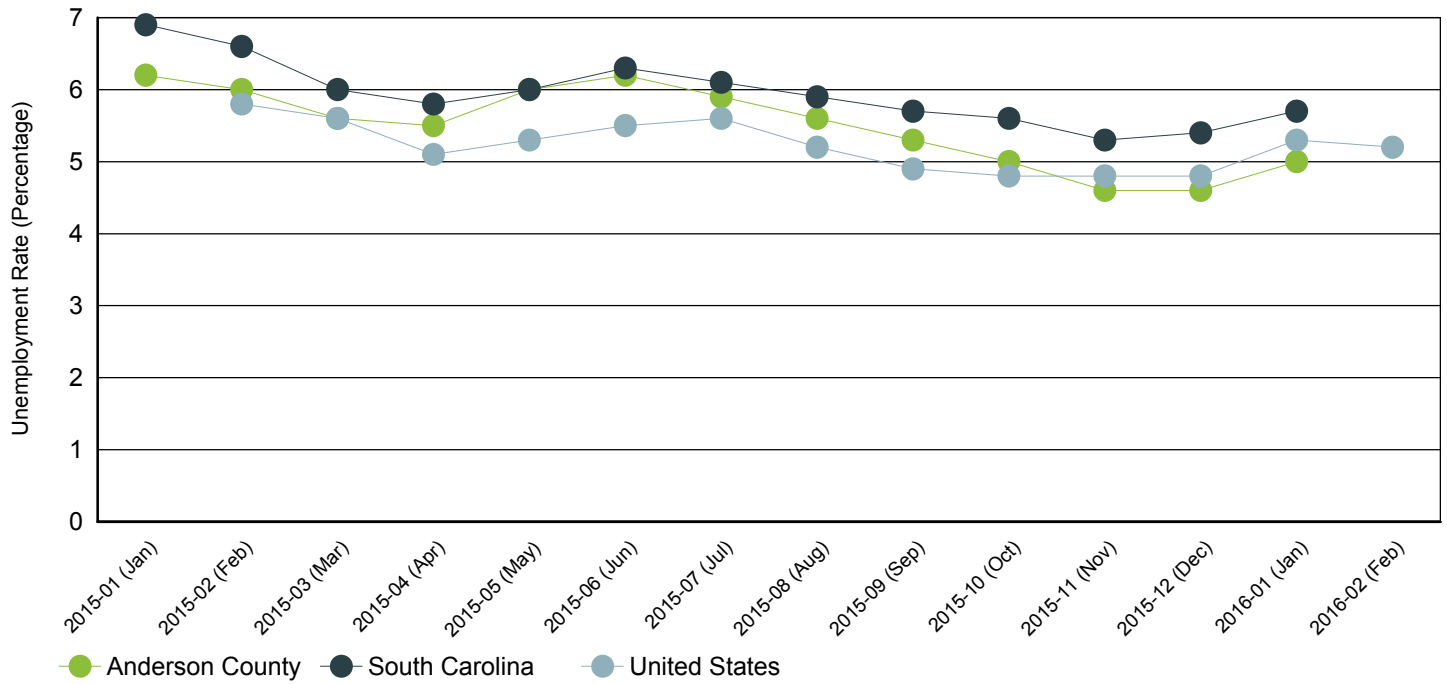

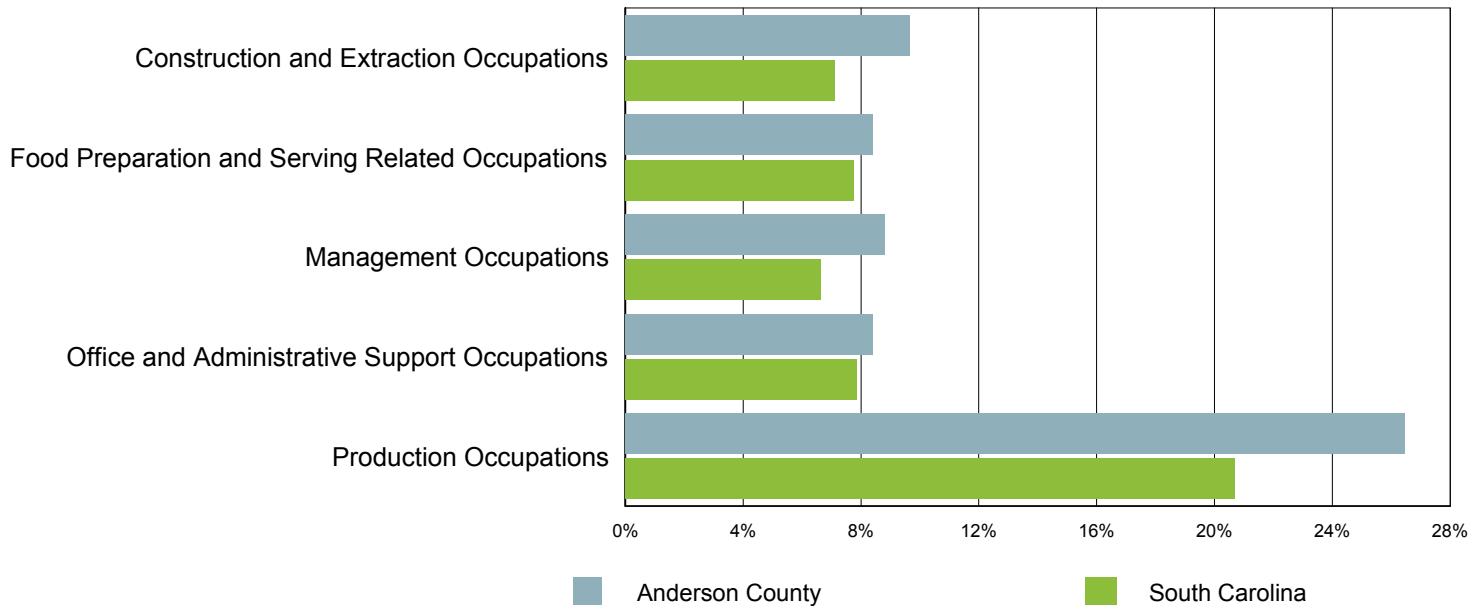

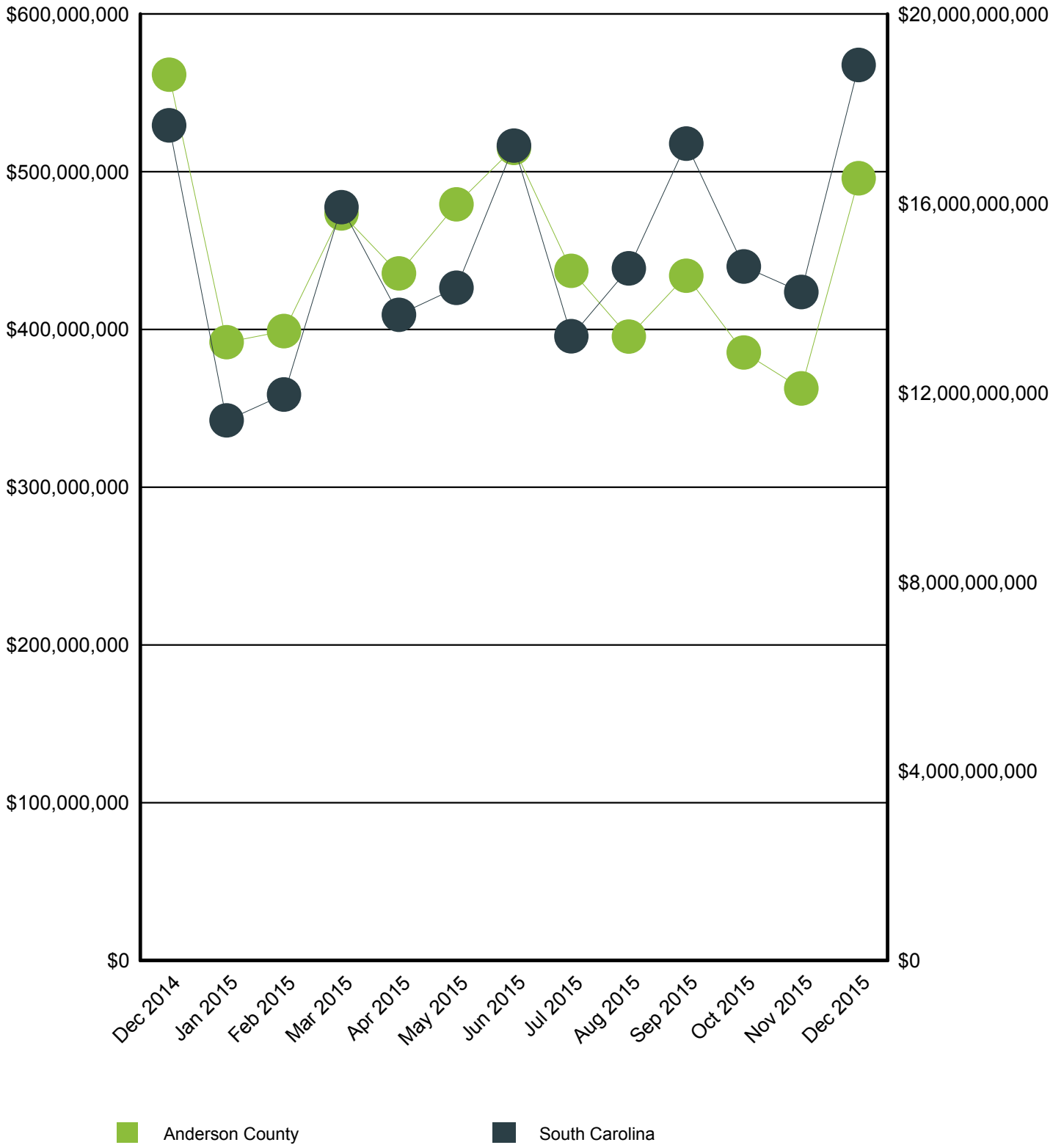

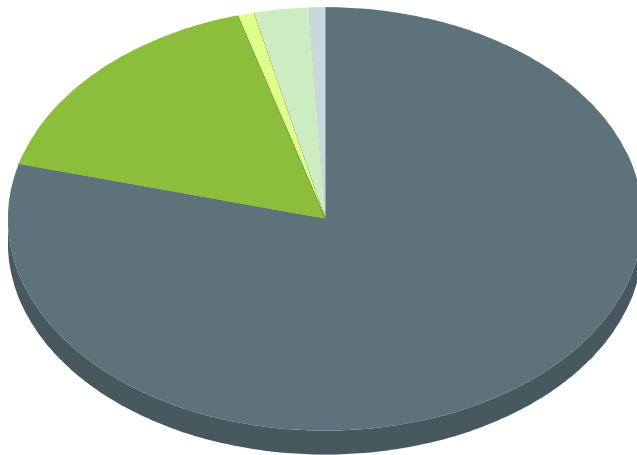

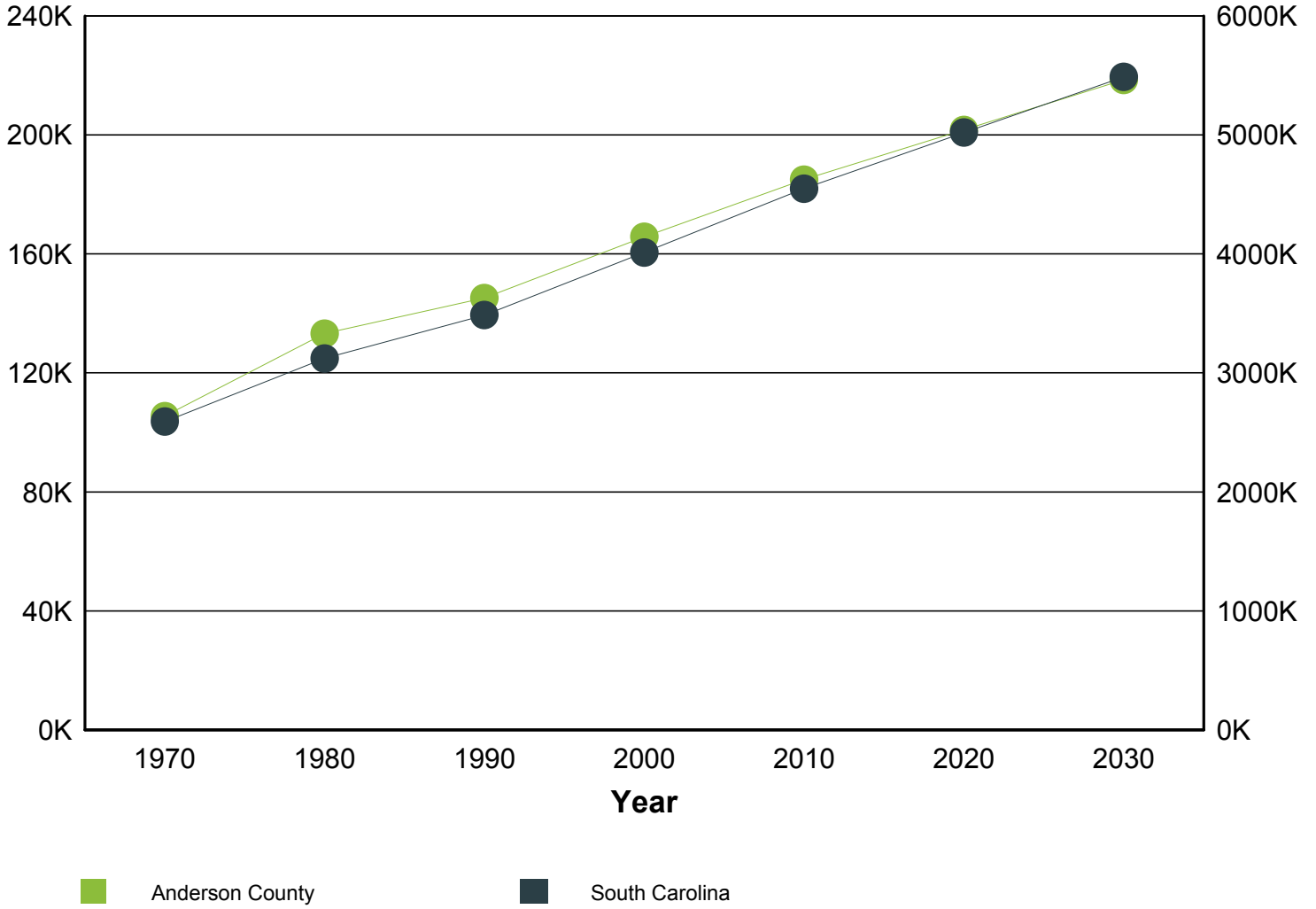

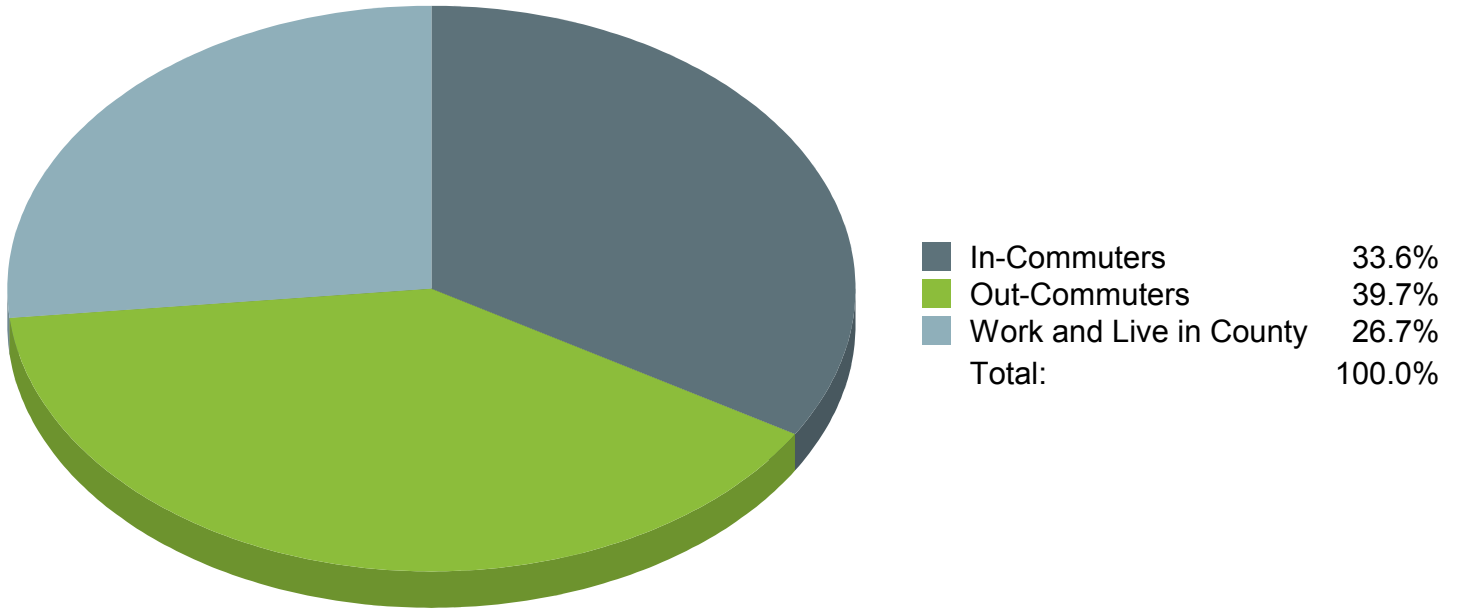

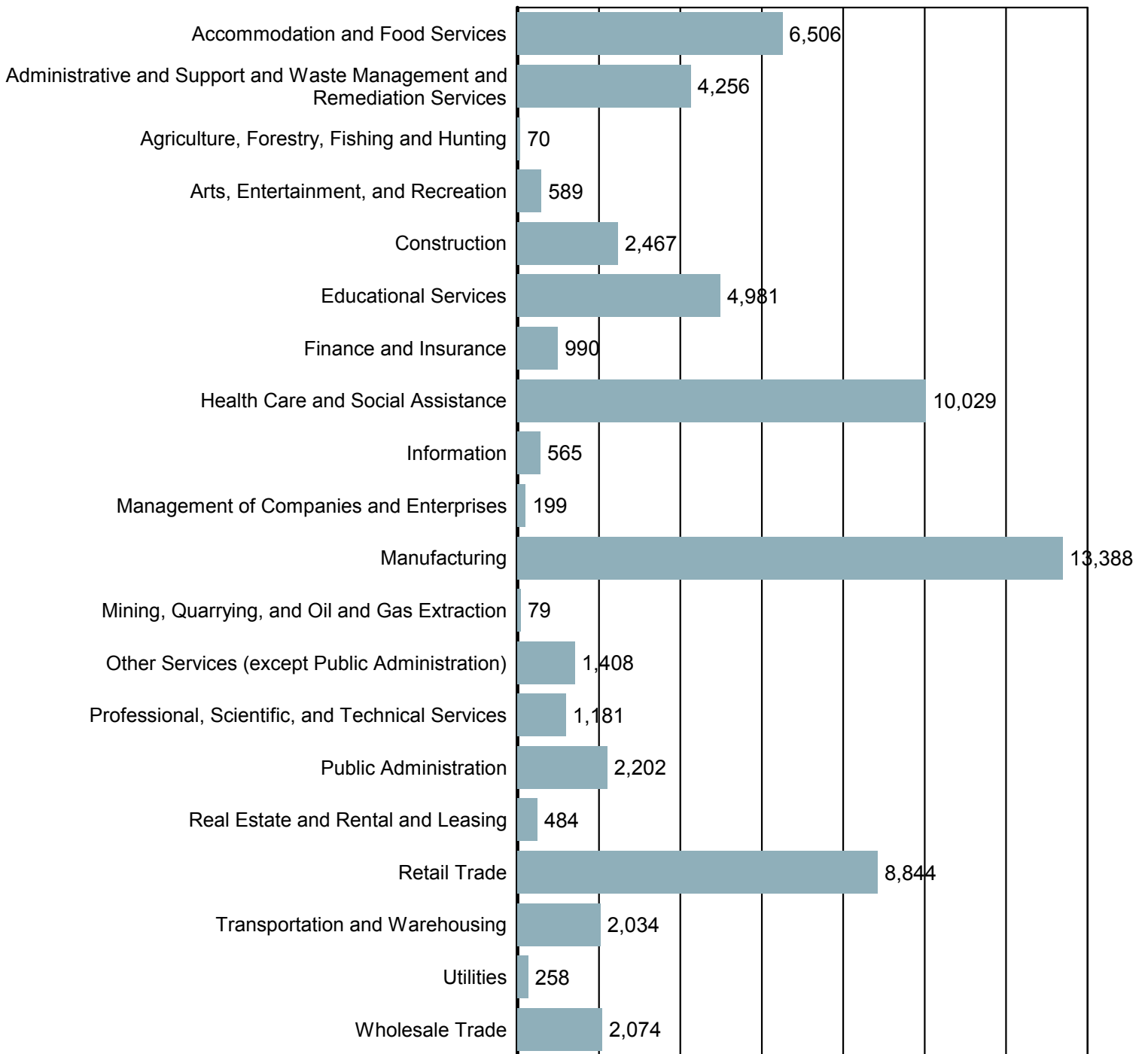

### Employment by Industry

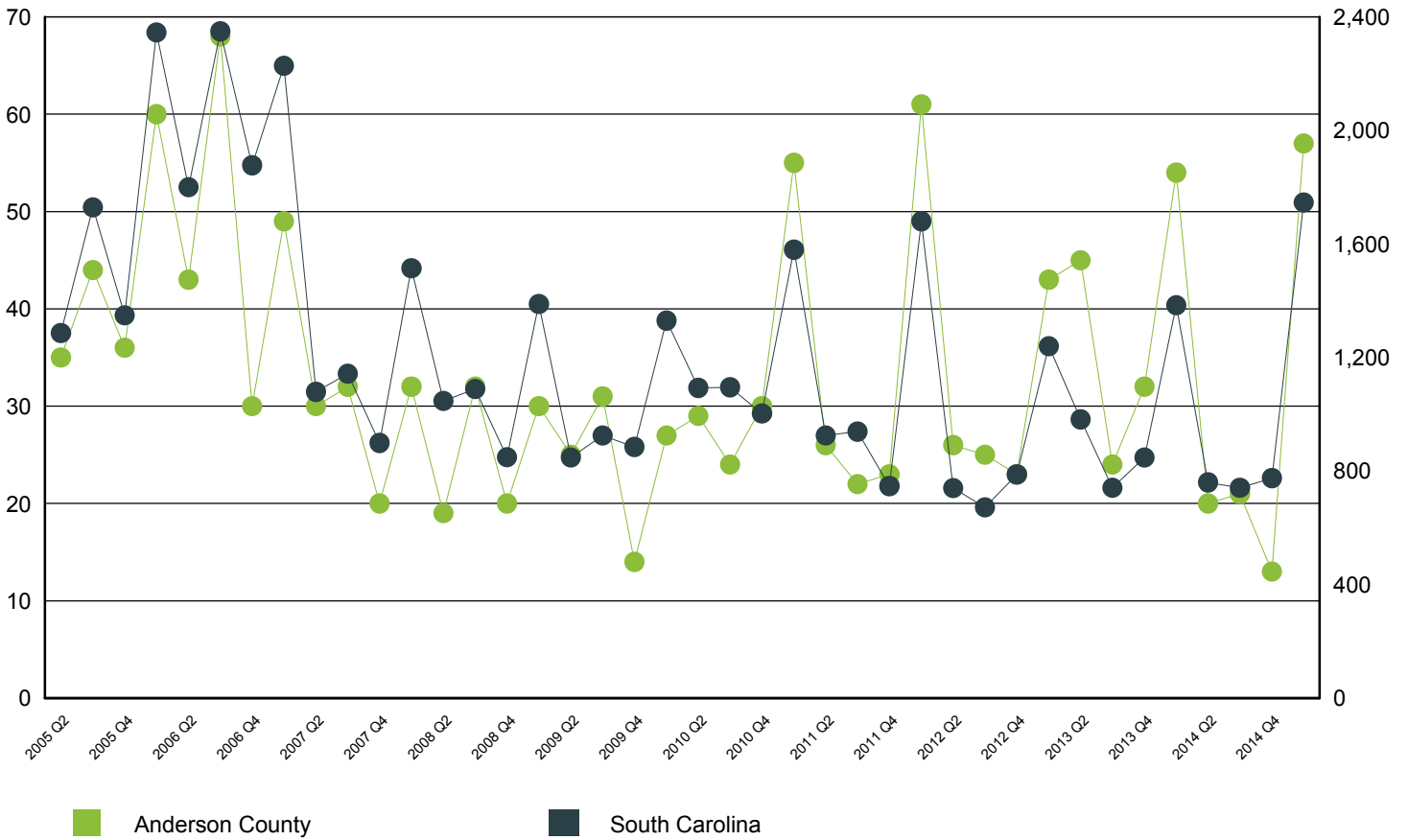

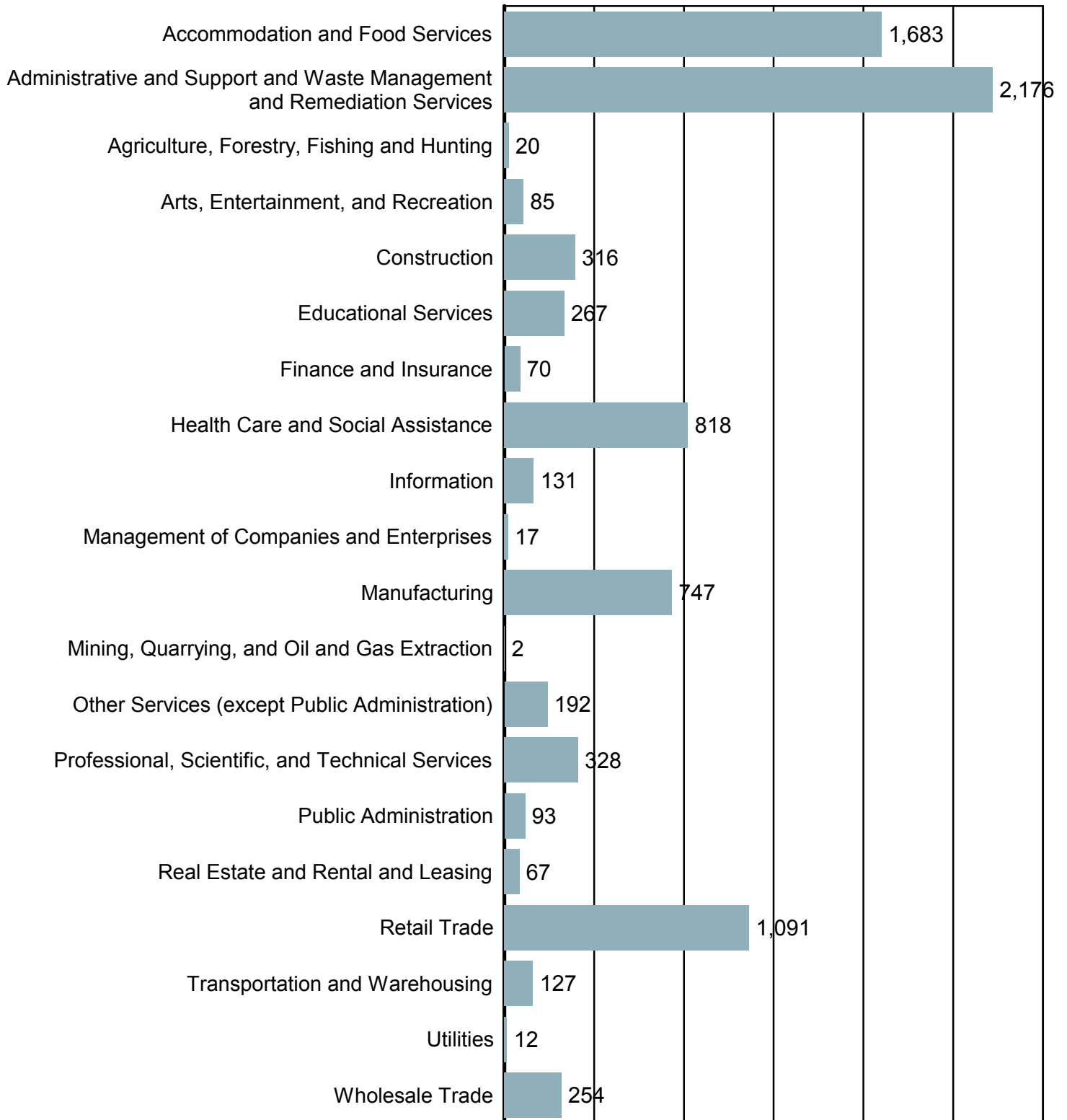

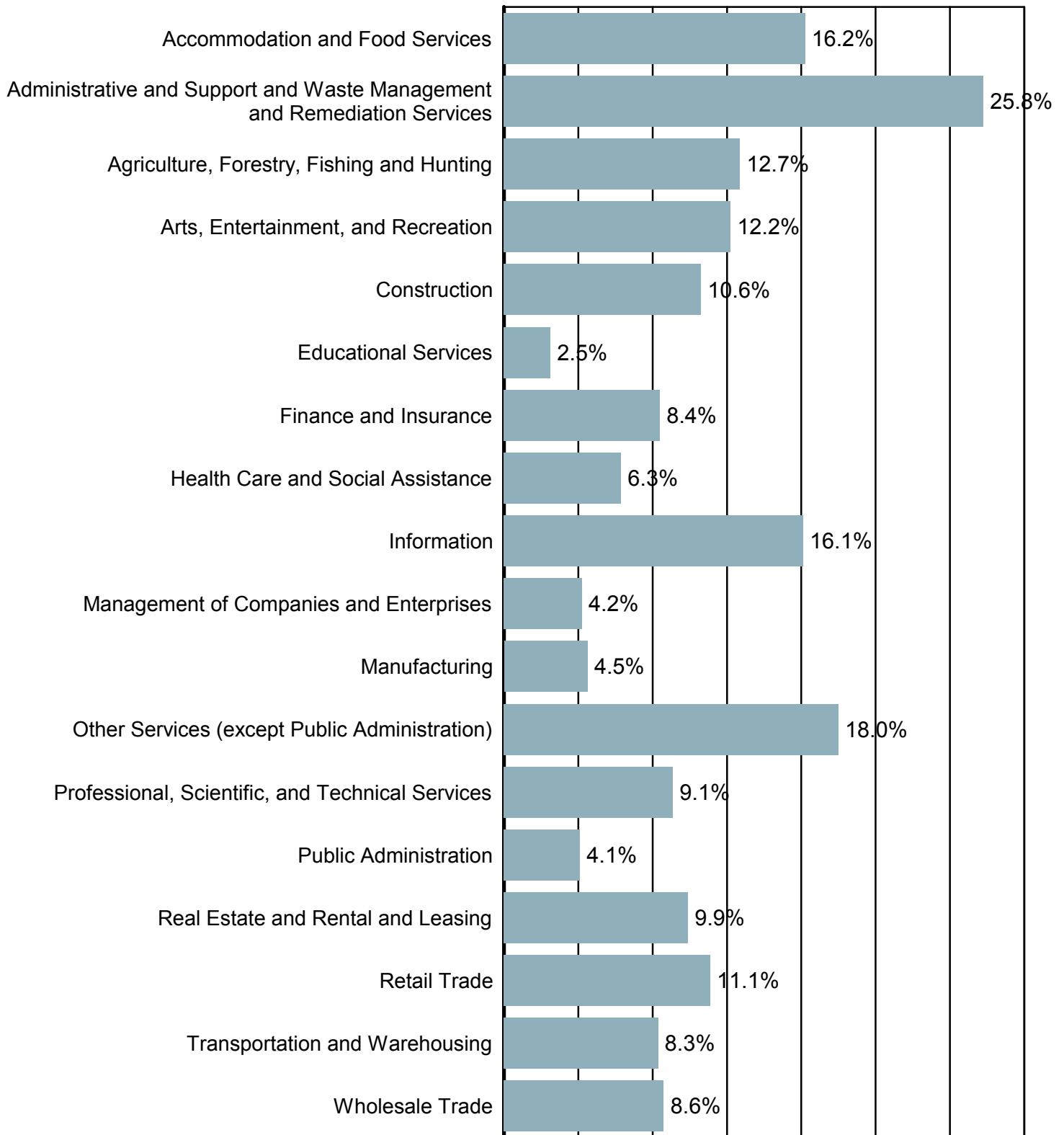

### New Hires by Industry



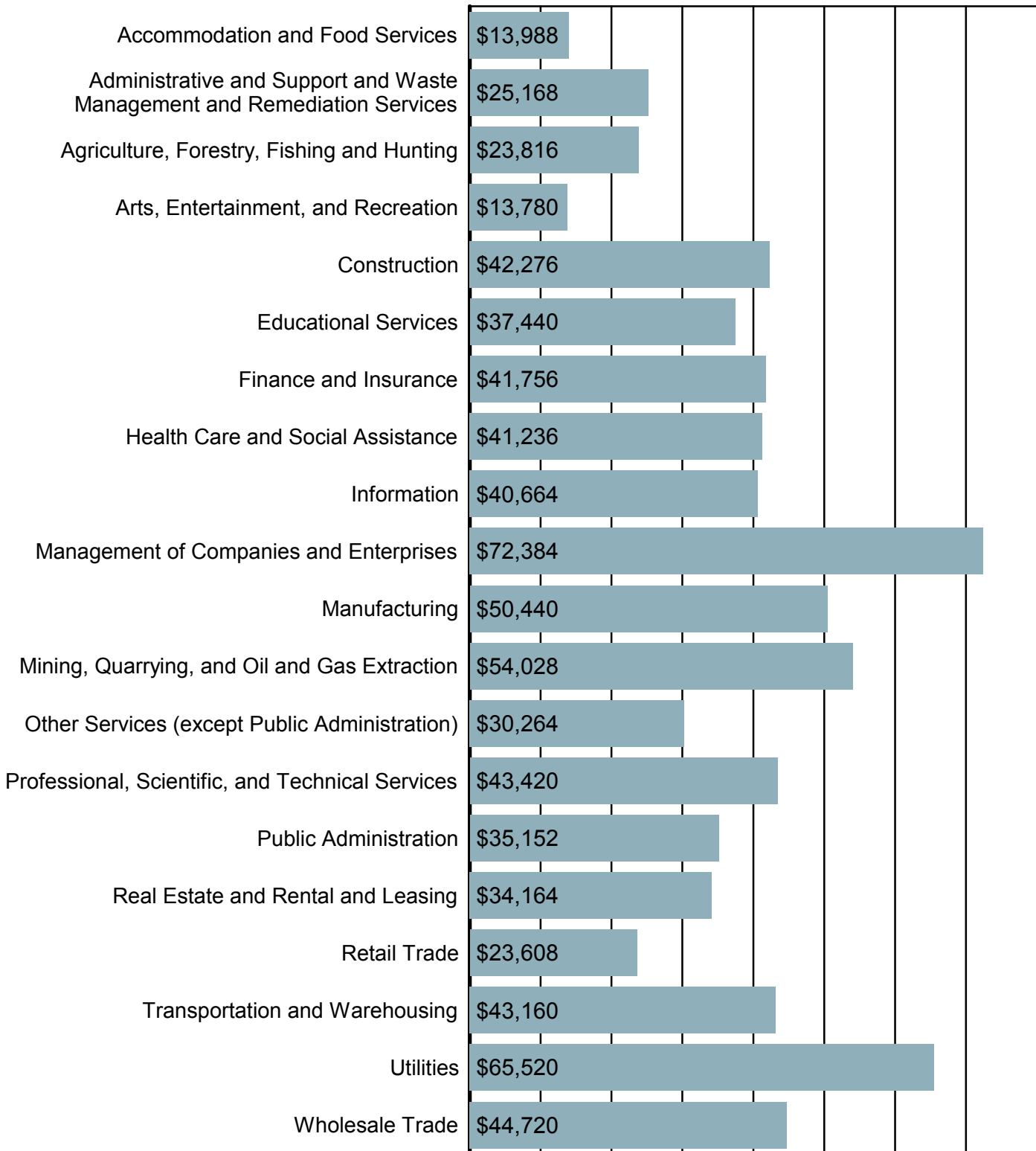

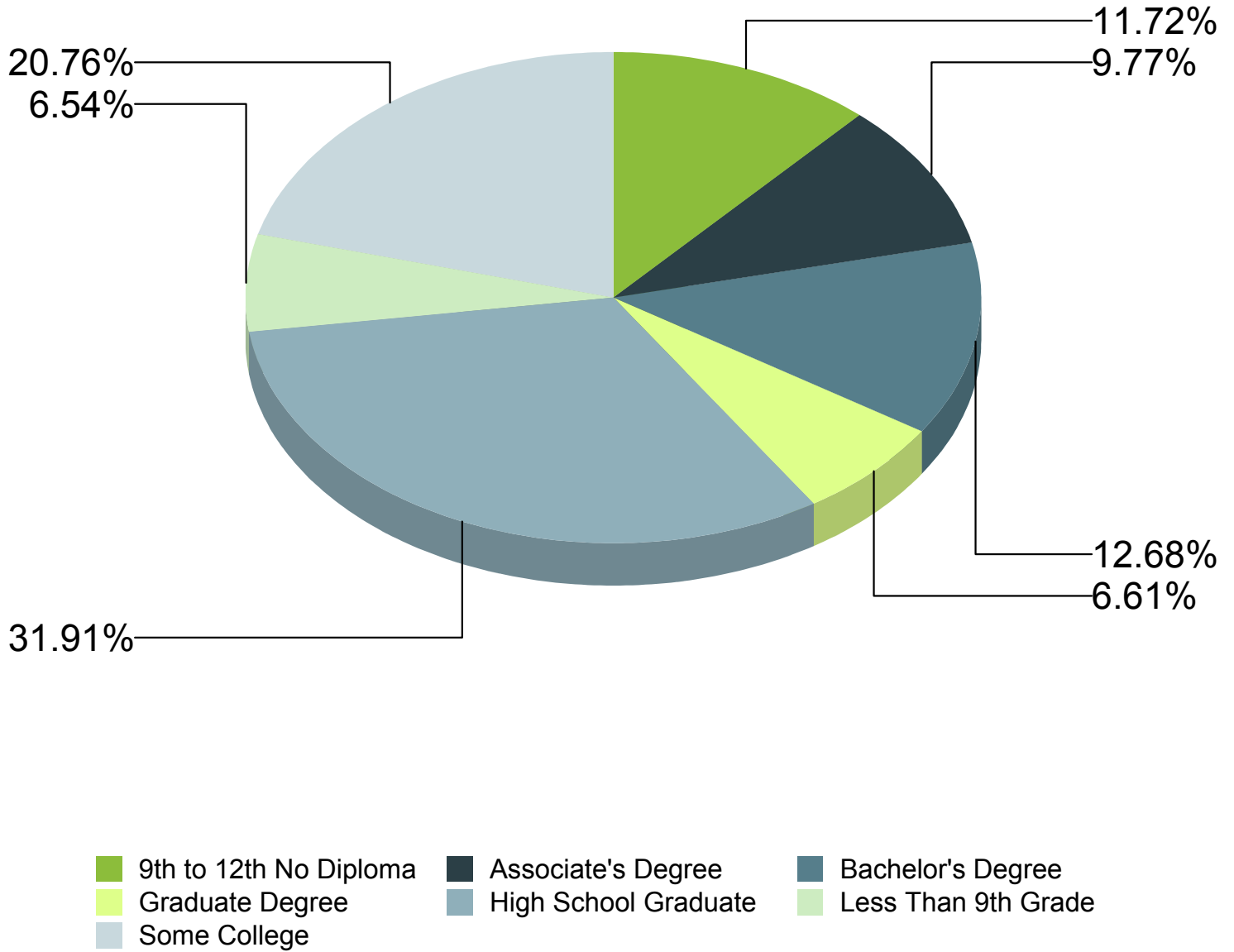

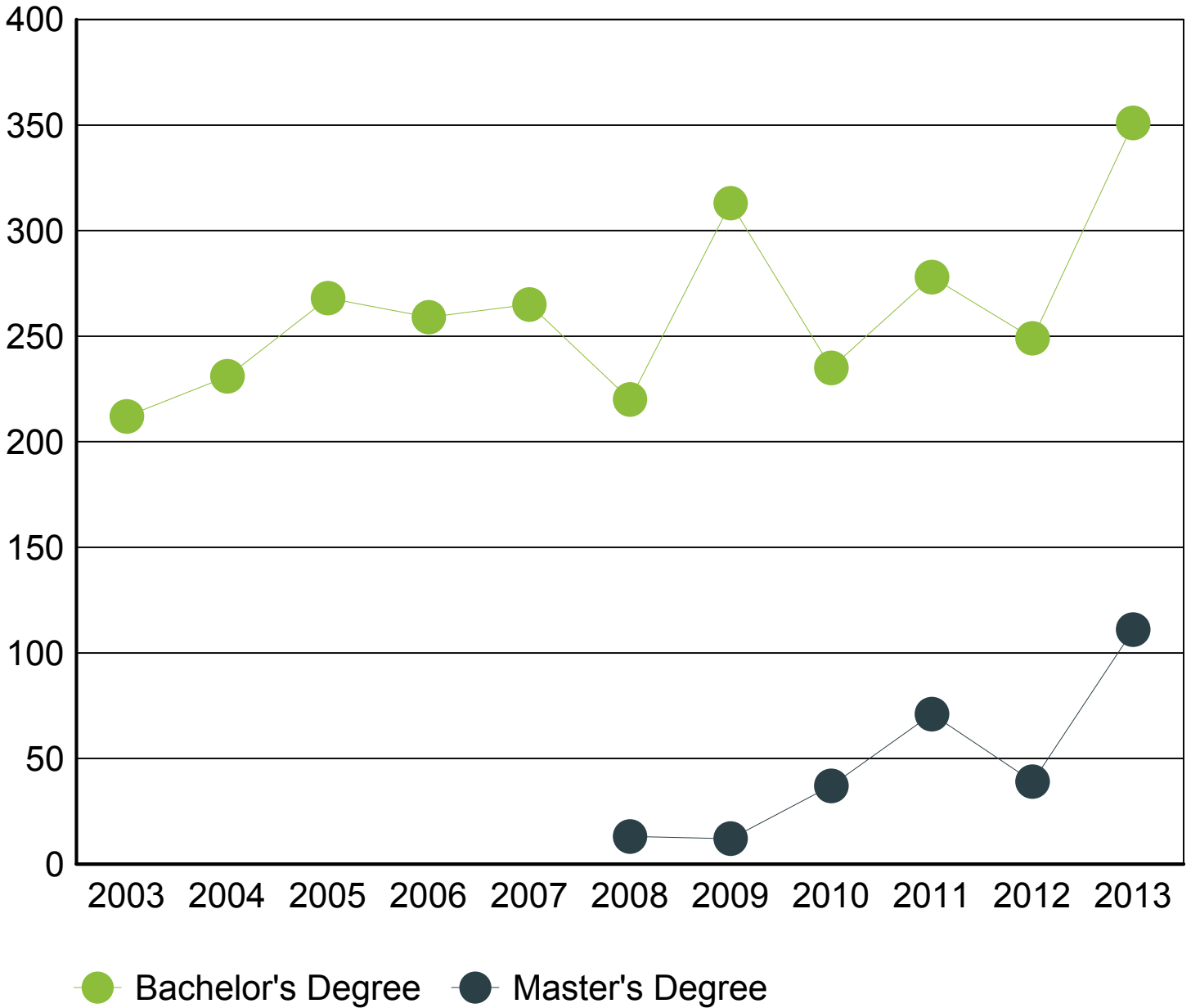
(Population 25 Years and Older)
