and the search could be made without great loss of time, this informa-
tion has been supplemented with details obtained by an examination of
the publications themselves. It is hardly to be hoped, however, that
the list is either complete or entirely accurate. An appendix is
therefore provided for titles omitted and corrections of errors made
in previous issues of the Checklist.

The publications have been listed alphabetically according to the
names of the publishing agency, the name in each case being that which
appears in the publication. If available, the following additional
data have been given for each item: short title; name of personal
author, or editor, if any; volume and number, if a serial; date of

publication; nature of the print (whether letterpress or processed); number of pages; and price, if any. If the price could not be obtained, this fact is indicated by a question mark.

Orders for the publications of the General Assembly and for the Acts should be addressed to the State Library. The other publications are distributed by the publishing agencies. In general, those for which no price is indicated are free; but in most cases the number of copies is limited. The state agencies are therefore seldom able to supply copies in large quantities.
