An act of Congress changed the name to “Veterans Day” on May 24, 1954 to pay tribute to all who have served our country.

Produced by ETV’s Mark Adams, a talented videographer, director and editor, this program was developed by Mark and his daughter Morgan, a student at Crayton Middle School. Their experience at Celebrate Freedom Education Day 2009 meeting the remaining Doolittle Raiders is captured in this interesting program.

### **Gilbert Middle School Gives Flight to Veterans (NEW)**

Produced by ITV, this NEW program tells the story of Gilbert Middle School sponsoring local veterans to participate in an Honor Flight to see the memorial in Washington, DC. ETV cameras visit the school, follow the WWII veterans on the flight and join in the celebration at the school upon return.

**The Big Picture: The Greatest Generation in SC (#128)** - Nov. 4, 9:00–9:56 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
Takes a look at those who served in WWII from SC and Europeans who were POW’s in our state.

**Carolina Stories - The Vanishing Generation** – Nov. 4, 10:00–10:56 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
A powerful visualization of the first-hand accounts of WWII by South Carolina veterans.

**Carolina Stories - Always First: The SC National Guard** – Nov. 4, 11:00–11:56 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
This documentary tells the story of the SC Air National Guard that supported US efforts in the Korean War, the Berlin Crisis, Operations Desert Storm, Enduring Freedom, and Iraqi Freedom.

**Carolina Stories – Over Here: The Homefront During World War I** – Nov. 4, 12:00–12:56 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
Commemorates the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the United State’s entry into the Great War through exhibitions, lectures, a documentary, and living history performances. World War I activities on the homefront changed the SC landscape and how women and African-Americans saw themselves in society.

**ETV Forum: South Carolina and the War** – Nov. 4, 1:00–1:56 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
South Carolina Historians discuss World War II’s impact on SC and South Carolina’s impact on WWII with an audience of veterans, teachers and students.

**Southern Lens – Warbirds: Diary of An Unknown Aviator (#12)** – Nov. 4, 2:00–2:57 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
Records the memories and horrors of World War I fighter pilots. When diary was first published in 1926, it was very controversial.

**Southern Lens – My Christmas Soldier (#608)** – Nov. 4, 3:00–3:58 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
A small Georgia town struggles with the rationing and sacrifices of America at war. Contact with German POWs change a young boy’s life forever.

**Tuskegee Airmen Educational Program** – Nov. 5, 9:00–9:57 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited)  
Taped with members of this African-American distinguished WWII veterans visited Columbia. (In *StreamlineSC*)

## ETV's Take on the South Series – 2 Programs Air

Dec. 2, 10:00 a.m.–1:10 p.m. Channel 2 SL

Repeats Dec. 9, 10:00 a.m.–1:10 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

**Take on the South** is a series of one-hour debates produced by ETV for USC's Institute for Southern Studies (ISS) under a grant provided by the Watson-Brown Foundation. The Foundation's mission is "to improve education in the American South by funding its schools and students, preserving its history, encouraging responsible scholarship, and promoting the memory and values of our spiritual founders." The grant for the series was awarded to USC to bring serious academic argument to a wider audience. Two programs that have been produced air in the ITV schedule for the first time. Future topics include the economy, the environment and the arts and how they impact the South.

- **What was the Most Influential 20<sup>th</sup> Century Southern Novel? (Broadcast on ETV May 2009)** Dr. Edgar, Dr. Trudier Harris, Distinguished Professor, University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, and Dr. Noel Polk, Professor Emeritus, Mississippi State University, debate which Southern novel has been the most influential.
- **Would Southern Slavery Have Survived the South? (Broadcast on ETV November 2009)** Dr. Edgar, Dr. Peter A. Coclanis, Associate Provost, International Affairs, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and Dr. Stanley Engerman, John Munro Professor of Economics, Professor of Economics and Professor of History, University of Rochester, debate "Would Southern Slavery Have Survived the Civil War?"

## Flight School – Celebration of Wright Brothers Dec. 2

Repeats Dec. 2, 9:00–9:46 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 4–8, this series was added to the ITV schedule this school year. Produced by the Fairfax Network, the four programs examine historical, scientific and technological aspects of aviation and its impact on exploration, communication and commerce. Each program integrates science, technology, engineering, physics, and math. Program 2 entitled *Higher, Faster and Farther!* is a good one to celebrate the anniversary of the Wright Brothers flight on December 2. It examines how the knowledge of the forces of flight inspired engineers and aviators to go higher, faster and farther than ever before. From propellers to jet engines, from subsonic to supersonic, this program explores revolutionary innovations in flight speed, distance and aviation technology as well as showcases many of the pioneering women and men of yesterday and today who made it all possible. ## Deskercise – Veterans Day and Book Week Topics

Each 10-minute **Deskercise** program is built around a weekly theme. ### Video Visits: France

ITV added these French series over the past few years that are recommended for elementary and middle/high school students. **The Foreign Language Scholastic Series – French**, designed for grades 1–5, will remain in the ITV schedule. Schools have rights to **Video Visits: France** for grades 7–12, as long as ITV leases and there are no plans to remove it from the schedule anytime soon.

## PBS's Roanoak – First English Settlers in the New World

Recommended for grades 8–12, the story of the first English settlement in the New World is retold in this popular PBS special series of three programs. The myths and legends of the disappearance of these early settlers are explored in a dramatic reenactment of the "lost colony." Produced in 1986, each program is 56 to 58 minutes in duration.

- ❖ **Idella Bodie’s Ghost Tour: A WRITER’S GUIDE with the Author** (grades 4-6) *SL*

Repeats Nov. 9, 10:30–11:13 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

This program was developed for students using *The Mystery of the Pirate’s Treasure* by Idella Bodie and features the author talking about the book and her writing process.

- ❖ **Inside Writing** (grades 5–12) *SL*

Repeats Nov. 9, 11:15 a.m.–2:02 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

This series features prominent authors who have visited our state and allows students to hear them talk about how they develop their ideas, story lines and characters.

- ❖ **William Price Fox** – (24 minutes) A popular American novelist who graduated from USC and was a Writer-in-Residence there until 2007, Fox wrote *Southern Fried* and *Doctor Golf*. He tried to make every book different from the one before it. He also wrote for many national magazines.
- ❖ **Natalie Dupree** – (34 minutes) She is the author of ten best-selling cookbooks and host of 300 TV shows, which have aired on PBS, The Learning Channel and The Food Network. Famous for starting the New Southern Cooking movement now found in restaurants throughout the South.
- ❖ **Dinah Johnson** – (11 minutes) Born in Charleston, a graduate of Spring Valley High School and resident of Columbia, she wrote several books for children and is a contributor to *In Daddy’s Arms I am Tall: African Americans Celebrating Fathers*. She holds a Ph.D. from Yale and teaches at USC.

### **Native-American Folktales** SL

Designed for grades 4–8, this program features four tales from different Native-American groups that are presented using music and animation. The stories assist students in understanding the culture and experiences of Native Americans. Stories presented are: *Storytelling Stone*, *Pelican Girl*, *The Boy Who Loved Bears*, and *The Turkey Girl*. This program was added to the ITV schedule in 2007.

### **Native America** SL

Repeat block feed Nov. 2, 1:30–2:49 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

The series introduces the issues that Native Americans faced in our history. The five lessons, which are designed for grades 5–8, are each approximately 14 minutes and 30 seconds in duration. Lesson 3 is entitled *Culture Issues*. This series was added in 2005-06.

### **Native American Month Shorts** SL

Repeat block feed Nov. 2, 2:55–3:31 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

These 29 short program segments are each between 20 and 35 seconds in duration. They are good for schools to include in school news programs for elementary through high school. Dr. Will Moreau Goins, who is with the Eastern Cherokee, Southern Iroquois and United Tribes of South Carolina, Inc. worked with ETV to produce these segments several years ago.

### **Nation to Nation**

Repeats Nov. 3, 8:00–9:30 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 9-12, this program explores whether George Washington's Indian diplomacy and policies set the stage for 19<sup>th</sup> century American Policy. As our first President George Washington faced a myriad of challenges solidifying the nation under one federal head as well as overseeing foreign relations with both European nations and the Indian nations of America. Lesson four in **The U.S. History Field Trips** series is entitled **Native American Regional Cultures**. This lesson is good to use during Native American Month. Lesson five is Plimoth Plantation, which talks about our country's early settlers. The **U.S. History Field Trips** series engages 4–8 grade students in the study of our nation's history by making it come to life. The programs cover some of the most widely taught standards-based topics in elementary and middle school history and geography.

## The Snowbird Cherokees – ETV Special Repeats

Repeats Nov. 3, 11:00–11:57 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

An ETV production made possible through funding from the South Carolina Humanities Council, the North Carolina Humanities Council, the Georgia Humanities Council, and SECA (now NETA), repeats in the ITV schedule. **The Snowbird Cherokees** examines the past, present and future of these Native Americans who live inside the western border of North Carolina. The documentary focuses on their spiritual nature and their struggle to maintain this part of their cultural heritage.



## Curriculum and Content Corner...highlighting Veteran's Day and Citizenship... with Dianne L. Gregory

**Veterans' Day** is an important school celebration as we honor those who have admirably served in the United States military. Originally known as "Armistice Day," November 11<sup>th</sup> is the anniversary of the armistice signed by the Allies and the Germans ending World War I. An act of Congress changed the name to "Veterans' Day" on May 24, 1954 to pay tribute to all who have served our country. To assist you in developing your lesson plan for this important day, let me encourage you to preview our **ITV** resources. ***Serving Their Country: SC's Greatest Generation*** and ***Tuskegee Airmen***, available through **ITV** and **StreamlineSC**, provide a unique opportunity to meet the heroes of this period in our

history. Hear the stories of South Carolinians as they relate their experiences during World War II. One of our most memorable programs, ***Holocaust Remembrance Specials: Paul Argiewics: Holocaust Survivor***, involves the experience of watching Paul Argiewics recount his personal experience of courage as a Holocaust survivor during World War II.

Complete with teacher's guide and correlated to the SC Curriculum Standards, this program is a must for students to have an appreciation of their freedoms today. Through the calendar feature of **StreamlineSC**, the commemoration of Veterans' Day is a learning experience worth remembering. Another local content program is entitled ***South Carolina and The War-ETV Forum*** which highlights the impact of World War II on our state and its citizens. Beryl Dakers hosts a live studio audience of WWII historians, teachers, students, WWII veterans, and the general public as they discuss Prisoner of War camps in South Carolina, the impact of the GI Bill of Rights on South Carolina's returning veterans, the role of the military in the early civil rights initiative, as well as the impact the war had on our state's industries. Segmented into 14 video clips, this program is a means of understanding the impact of WWII on South Carolina. **ITV** with **StreamlineSC** assists in bringing history to life in the classroom.

The responsibility of **citizenship** is an important trait to instill in our students of all ages. The **ITV** program available on **StreamlineSC**, ***The U.S. Flag: Proper Rules and Display***, is a six minute program that demonstrates the proper techniques for displaying and respecting the American flag, including how to raise and lower a flag as well as correct etiquette for singing the National Anthem. This program also includes a list of things that should never be done to a flag. ***The Almost Painless Guide Series*** encompasses five lessons which give an overview of the Election Process, the Executive Branch, the Judicial Branch, the Legislative Branch, and the US Constitution. Geared for upper elementary and middle/high school students, this series utilizes contemporary and archival video footage to offer a fresh approach to the study of civics. Produced by **ETV** in conjunction with **ITV**, ***South Carolina Elects Its Leaders*** is designed to assist students in understanding the role of political parties in our state. The duties of South Carolina's constitutional officers are highlighted without emphasizing the holders of these offices. From fifteen to seventeen minutes in length, the eight programs in the series are designed for upper elementary and middle/high school students. A teacher's guide accompanies the series.

Holiday programs abound on **ITV** and **StreamlineSC**. President Abraham Lincoln made Thanksgiving a national holiday in 1863, designating the fourth Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day. For younger students, ***Holiday Facts & Fun: Thanksgiving*** and ***Thanksgiving Day: America Celebrates*** give students an understanding of the importance of Thanksgiving to our heritage. Upper level students will be introduced to the issues that Native Americans faced in our history in the ***Native America Series***.

The CWEFT programs use 21<sup>st</sup> century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. - Feb. 11, 2010 *The Slave Trade* – Beginning with the American Revolution, this program explores the U.S. law of 1807 that abolished the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Meet the people who were involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: the slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains, common seamen, government officials, Navy officers, and anti-slavery activists.
- Mar. 11, 2010 *The Rights of Youth* (premiere) – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. ## Using a PC

1) Make a folder for your videos on your computer. (On the Desktop or under My Documents or your favorite place to save.)

In Streamline

2) Go to a video. Scroll down just a bit and look under the video preview window.

There are several settings here.

3) Find the Closed Captioning icon and click it once to Enable CC.

4) If downloading, download the video AND the CC text file and save both in the same folder. The file names must be the SAME.

## In Windows Media Player

5) Play the video. (Either click on the video to play it from where you saved it or open Windows Media player and then open the video file.)

6) Find the Play menu and go to "Lyrics, Captions, Subtitles" and turn it ON with a click. There will be a checkmark beside it when it is ON. (You may need to right-click in the gray bar at the top near the right side to find the menus.)

7) Find the Tools menu. Go to Options. Click on the Security tab. Check "Run Script commands when present" and "Show local captions when present." Click Apply and OK.

8) Exit/close Windows Media player.

9) Reopen/Replay your video. You should see the closed caption now.
