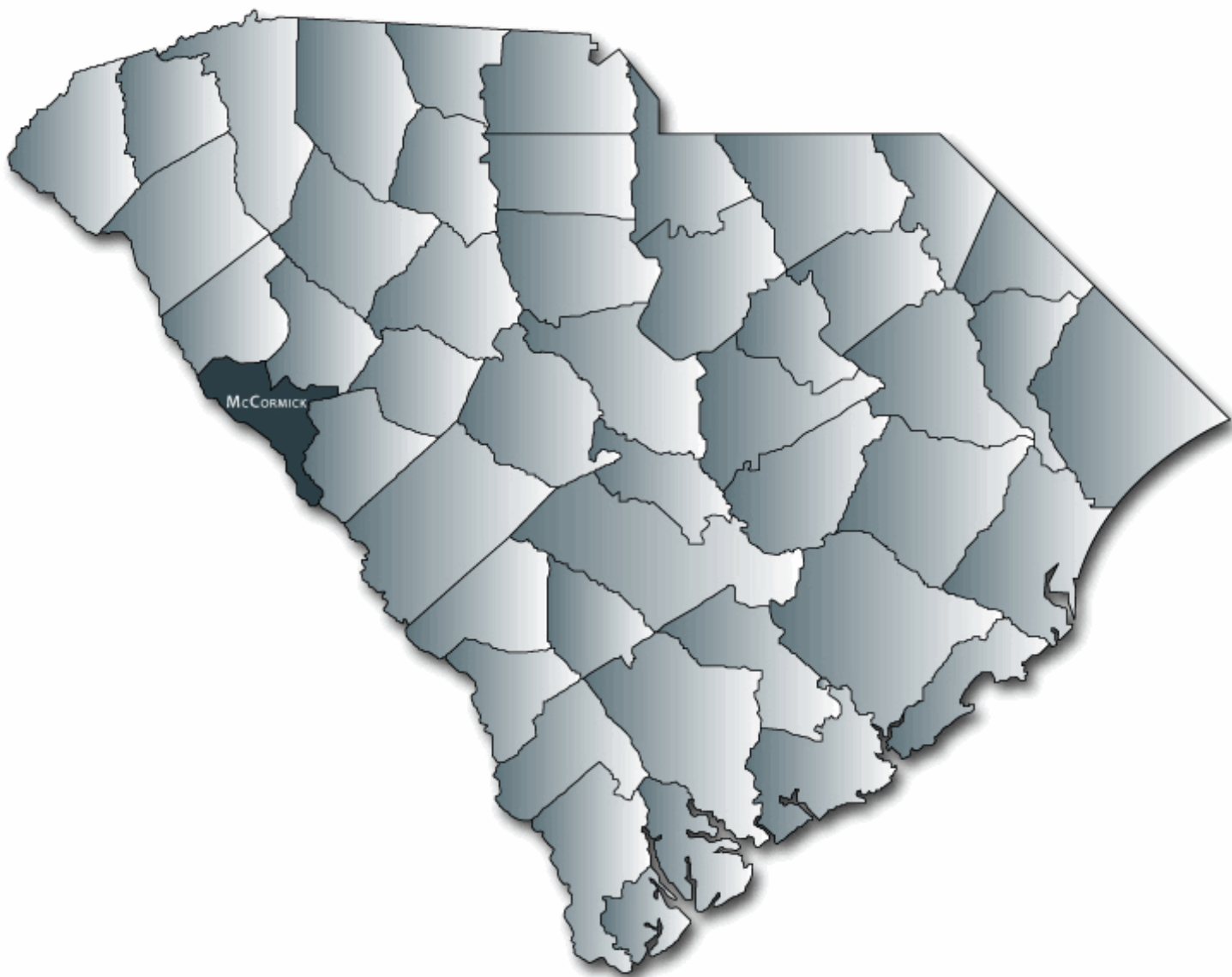

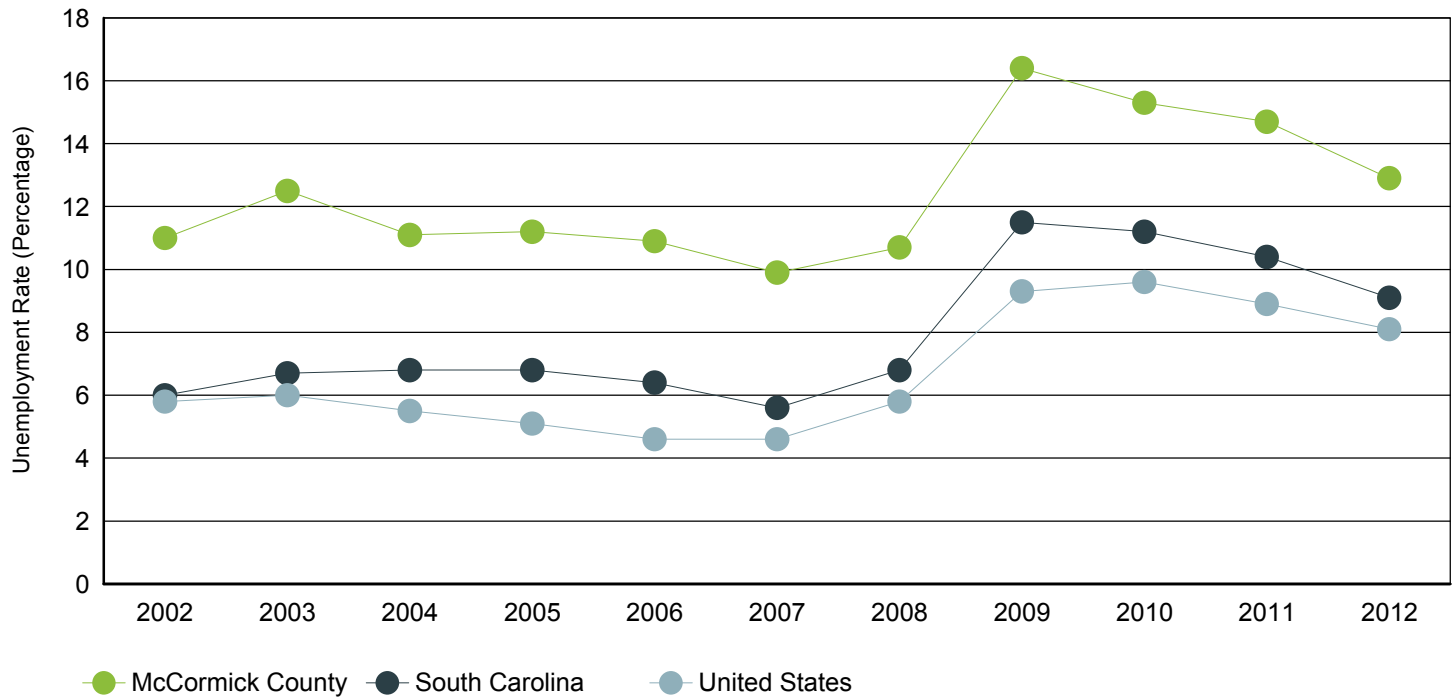

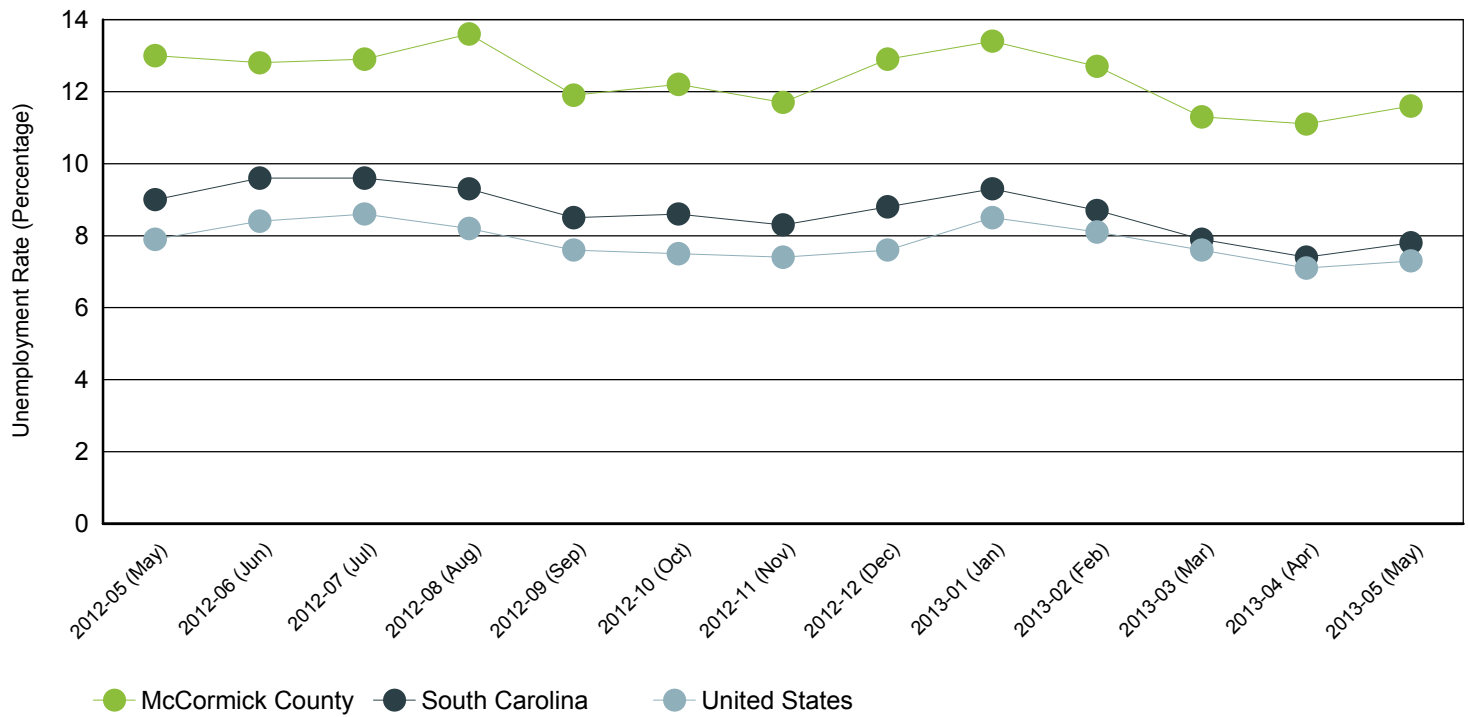

Past 13 Months



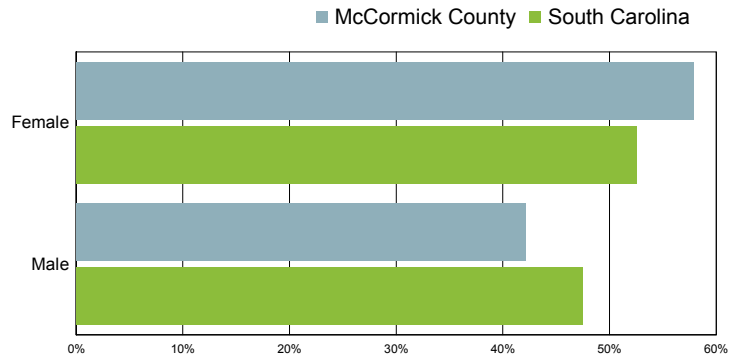

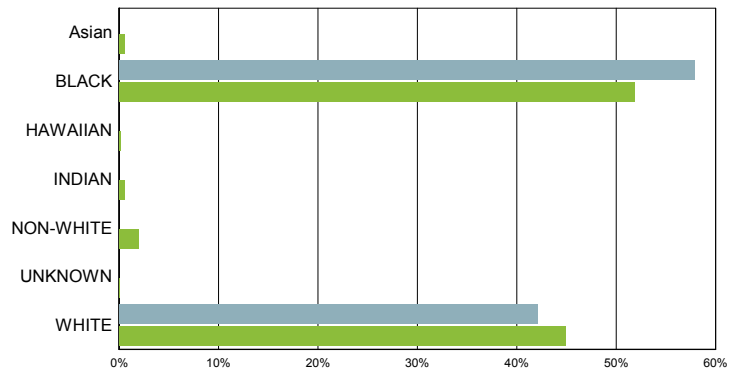

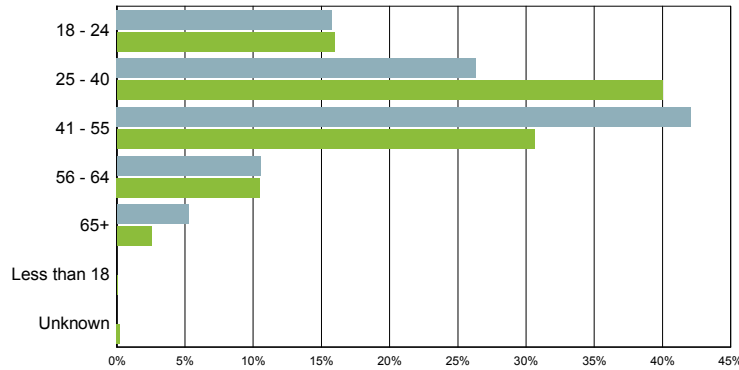

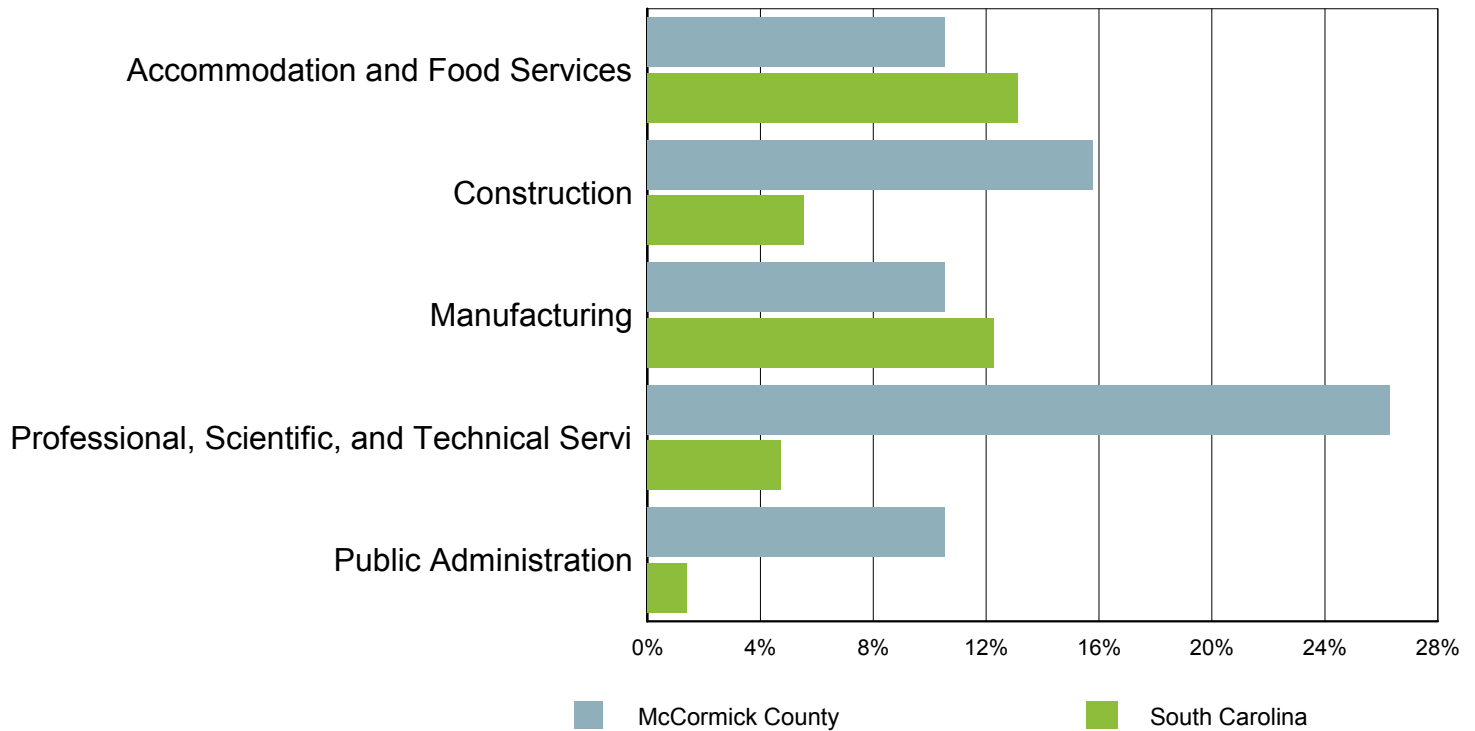

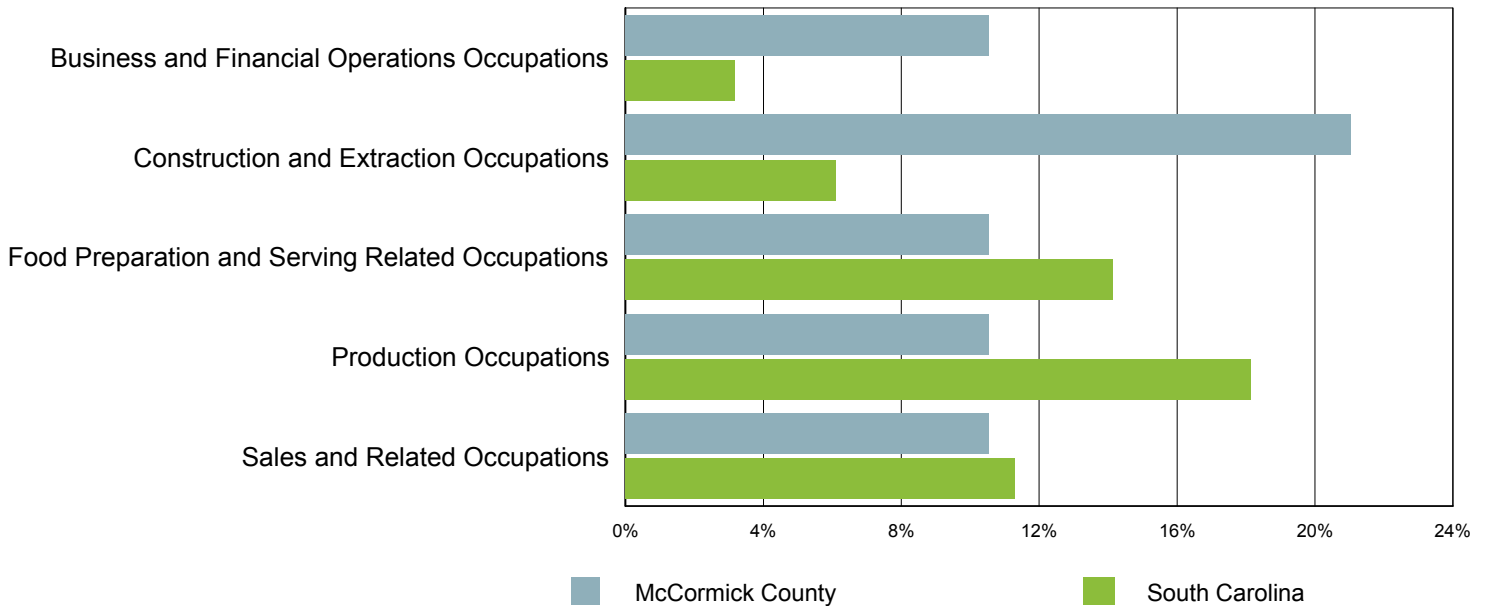

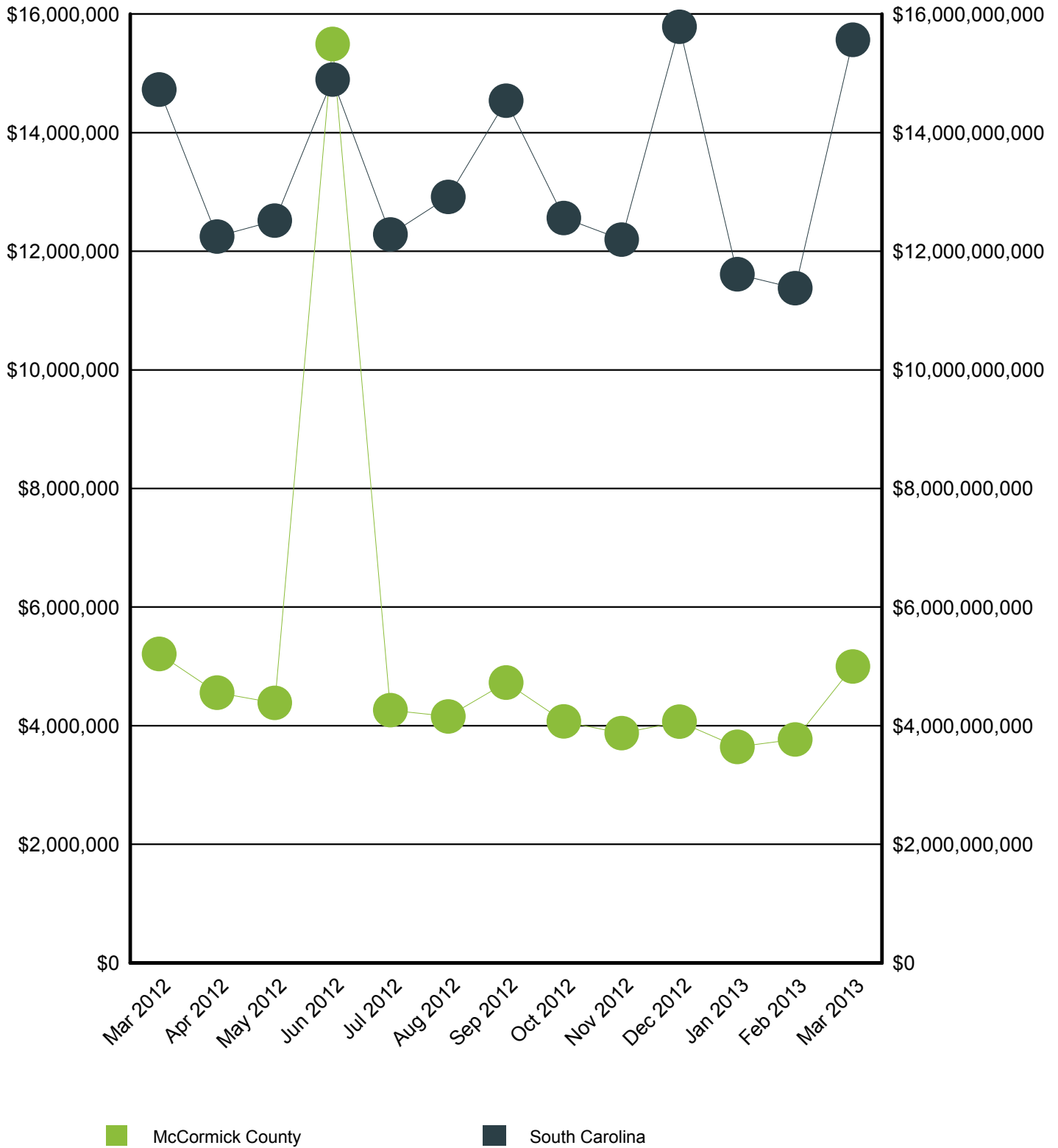

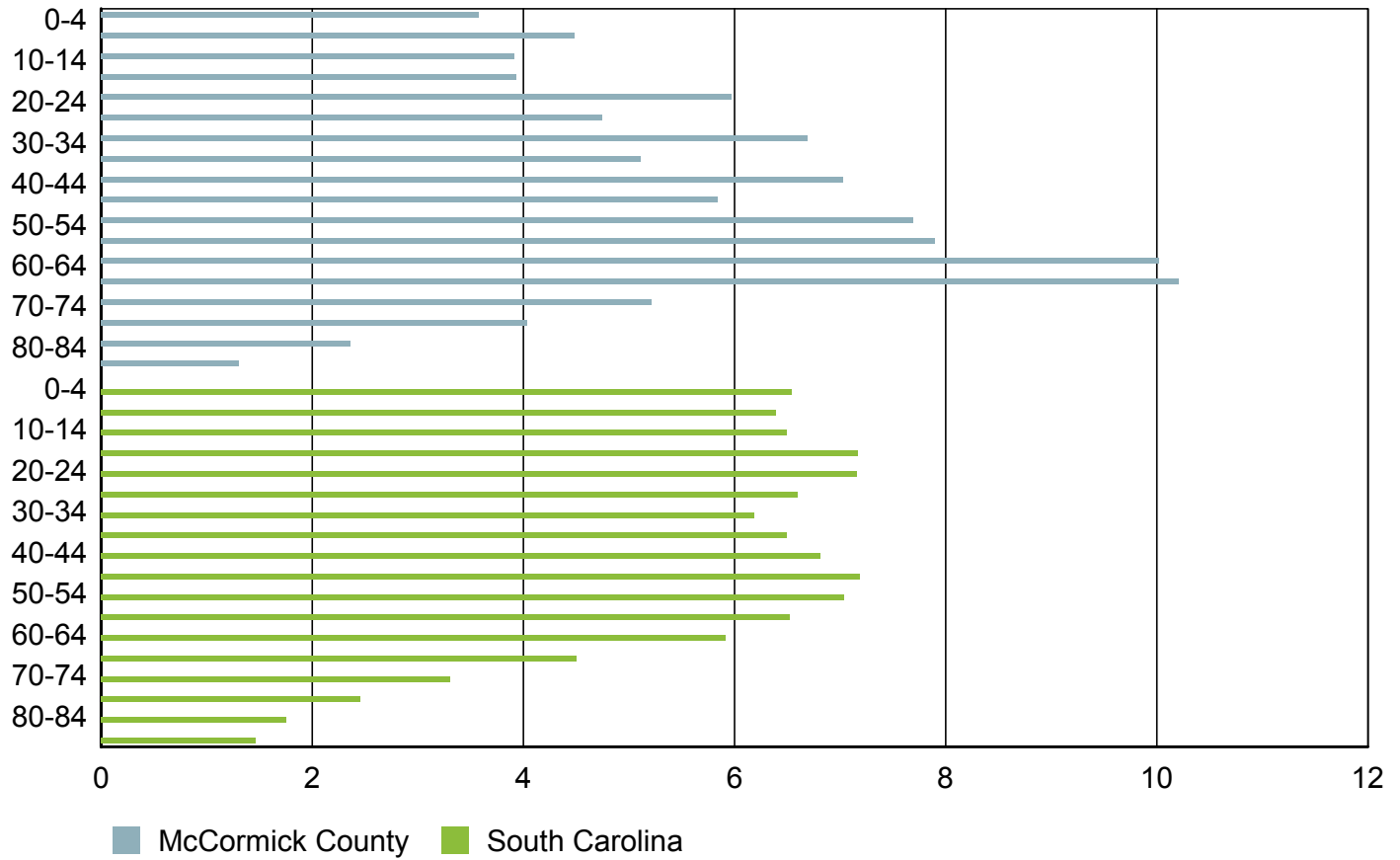

Population by Age



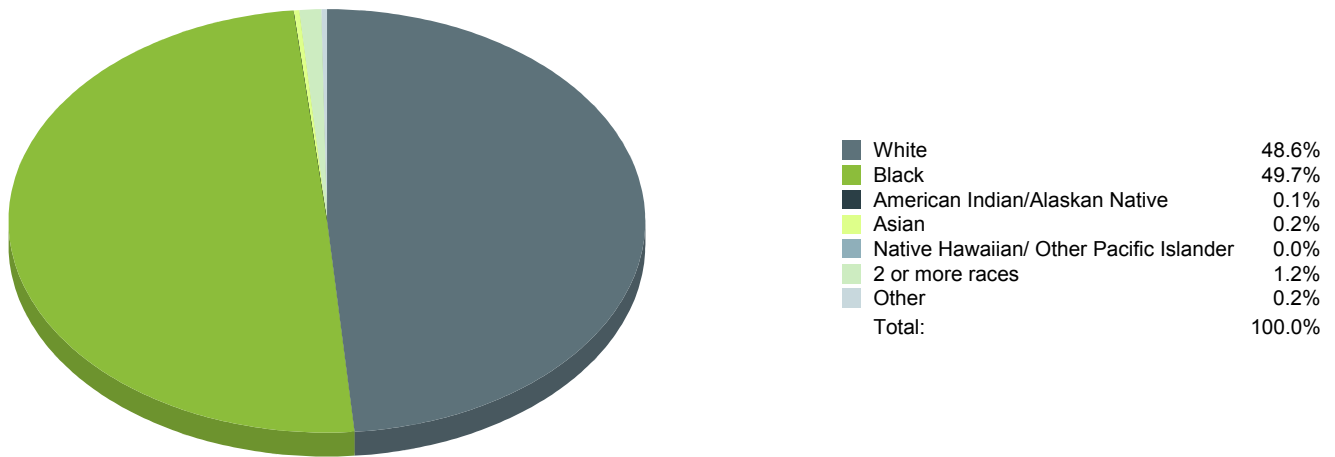

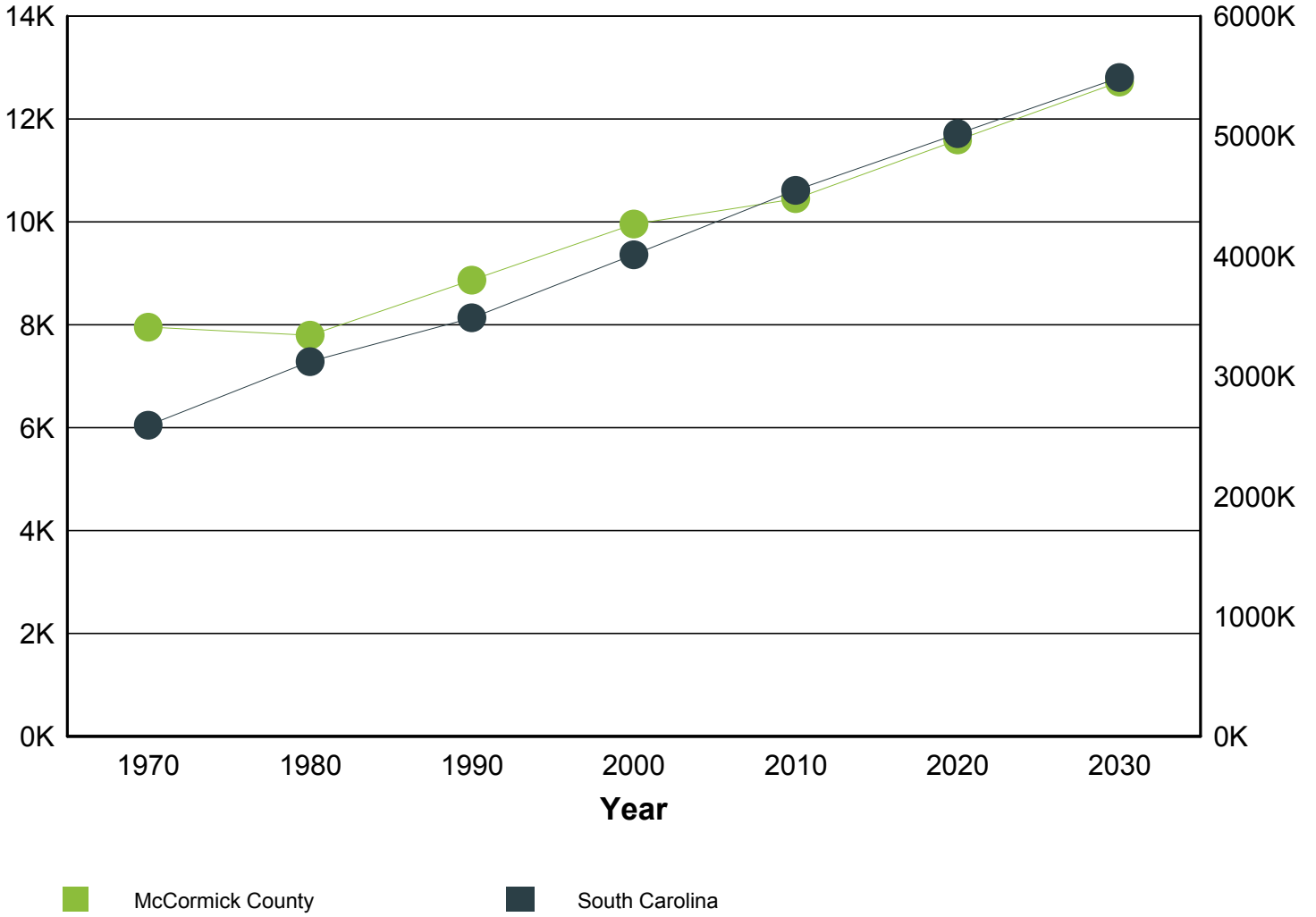

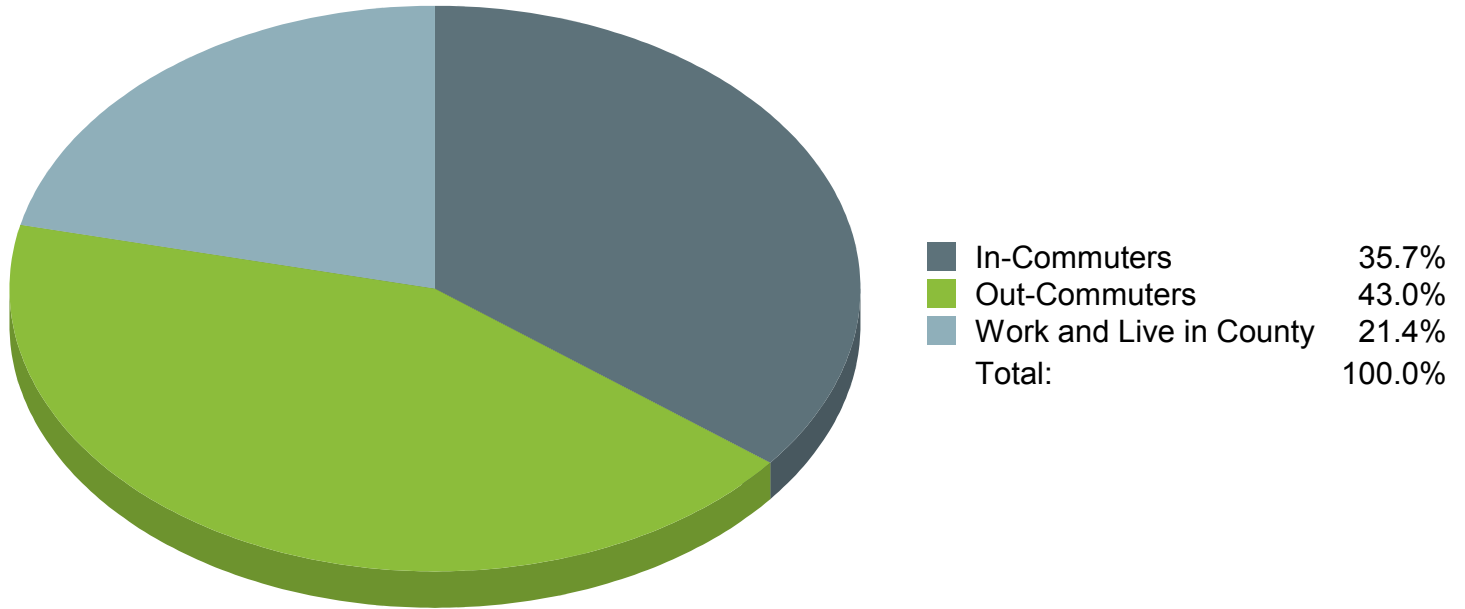

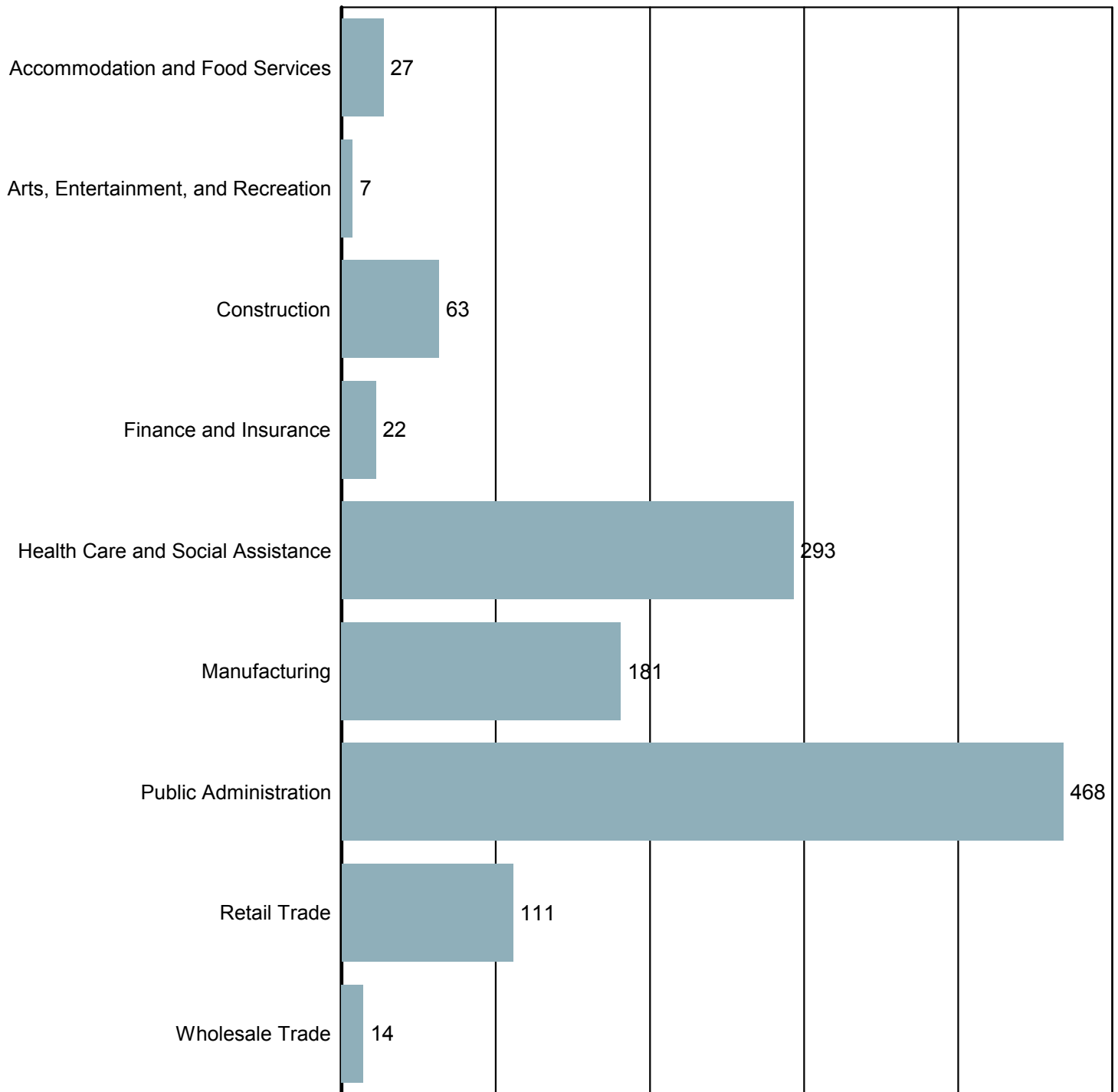

Employment by Industry

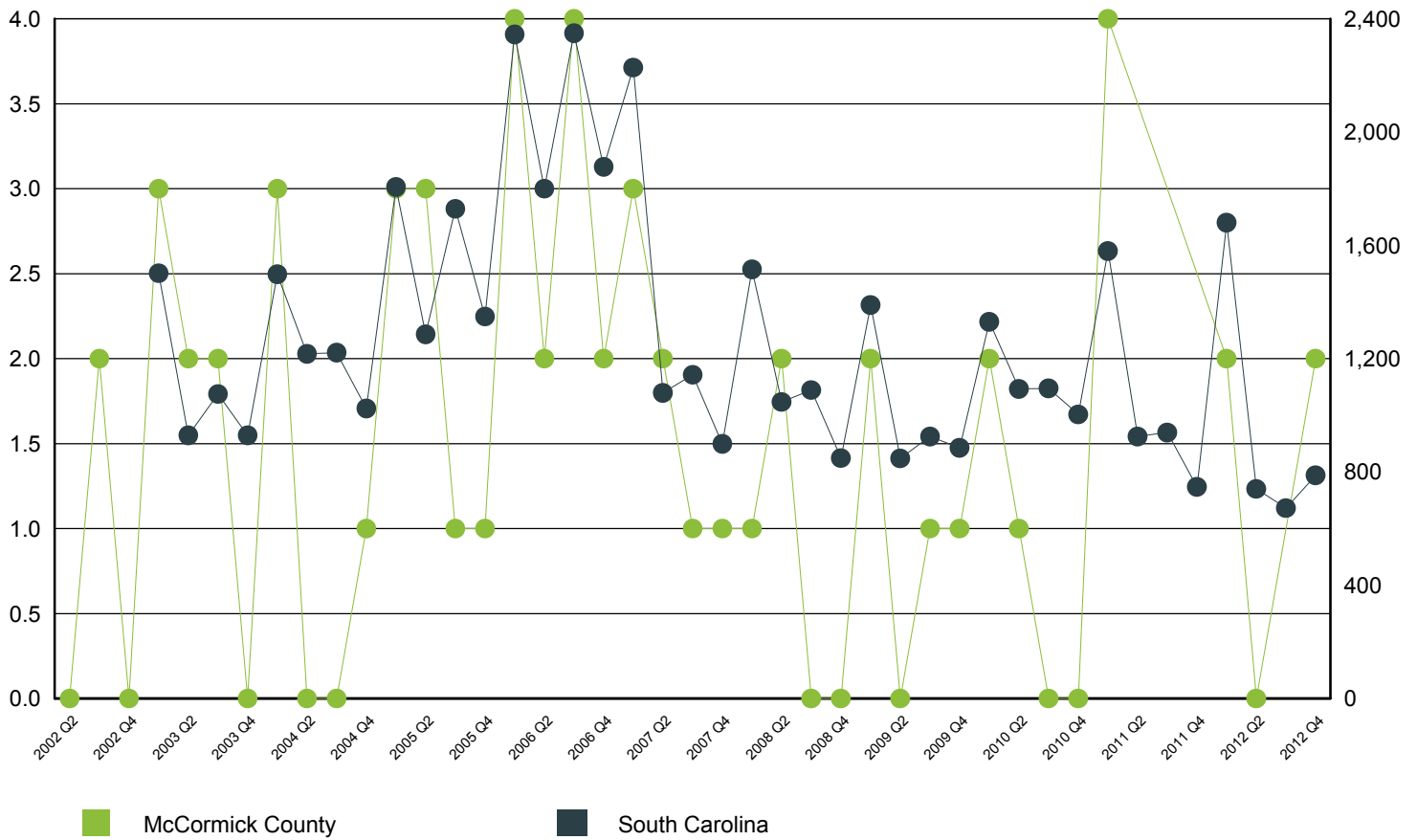

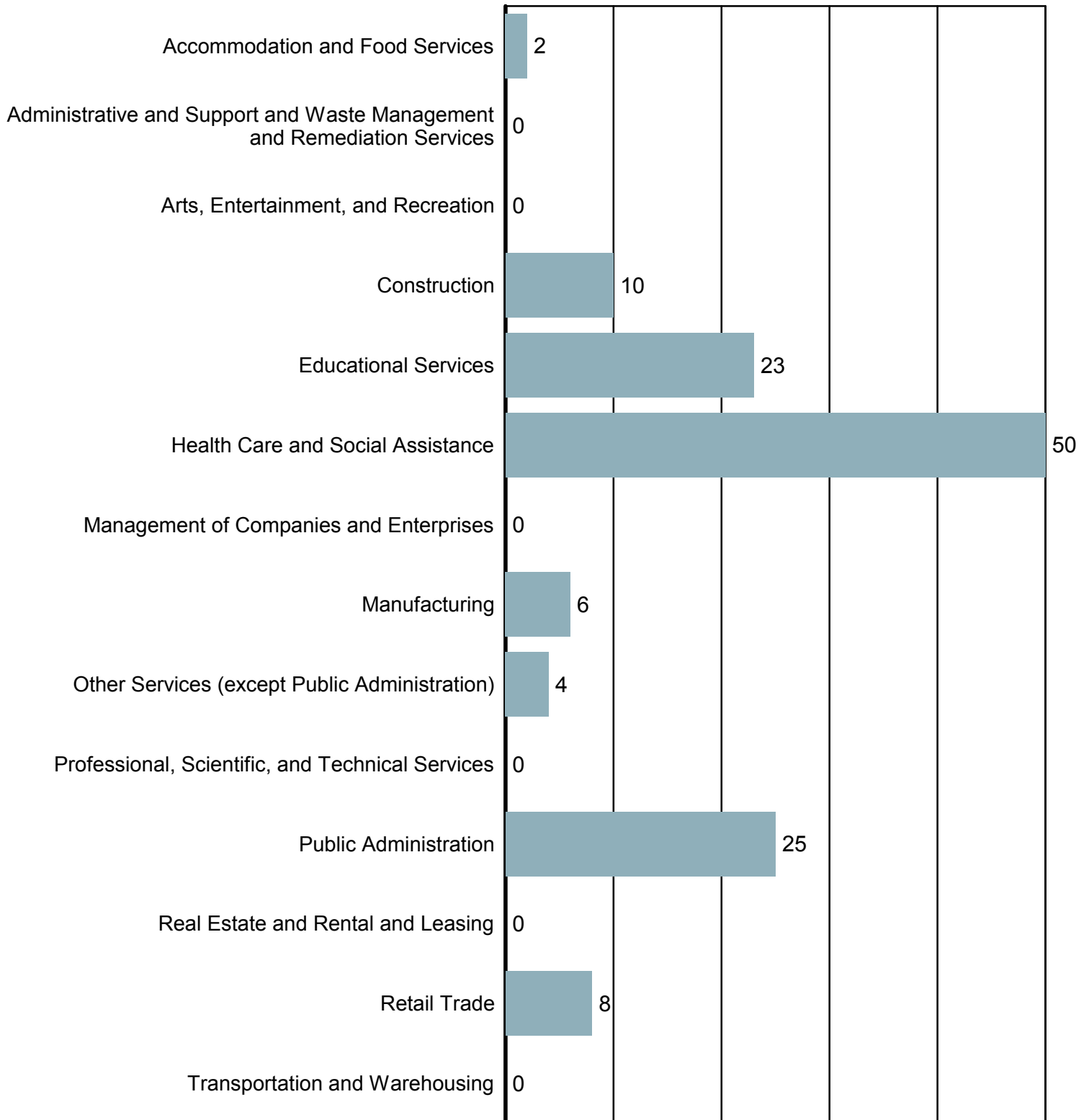

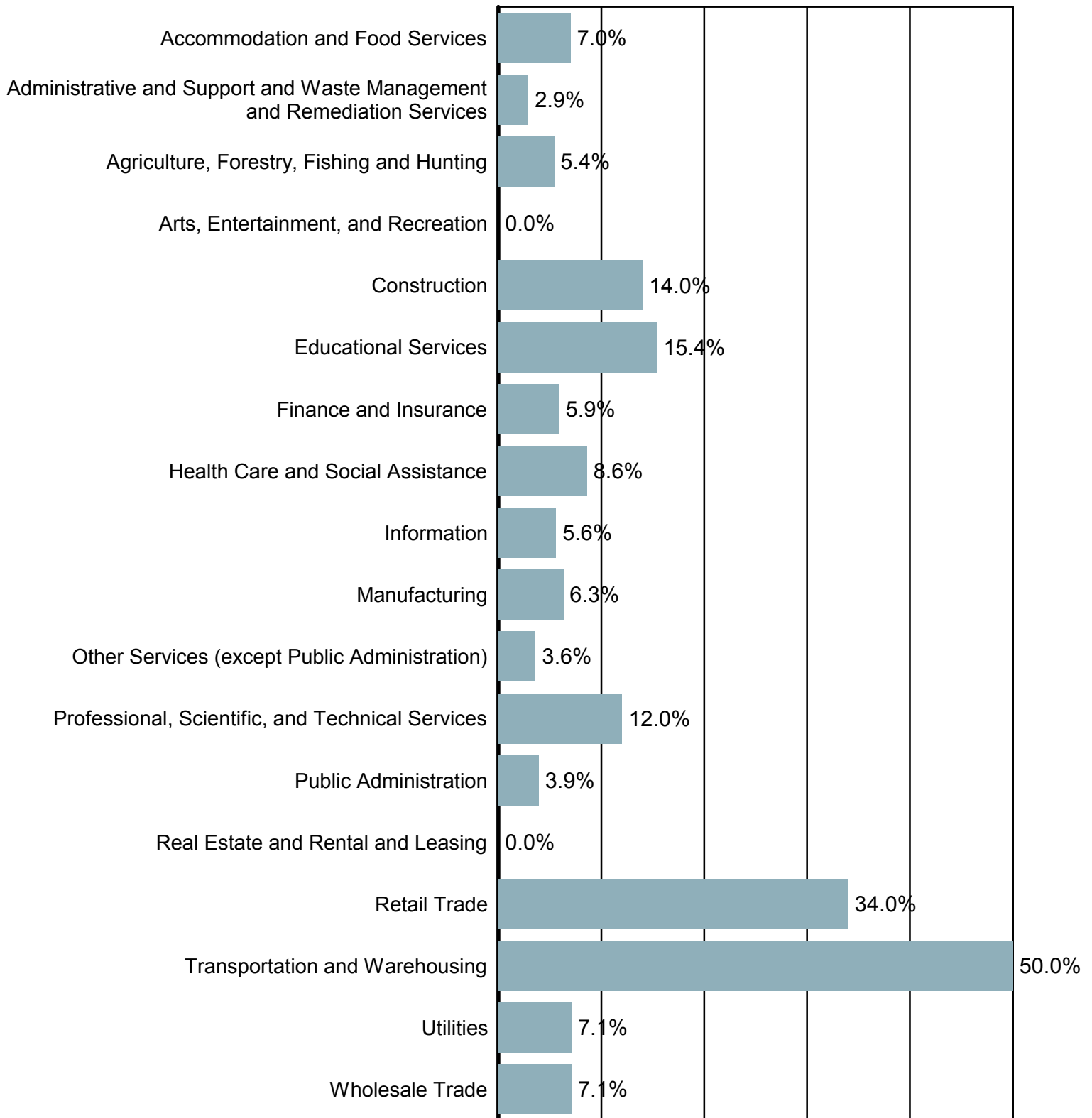

New Hires by Industry



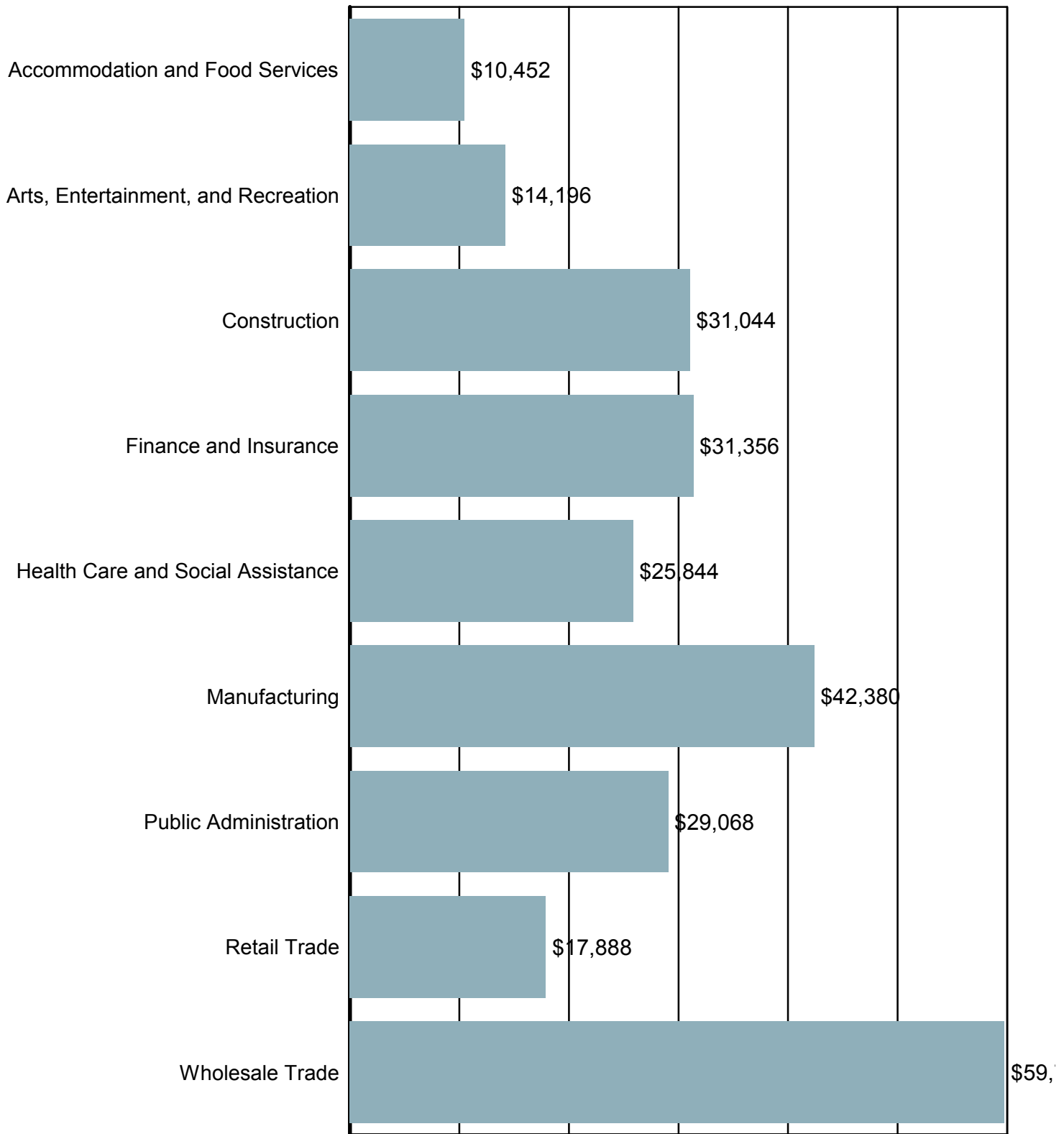

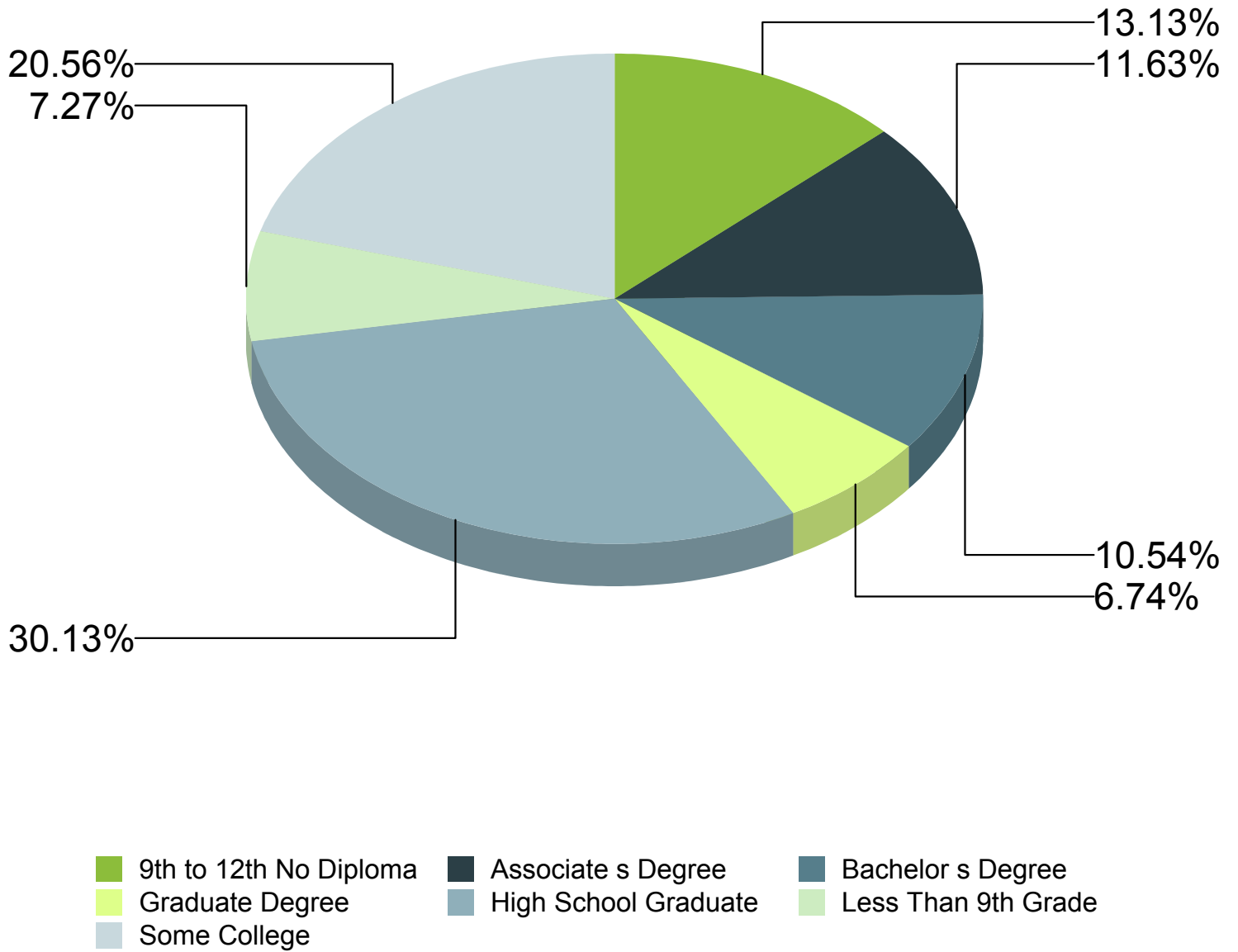
