Healthy Hannah's Healthy Choice Heroes is an exciting educational series of very short programs designed to assist students in making healthy living choices. Ten programs were produced for March 2011 and ten more now join the lineup. The new set of ten programs is integrated into the first group and this is the order recommended for use by K–6 grade students.

Healthy Hannah is a superhero-like character that communicates with and guides two students through a variety of real-life everyday scenarios and missions that facilitate them learning how to make healthy choices and the concepts behind those choices. This fun and fast-paced series is designed to educate children in grades K–6 about nutrition and physical activity based on the Dietary Guidelines and MyPyramid.

The short programs, between 2 and 3 minutes each, are designed to be used in the morning news program and incorporated into lesson plans or to be used with lesson plans that have been developed for each short program (will be posted online with programs). The programs combined with their respective lesson plans meet the South Carolina Academic Standards for Health and Safety Education for grades K–6. Produced by ETV, working with the SC Department of Education and DHEC, this series is also posted in *StreamlineSC*.

A NEW program on Revolutionary War heroine fourteen-year-old Dickey Langston, a young South Carolina girl who risked danger to help the Patriot cause, airs for the first time in February and will be posted online in *StreamlineSC*. It is a tale of courage, sacrifice, and determination. Directed by ETV's Pat Henry, this special program has two parts that highlight the true story of one of the young heroines featured in Idella Bodie's book *SC Women*. The Battle of Eutaw Springs in Orangeburg County took place in 1781 and was important in the Patriot's cause in the Revolutionary War. This special program was created by eMedia to support the 2011 Social Studies Academic Standards since the battle is now included in what students should study. Please alert your social studies teachers to this new offering that focuses on Francis Marion and this important battle fought in the Revolutionary War on our South Carolina soil.

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2011–12

Jan. 19 at 1:00 p.m. on ETV – The War of 1812 (Premiere)

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. - Jan. 19, 2012 ***The War of 1812 (premiere)*** – A generation after the Revolution, Americans once again plunged into war with Great Britain. Why? Join Henry Clay, Tecumseh, Andrew Jackson, James Madison, and others as they struggle to determine what course the United States will take.
- Feb. 16, 2012 ***When Freedom Came (premiere)*** – Everyone knows Abraham Lincoln freed all the slaves or did he? Freedom came to enslaved people over the course of many months and years – and it arrived in different ways in different places. Discover how enslaved Americans made everyday choices during the Civil War that helped bring about their freedom.
- Mar. 15, 2012 ***Remember the Ladies*** – In 1776, Abigail Adams requested that her husband, future president John Adams, “remember the ladies” when establishing the government and the laws of the new nation. Examine the roles, responsibilities and daily activities of early American women.
- Apr. 19, 2012 ***The Rights of Youth*** – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the 18th century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.

***RIGHTS: SC schools may view with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but program must be used within ten days and erased/destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that get a scholarship through eMedia OR pay CWEFT to participate can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape/DVD, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.**

IMPORTANT: Block Feeds of Series with “Limited” Rights

The following series have “limited broadcast/off-air record rights and no duplication rights,” which means that eMedia is limited to the number of times we can broadcast these series. We cannot repeat these series again this school year. All broadcast on IMC. These series are also available online in *StreamlineSC*.

- **20th Century Turning Points in US History** (Grades 7–12, 8 lessons) – This series is designed to provide a clear overview of the people and events that distinguished the 20th century. **Repeats Feb. 6, 3:35–7:50 p.m.**
- **America’s Quest for Freedom** (Grades 5–12, 9 lessons) – This series focuses on America’s struggle for freedom for all, dramatizing common history and showing events that increased freedom. **Repeats Feb. 7, 3:30–7:16 p.m.**
- **Becoming a Better Me** (Grades K–5, 8 lessons) – This series helps students build self confidence, responsibility, self esteem, and self control. **Repeats Feb. 7, 10:30 a.m.–12:55 p.m.**
- **Becoming Successful in Middle School - 1 and 2** (Grades 4–8, 16 lessons) – These address important concerns that young teens deal with like peer pressure, decision-making, study skills, and rules of common courtesy. **Repeats Feb. 8, 3:00–9:48 p.m.**
- **(NEW) Bullying and Cyber Safety** (HRM) (Grades 5–12, 3 lessons) - This series contains three programs that each address an important topic for today’s youth: texting, Internet safety and bullying situations. **Airs Feb. 8, 10:50 a.m.–12:01 p.m.**
- **Connect with Kids At-Risk** (Grades 6–12, 6 lessons) – This series features true stories and real kids in peer-to-peer format that focuses on at-risk issues that teens face everyday. **Repeats Feb. 9, 9:10–11:24 a.m.**
- **Exploring Healthy Choices** (Grades 6–12, 6 lessons) – This series teaches students vital information concerning key areas of their health, including proper nutrition and suicide prevention. **Repeats Feb. 9, 3:00–5:41 p.m.**
- **Great Campaigns of the Civil War** (Grades 6–12, 4 lessons) – This series uses realistic reenactments of the pivotal battles in the Civil War, along with letters, speeches and diaries to humanize the struggle. **Repeats Feb. 10, 10:05 a.m.–12:03 p.m.**
- **(NEW) History of Black Achievement in America, A** (Grades 6–12, 8 lessons) - This series documents Black Achievement in American history, its defining role in the growth of the country, and its influence on events by highlighting contributions of Black Americans that have over 350 years influenced our culture, enriched our society with their achievements, and shaped the history of the U.S. **Airs Feb. 2, 8:00 a.m.–12:06 p.m.**
- **(NEW) History of Hispanic Achievement in America, A** (Grades 6–12, 8 lessons) - History of Hispanic Achievement in America began 500 years ago when Columbus stepped ashore in the new world. The contributions of Hispanics to the development and success of America are key to our history. **Airs Feb. 2, 1:10–5:35 p.m.**
- **History of Women’s Achievement in America, A** (Grades 5–12, 8 lessons) – This series celebrates women’s contributions to American history from the 17th century to present day. **Repeats Feb. 13, 9:50 a.m.–2:13 p.m.**
- **Nutrition Basics: Why Food Matters** (Grades 4–12, 7 lessons) – This series covers nutrition from A to Z and includes the food pyramid, which focuses on the importance of physical activity. **Repeats Feb. 13, 6:00–7:20 p.m.**
- **Primary Citizenship** (Grades 1–3, 7 lessons) – This series told by a primary child, gives children the major ideas and experiences that they should acquire to be effective citizens. **Repeats Feb. 8, 12:50–1:59 p.m.**
- **Technology and Architecture in Ancient Civilizations** (Grades 7–12, 3 lessons) – This series shows how to look at technology and architecture to find out what an ancient civilization was like. **Repeats Feb. 13, 7:30–9:08 p.m.**
- **U.S. History Field Trips** (Grades 4–8, 8 lessons) – This series covers some of the most widely taught, standards-based topics in elementary-middle school American history and geography, making them come to life. **Repeats Feb. 13, 4:00–7:37 p.m.**
- **What’s Up in Finance** (Grades 7–12, 1 Lesson) – This program features young people developing their money smarts and workplace skills they need to achieve their goals. **Repeats Feb. 9, 8:00–8:25 p.m.**
- **(NEW) Wise Owl Bully Stopper** (Grades K–3, 3 lessons) - These live-action videos are hosted by a likeable cartoon character, Wise Owl, who encourages young viewers to learn more about what bullying is and how it can be stopped. Deskercise: Martin Luther King & Presidents Day Themes

Each 10-minute **Deskercise** program is built around a weekly theme. eMedia will block feed the entire month's programs (usually 4 weeks or 20 programs) during the middle of each month PRIOR to when they are recommended for use according to the weekly themes. For example, all the programs designed with themes for February use will air January 11 and 18. eMedia will repeat several January topics the first of this month so you can access them if you have not yet! (See list below)

January's theme for the third week is "Martin Luther King Day." The five programs, each 10 minutes, for this week all contain the same core exercise segment that relates information about the theme. Each of the five programs begins with a different warm-up segment about a place in a different state and ends with a different short health tip, but the core exercise-at-your-desk segment is the same the entire week.

The series was developed in cooperation with the American Association for Health Education (AAHE) and provided by the State Department of Education through eMedia.

Designed for grades Pre-K–3, these two programs in the NEW eMedia series encourage literacy using original songs by composer/lyricist/educator Dr. Al Balkin, former Western Michigan Professor and composer who wrote music for *The Hobbit* as well as several off-Broadway children's musicals.

The programs musically introduce/reinforce concepts such as punctuation and sentence construction with songs like ***Get the Point*** and ***Punctuation Mystery!*** Each song is under two minutes in duration. eMedia will be working to create more of these videos to Dr. Balkin's music so look for these in 2012!

Wise Owl Bully Stopper – Block feed Feb. 8, 12:05–12:48 p.m. IMC (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades K–3, these three live-action videos are hosted by a likeable cartoon character, Wise Owl, who encourages young viewers to learn more about what bullying is and how it can be stopped. Helpful vignettes play out common situations that appeal to young viewers and ask them to think about what they would do in each situation.

Bullying and Cyber Safety (HRM) – Block feed Feb. 8, 10:50 a.m.–12:01 p.m. IMC (LIMITED rights)

Recommended for grades 5–12, these three programs each address an important topic for today's youth: texting, Internet safety and bullying situations. *B Careful when U Txt* gives students a primer on the Do's and Don'ts of text messaging. *Think Before You Click* provides smart online strategies to stay safe and *Bully Bystanders* sets the tone for refusing to accept hostile behavior, offering effective ways to deal with bullying.



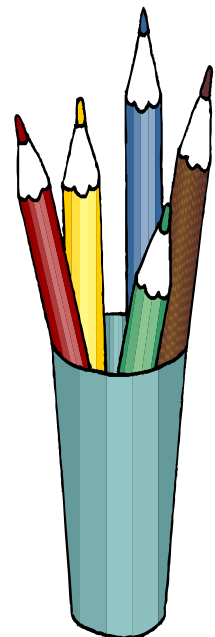

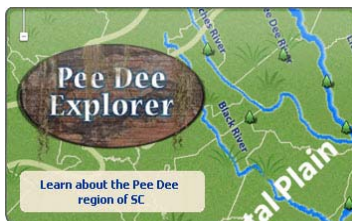

A "sense of place" weaves together our experiences with the land, its culture and lifestyle. This website explores the relationship of the landscape of the Pee Dee and the people who live there.

Pee Dee Explorer features over six hours of video vignettes that characterize the natural, cultural, and agricultural landscapes of the Pee Dee region of South Carolina. This new site is a virtual treasure trove of stories told by farmers, naturalists, historians, conservationists and other members of the Pee Dee community with intimate knowledge of the land. The website serves as both an educational resource and tour guide to the region's many landmarks, farms, festivals, and parks. K–12 teacher and student resources connect the Web content to the classroom through lesson plans, standards correlations, and related Web content, and visitor information is provided for schools and the general public.

The **Pee Dee Explorer** website is divided into chapters that provide various contexts for telling the story of the region. Each chapter contains a collection of video stories and accompanying text, based on well-known and "off the beaten path" landmarks found in the Pee Dee. - **Literacy Matters Focuses on Classroom Libraries**

Coordinated by Jennifer Brown, SCDE Literacy Specialist, our Literacy professional development series has a new name! **Literacy Matters** second program for the 2011–12 school year is entitled *Classroom Libraries: Access to Materials Appropriate for Learning to Read and Reading to Learn*. High-progress classrooms are well-stocked with a variety of interesting books and materials at students' reading levels. Data collected in the SCDE sample reveal that 43% of these classrooms had fewer than 100 books (about one-quarter of the number recommended for a classroom of 25 students) and 85% had fewer than 250 (about half the number recommended for a classroom of 25 students) (Hoffman, Sailor, Duffy, & Beretvais, 2004; Allington & Johnston, 2002; Pressley et al., 2000; Johnston et al., 1998; Allington et al., 1996; Guice et al., 1996). Furthermore, of the books that were in classrooms, most were well above the reading levels of students, making it impossible for many students to engage with texts to read for understanding and gain content knowledge. Literacy Specialists and teachers will share how they worked on adding to their classroom libraries.

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History: Life and Culture in the New States 1786-1808, The Antebellum Period 1793-1822 and Southern Discontent 1830-1860. Participants learn about Charles Pinckney, the Forgotten Founder who contributed to the birth of our nation and the construction of the Santee Canal, considered the first "true" canal in this country. Participants will view a new program about the Grimke Sisters who spoke out at an early age against slavery and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series IV: Civil War

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in SC History. South Carolina and the Civil War are discussed in three lessons: Secession from the Union, Beginning of the Civil War and Civil War in South Carolina. Participants will learn about political events, personalities, military campaigns, participation of African Americans, and the upheaval of this period in SC. We will visit the SC State Museum as they focus on the 150th anniversary of the start of the Civil War, featuring the museum's exhibit and program plans marking the historic events that led to the firing on Fort Sumter. The course also includes *The Story of Mary Boykin Chestnut* and her writings, which became "A Diary from Dixie."
