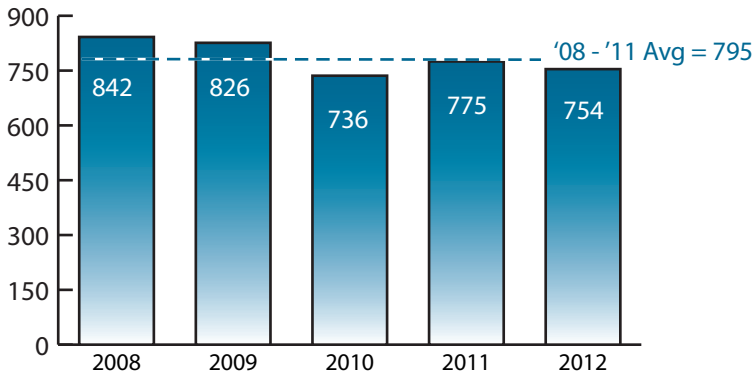

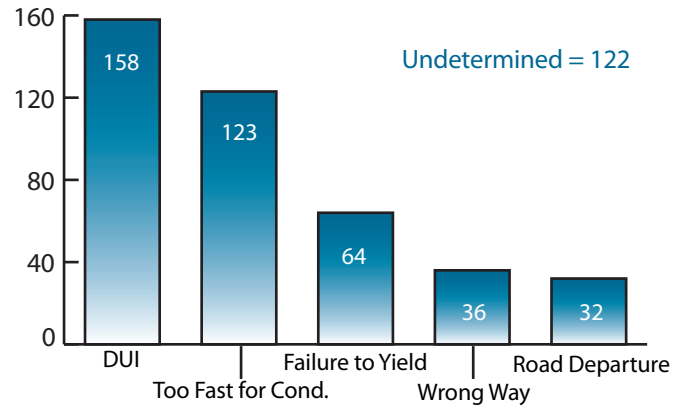

2008 - 2012 Fatality Comparison through November



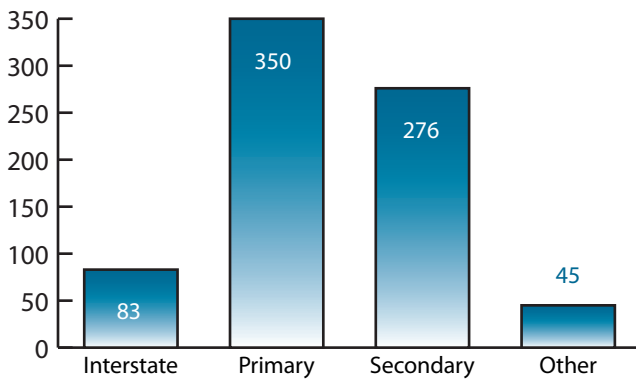
Traffic fatalities through November 2012 are nearly 5% below 2011 and more than 5% below the previous four-year average.

Top Probable Causes



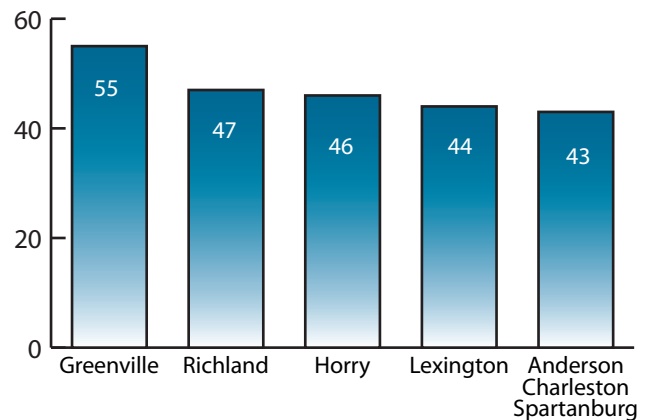
While fatalities caused by DUI and Driving Too Fast for Conditions remain nearly unchanged from 2011, those caused by Failure To Yield have increased by nearly 30% from 2011 and about 5% from 2010.

Fatalities by Route Category



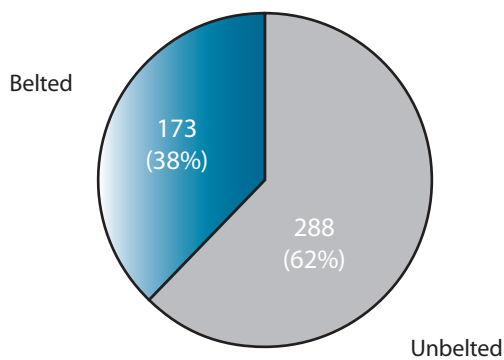
Fatalities on secondary roads have increased by 8% from 2011, and nearly 15% since 2010. Fatalities on interstates have declined nearly 25% from 2011.

Top Fatality Counties



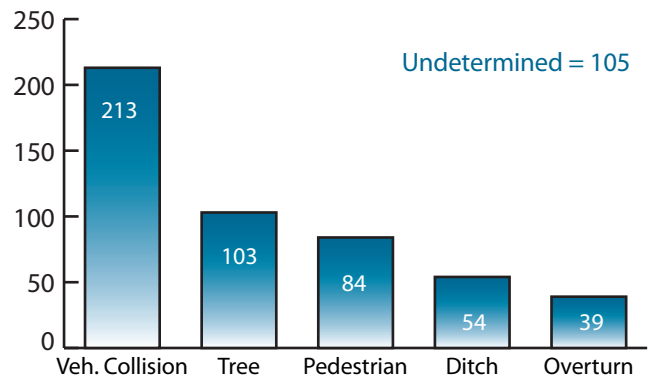
Fatalities in Richland County have increased by more than 30% from 2011 and nearly 25% since 2010. Conversely, fatalities in Lancaster County have decreased by 65% from 2011 and 22% since 2010.

Fatalities by Restraint Usage



This graphic does not include 293 people (pedestrians, motorcyclists and others) who were killed and did not have access to restraints.

Top Crash Events



Fatalities resulting from a vehicle crashing into a tree have increased by more than 15% from 2011 and nearly 20% since 2010, while those resulting from a collision with a ditch have increased 36% and 50% respectively.
