A Note from the Agency Director

We hope that you are enjoying our newly formatted newsletter and weekly email alert! Our goal is to communicate regularly with you in a manner that works best for the way that you consume information. Libraries are vibrant, transforming places; the redesign was driven by our desire to consistently meet the needs of our users by maximizing technological advances for broader access across multiple types of devices. Basically, we want to stay current and make it easy for you.

At the South Carolina State Library (SCSL) we pride ourselves on evaluation and analysis of information; we are naturally curious as a group. We regularly review our resources to ensure that we are providing the best solution to our users. As we prepared and planned for the coming financial year, we scrutinized the products and programs that we were providing and decided to make a few changes.

We decided to eliminate four resources because the usage of those resources had decreased significantly, the return on

investment being made could not be supported, or the program was at the end of its intended life cycle. However, we also decided to purchase an enhanced version of Tumblebooks, one of our existing SCSL products.

We are particularly excited about this enhanced version of Tumblebooks and the changes to the access structure that it will bring. The access structure change will be particularly helpful for teachers and families who homeschool. The enhanced version of Tumblebooks is considered the premium version which includes: over 1,100 titles; resources for K-6; lesson plans for teachers; animated talking picture books; chapter books; National Geographic videos; both fiction and non-fiction materials; graphic novels; books in English, French, and Spanish; and many other resources.

I have written before about the importance of funding for libraries and library programs. It is never easy to decide that a product must be reduced or eliminated, but ultimately we must make those decisions so that we may provide the broadest possible access to resources that will positively impact the lives of our users. We have confidence that you will enjoy the new version of Tumblebooks along with the other technological advances we have made. Thank you for your ongoing support of libraries!

Just what does a Seed Beetle look like? Are you curious about False Blister Beetles? Are you fascinated by Jewel Beetles? What do you want to know about the larvae of Mayfly? A wealth of information on the subject of coleopterology (the scientific study of beetles) and other topics relating to the biodiversity of South Carolina can be found in the *Biota of South Carolina*, a series of nine volumes issued by Clemson University Public Service Publishing. Books from this series reflect the expertise of the authors and editors, and are also examples of the unique types of publications regularly received by the South Carolina State Library.

As the central State Documents Depository, the South Carolina State

Library receives materials, in print or electronic format, published by state agencies, departments, and state-supported colleges and universities which are intended for public distribution. The State Library also supplies these materials to the eleven other state depository libraries, and to the Library of Congress.

So if you're looking into identifying the dorsal surface of a leaf beetle, interested in a plan put out by the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism in 2008, or want to view *PowerSource*, a quarterly magazine issued by Santee Cooper, visit the library or take a look in our [SLENDS](#) catalog. State Library card holders may check out available items, and searchers will also be directed to digital items or significant web resources.
