

2005 Results of the ACT Assessment

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Colleges and universities use tests such as the ACT or the SAT, along with other information, to make admissions decisions. This report reviews the results of the ACT Assessment for South Carolina and for the nation for 2005.

The ACT includes four tests that measure academic achievement in the areas of English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. Each requires between 35 and 60 minutes for a total testing time of 2 hours, 55 minutes. Results are reported for all four tests and for a composite score. The score scale for each ACT subject area, as well as the composite score, is from 1 to 36.

The average composite score of the 1,186,251 students in the nation who graduated in 2005 and had taken the ACT during their sophomore, junior, or senior years was 20.9. In South Carolina, the average composite score of the 13,867 students who graduated in 2005 and had taken the ACT during their sophomore, junior, or senior years was 19.4. In South Carolina 535 more scores were reported for ACT test-takers than in the previous year (13,867 in 2005 and 13,332 in 2004). The number of ACT test-takers in the nation increased by 14, 791 from the previous year (1,186,251 in 2005 and 1,171,460 in 2004).

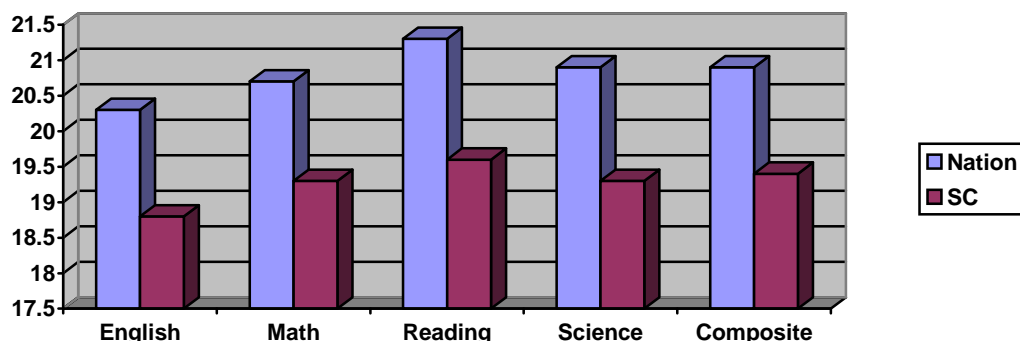
Scores in South Carolina generally remain below the benchmark scores that, according to ACT, Inc.'s "National Score Report" for 2005, indicate adequate preparation for typical college courses. According to that report, the typical cut-off scores indicating that a student has at least a 50 percent chance of obtaining a "B" in such college courses are 18 for English composition, 24 for college biology, 22 for college algebra, and 21 for reading in college social sciences courses. ACT reports that, among South Carolina (SC) test-takers, 57 percent scored 18 in English; 16 percent scored 24 in science; 28 percent scored 22 in math; and 40 percent scored 21 in reading. Students who do not meet the college-ready benchmark scores above "are less likely to stay in school and earn their degrees," according to ACT's "National Score Report."

The table below gives average scores for South Carolina and the nation by subject area and by composite. South Carolina's average composite score for 2005 was 19.4, a tenth of a point higher than the previous year's composite score.

The table below presents 2005 ACT data by gender. In South Carolina, for composite scores, females scored higher than males, while the reverse was true for the nation. In both South Carolina and the nation, female students scored higher on English and reading, and male students scored higher on math and science reasoning.

The table below presents 2005 ACT data by ethnicity/race for South Carolina and the nation. For all tests and the composite, the average scores for white students were higher than those for African American students. For the nation, scores of African American students fell in each subject area and the composite by a tenth of a point, while, for South Carolina, scores of African American students remained at prior-year levels.

ACT reports average scores for students taking the "core or more" and taking "less than core." ACT defines this coursework in the "ACT High School Profile Report" for 2005 as follows:

Core or More

A core or more program is defined as a typical college preparatory program including the following:

•**English:** four years or more with one year of credit each for English 9, English 10, English 11, English 12;

•**Mathematics:** three years or more with one year of credit each for Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry and one-half year of credit each for Trigonometry, Calculus (not Pre-Calculus), other math courses beyond Algebra II, and Computer Math/Computer Science;

•**Social Sciences:** three years or more with one year of credit each for American History, World History, and American Government and one-half year of credit each for Economics, Geography, Psychology, and other history; and

•**Natural Sciences:** three years or more with one year of credit each for General/Physical/Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics.

Less than Core

A less-than-core program refers to any high school program consisting of fewer courses than those included in "core or more."

The average ACT scores in English, mathematics, reading, science reasoning, and the composite for 2005 students who completed or planned to complete a core curriculum ("Core or More") and for those who did not ("Less than Core") are shown for South Carolina and the nation and for South Carolina by ethnicity in the following two tables. Students who completed or planned to complete core coursework had higher average scores than students who did not, and white students had higher average scores than African American students. White students who did not complete or plan to complete core coursework had higher average scores than African American students who did complete or plan to complete core coursework. (Scores are not reported for "Other" ethnic groups because ACT, Inc. does not report scores for groups in which there are fewer than 100 total graduates.) "E" is English, "M" is Mathematics, "R" is Reading, "SR" is Science Reasoning, and "C" is Composite.
