NEVER THROW THESE 12 ITEMS IN YOUR RECYCLING BIN

 <p>1</p> <p>PLASTIC BAGS</p> <p>Reuse, recycle at the grocery store or give to food banks.</p>	 <p>2</p> <p>BAGGED ITEMS</p> <p>Don't bag recycled items. Keep loose in the bin.</p>	 <p>3</p> <p>FOOD & LIQUIDS</p> <p>Empty and rinse containers that can be recycled.</p>	 <p>4</p> <p>ROPE-LIKE ITEMS</p> <p>Hoses, wire and string lights jam sorting equipment.</p>
 <p>5</p> <p>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS</p> <p>Check local program options or dispose properly.</p>	 <p>6</p> <p>FLATTENED CANS & BOTTLES</p> <p>Keep the original shape to prevent sorting jams.</p>	 <p>7</p> <p>NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTIC</p> <p>See what type of plastic is accepted in your program first.</p>	 <p>8</p> <p>SHREDDED PAPER</p> <p>It can become litter or jam recycling facility equipment.</p>
 <p>9</p> <p>SCRAP METAL</p> <p>Some metal damages machinery. Most drop-off sites will accept.</p>	 <p>10</p> <p>NON-RECYCLABLE GLASS</p> <p>Don't place dishes, bulbs, mirrors or windows in the bin.</p>	 <p>11</p> <p>CAPS ON GLASS BOTTLES</p> <p>Remove and discard caps before recycling.</p>	 <p>12</p> <p>BIO-HAZARDOUS WASTE</p> <p>Syringes, diapers and similar items can harm workers.</p>
