

The 3rd Annual South Carolina Public Library Trustee Institute will be held **January 19-20, 2001** at the Sheraton Columbia Hotel & Conference Center, located near the juncture of I-20 and I-26. You will be receiving registration forms and additional hotel information this November.

This year's **featured speakers** are Frederick A. Schlipf, John A. Moorman, Dr. Joyce Parks, Carol Rauscher, and Glenis Redmond. The general sessions will include, among other topics, presentations on ensuring the appointment of the very best people to your board, providing good and timely orientation for new appointees, and seeing to the care and feeding of all trustees throughout their board tenure. Due to the tremendous boom in library construction in the state, a large block of time will also be devoted to the trustee's role and responsibility in the entire construction process. The concurrent sessions will zero in on more specific topics of interest.

Fred Schlipf and **John Moorman**, conference leaders, are both full-time library directors who provide library consulting and training in addition to their full-time professional careers.

Fred Schlipf—Currently, he is the executive director of the Urbana Free Library in Urbana, IL. Since 1974, he has also served as an adjunct professor at the Graduate School of Library and Information Science at the University of Illinois in Urbana and as a library building consultant since 1987. He received both his Master's and his Doctoral Degrees in Library Science from the University of Chicago. He has been a member of various professional committees, task forces, etc., at the local, state, and national levels and has participated, in different capacities, in numerous community activities.

John Moorman—Since 1975, he has been a library administrator of public libraries in North Carolina, Texas, Illinois, and Virginia. He is currently a member of the Intellectual Freedom Committee of the American Library Association. In cooperation with Fred



Schlipf, he has presented programs on library building problems and the library planning and construction process to national conferences of the Public Library Association. He has also given presentations at conferences on a number of other library topics.

Dr. Joyce Parks, Certified Professional Parliamentarian and Member of the American Institute of Parliamentarians, will present concurrent sessions on basic procedure and precautions for board meetings.



Carol Rauscher, former Senior Vice President of the Organizational Building Center of the United Way, Columbia, will present concurrent sessions on building community and local partnerships.

Glenis Redmond, performance poet and author will be the luncheon speaker on Saturday. She presents her poetry in a performance that causes the printed word to spring from the page. With her poems, she tells stories of her life, her family, and her African-American heritage, inspiring audiences of all ages.
