WHEREAS, character education programs in our schools contribute to improved student attitudes, behavior, and academic performance; and

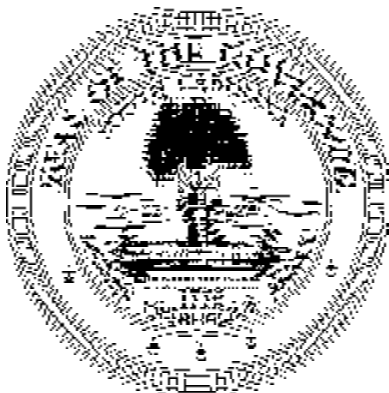
