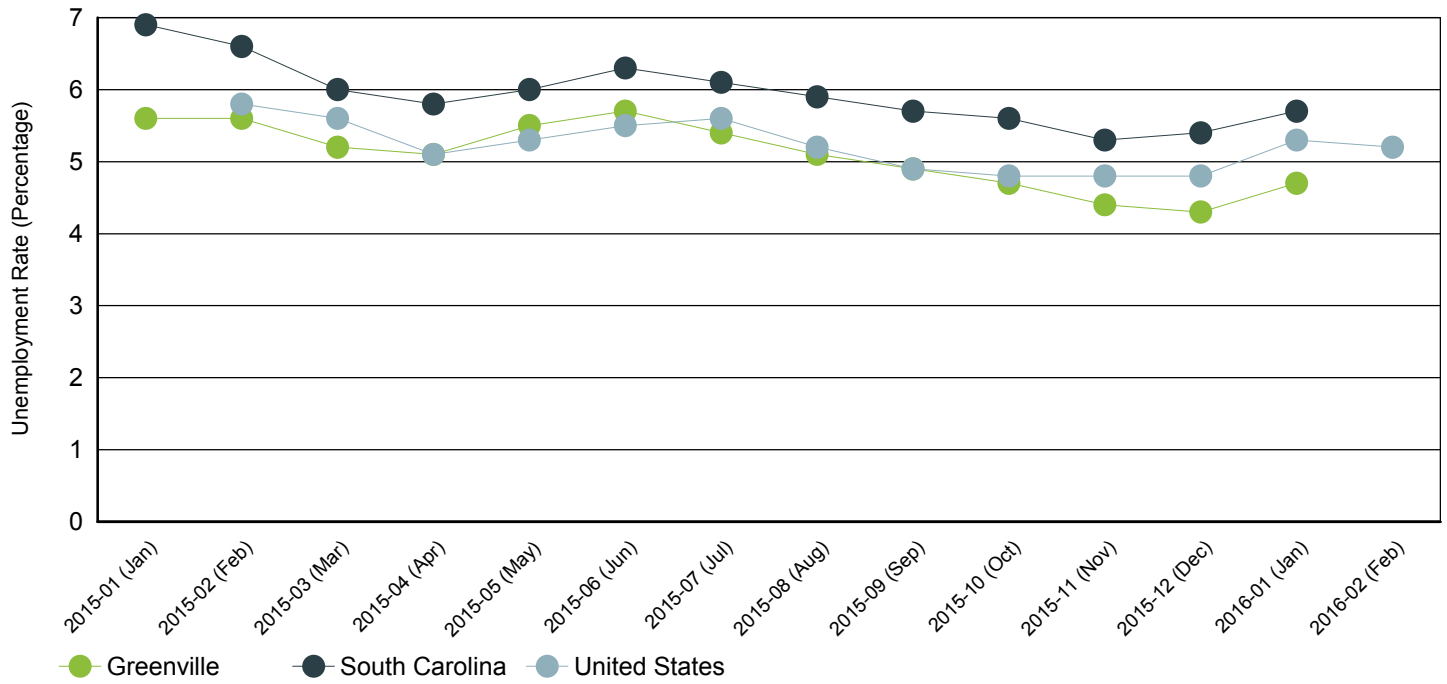

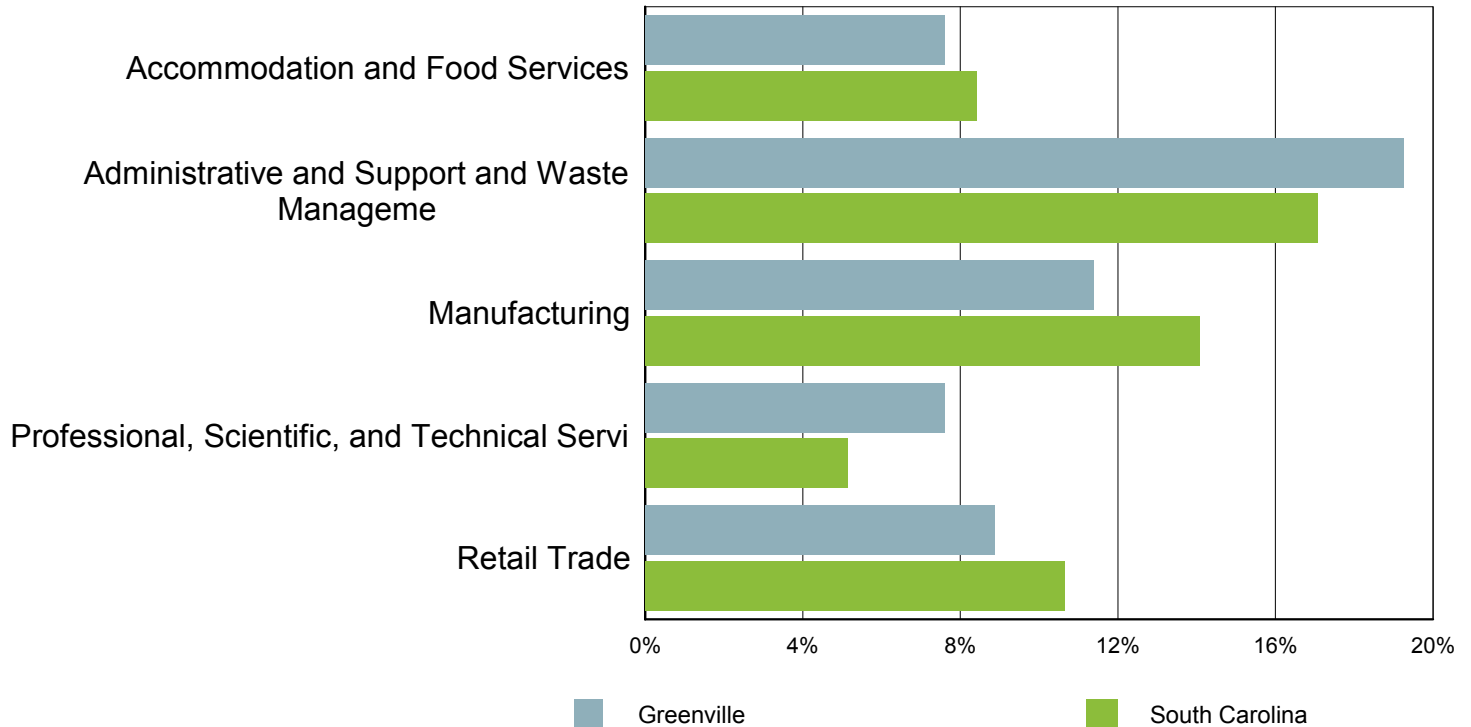

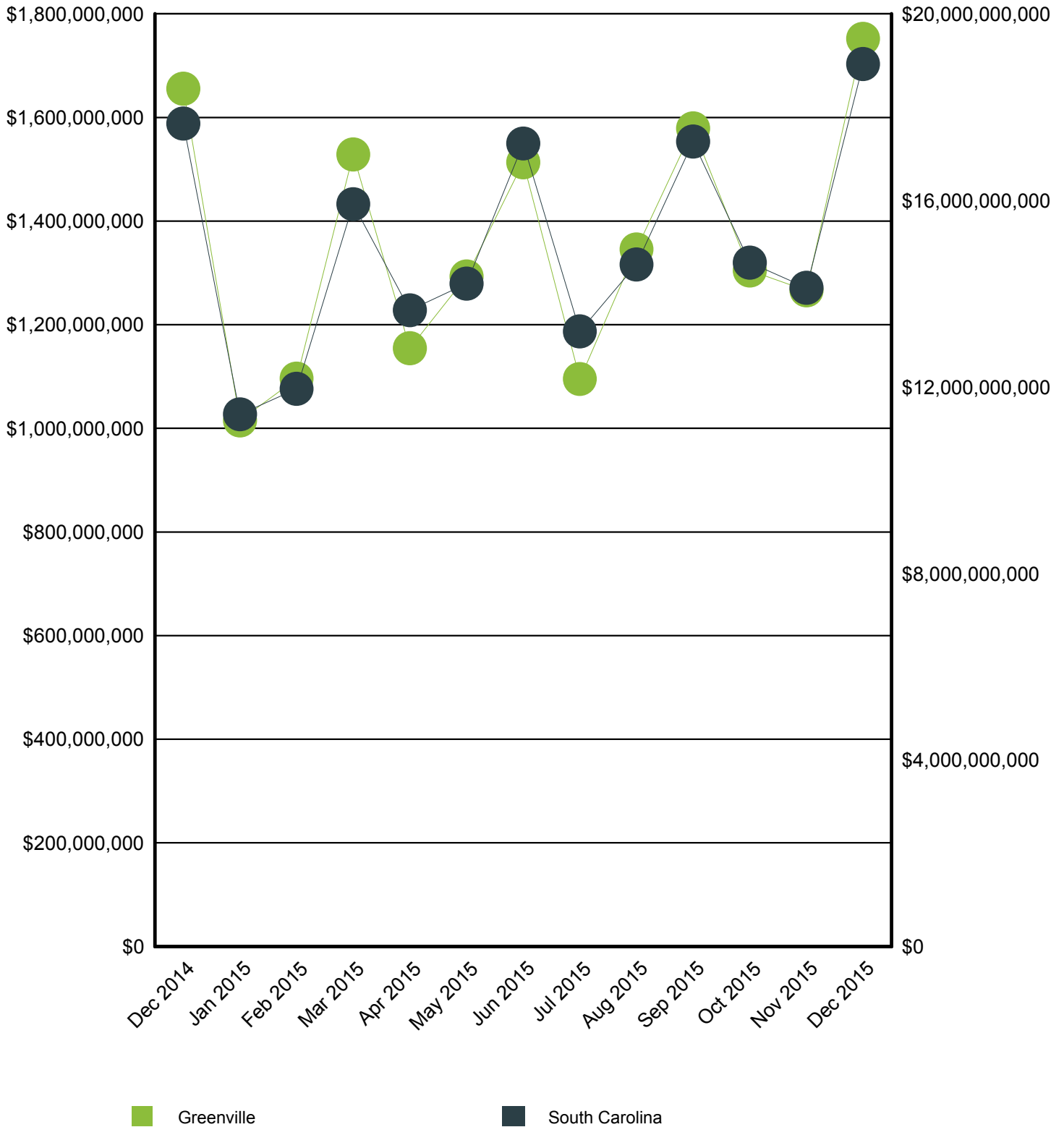

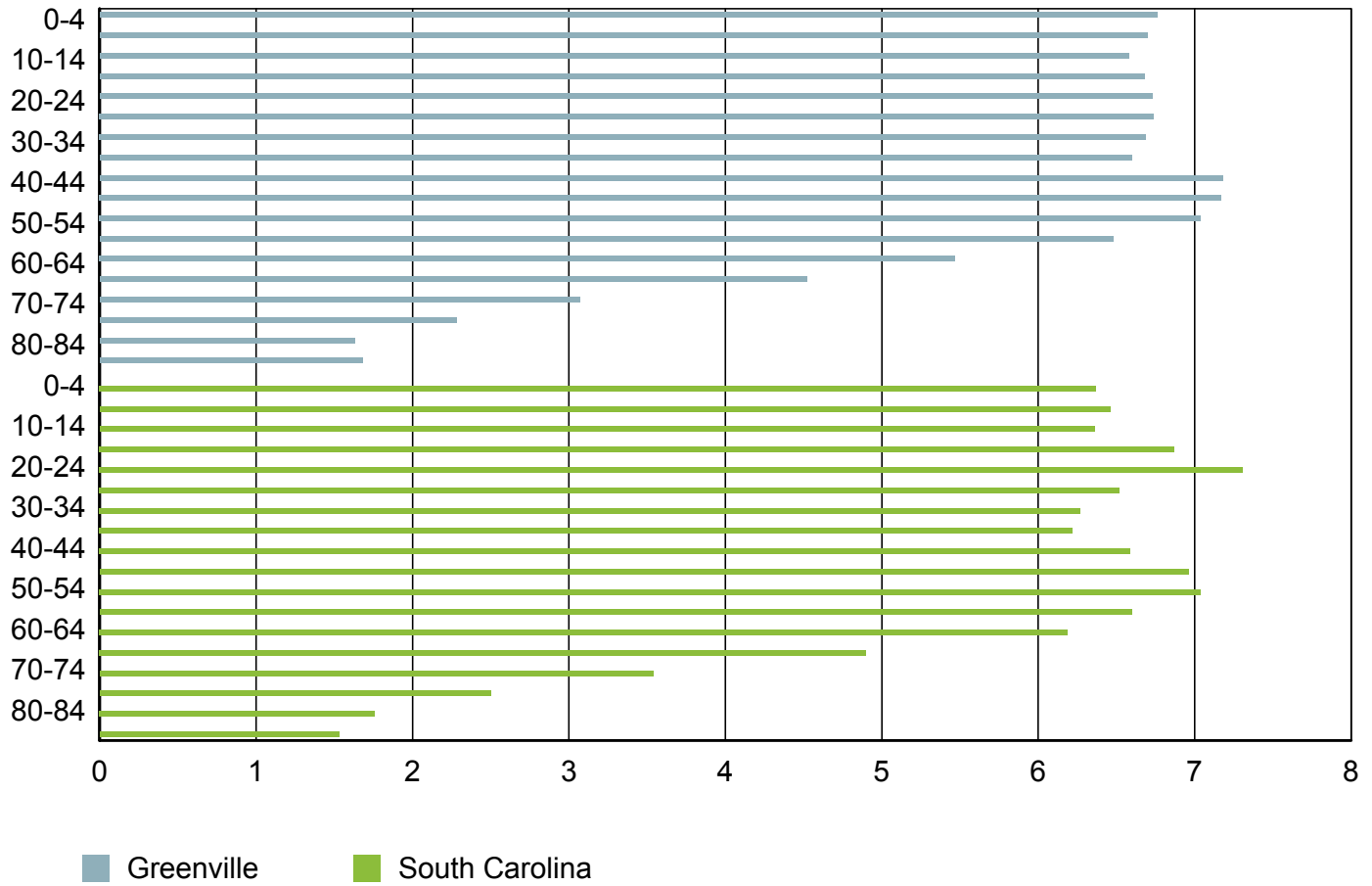

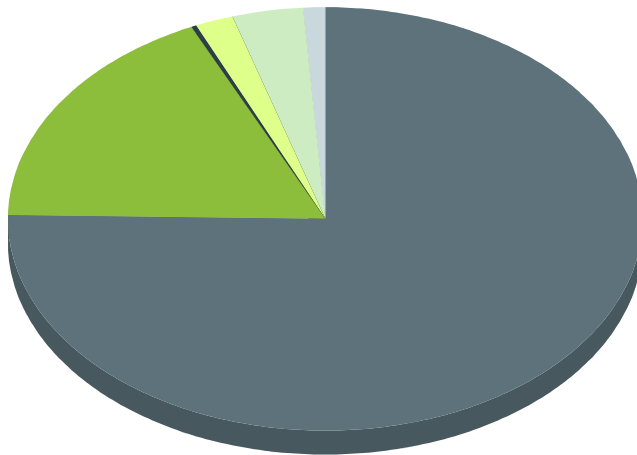

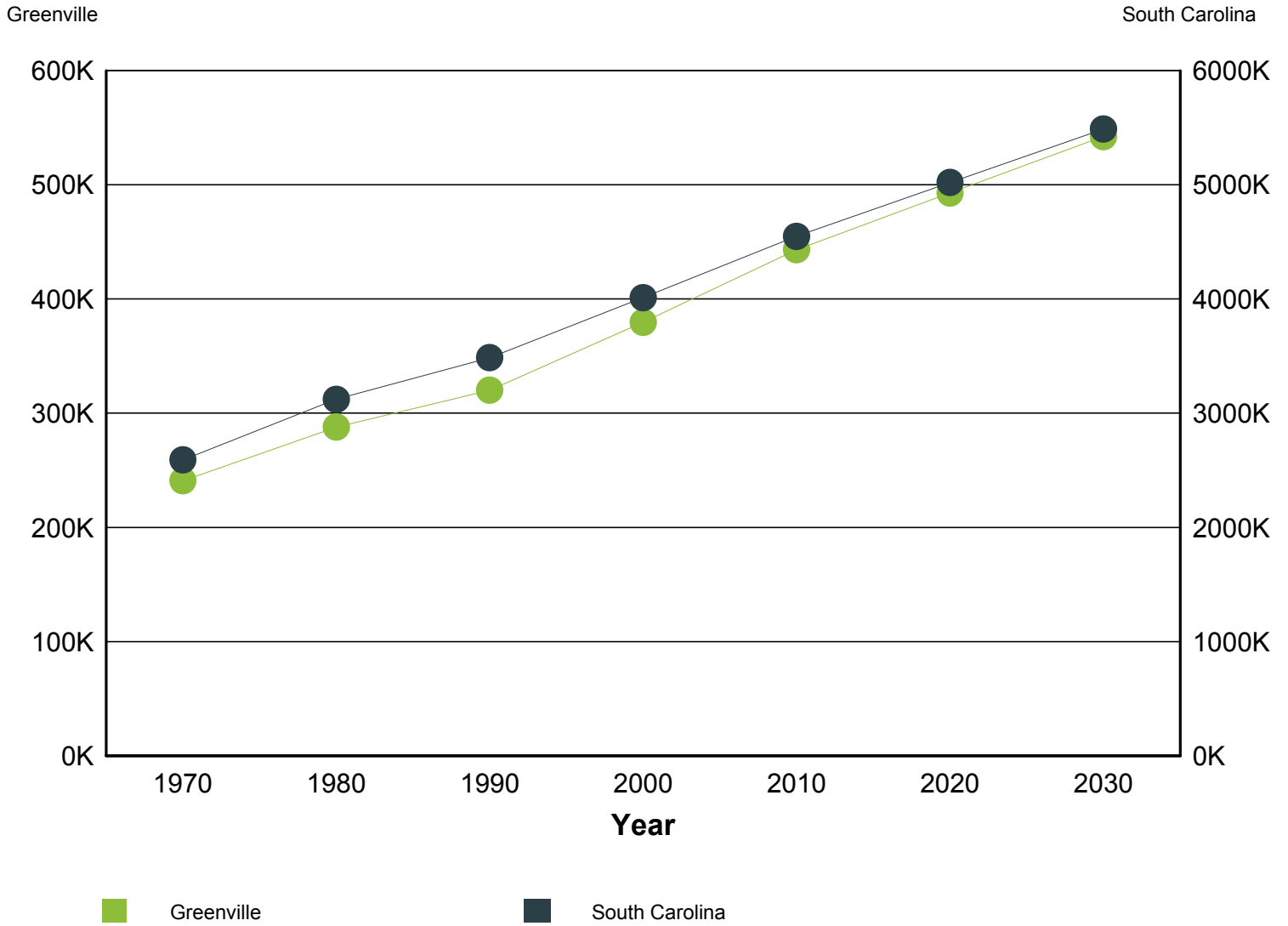

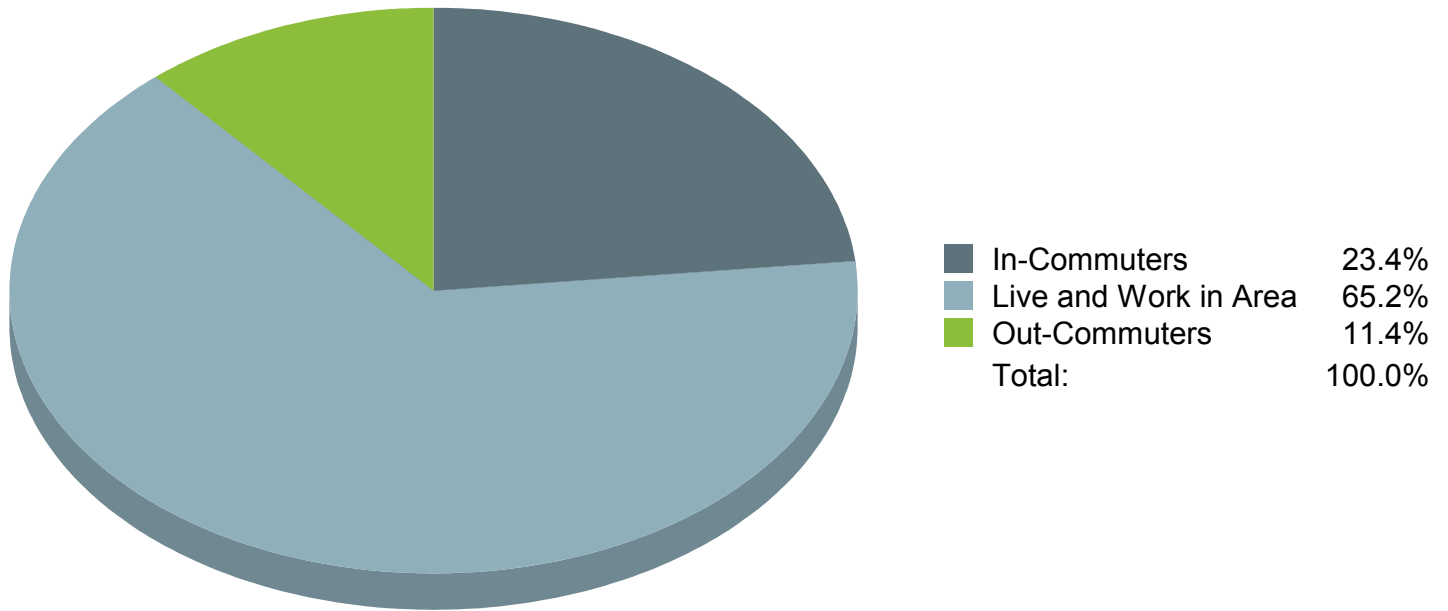

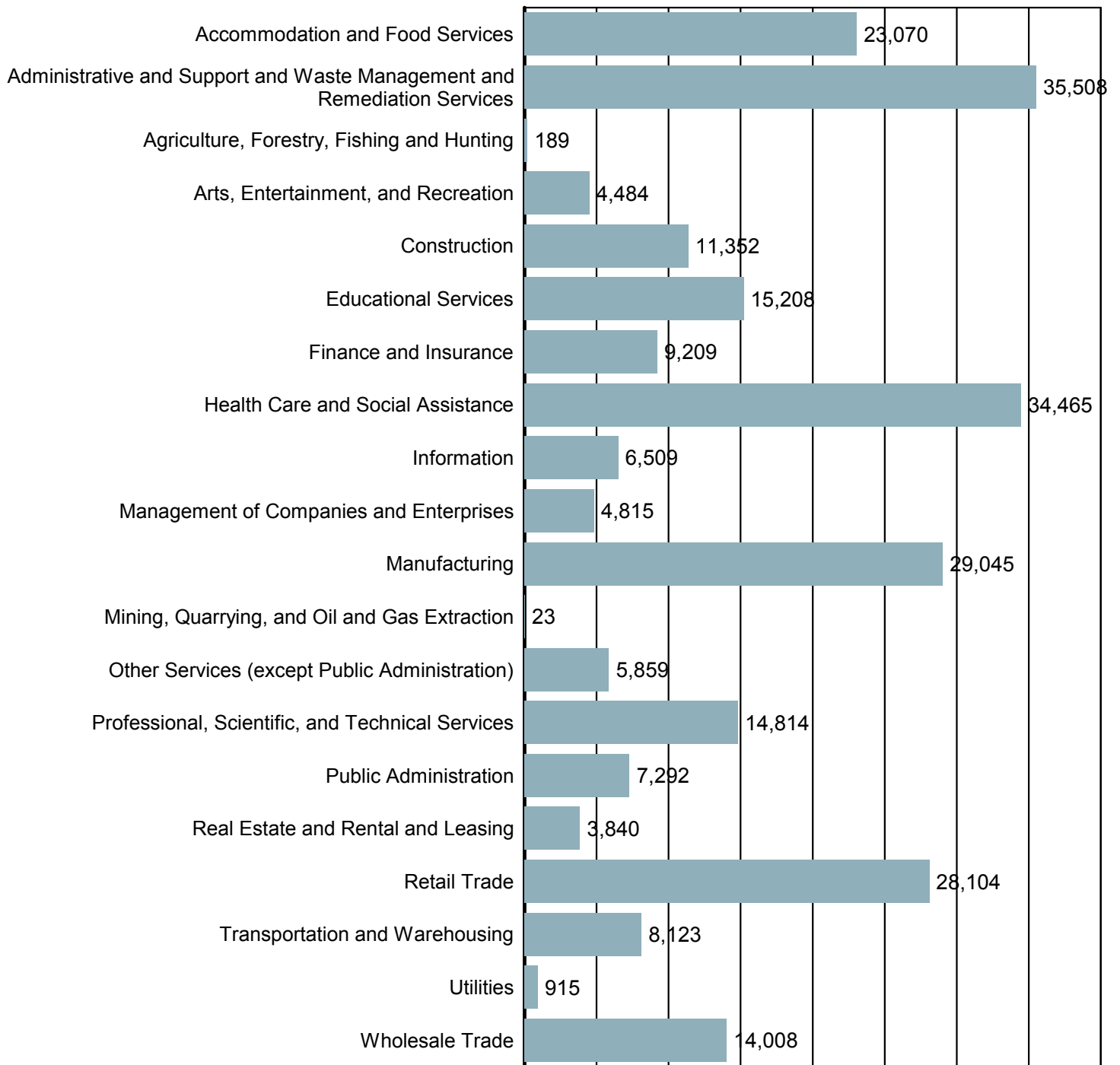

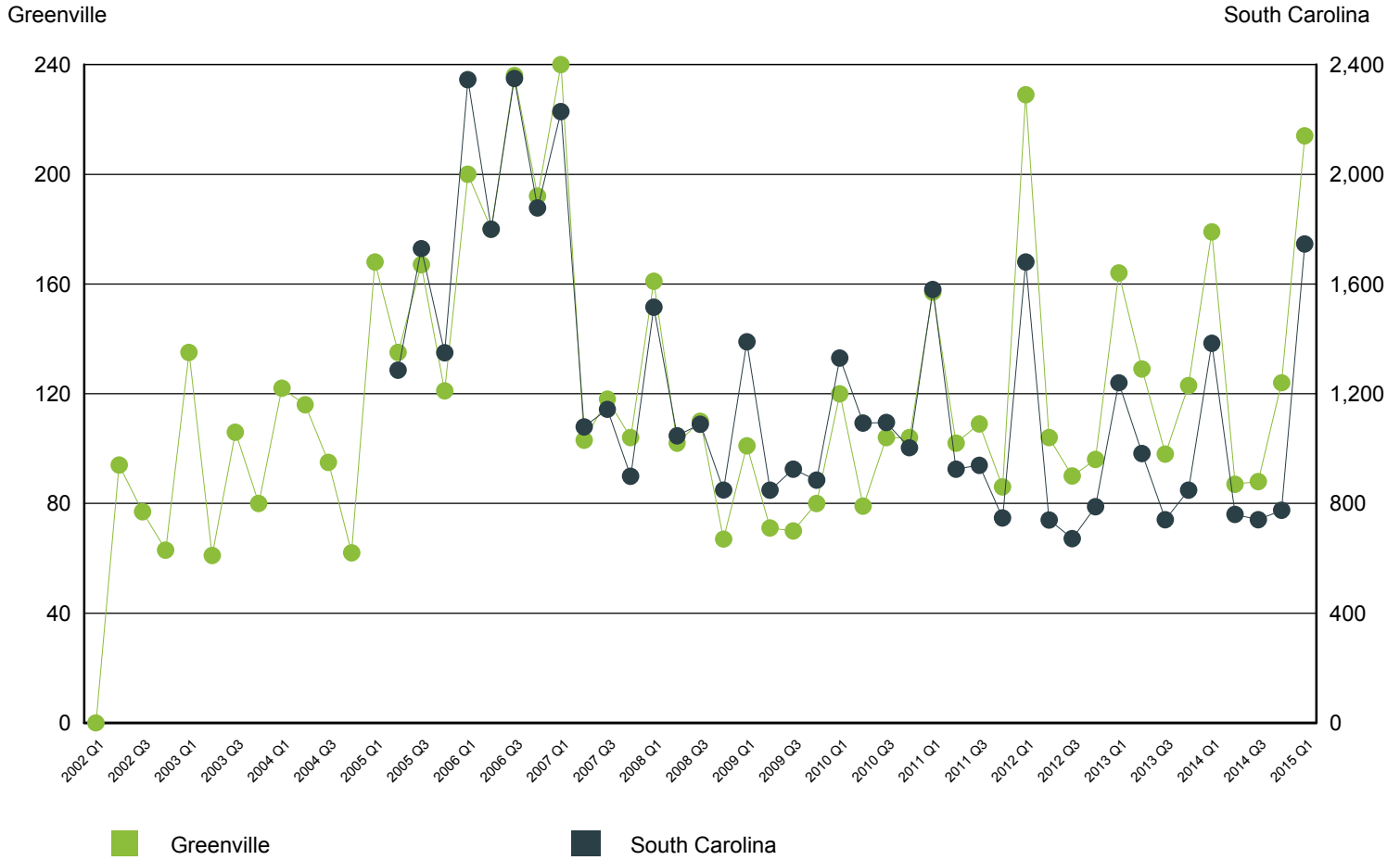

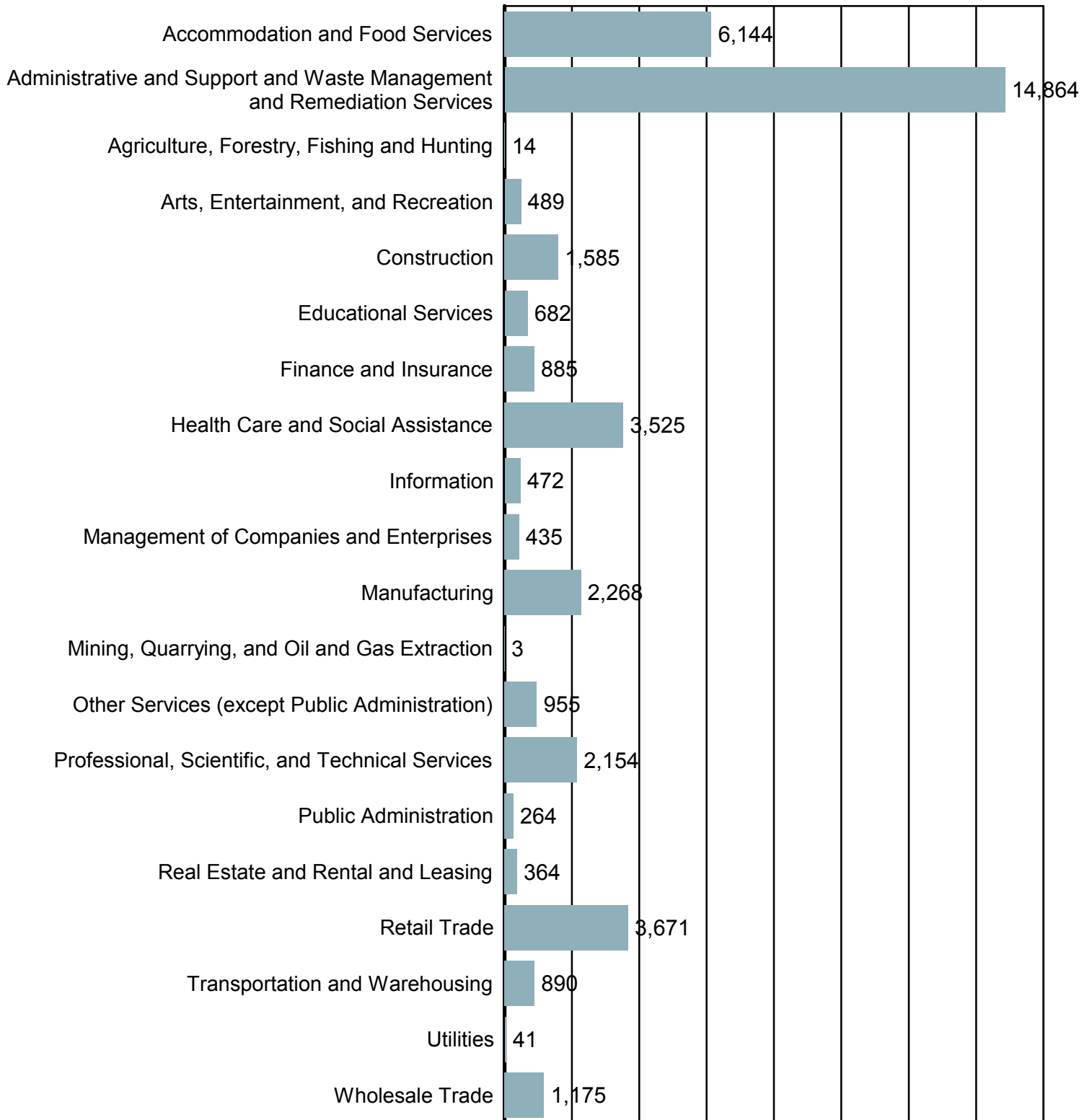

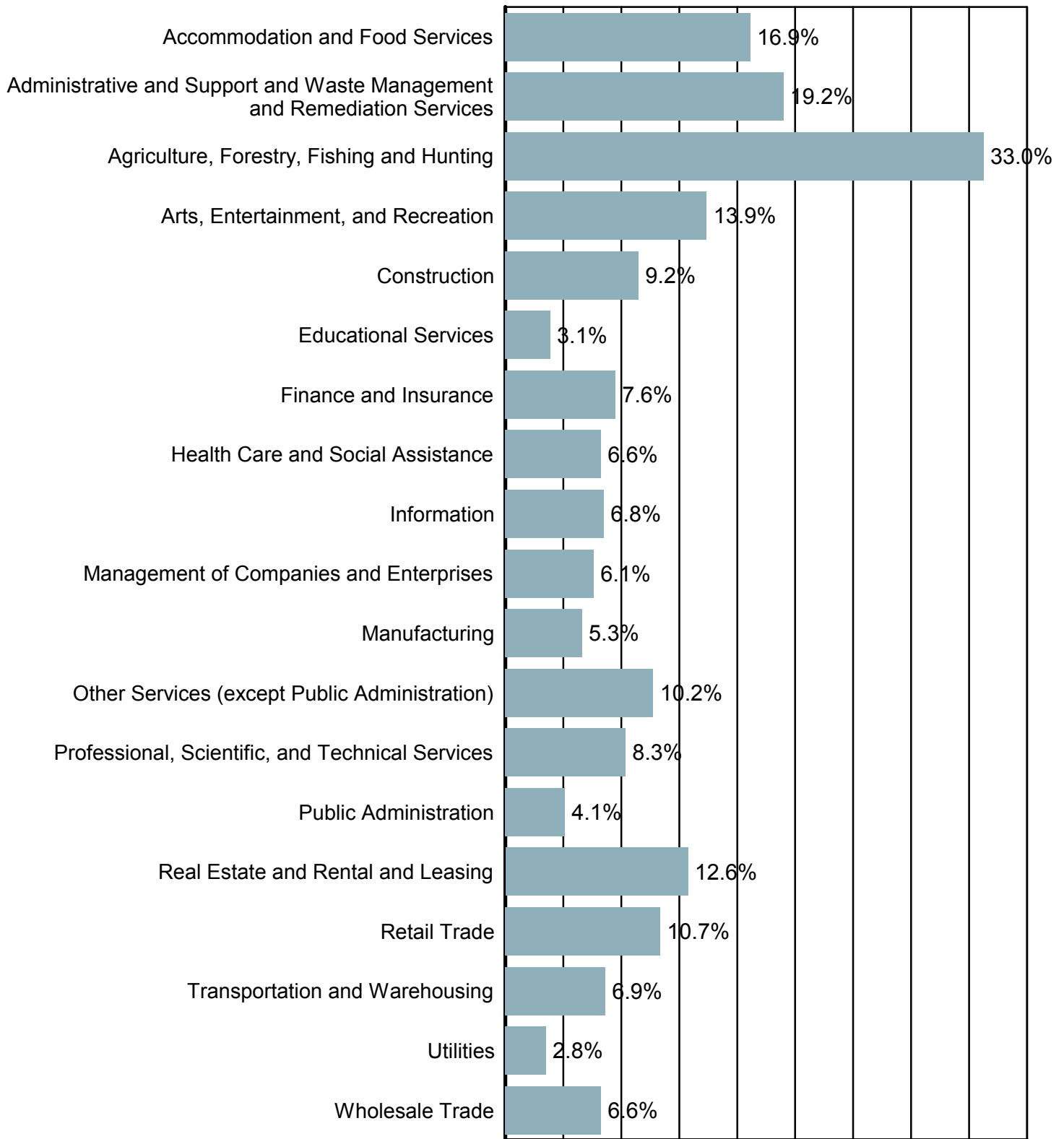

New Hires by Industry



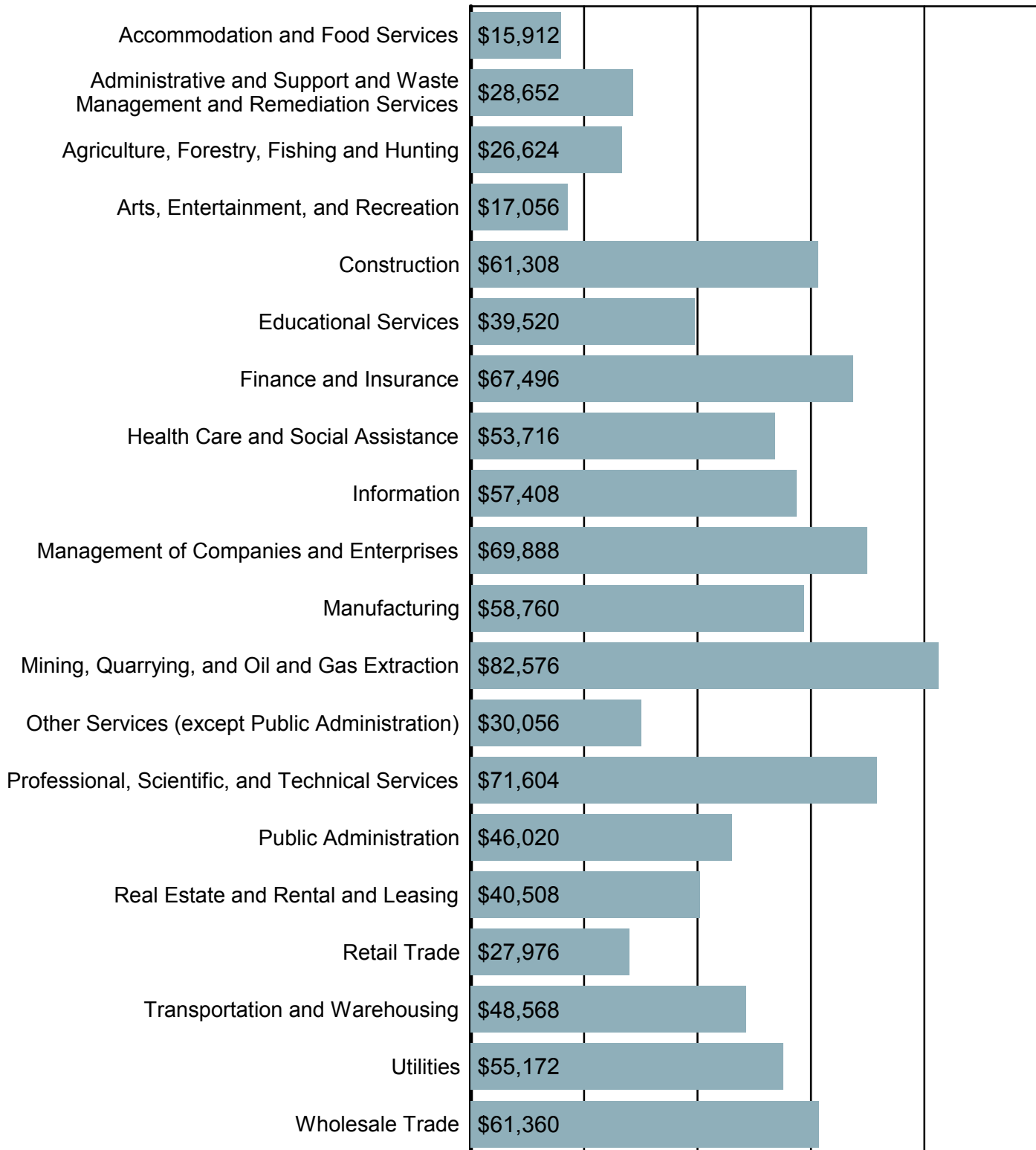

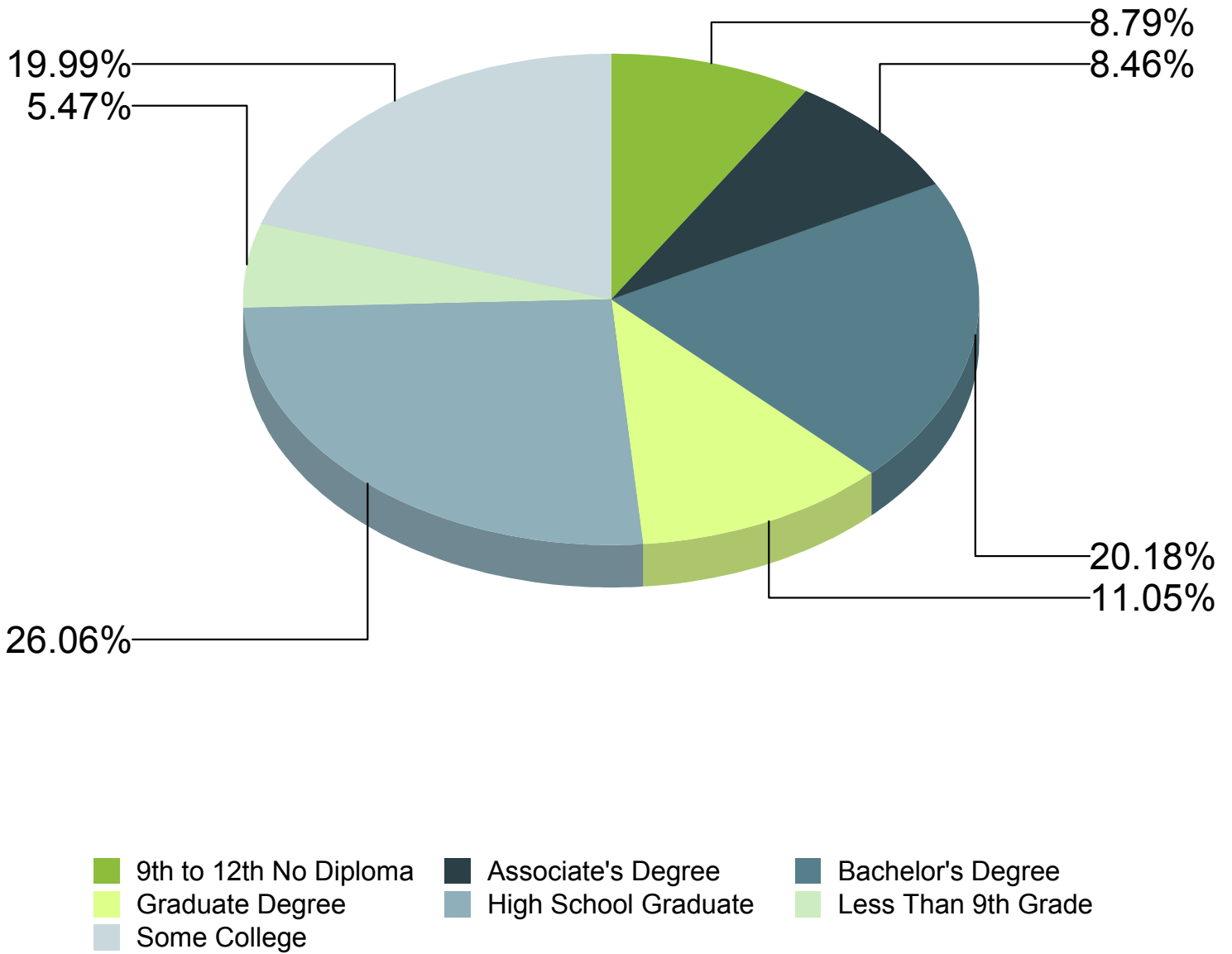

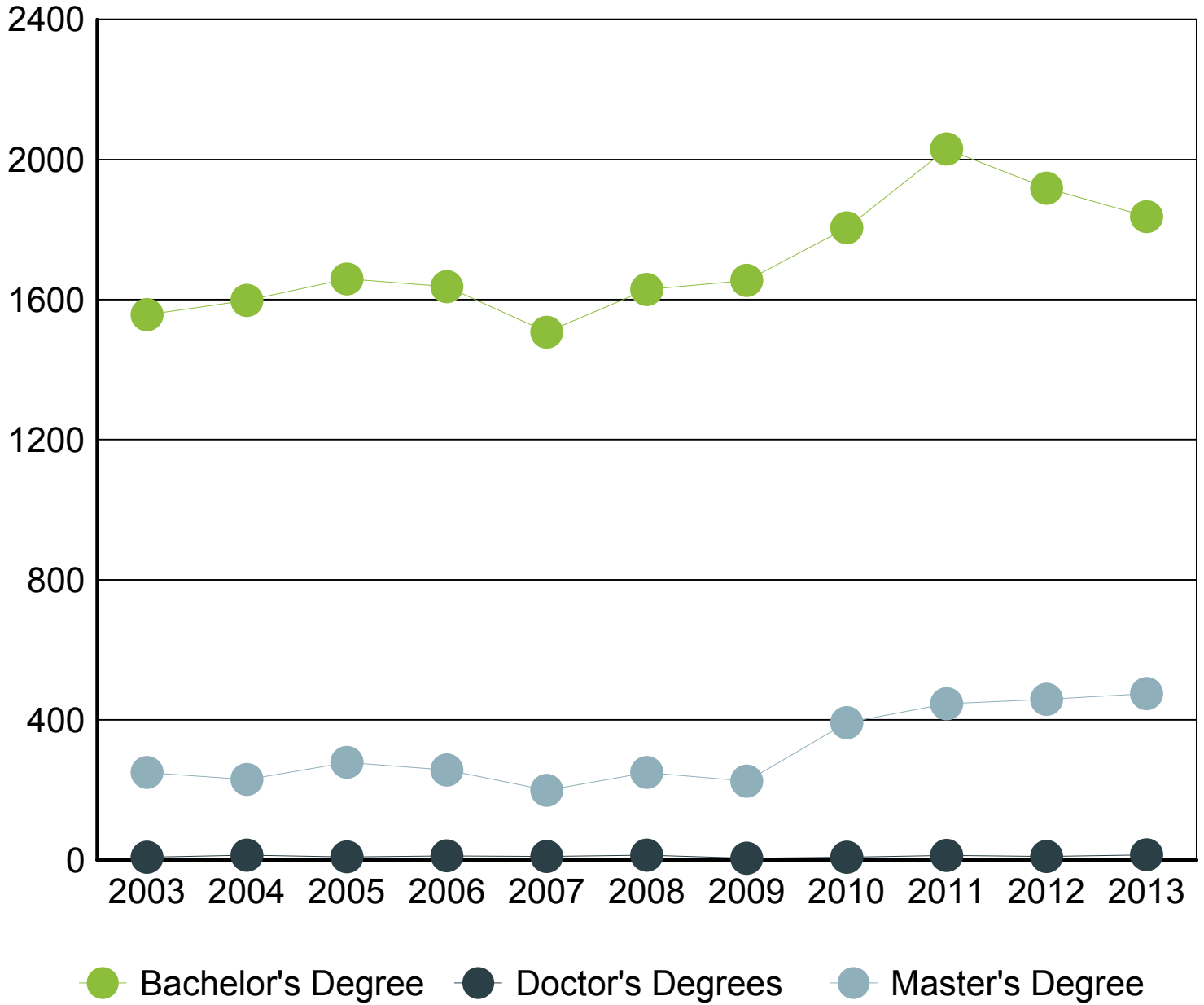
