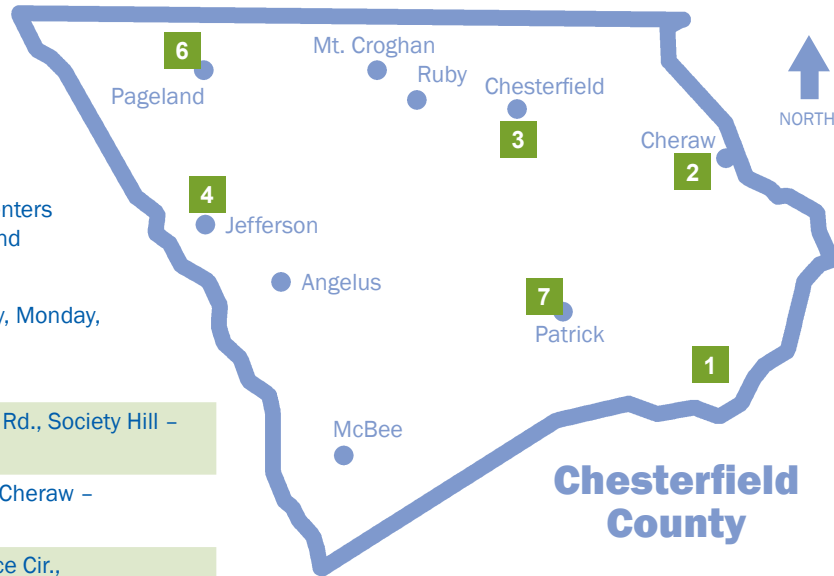


Chesterfield County Recycling Centers

CHESTERFIELD COUNTY RECYCLING CENTERS are for residential use only. The use of these sites for the disposal of commercially generated waste is **ILLEGAL**.

HOURS OF OPERATION: All centers are **OPEN** Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

All centers are **CLOSED** Sunday, Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Why recycle?

TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES

- For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, **nine gallons** of fuel are saved.
- When paper is made from recycled fibers, **58 percent less water is used** – compared to making it from raw materials.

TO SAVE ENERGY

- One aluminum can saves enough energy to power a television set for **one hour**.
- Two gallons of used motor oil has enough energy to power the average home for **24 hours**.

TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE

- It costs tax payers **millions of dollars** to construct new landfills. The less that goes into a landfill, the longer it will last.

Recycling Tips

- **COMPOST!** To learn the basics, please visit www.scdhec.gov/compost.
- **SHOP SMART!** Buy in bulk. Buy only what you need. Think about the packaging when you shop. Is it recyclable?
- **THINK BEFORE YOU THROW.** Reuse items like paper, plastic bags, boxes and packaging materials.

Recycle used motor oil!

The following petroleum products **ARE ACCEPTED** and may be put into any used oil collection tank:

- **Motor oil;**
- **Hydraulic fluid;**
- **Gear oil;**
- **Diesel fuel;**
- **Fuel oil;**
- **Kerosene;**
- **Lamp oil;**
- **Automatic transmission fluid;** and
- **Power steering fluid.**



Used motor oil, oil filters and empty motor oil bottles are frequently disposed of improperly. **1 GALLON** of used motor oil poured on the ground or in a sewer system can contaminate as much as **1 MILLION GALLONS** of water – often the very water we drink.

To make proper disposal easy and convenient, all Chesterfield County Recycling Centers accept used motor oil and oil filters for recycling. The used oil must originate from do-it-yourself oil changers. **NO LARGE** or **BULK-TYPE DISPOSALS** are permitted.

| APPLIANCES, LARGE | Refrigerators, washers, dryers | | All Recycling Centers |
| ALUMINUM | Aluminum beverage cans, clean aluminum baking pans, clean aluminum foil | Rinse. Labels DO NOT need to be removed. | All Recycling Centers |
| BATTERIES (lead-acid only) | Used automotive, marine and lawn mower batteries | Alkaline and nickel-cadmium batteries ARE NOT accepted. | All Recycling Centers |
| CARDBOARD | Corrugated cardboard boxes (no wax finish) and paper bags; NO pizza boxes; NO paperboard boxes (e.g., cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc.) | Flatten. Keep items clean and dry. | All Recycling Centers |
| ELECTRONICS, HOUSEHOLD | Televisions, computers, computer monitors, printers and other electronic equipment | Electronics must be whole. DO NOT disassemble. | All Recycling Centers |
| FARMER OIL | Oil from farm equipment | LIMIT 55 GALLONS PER VISIT. Call (843) 623-2464 or visit www.chesterfieldcountysc.com/Recycling for more details. | ONLY at Patrick Recycling Center and the Chesterfield County Public Works Facility |
| NEWSPAPER | Dry newspapers and other newsprint-type material – Glossy inserts and telephone books ARE NOT accepted at this time. | Keep items clean and dry. | All Recycling Centers |
| OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURES | Motor oil and gasoline mixtures from lawn equipment and recreational vehicles | LIMIT 5 GALLONS PER VISIT. | ONLY at Cheraw, Chesterfield Jefferson and Society Hill Recycling Centers |
| PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS AND JUGS (PET #1) | Soft drink, water, salad dressing and other plastic bottles, jars and jugs marked by a recycling symbol with a number 1 (usually found on the bottom). Plastic flower pots and Styrofoam (although they may have a recycling symbol) ARE NOT accepted at this time. | Rinse. | All Recycling Centers |
| PLASTIC BOTTLES, JARS AND JUGS (HDPE #2) | Milk, juice or other plastic bottles, jars and jugs marked by a recycling symbol with a number 2 (usually found on the bottom). | Rinse. | All Recycling Centers |
| SCRAP METAL | Steel (tin) cans, grills, bicycles, appliances (stoves, washers, dryers, refrigerators, etc.) as well as any other metal item. | Place in the container labeled SCRAP METAL. | All Recycling Centers |
| TIRES | Chesterfield County residents may recycle 10 tires per year at no charge. For additional tires, proof must be provided that the \$2 tire recycling fee was paid. If proof is not available, a fee of \$1 is charged for each car or truck tire. | Tires must be off the rims. | ONLY at Burnsite, Chesterfield, Jefferson and Patrick Recycling Centers |
| USED MOTOR OIL, FILTERS AND BOTTLES | Used motor oil, filters and bottles from cars and other vehicles | Oil must be free of gasoline. LIMIT 5 GALLONS PER VISIT. | All Recycling Centers |

More to Know

- **HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE** must be bagged and must not originate from a commercial, industrial or municipal source.
- **FREE RECYCLING!** There is NO CHARGE to recycle materials accepted in the Chesterfield County program. See the table at the left for more details.
- **BROWN GOODS** consist of household furniture, carpet, wooden swing sets, small quantities of painted lumber and other similar items. The cost for disposal is \$7.50 per half ton pickup load or \$1.50 per individual item (e.g., chair, mattress, etc.).

Open burning is ILLEGAL!

Open burning is the burning of any material in an open fire or an outdoor container. Smoke from open burning pollutes the air and causes health problems for children and adults. These problems can be worse for people with lung problems.

In South Carolina, **IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO BURN:** household garbage and trash; paper, motor and waste heating oils; roofing materials such as shingles and tar; tires and other rubber products; building materials; plastics; paints; household cleaners; farm chemicals; electrical wire; and insulation and duct work. South Carolina and local governments have laws to limit open burning.
