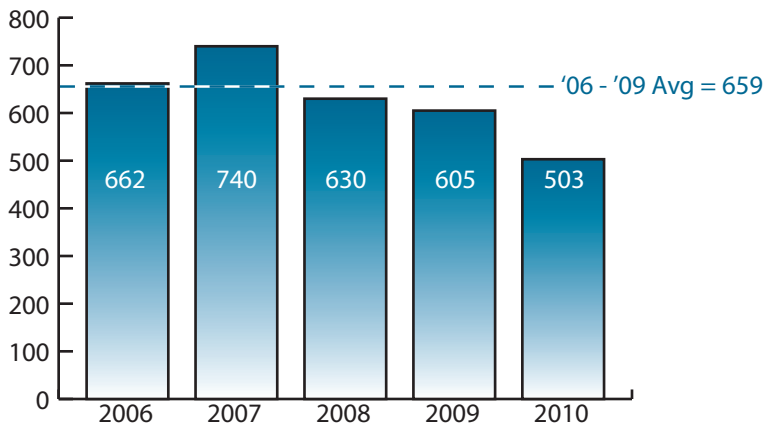


# SOUTH CAROLINA TRAFFIC FATALITY REPORT FOR 2010

Statistics through August 2010

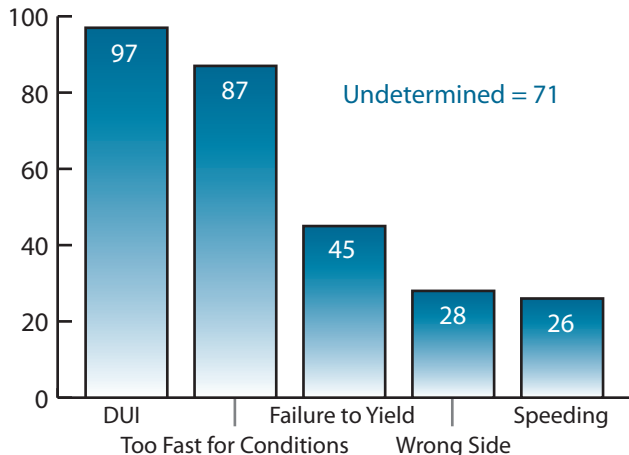

## 2006 - 2010 Fatality Comparison through August



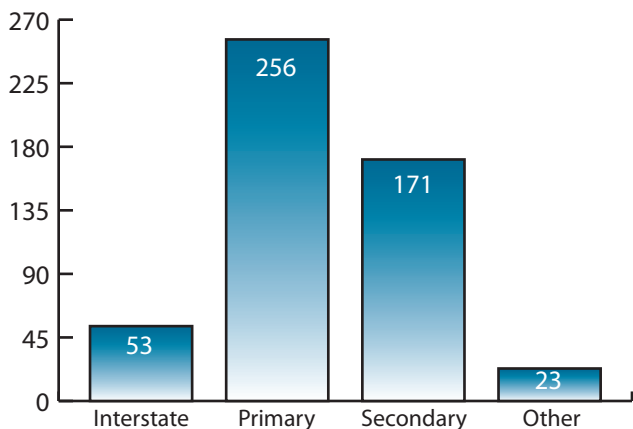
Preliminary figures indicate traffic deaths through August 2010 are nearly 25% below the previous four-year average and more than 15% below the same period in 2009.

## Top Probable Causes



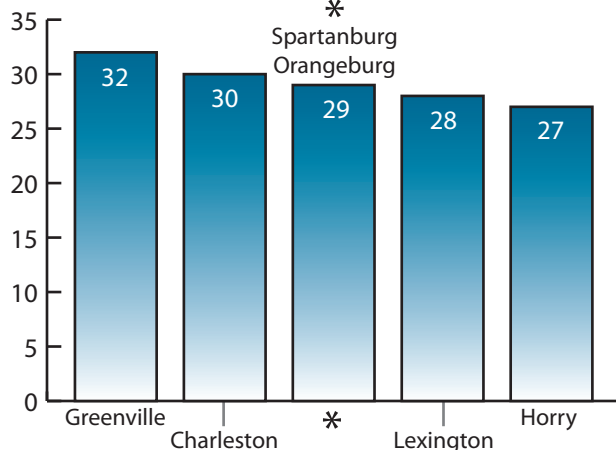
Although DUI deaths through August are down nearly 100 compared to same period last year, they still comprise nearly 25% of all fatalities with known causes.

## Fatalities by Route Category



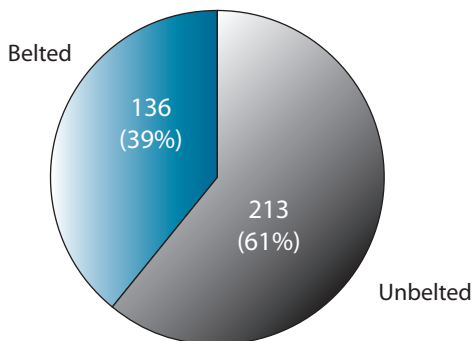
Fatalities through August 2010 are down nearly 25% (from 226 to 171) on secondary roads compared to same period last year while deaths on interstates are down approximately 10%.

## Top Fatality Counties



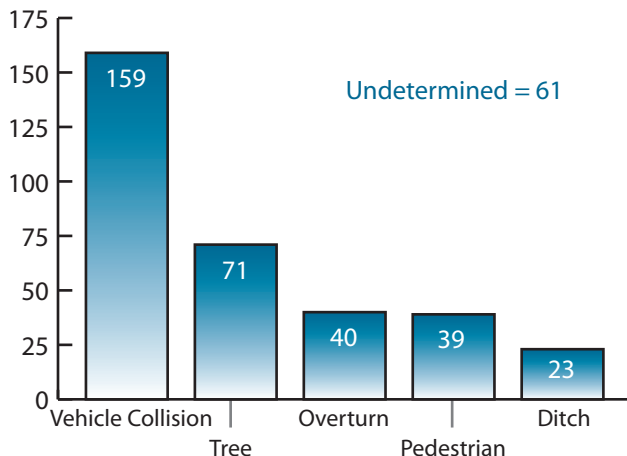
Fatalities in Greenville and Charleston Counties have dropped by 15% through same period last year while traffic deaths in Spartanburg and Lexington Counties have increased slightly.

## Fatalities by Restraint Usage



This graphic does not include 154 people (pedestrians, motorcyclists and others) who were killed and did not have access to restraints.

## Top Crash Events



Nearly 20% of all fatalities with known causes involve vehicles striking trees. Pedestrian deaths are down nearly 20% so far in 2010 compared to same period last year.
