Legislative Update

What Have You Done For Us Lately? (Preview)

The Old Story

The story is an old one. The candidate for re-election gives a speech, telling his audience what he has done for them: the new bridge, the repaved highway, the water plant that serves the whole town.

"Yeah," someone in the crowd says. "But what have you done for us lately?"

The story is an old one, but a good part of its staying power is its truth. Public officials, especially elected ones, are held accountable by citizens who often seem to have short memories. The events of the 1986 session are already fading; who, outside of the legislature, really recalls the issues and debates of 1985?

And what can be recalled is generally unpleasant: higher fees, stricter laws, more "government interference." At times it seems that the hereditary motto of a legislator must be this: "When we do right, no one remembers; when we do wrong, no one forgets."

What HAS Been Done Lately?

This situation is unfair, both to legislators and to the voting public. What the General Assembly does affects everyone in this state, and so should concern everyone in this state. What the public thinks about the membership definitely affects the legislators--not just in the obvious fact of elections, but also in what issues are debated, what laws are passed, what issues are considered.

To put it plainly: the General Assembly reacts just as much as it acts. The better informed the people are, the better reaction the General Assembly can provide.

Because of this give-and-take nature of the democratic process, the public needs to know what the General Assembly has done for them lately. Members need to have ready information to say to that heckler in the crowd: "This is what we've done in the areas of environment, of crime control, of economic development. You said you wanted action, and this is the action you got."

Another aspect which needs to be addressed: some explanations for the reasons behind the actions of the General Assembly. Government has grown increasingly complex over the past few decades, and the role of the legislator has been required to match this complexity. Legislative issues are not as simple as some observers would like to believe. The issues which confront members of the General Assembly have a number of levels: legal, administrative, financial, even moral and ethical. All of these must be considered when bills are debated.

This debate can "slow down" the process, but debate and discussion are intended to make sure bad bills aren't passed and good bills are made better. Legislators do their best work when legislating carefully, rather than quickly.

In the next two issues of *Legislative Update* there will be a review of the most recent session of the South Carolina General Assembly. This brief history of the 1985-86 term will focus on the major issues which occupied the attention of the members of the legislature, and the people of the state. The legislation which resulted from this attention will be presented--the activities of the 1985-86 General Assembly.

The purpose of this review: to provide House members with brief, pertinent information about the activities of the House, and to help them convey to constituents what has been discussed, debated, considered and enacted.

In short, this two-part review will tell what the General Assembly has "done lately."

Coming Up in the *Legislative Update*

During the off-session *Legislative Update* is published once a month, rather than once a week. In the months ahead we plan to present House members with information on the following topics:

The accomplishments of the 1985-86 General Assembly: a summary of major issues and legislation completed by the Legislature during its past session.

Issues which are likely to return in 1987. This will include topics which were discussed, but not passed, such as the local government finance bill, lotteries, medical malpractice, and annexation.

Preview of the up-coming session. A glance at new (and old) matters which are likely to arise during 1987, and issues which will face members in January.

Orientation of new members. The new year will see some new faces in the House, and the House Research Office has the responsibility of coordinating the orientation for them; the *Update* will keep all members informed about that event.

Organizational session. Also coming in the months ahead, the House organizational session, as it prepares itself for another two-year session.
