




## A Conversation with USC First Lady Patricia Moore Pastides

They showcase the lives and culture of the Gullah Geechee people in communities from Hog Hammock on Sapelo Island, GA to Mosquito Beach on Sol Legare Island, SC. The SCDL provides free access to historic materials, such as photographs, manuscripts, journals, books, oral histories, and objects from more than 40 cultural heritage institutions across the state.
