SCETV Teacher Recertification Courses 2013

The recertification courses previously offered by eMedia are now provided and managed by South Carolina Educational Television. (The content remains the same.)

ETV will offer one-hour (20 renewal credits) teacher recertification courses during two upcoming sessions: Short 4-week session (May 20-June 7) and a Summer 8-week session (July 10- September 4).

Cost: \$50 per course

Registration for Short session opens May 6 and ends May 15.

Registration for Summer session opens June 19 and end July 3.

The teacher recertification courses are for certificate renewal credit only. (NO graduate credit is available.) PRIOR to registration, participants must work with their district professional development coordinator or, if they are not currently employed by a district, a SCDE Office of Teacher Certification analyst to ensure the course(s) selected will meet their individual certificate renewal or professional development needs.

The courses will be accessed online in Moodle. Participants view course videos and complete discussion questions related to the video lessons via discussion forum in Moodle.

Project Discovery – Life at Lemmon Hill Plantation, Part 2 airs May 21 and 28, 1:30-1:57 p.m. on the IMC and June 9, 3:30-3:57 p.m. on the SC Channel (SCC)

This special **Project Discovery - Life at Lemmon Hill Plantation, Part 1** was produced in November 2012 by the South Carolina Department of Education with SCETV. The special takes students to Lemmon Hill Plantation near Winnsboro to explore a historic home with remnants of authentic indigo paint and an unusual decorated ceiling in a bedroom that now holds the bed belonging to an important South Carolinian! It is recommended for grades 5-12.

Join Bette Jamison and SCDE Social Studies Consultant Lewis Huffman with guest hosts Katie Mixon and Tanisha Polite to learn why settlers living in our coastal areas made their way inland to build working plantations as we look at life during the 1790's and early 1800's in the piedmont region of our state. We'll see how Lemmon Hill Plantation, rescued and restored over the last few years to its original beauty, is an example of the refined living that was rather unique to what was the back country at that time. During this period of our history, western Fairfield county was a bastion of wealth with cotton and indigo grown abundantly in the fertile fields and blue granite mined in nearby quarries.

This program is Part 1 of two **Project Discovery** programs produced at Lemmon Hill Plantation. Part 2 aired in February 2013 and focused on the contributions of the African Americans who helped South Carolina plantations prosper. As craftsmen they built fine and useful furnishings, some of which we get to see in this second program. Both programs will air back to back on May 21 and 28 starting at 1:00 p.m. on the Instructional Media Channel (IMC) and June 9 starting at 3:00 p.m. on the SC Channel.

Special thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Chuck Corley, owners of Lemmon Hill Plantation, for opening their home and assisting us in producing this interesting program that allows South Carolina students to go back in time to see what life was like over 200 years ago in this area of our state! Please alert your social studies teachers to these two programs.

OnePlaceSC – Website to be Simplified & Improved

Starting this August for the 2013-2014 school year, ETV will offer a simplified and improved **OnePlaceSC** website. The technical capabilities to search all the **OnePlaceSC** content sites once available are no longer viable. ETV will be dropping the single sign-on and search capabilities. The new web site will simply list qualified sites for teachers to search individually, and teachers will no longer need to sign-on.

The South Carolina Department of Education recently transitioned their eMedia department into the new Office of Virtual Education, reassigning responsibilities for most eMedia staff. As a result, the programming once provided by SCDE on the K-12 Instructional Media Channel (IMC) will no longer be delivered in this manner after May 2013. To date, ETV has not decided the future of the K-12 IMC channel, but the search of eMedia programming will not be an option. However, ETV will continue a TV guide feature similar to what currently is offered.

Many districts used **OnePlaceSC** to access their local district Education TV portals. In the new upcoming site, applicable district portal links will be easily listed for teachers to access.

And finally, **OnePlaceSC** will offer an improved consolidated listing of teacher recertification courses, professional development and trainings. Teachers will be able to easily find the recertification courses, PD and training they need. So, look out for the new streamlined **OnePlaceSC** coming in August!

IMPORTANT Note about Programming in *StreamlineSC*

Even though eMedia programming will no longer be provided through the K-12 Instructional Media Channel (IMC), most of the eMedia programs and series for K-12 students will continue to be available online in *StreamlineSC* as they are now.

Many of the locally-produced K-12 resources have been produced by ITV/eMedia in partnership with ETV and these programs have unlimited rights for our South Carolina districts, schools and educators to use with their students for as long as you deem the content viable. Other programs and series have been produced in partnership with national educational entities or provided free-of-charge for educational use so these will also remain in *StreamlineSC* with the rights designated.

However, some of the programs and series leased by the SC Department of Education for use in our state districts and schools will no longer be available after July 31, 2013. The good news is that some of these nice distributors are allowing us to continue to use these programs until January 1, 2014 or August 1, 2014, giving us time for districts, schools and educators to delete or destroy copies OR contact distributors to purchase rights to retrain these valuable resources for use in the classroom.

Remember ... Rights for these will be discontinued so it is important that media specialists and teachers discontinue use of these resources as it is a violation of copyright to keep and/or use them. Tapes and DVDs must be destroyed. These programs need to be eliminated if archived or parked on your desktop for access. Continued rights can be purchased from distributors.

SC Hall of Fame Inductees Astronauts Duke, McNair and Bolden ... Access for Space Day May 3!

Produced, directed and edited by ETV’s Mark Adams, these three, short programs highlight our state’s astronauts who were inducted into the South Carolina Hall of Fame.

- **Col. Charles M. Duke, Jr.** (duration 9:52)

Inducted into the South Carolina Hall Of Fame, Charles Duke, Jr. is one of only 12 people to ever walk on the Moon as part of the historic Apollo 16 mission in 1972.

- **Ronald Erwin McNair** (duration 10:03)

Inducted into the South Carolina Hall Of Fame, Ronald McNair was the second African-American to go into space, and was part of the STS-51L crew that died when the Space Shuttle Challenger exploded shortly after lift-off in 1986.

- **Maj. Gen. Charles F. Bolden, Jr.** (duration 9:31)

Inducted into the South Carolina Hall Of Fame, Charles Bolden, Jr. flew on four historic Space Shuttle missions in the 1980’s and 90’s, and became the first African-American to lead NASA as NASA Administrator.

A Natural State explores how people express a love for nature by shaping, twisting, carving, and weaving materials collected from the landscape. Some of the arts and crafts featured in **A Natural State** reveal the cultural heritage of our state, while others employ concepts from the world of modern art. What unifies the artists is their unique bond to the natural world - where a hike in the woods, a backyard picnic, or a walk in the park provides materials and inspiration for a work of art. By examining the materials, artwork, landscape, and artist, we learn how to create our own *sense of place*, a unique picture of how we shape the land and community as they shape us.

The Featured Artists section takes a look at "natural" artists across the five landforms of the state - the blue ridge, piedmont, sandhills, coastal plain, and coastal zone. Videos, text, and photographs explore the inspiration, materials, and process behind their work, while providing "how-to" guides for students and teachers who would like to work within the artist's medium and form.

The Students section provides aspiring young artists with a virtual museum to display work that uses materials and inspiration from their "neck of the woods."

The Folklife Resource Center is a reference tool and online catalog developed in partnership with the McKissick Museum of the University of South Carolina. Many of the museum's videos, photographs, and research documents related to the folk life and arts of South Carolina are available online through this growing collection of assets.

His career of public service began in 1779 when at the age of 21 he became a member of the SC General Assembly. Then Pinckney was selected as a delegate to Congress four years later and became one of four representatives from SC at the Constitutional Convention. Throughout his active political career he served four terms as our Governor, in the U.S. House and the Senate, and appointed as the U.S. Ambassador to Spain.

Through the research of several historians, this documentary explores Pinckney's work as a public servant and his contributions to the United States Constitution while examining the reasons why his story is all but removed from American history. This special program is directed by ETV's Sanford Adams with original artwork by James. H. Palmer, Jr., and was funded in part by the Friends of Historic Snee Farm and Humanities Council of SC. It was used as part of this year's celebration for Constitution Week at the National Park Service Charles Pinckney National Historic Site in Mt. Pleasant, SC.

This information should be compiled for each experience completed. The Work-Based Learning (WBL) fields in PowerSchool have been designed to collect information on up to our experiences that the student participated in throughout the school year. In order to properly account for all extended learning opportunities (ELOs), they must be entered into the WBL component of the Pearson PowerSchool system. The **SC Chronicles Series** of five courses, each for one hour renewal credit, will enhance the teacher's understanding of SC history and add a repertoire of material to use in the classroom. The video sessions focus on integrating SC history into the social studies curriculum. As participants gain a greater understanding of the history, they will be able to teach state curriculum standards with an updated historical knowledge of South Carolina history. All class meetings take place through online learning. The facilitator and participants communicate via Moodle course platform on the Internet. Assignments/discussions facilitated in Moodle.

SC Chronicles Series I: Geography, Native Americans & Colonial Period

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History. Experience an archeological adventure at the Topper dig site in Allendale County, learn about the rise and fall of rice-growing and its impact on the state and find out the true tales of treachery and villainy that occurred off the coast during the Golden Age of Piracy. You will also virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series II: The Winds of Discontent

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses three key issues in early SC History: The winds of discontent in SC, The American Revolution in the Low Country and The American Revolution in the Up Country. Learn about Francis Marion's partisan campaigns during the American Revolution in SC and the historical importance of the Battle of Camden. You will view programs about SC heroines who have shaped our history and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State to learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series III: Post Revolutionary

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History: Life and Culture in the New States 1786-1808, The Antebellum Period 1793-1822 and Southern Discontent 1830-1860. Participants learn about Charles Pinckney, the Forgotten Founder who contributed to the birth of our nation and the construction of the Santee Canal, considered the first "true" canal in this country. Participants will view a program about the Grimke Sisters who spoke out at an early age against slavery and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State to learn about their historic relevance to SC today.

SC Chronicles Series IV: Civil War

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in SC History. South Carolina and the Civil War are discussed in three lessons: Secession from the Union, Beginning of the Civil War and Civil War in South Carolina. Participants will learn about political events, personalities, military campaigns, participation of African Americans, and the upheaval of this period in SC. We will visit the SC State Museum as they focus on the 150th anniversary of the start of the Civil War and the course also includes *The Story of Mary Boykin Chestnut* and her writings, which became "A Diary from Dixie."

SC Chronicles Series V: Art and Culture

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in SC History. SC art and architecture are discussed: 1) Art and Architecture, 2) Frontier, 3) Art and Purchasing, 4) Colonial Education. SC music and musicians are discussed: 1) Southern Music, 2) Blending of Musical Cultures, 3) Spoleto Festival, 4) Opera Houses and Theaters. The course includes programs from the *SC State Museum Resources for Educators* featuring exhibits of SC pottery, stoneware, baskets, and quilts. Included are highlights from the Holcombe family stoneware collection, ranging from exquisite pottery from the old Edgefield district, the highly-recognized slave potter Dave and South Carolina Silver: Varieties in Society, 1750–1910. The course will also explore the work of local authors and artists and virtually visit Brookgreen Gardens, a National Historic Landmark located on the coast of South Carolina and the Gullah-Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor.
