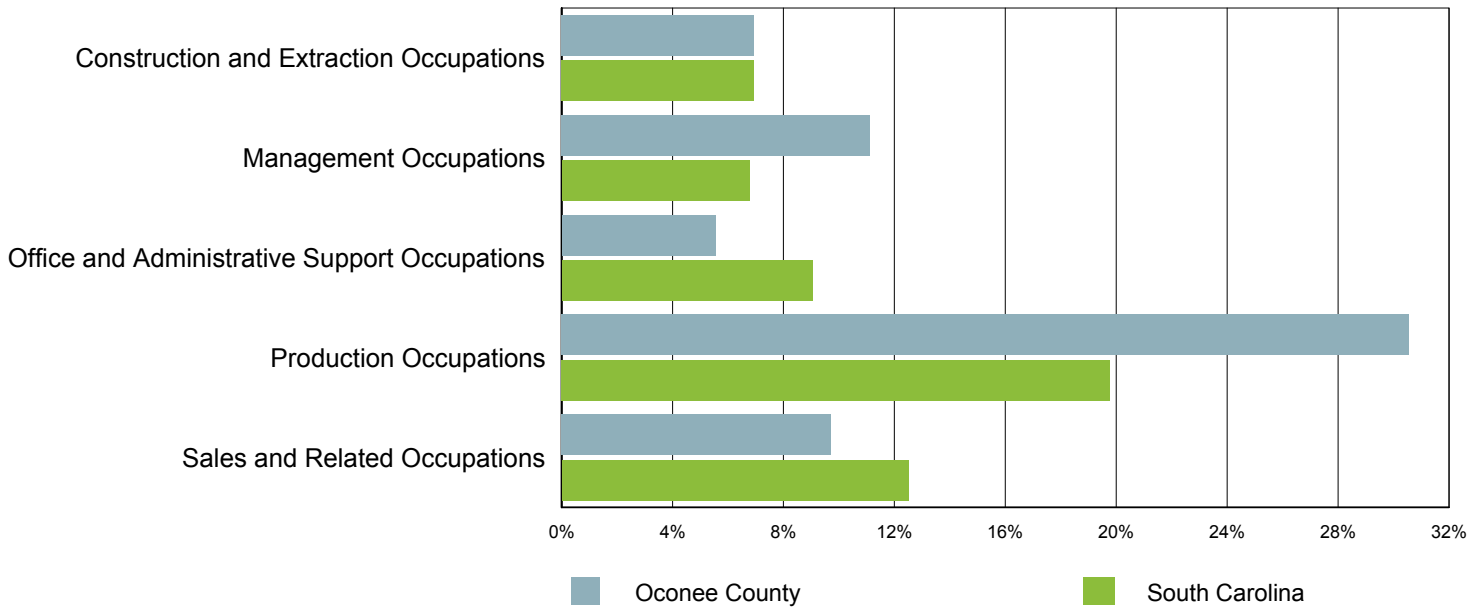

### Retail Sales

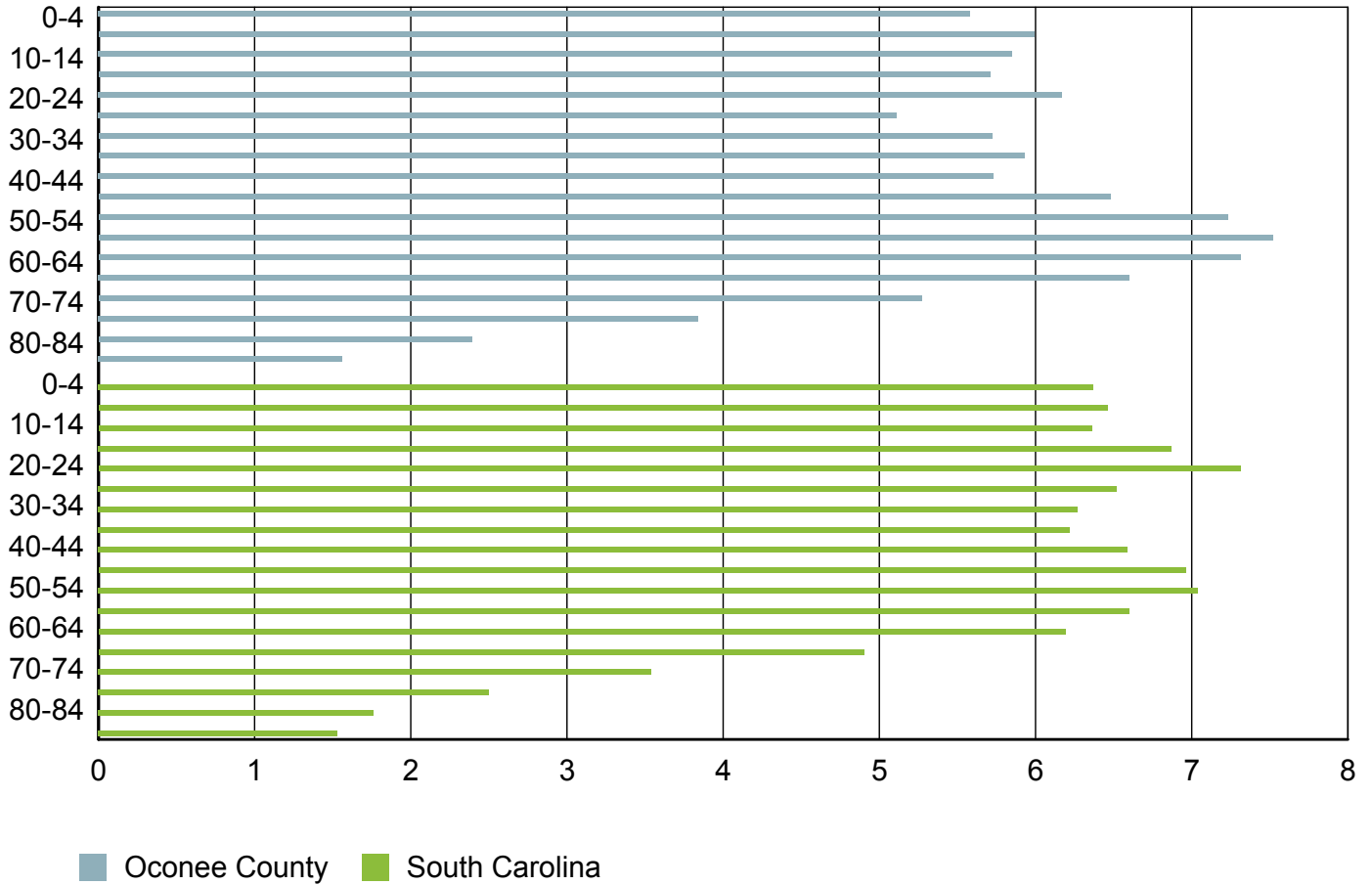

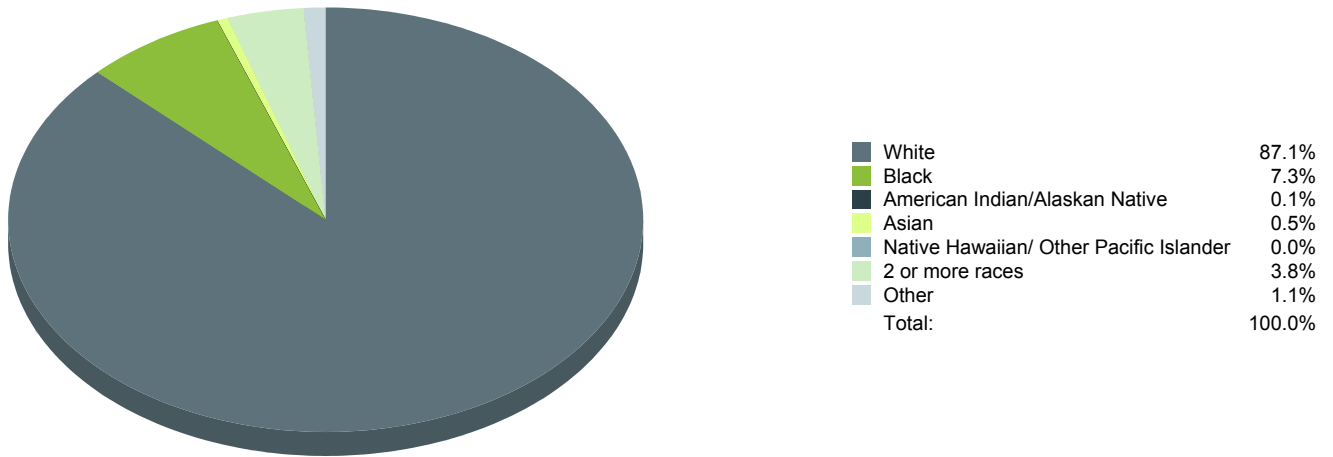

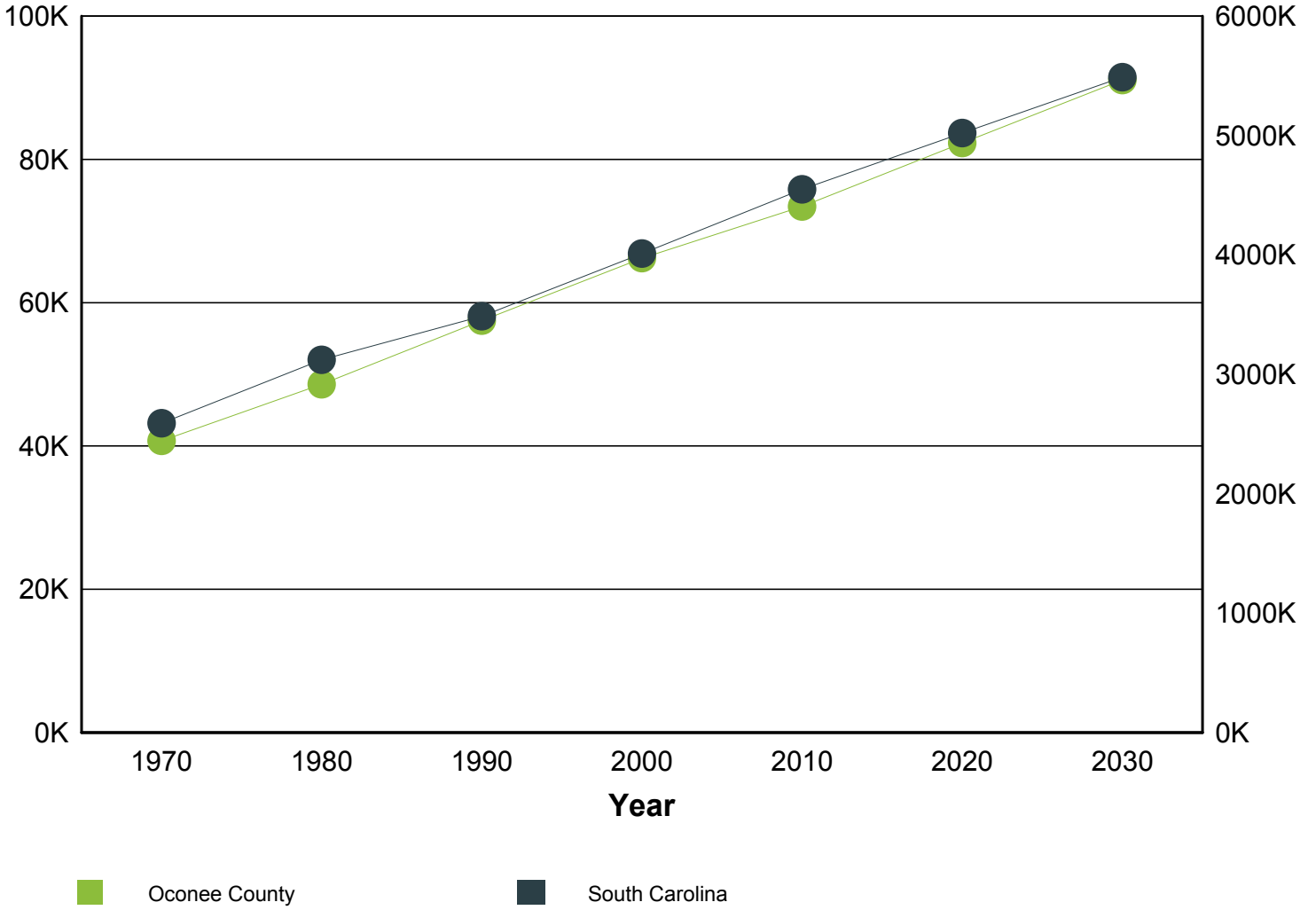

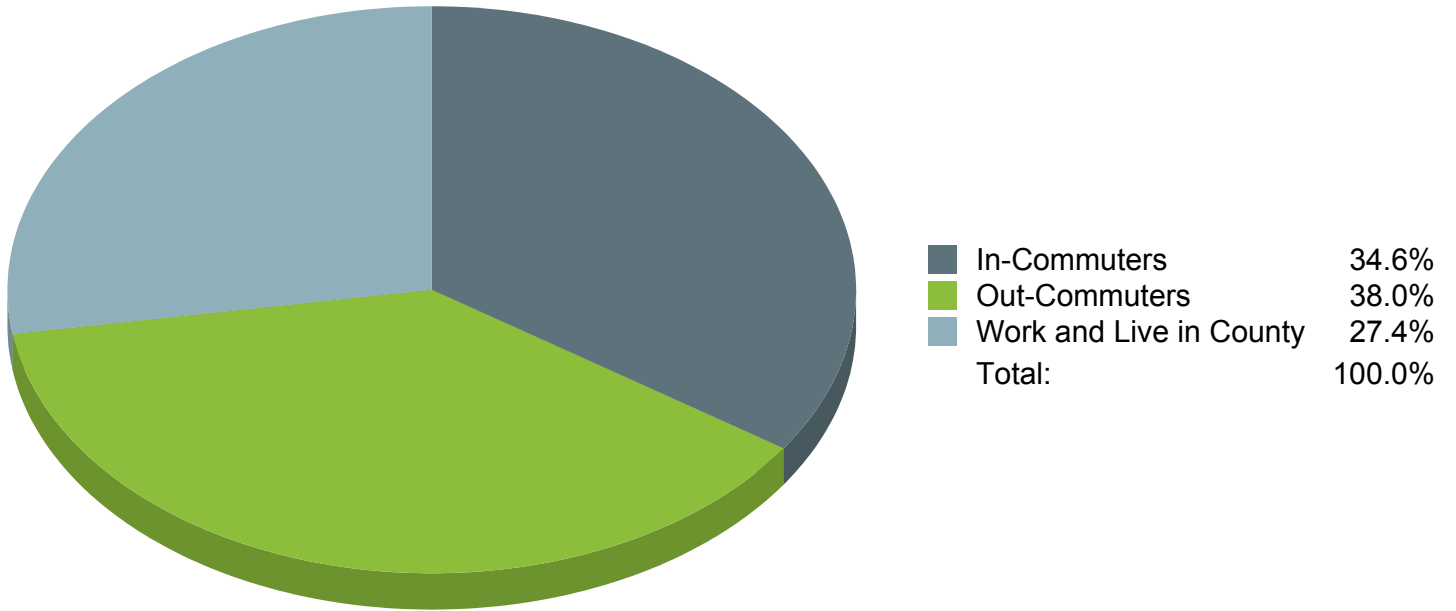

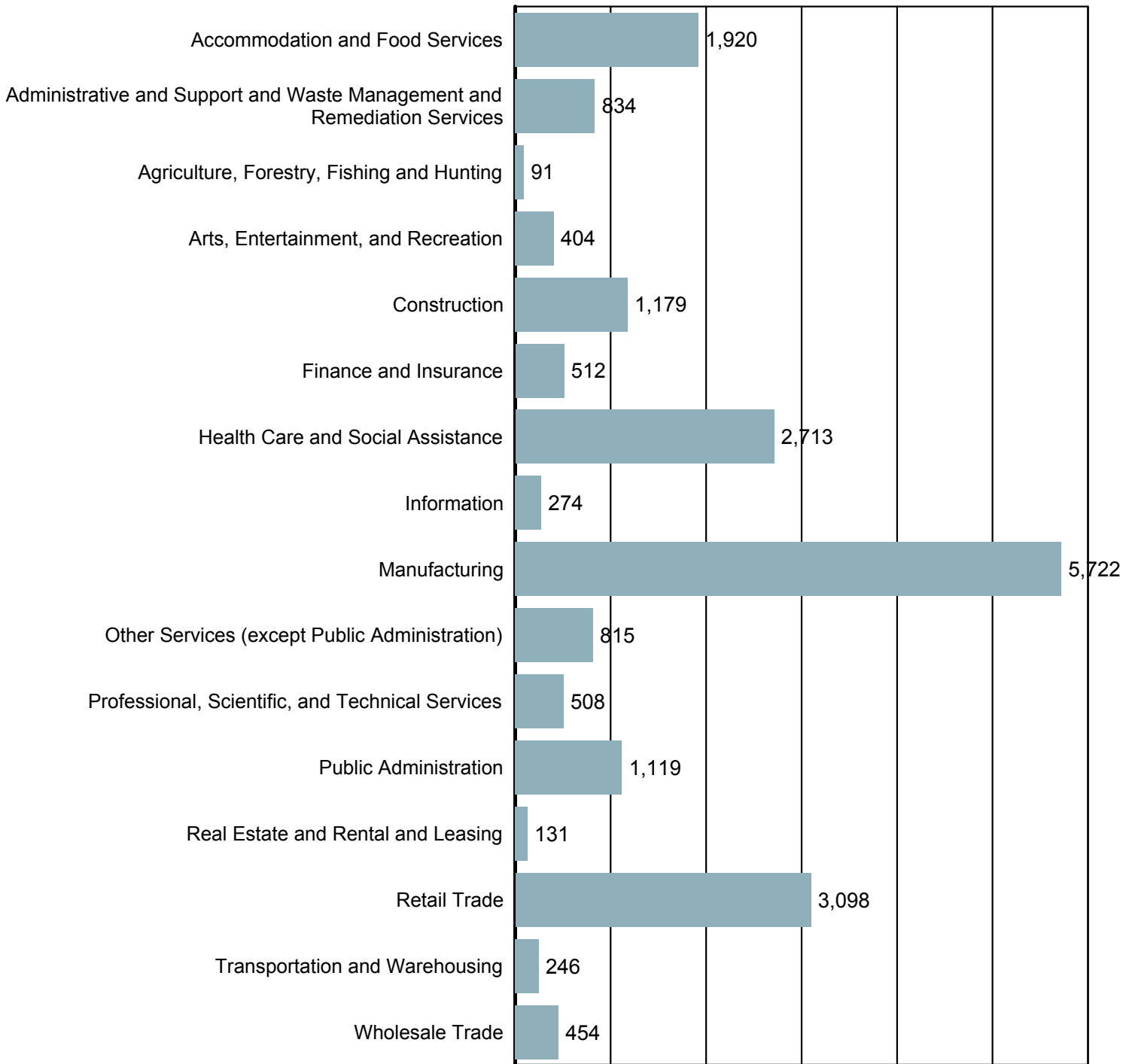

### Employment by Industry

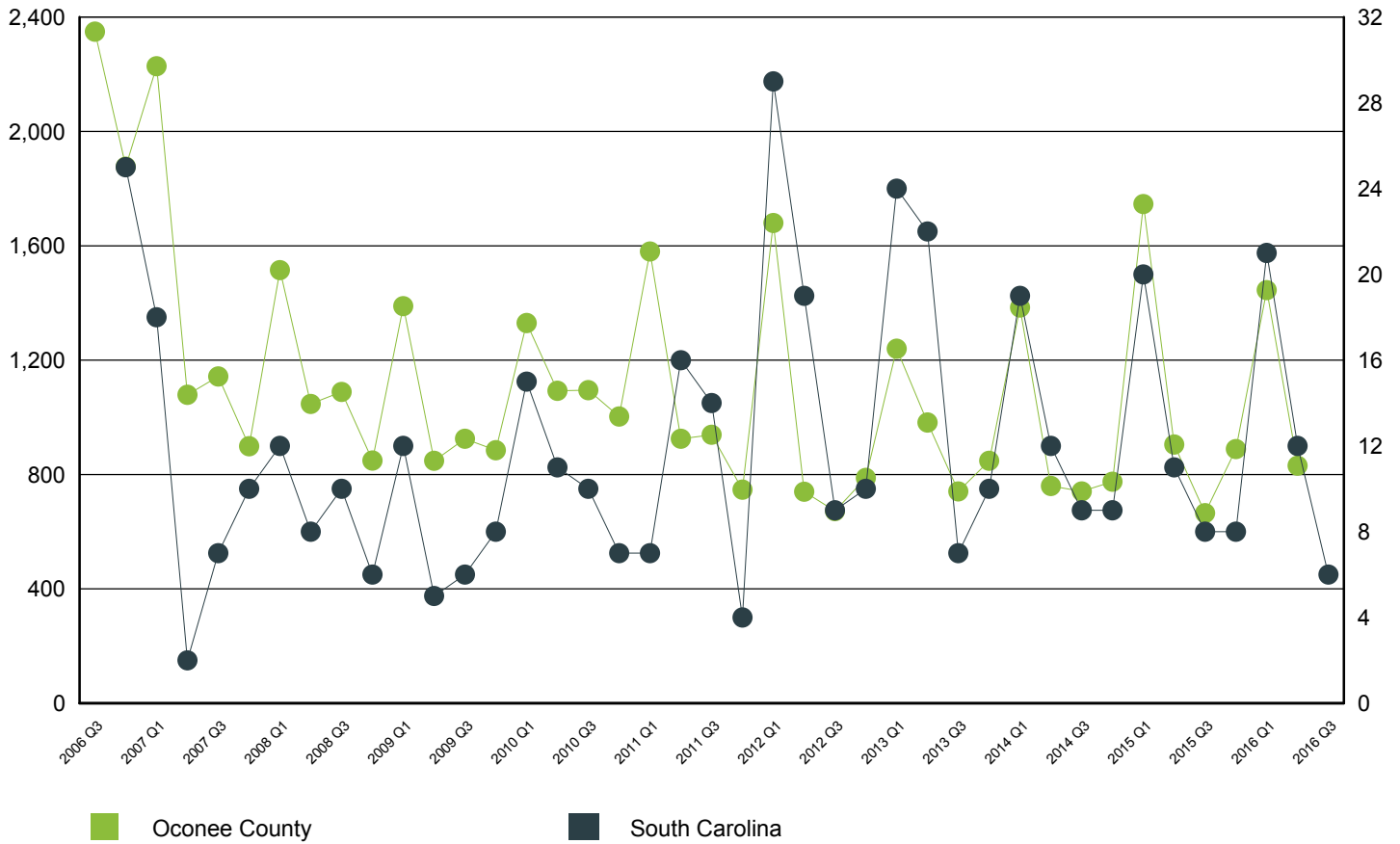

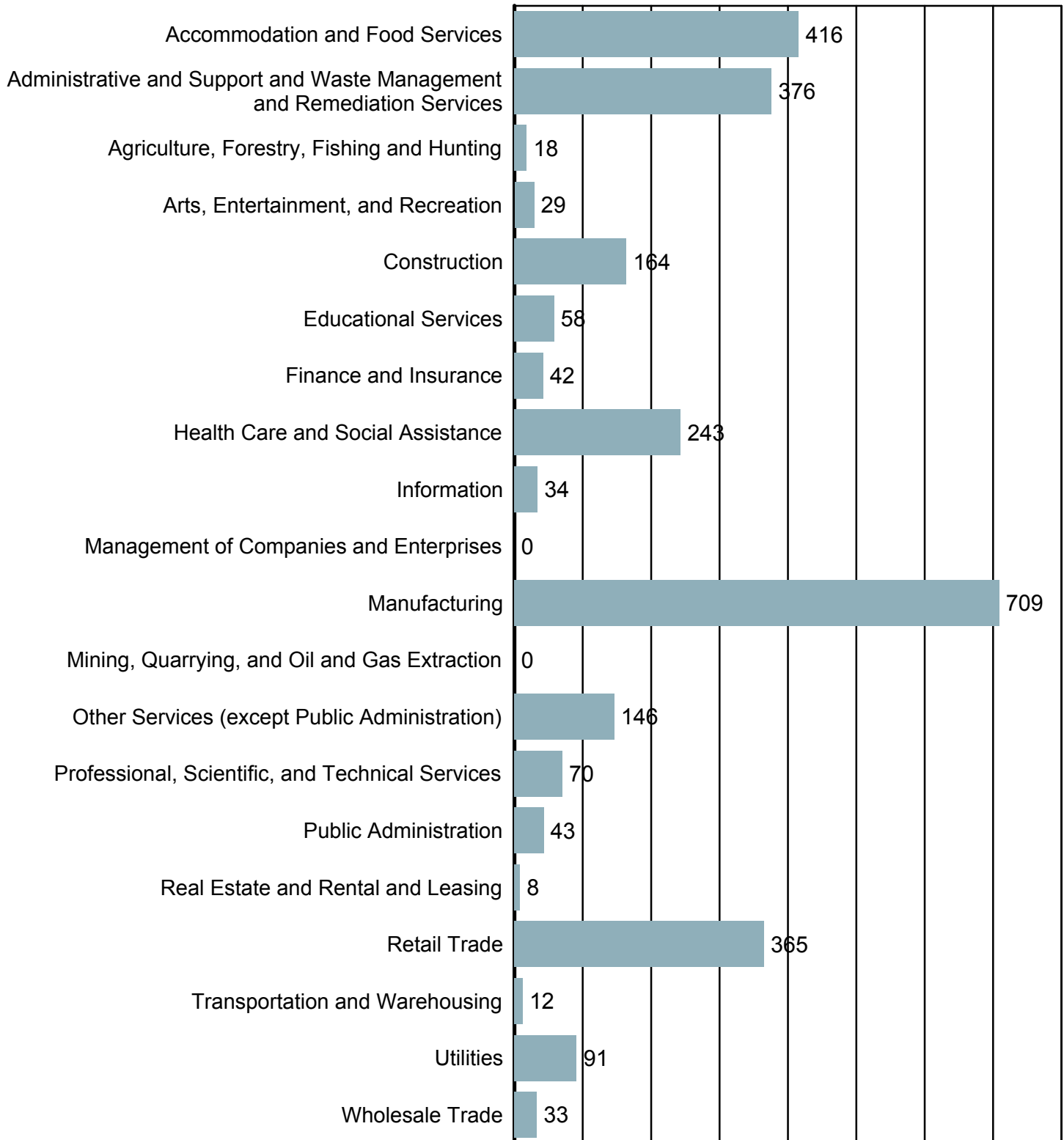

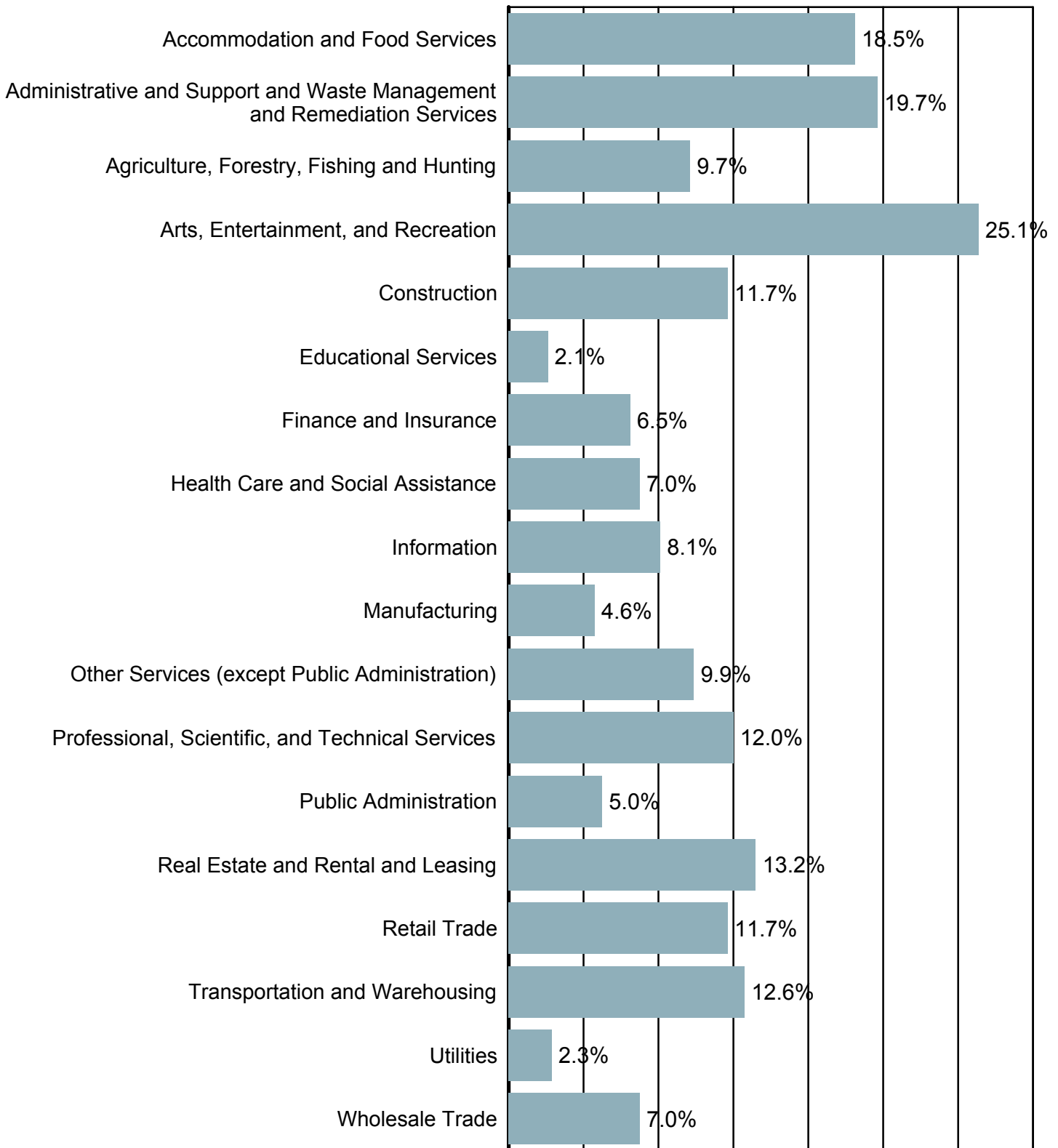

### New Hires by Industry



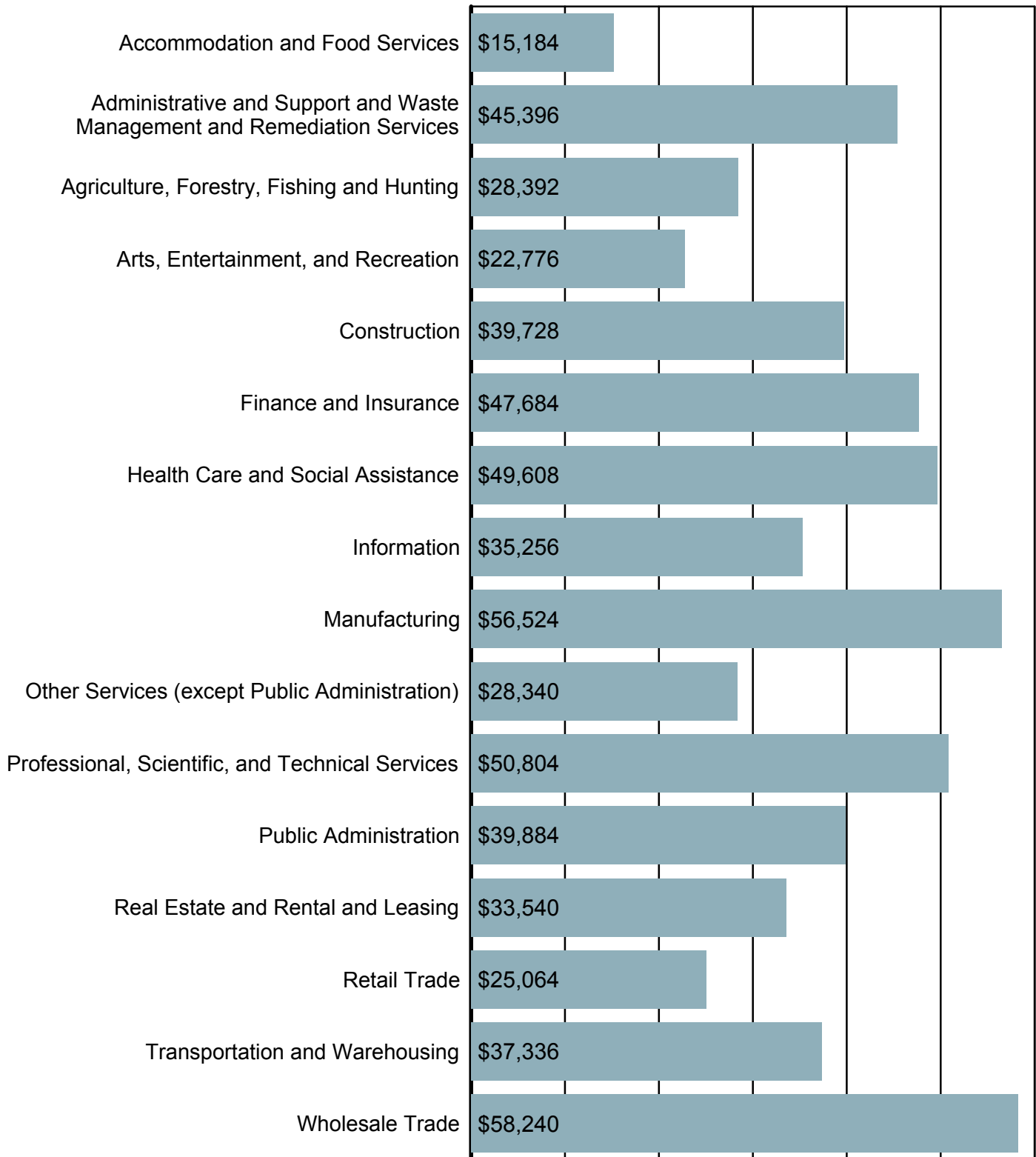

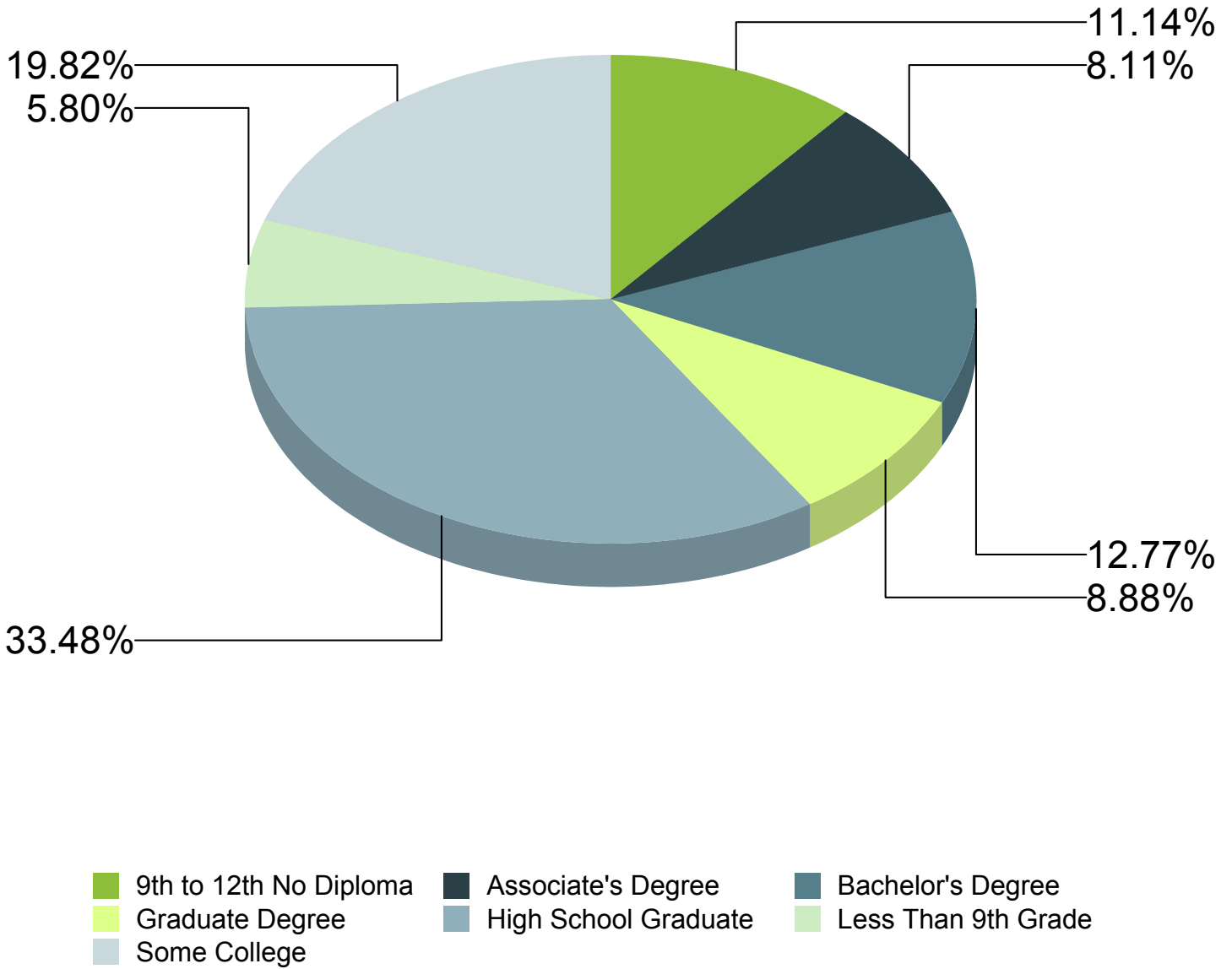
