MCCORMICK COUNTY TRANSPORTATION PLAN
June 24, 2010

1. ROAD ANALYSIS

McCormick County has approximately 498 miles of public roads including municipalities. A breakdown by category is as follows:

SCDOT Maintained Roads:

101 US and SC Routes

356 Secondary Roads

41 Dirt Roads

The county roads are maintained by the county. SCDOT request funds periodically for paving or resurfacing. The CTC provides funds to the extent of availability. All bridges in the county are inspected by SCDOT.

ADMINISTRATION

The McCormick CTC request that the Columbia office of SCDOT continue to administer the funds allocated for state maintained roads in the county and implement the approved projects within the plan. This policy will be reviewed annually. The CTC reserves the right to review all final bids before they are let to the contractor.

SCDOT will implement the approved transportation plan with the funds allocated to the county and provide the following for each funded project.

- A. Design Engineer
- B. Acquisition of right-of- way
- C. Procurement of construction contracts
- D. Project supervision
- E. Compliance with minority and women-owned business requirements under S.C. Code 12-27-1320

2. UNPAVED ROADS

A goal of the CTC will be to hard-surface as many unpaved roads as practical; however, repaving industrial schools, school routes, mail routes, bridges and sidewalk projects will be considered and all will be prioritized based on need as deemed by the CTC after all pertinent information has been reviewed.

3. **PROJECTS PROGRAMED BUT NOT LET TO CONTRACT**

The CTC is in the process of reviewing all projects listed in this category. Upon approval each project will be forwarded to SCDOT for approval and implementation.

4. **PRIORITIZING PROJECTS**

The CTC will be using information from SCDOT concerning the condition of state maintained roads and bridges. The CTC will rate and evaluate all roads under local jurisdiction and will solicit input from local officials and citizens on specific projects.

5. **EQUAL CONSIDERATION**

A balance of expenditures among the five (5) districts of the county including towns and municipalities will be monitored, realizing that specific projects needs might cause an imbalance from time to time. Such factors as need, miles of road, population of area, traffic count, cost, cost per mile, effects on adjoining property, environmental, right of way, number of households served etc. will be considered.

6. **RESURFACE AND REPAIR**

The CTC will establish a reserve for repair and emergency needs.

7. **REVISIONS TO PLAN**

The CTC will from time to time review and revise the County Transportation Plan, any changes, additions, deletions, etc. will be forwarded to SCDOT for approval.

8. **GOAL**

The McCormick County Transportation Committee's goal will be to provide the citizens of this county with the best and safest roads and bridges possible for the funds we administer.
