Quality mostly plain through average. Much needed rain fell across the trade area over the weekend bringing much needed relief to pastures and stock ponds. Feeder cattle supply included 54 percent Steers, 41 percent Heifers, and 4 percent Bulls. Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 71 percent.							
Slaughter cows mostly steady to 1.00 higher. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand moderate to good. A total of 315 cows and bulls sold with 38 percent going to packers.
