WHEREAS, tragically, a disregard for human rights continues to result in a denial of fundamental freedoms for individuals in many regions of the world; and

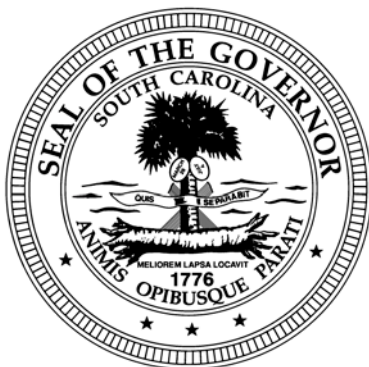
