Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, substance use disorders are a serious and treatable public health problem affecting millions of Americans of all ages, races, and ethnic backgrounds and having huge medical, societal, and economic costs; and

WHEREAS, health care providers throughout South Carolina and the nation are dedicated to furthering the recovery process while educating the public about alcoholism, drug dependence, and treatment issues; and

WHEREAS, just as drug and alcohol problems affect all areas of the community, so too does recovery depend on the cooperation and support of friends, neighbors, community leaders, and health care professionals; and

WHEREAS, with the theme, "Join the Voices for Recovery: Healing Lives, Families, and Communities," the 2005 observance of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month calls attention to the positive impact of treatment and recovery on the residents of the Palmetto State.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark Sanford, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim September 2005 as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to recognize the benefits of substance abuse treatment and recovery and to support community treatment programs.
