In October 2013, the South Carolina Department of Juvenile Justice opened its innovative, Job Readiness Training Center. The facility will provide life and job skills classes to DJJ youth on probation, parole, or in committed status ranging primarily from ages 12 to 18, and other youth as part of the agency's prevention and intervention efforts. In addition to job readiness training, the JRTC also offers a range of "soft" life skills courses designed to enhance a youth's chance of being successful in finding and keeping a job.

This paper explains the Carpentry program and its goals at the Department of Juvenile Justice. The core carpentry program length is a minimum of two months or 80 hours, and includes nationally recognized texts from The National Center for Construction Education and Research Core Curriculum. DJJ staff will determine if a youth is appropriate for the program and refer them to attend. Primary objectives of the Carpentry Apprenticeship classes and curriculum are listed. It also gives a listing of telephone numbers for the DJJ county offices throughout the state.

DJJ's Division of Community Services is responsible for a wide range of direct services to youth and their families, as well as victims of crime, in the community through 43 DJJ county offices, servicing all 46 counties in the state. Among these services are a number of programs and initiatives aimed at providing effective supervision of youth in the least restrictive environment, who are on probation or parole and support for their families, with the goals of reducing juvenile crime and recidivism, and providing for safer communities.

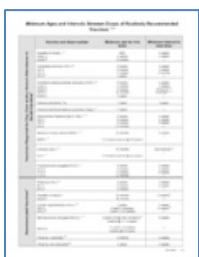
