Please let your elementary teachers and middle school science teachers know about this NEW program! In this special edition of **Project Discovery**, South Carolina students will get to visit the SC Aquarium in Charleston to find out what is new as we look at wetlands and water creatures and explore beyond the classroom at Capers Island with Clay Hill Middle School students!

The salt marsh is one of the most diverse and amazing ecosystems! Have you ever thought about how many animals make the marsh their home? Birds, turtles, fish, crabs, and even dolphins! The salt marsh is one exciting habitat from morning to night. This working environment helps to keep our water clean, protects land from erosion and even acts as a nursery for young animals before heading out into the deep blue sea. Animals, like the diamondback terrapin, find crabs and snails hiding in the spartina grass as a tasty treat and birds, like the pelican or great blue heron, can fly high above the tidal creeks looking for fish to gobble up. Get up close and personal with some of the most amazing salt marsh inhabitants when we visit the SC Aquarium!

Also, **Project Discovery** will explore beyond the classroom, taking a field trip to a barrier island with students from Clay Hill Middle School in Dorchester School District Four. The students experience an outdoor field investigation where they use science and math to explore the environment first hand. We'll get to join in as two education specialists with Barrier Island Eco Tours allow Clay Hill students to see, taste and touch as they learn about the wetlands and creatures in the marsh and sea! Plus Rudy Mancke, Naturalist in Residence at USC and former host of ETV's **NatureScene**, will be on hand to provide interesting information during this special program that is great science content for students.

State House Constitution Day Special – James Otis Lecture

To help SC schools meet the Constitution Day requirements, The SC Chapter of the American Board of Trial Advocates (ABOTA) will host its Annual **James Otis Lecture** series at the SC State House in observance of National Constitution Day. It's not too early to plan to send several of your high school students to participate at the State House (see contact information below) and to plan on accessing the broadcast for all students. ETV will broadcast the program LIVE through OnePlaceSC on the IMC (K–12 Instructional Media Channel) and it will be archived for later use online in *StreamlineSC*.

By federal law, all schools that receive federal assistance are required to have a program about the Constitution on or around the anniversary date of the signing of the Constitution on September 17, 1787. James Otis was a prominent Boston lawyer in the colonial era credited by John Adams as igniting the spark that led to the Declaration of Independence and the American Revolution. ABOTA nationally developed the James Otis Lecture Series to help schools comply.

This year, Constitution Day will focus on privacy and first amendment rights in the age of social media, examining doctrines from the past applied in the context of today's ever-changing technology and its implications for individual rights as well as freedom of speech. Produced, directed and edited by ETV's Mark Adams, these three, short programs highlight our state's astronauts who were inducted into the South Carolina Hall of Fame.

- **Col. Charles M. Duke, Jr.** (duration 9:52)

Inducted into the South Carolina Hall Of Fame, Charles Duke, Jr. is one of only 12 people to ever walk on the Moon as part of the historic Apollo 16 mission in 1972.

- **Ronald Erwin McNair** (duration 10:03)

Inducted into the South Carolina Hall Of Fame, Ronald McNair was the second African-American to go into space, and was part of the STS-51L crew that died when the Space Shuttle Challenger exploded shortly after lift-off in 1986.

- **Maj. Gen. Charles F. Bolden, Jr.** (duration 9:31)

Inducted into the South Carolina Hall Of Fame, Charles Bolden, Jr. flew on four historic Space Shuttle missions in the 1980's and 90's, and became the first African-American to lead NASA as NASA Administrator.

Last May's **In Our Schools** featured the **Richland One Challenger Learning Center**. Serving students throughout our state, the Richland One Challenger Learning Center is an exciting, hands-on simulated space science environment where students and educators work in teams to solve real-life math, science and technology problems during a space flight simulation.

The Challenger Learning Center was established as a living memorial to the heroes of the Challenger 51-L crew and opened in February of 1996. Located near W.A. Perry Middle School in Columbia, the center is a stand-alone facility and the 26th of its kind in the national Challenger Center Network.

This program takes viewers on a simulation with students from Richland County School District Two's North Springs Elementary School and Lonnie B. Nelson Elementary School. We see the student crews use innovative curriculum materials, working in an environment conducive to problem-solving, teamwork and sharing information on their simulated mission. Please make sure elementary and middle school science teachers know about this special program!

Space Files for National Space Day in May

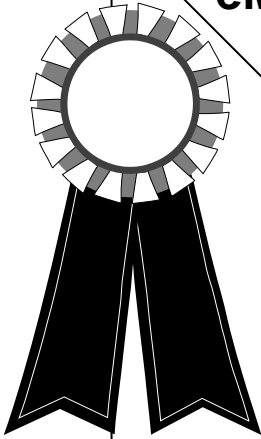

These programs were coordinated and hosted by Kimberly W. Smith, formerly with SCDE Safe and Drug-Free Schools. The first program is designed for educators and parents and the other important program is targeted towards teens. Please access for your school and community.

New Fads in Teen Alcohol Use with Kristy A. Stoneburner, MPH, CHES, CPP. Ms. Stoneburner is Program Coordinator for Lexington One Community Coalition (LOCC). *PEEL it! Spark it! Spyke it!* This presentation explores new trends in underage alcohol use. Current information on teen alcohol use is presented, along with a review of emerging products. The program examines the advertisers' role in marketing alcoholic beverages to youth to enable understanding of the scope of underage drinking both locally and nationally, examine the role of the environment on underage alcohol use and identify new trends in underage alcohol use.

Youth Services: Dangers for Teen Drivers – Texting & Other Safety Tips is a good program for educators to share with teens. Kimberly W. Smith welcomes Lance Corporal Robinson, Community Relations Officer with SC Highway Patrol, to talk about the dangers of texting while driving and provide safety tips for teens.

Reading, Safety and Internet Safety Minutes – May 2, (**High School**) 8:00–8:04 a.m. and (**Middle School**) 8:11–8:15 a.m. on IMC. Produced with Dutch Fork High School and Gilbert Middle School students, these short segments are provided for high school and middle school students to help them think about their own safety and realize the importance of cyber bullying. (Unlimited rights)

XPress: Safety for Students – Repeats May 2, 8:22–9:23 a.m., on IMC. Designed for middle and high school students, these two programs feature teens that are part of the SC Department of Education's Office of Youth Services Youth Advisory Board. Students join Dr. Glen Walter to talk about important issues that teens deal with every day. These programs focus on cyber safety and mental health issues. (Unlimited rights)

I'm Safe – Repeats May 2, 9:30–9:41 a.m., on IMC. Designed for grades 1–3, *I'm Safe on Wheels* is an animated lesson created by Slim Goodbody that helps young children know how to stay safe. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record use, but no duplication)

Life Skills 101 – Repeats May 2, 9:48–10:45 a.m. on IMC. Designed for grades 2–3, the five lessons, each between 9–11 minutes in duration, emphasize National Health and Education Standards. The lessons help children explore health-supporting life skills such as decision making, goal setting, self-management, passing on health information to others, and assessing the health values of products in the media. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record use, but no duplication)

Safe Student School Scenarios – Repeats May 2, 10:52–11:43 a.m. on IMC. Designed for middle and high school students. Produced by ETV, these short dramatizations are part of the **Partnership Training for Law Enforcement and Education** recertification course and can be used with students to initiate discussion on various topics, which include whether to tell or not to tell, dealing with prejudice, rumors, and conflict resolution. 12. **Aerobic Activity (2:19)** – Hannah teaches Erin and Michael a simple aerobic exercise while learning that the best kind of exercise is the kind you get from using lots of oxygen.
13. **Play Hard, Snack Healthy (1:47)** – The Healthy Choice Heroes learn that while its fun being active it's important to stay hydrated and choose healthy snacks.

In addition, KITE-LL teachers get ideas on how to sustain the language program through community outreach.

Module 2 - A Week in the Life of a KITE-LL Teacher (duration 56:10)

Provides an orientation for language teachers who are new to the KITE-LL program, taking them through each day of a typical week of instruction. Teachers learn what, when and how to present each lesson and how to work with the classroom teachers who are responsible for the monitoring of students during the taped lessons.

SC Chronicles Series II: The Winds of Discontent

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses three key issues in early SC History: The winds of discontent in SC, The American Revolution in the Low Country and The American Revolution in the Up Country. Learn about Francis Marion's partisan campaigns during the American Revolution in SC and the historical importance of the Battle of Camden. You will also view new programs about heroines in our state who have shaped South Carolina history and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series III: Post Revolutionary

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in early SC History: Life and Culture in the New States 1786-1808, The Antebellum Period 1793-1822 and Southern Discontent 1830-1860. Participants learn about Charles Pinckney, the Forgotten Founder who contributed to the birth of our nation and the construction of the Santee Canal, considered the first "true" canal in this country. Participants will view a new program about the Grimke Sisters who spoke out at an early age against slavery and virtually visit sites around the Palmetto State and learn about their historic and special relevance to South Carolina today.

SC Chronicles Series IV: Civil War

Noted South Carolina historian Dr. Walter Edgar discusses key issues in SC History. South Carolina and the Civil War are discussed in three lessons: Secession from the Union, Beginning of the Civil War and Civil War in South Carolina. Participants will learn about political events, personalities, military campaigns, participation of African Americans, and the upheaval of this period in SC. We will visit the SC State Museum as they focus on the 150th anniversary of the start of the Civil War, featuring the museum's exhibit and program plans marking the historic events that led to the firing on Fort Sumter. The course also includes *The Story of Mary Boykin Chestnut* and her writings, which became "A Diary from Dixie."
