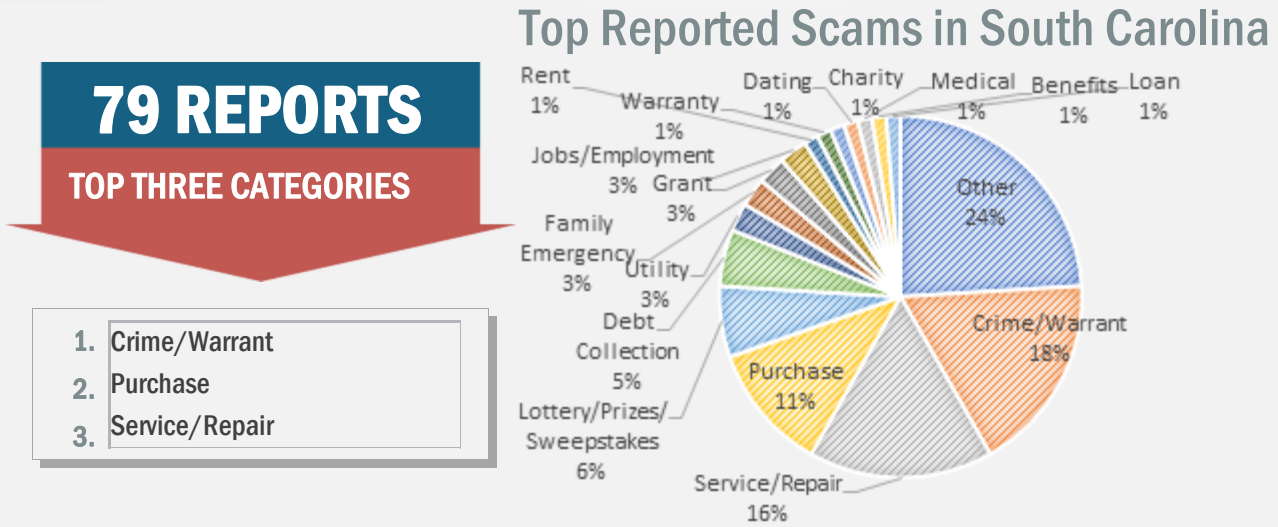

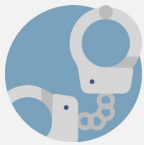
SCAMS IN SC | JUN 2021

They add new twists to old schemes and pressure people to make important decisions on the spot. One thing that never changes: they follow Headlines—and the money.

The charts below reflect scams reported to SCDCA in Jun 2021



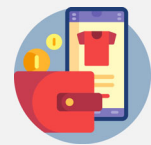
Crime/Warrant



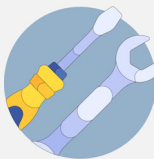
Consumer threatened with jail or arrest

Purchase

Consumer directed to or approached by imposter business to trick consumer into paying for fake consumer goods. Most online purchase scams occur when a payment is made online to purchase something, and nothing is delivered.



Service/Repair

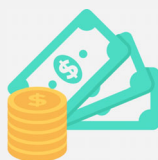


Consumer directed to or approached by imposter business to trick consumer into paying for a fake service or repair.
Example: Fake credit repair companies; internet services
