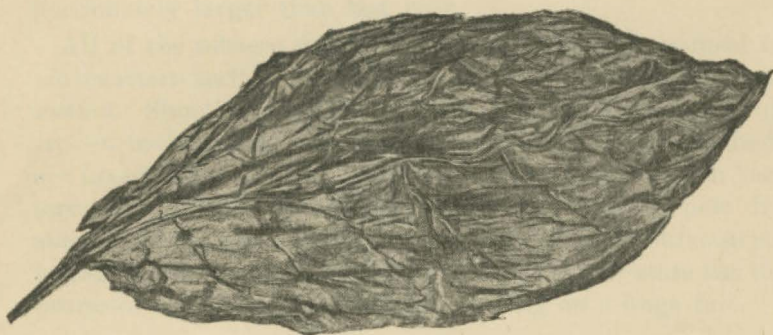

TOBACCO

Final reports from South Carolina tobacco warehouses indicate that tobacco growers in South Carolina divided \$13,890,188.52. This amount was realized from the sale of 69,841,461 pounds of cigarette type tobacco which averaged 19.88 cents per pound—1.09 cents more than the average for 1935. Although the average was higher the crop decreased nearly fifteen million pounds and the amount of money paid to producers was approximately two million dollars less than the previous year.

As a general rule the farmers were well pleased with the price received. Planting conditions this year were not favorable and there was a shortage of plants due to blue mould. Even after the crop was set, conditions looked very discouraging for some time.

While the amount sold was considerably short of 1935, the quality seemed to be very good and the amount received was proportionately larger than last year.

All of the tobacco grown in South Carolina is confined to the northeastern section of the state which is known as the Pee Dee section. Shortly before the markets open the larger towns of this section make great preparation for this event. Hotel facilities are taxed to the limit and every one looks forward with keen interest to meeting old acquaintances and making new friends among the people who represent the tobacco manufacturing interests of the country. This entire section of the state has the appearance and mental attitude of carrying on a huge fair.
