Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, acquired immunodeficiency syndrome or AIDS is a major worldwide epidemic caused by the human immunodeficiency virus, (HIV), which progressively destroys the body's ability to fight infections and certain cancers by killing or damaging cells of the body's immune system; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 39 million people worldwide are currently living with HIV/AIDS, with women increasingly at risk and young people under the age of 25 accounting for more than half of all new infections; and

WHEREAS, at the end of 2004, South Carolina ranked 10th in the nation for the rate of newly diagnosed cases of AIDS; and

WHEREAS, the 2006 observance of "World AIDS Day" provides an opportunity for people in South Carolina and around the world to join together to support the individuals, families, and communities affected by this disease and to renew our commitment to addressing the threat AIDS poses to our well-being and quality of life.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark Sanford, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim December 1, 2006, as

WORLD AIDS DAY

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to learn more about HIV and AIDS and to work together to raise awareness of the threat, treatment and prevention of AIDS among the residents of the Palmetto State.
