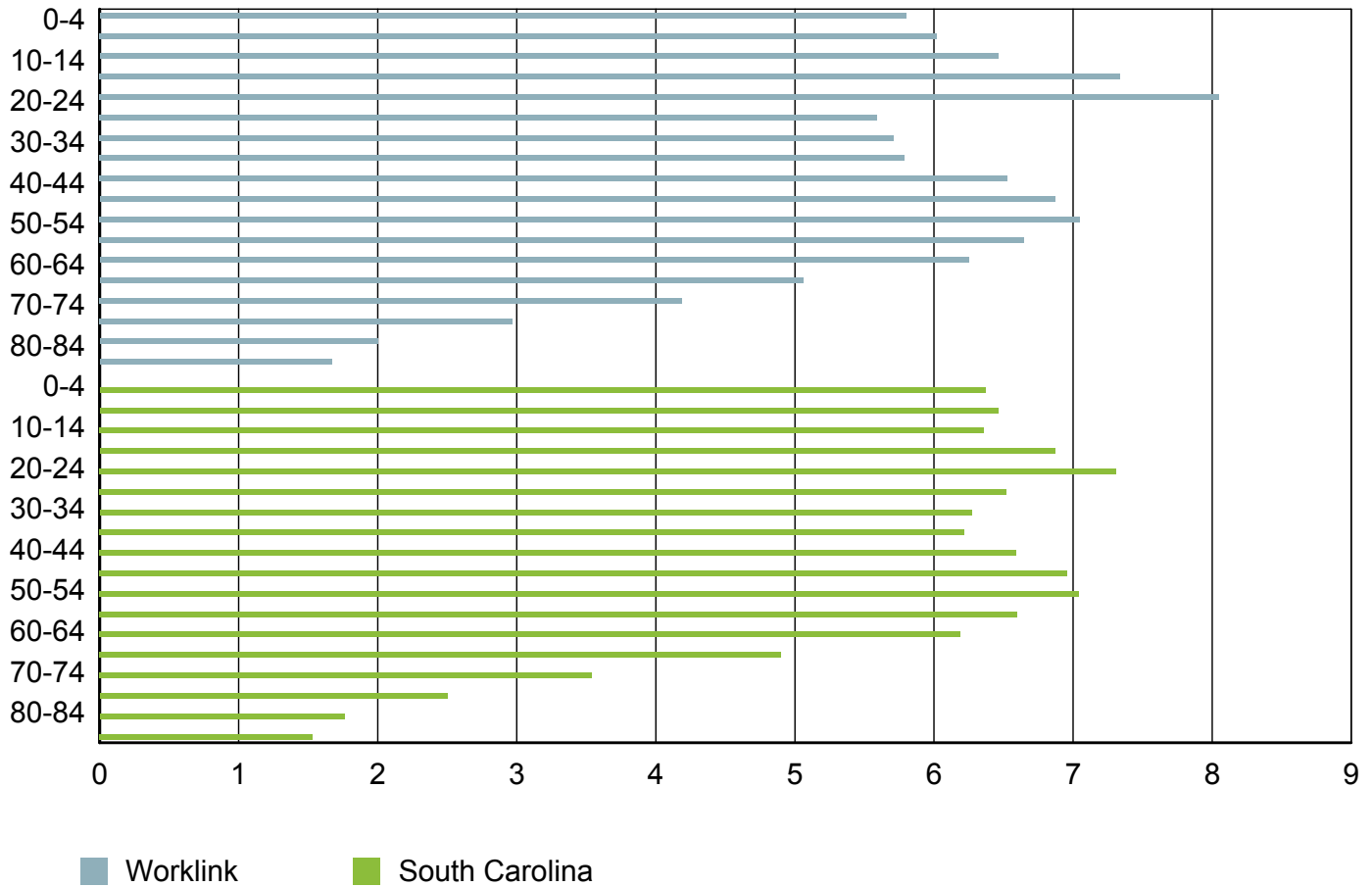

Population by Age



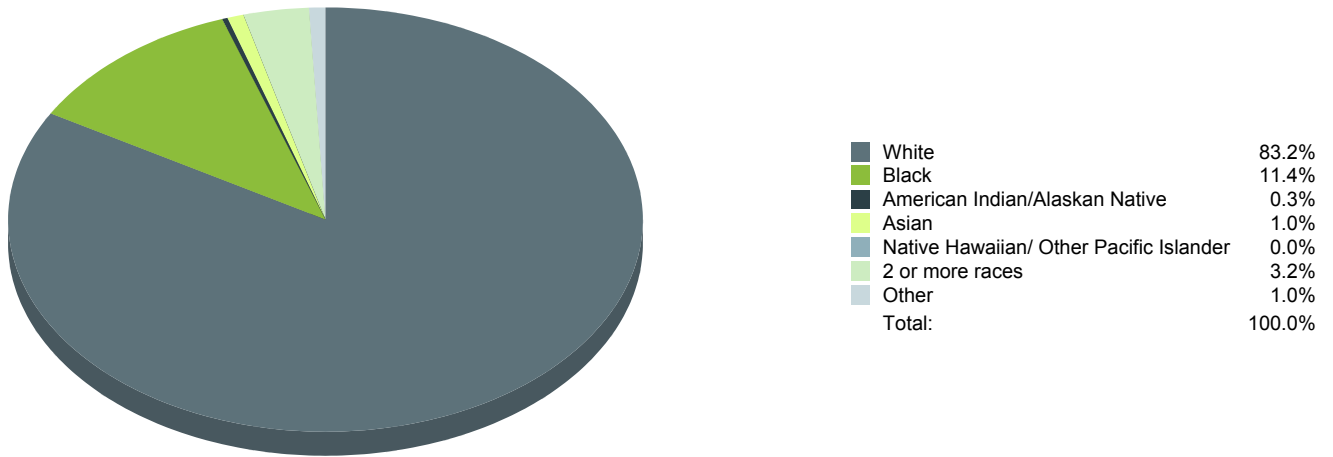

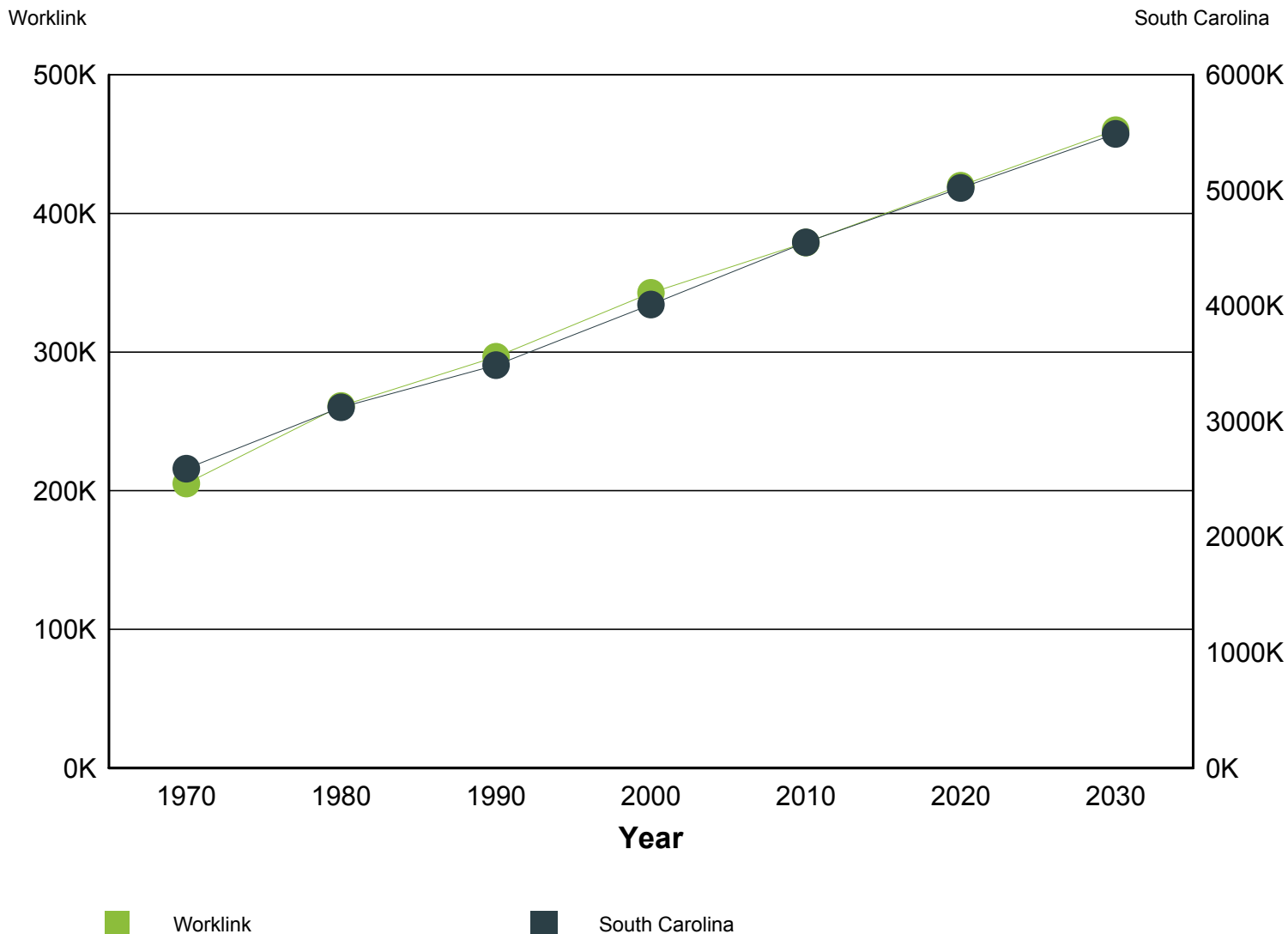

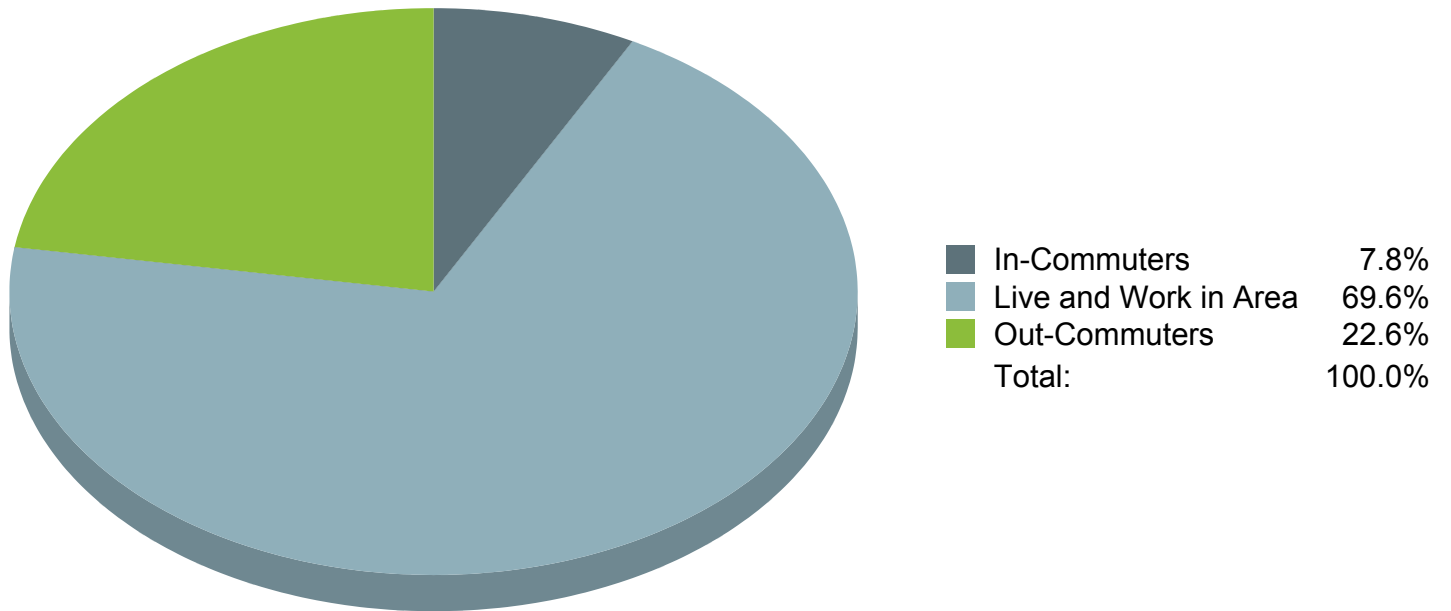

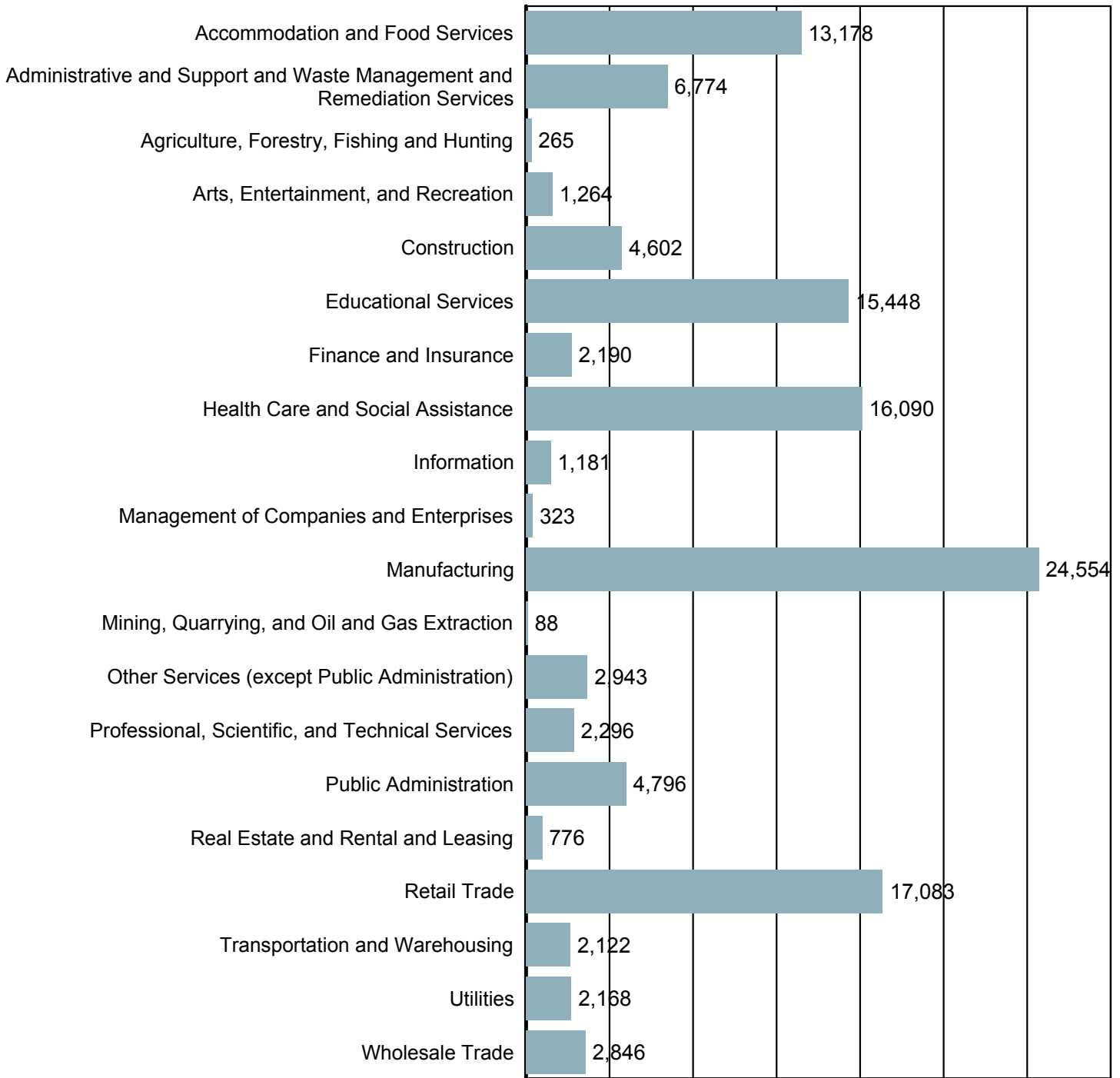

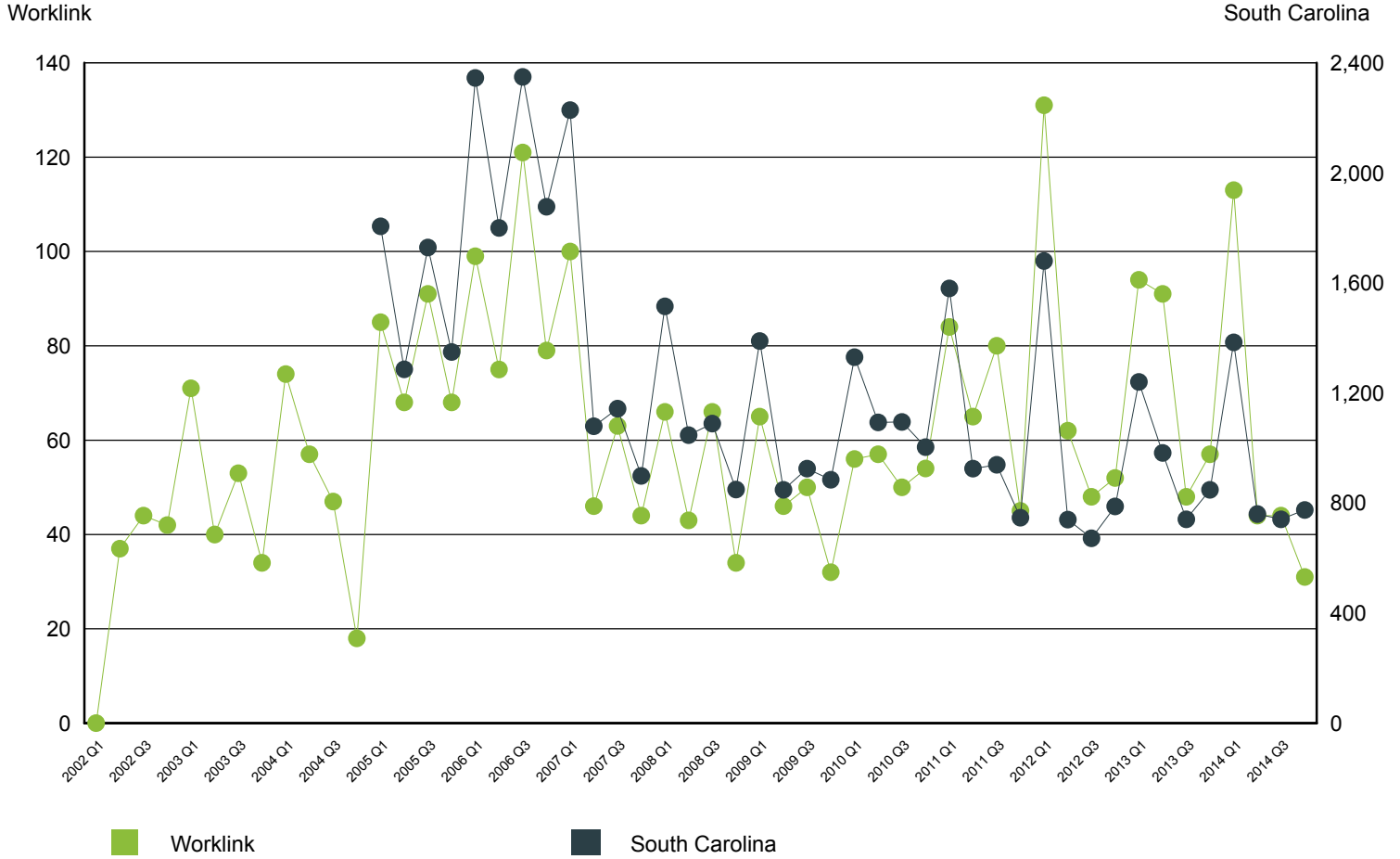

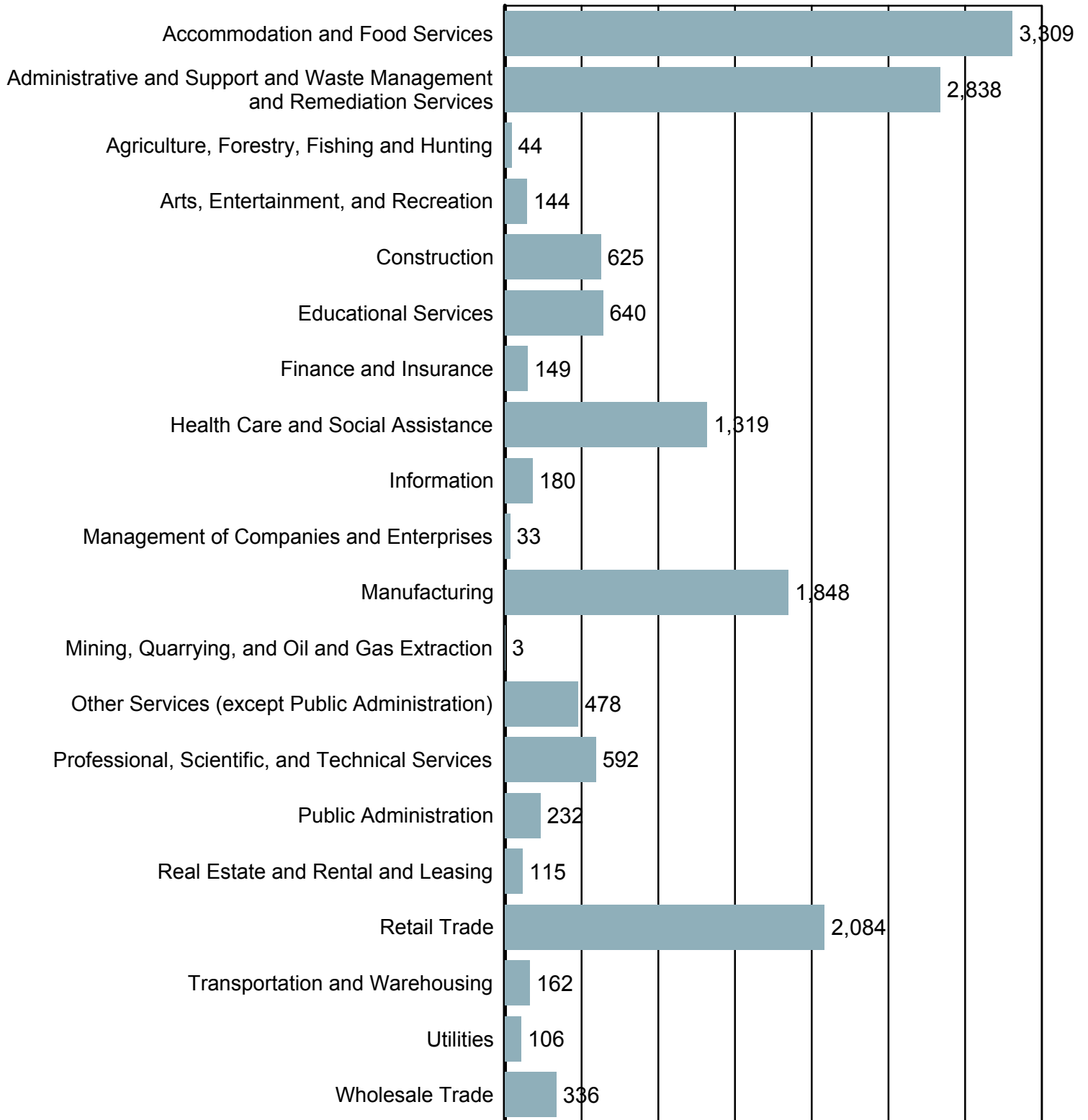

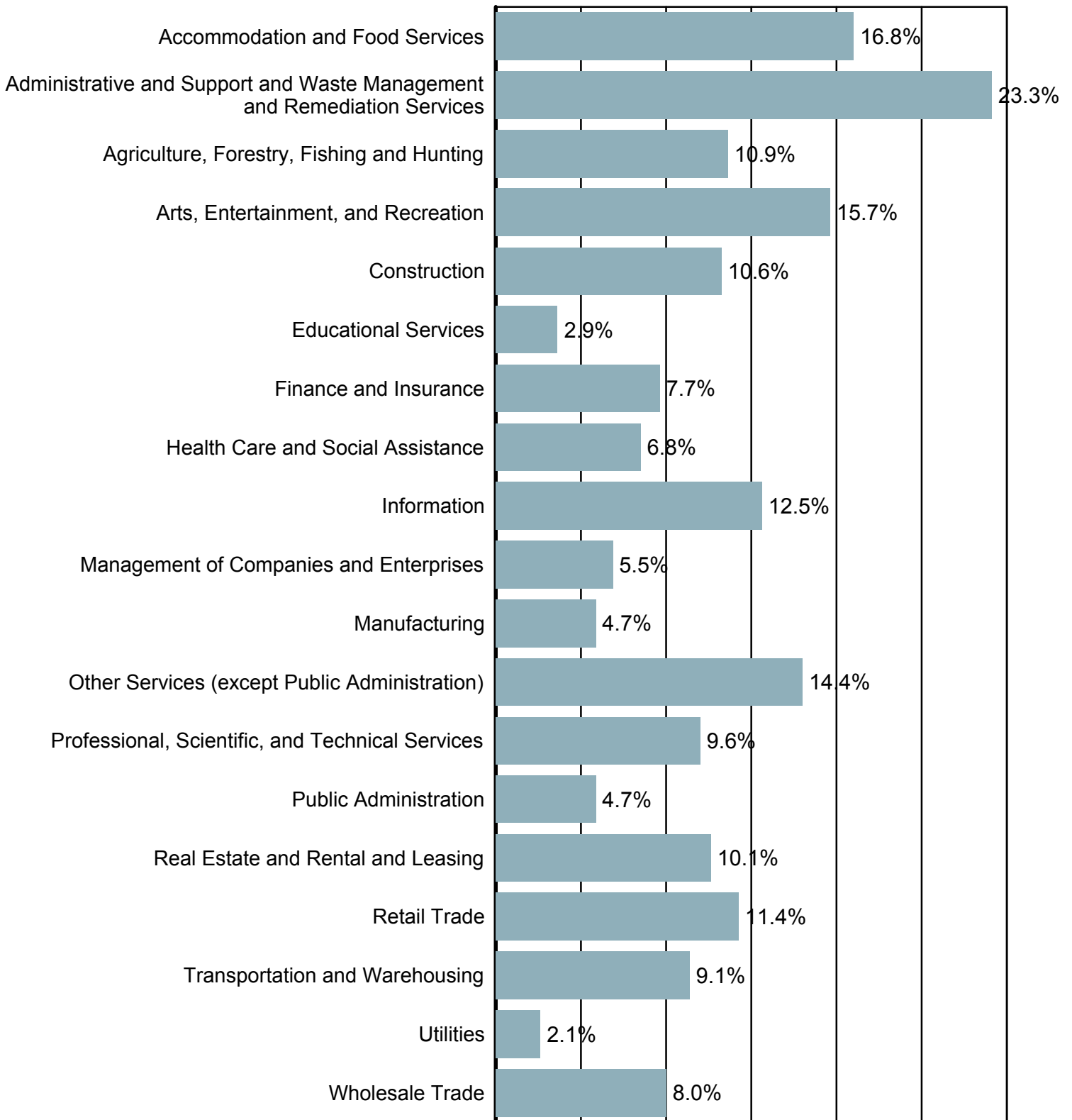

New Hires by Industry



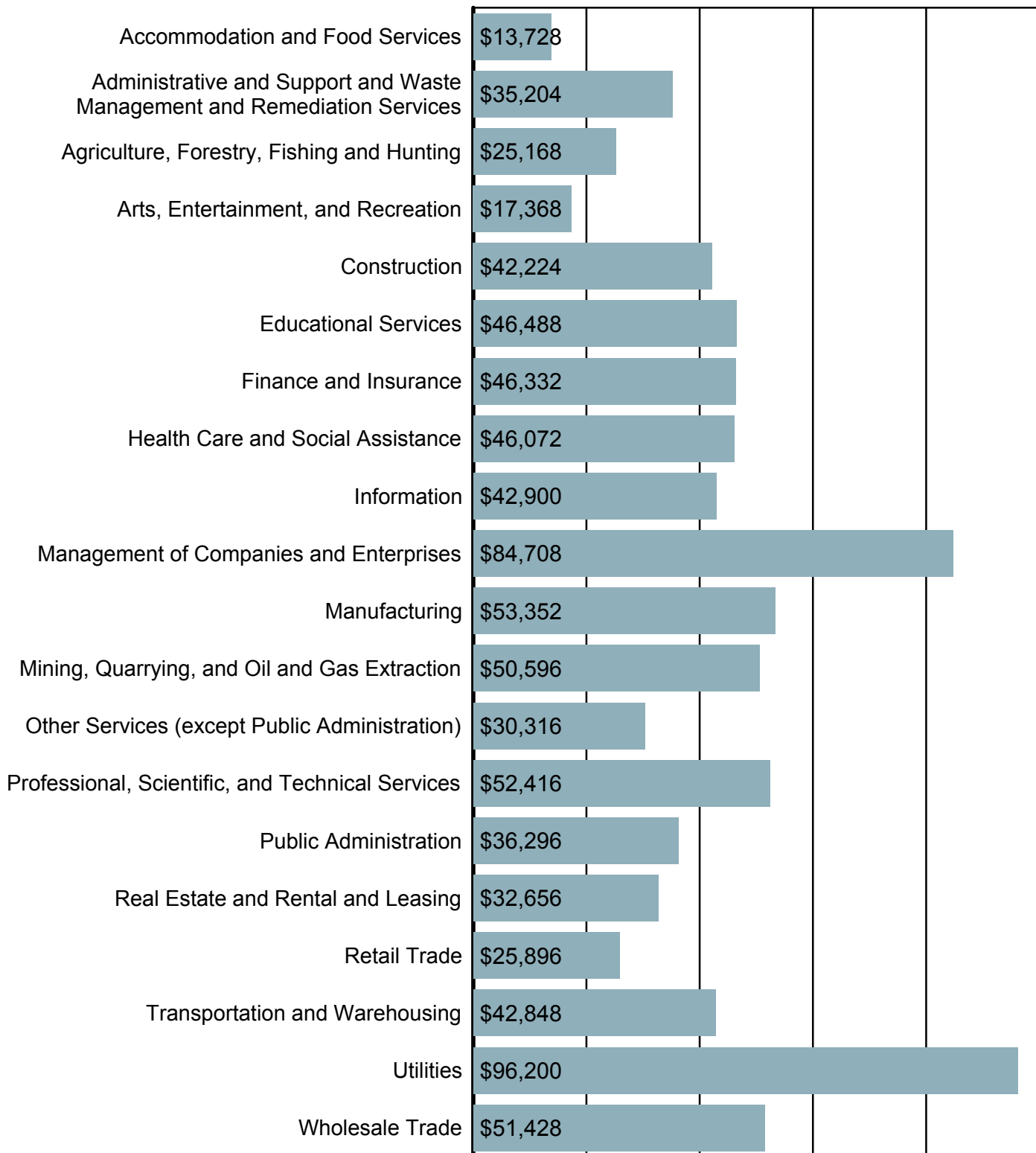

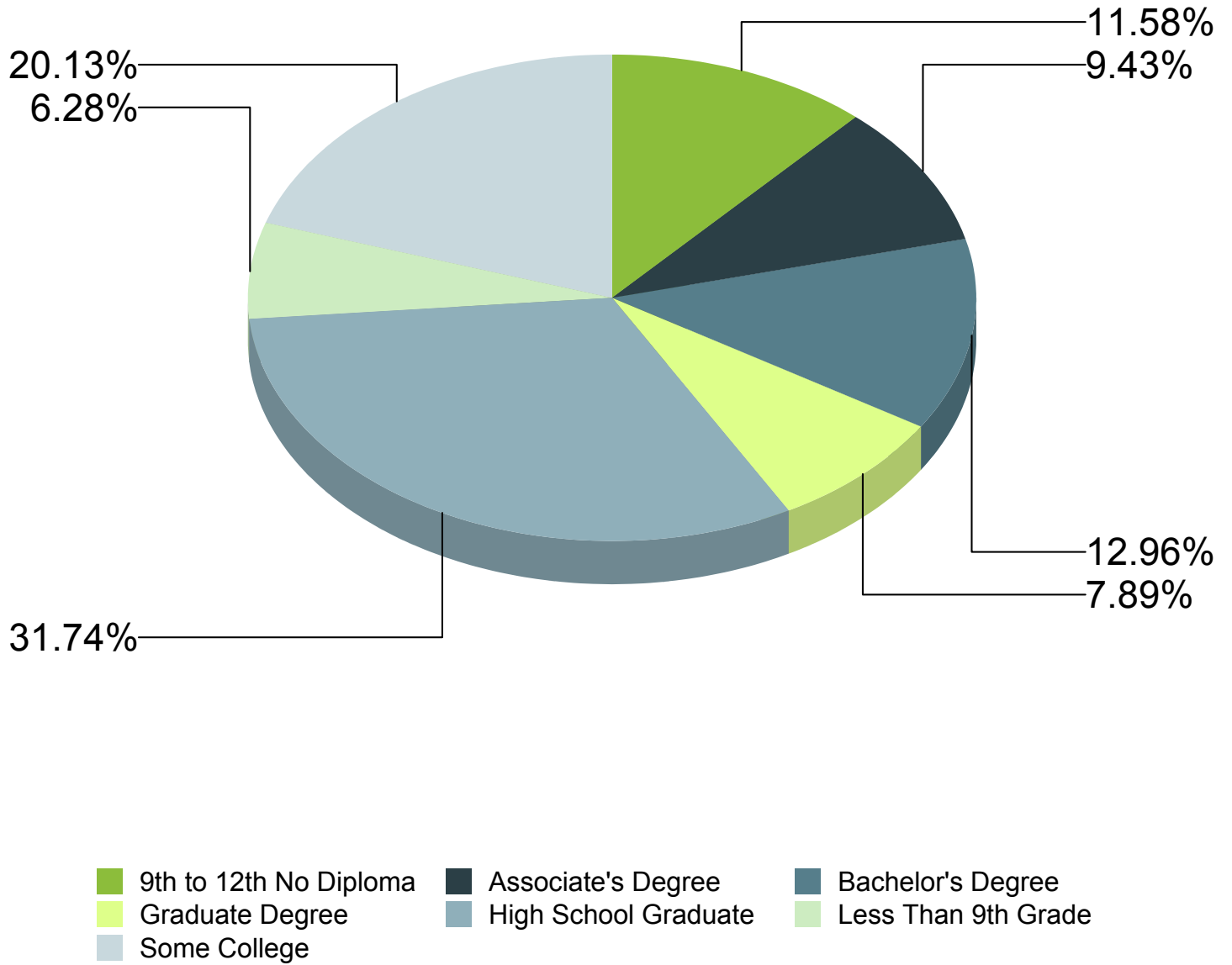

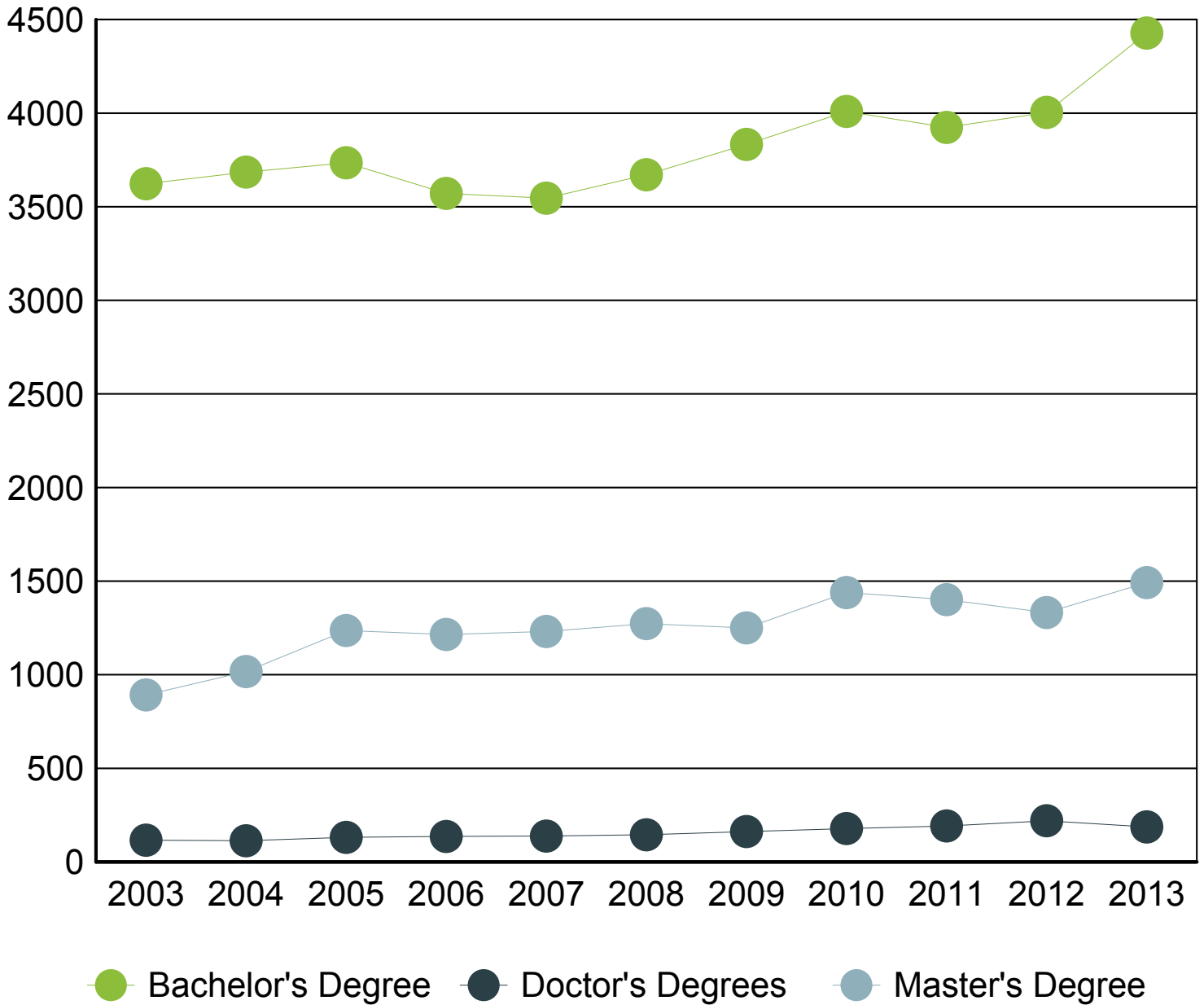
