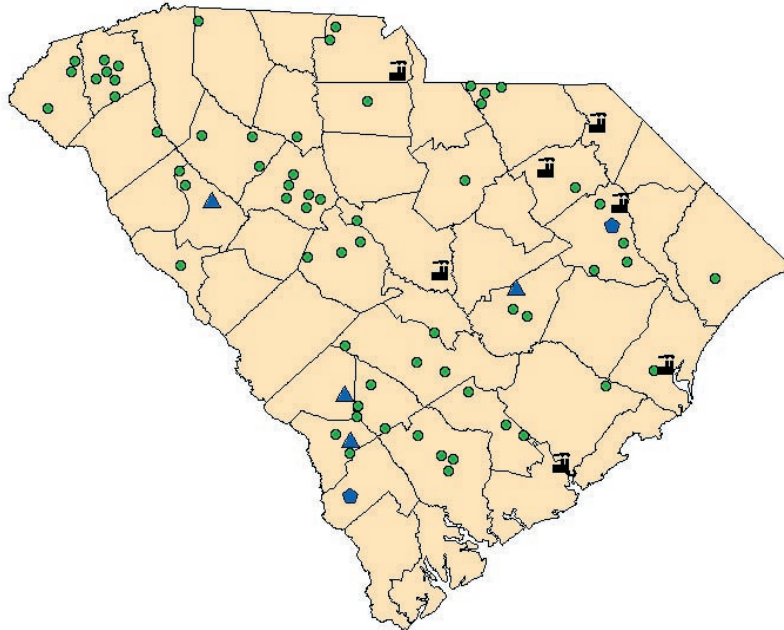

Wood Processing Mills in South Carolina

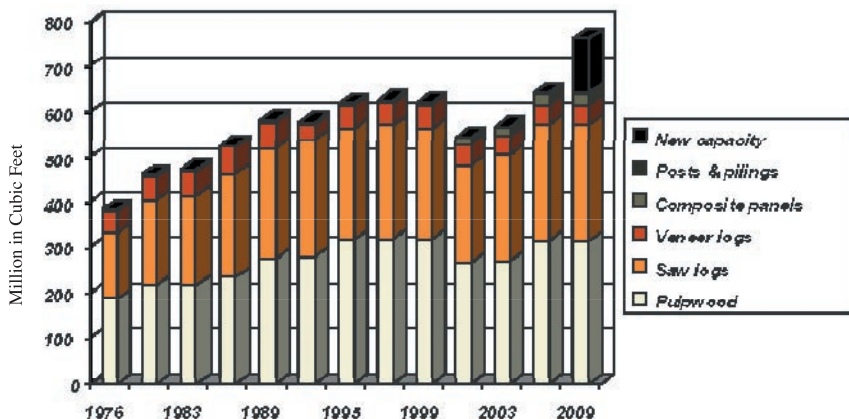


Legend

SC FACTS

- South Carolina mills now produce more forest products than ever recorded.
- Pulpwood is our leading forest product by volume, but sawtimber is South Carolina's most valuable forest product (\$482 million for sawtimber vs. \$281 million for pulpwood).
- Announced mill capacity will increase timber product output by 18%.
- South Carolina exports \$1 billion in forest products annually.
