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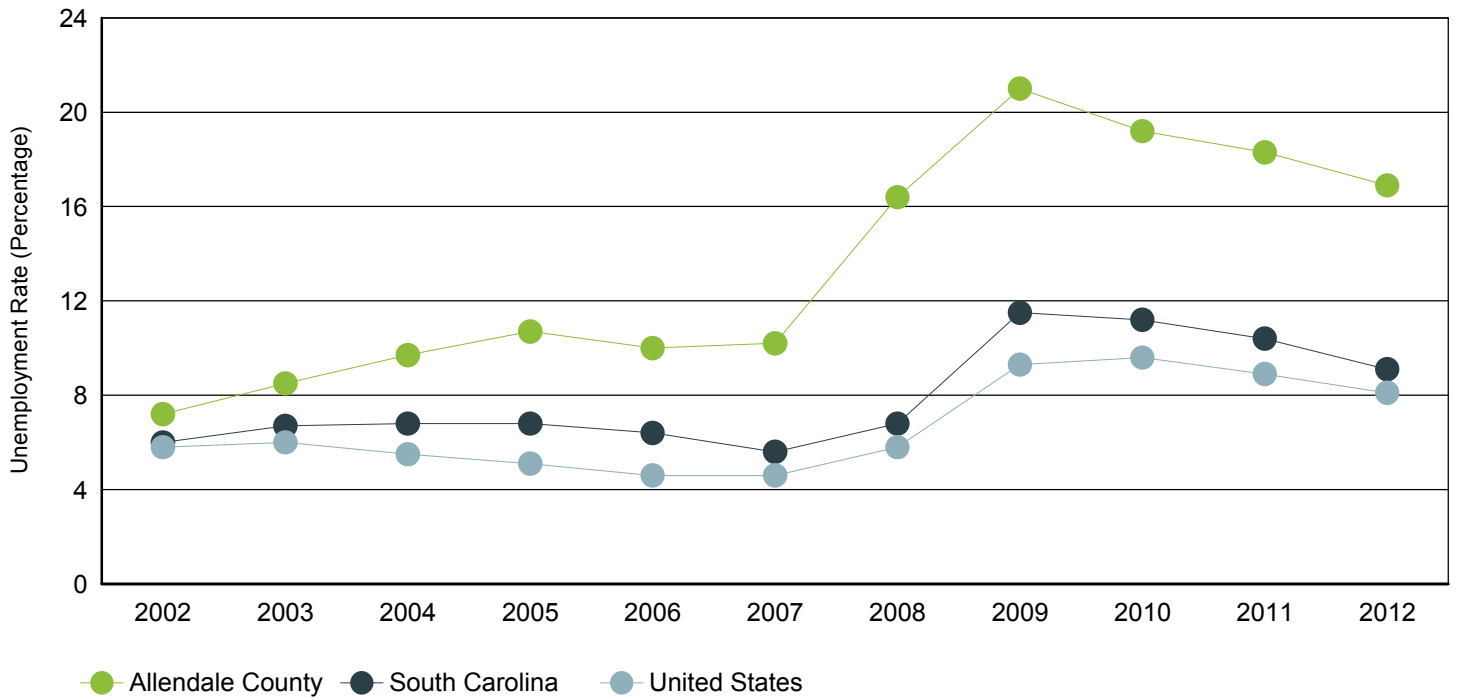

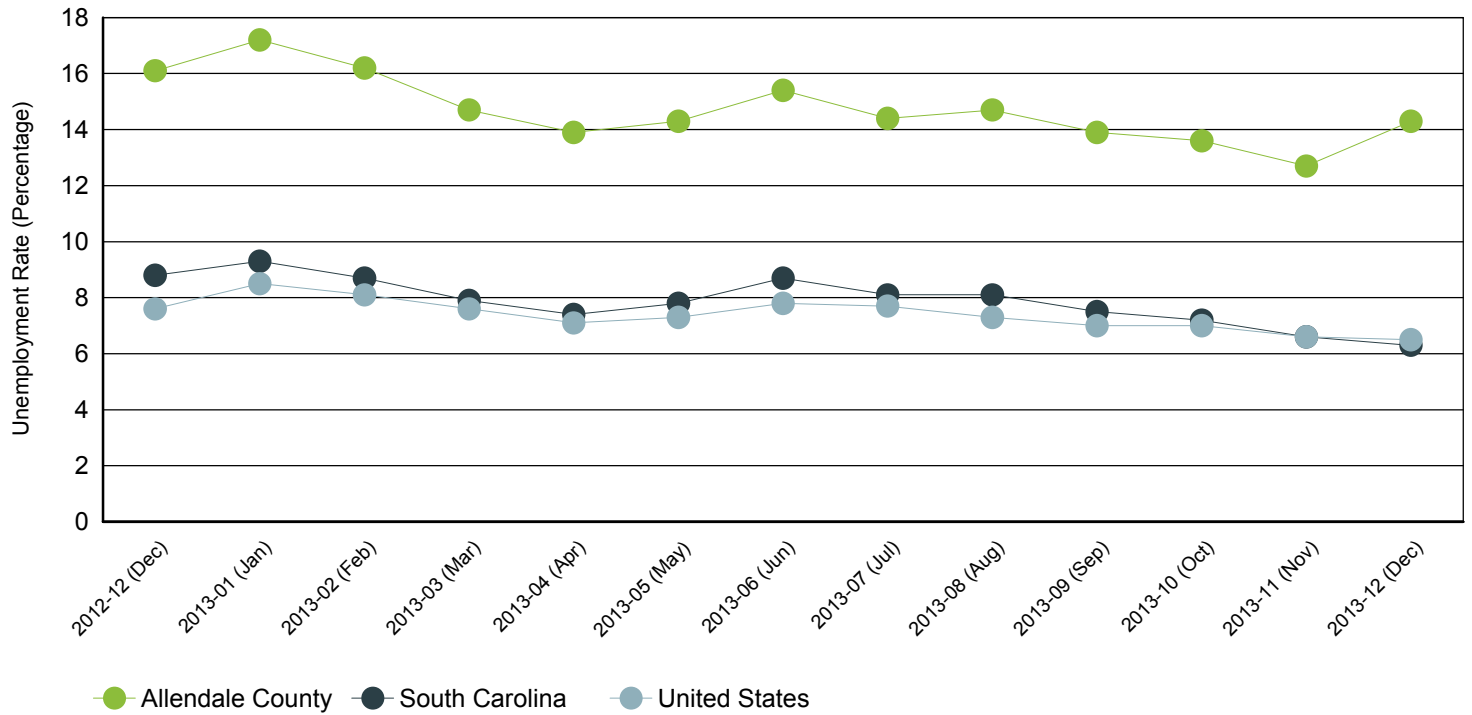

Past 13 Months



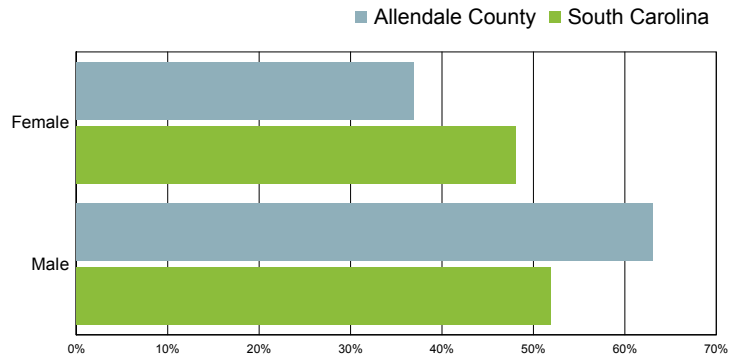

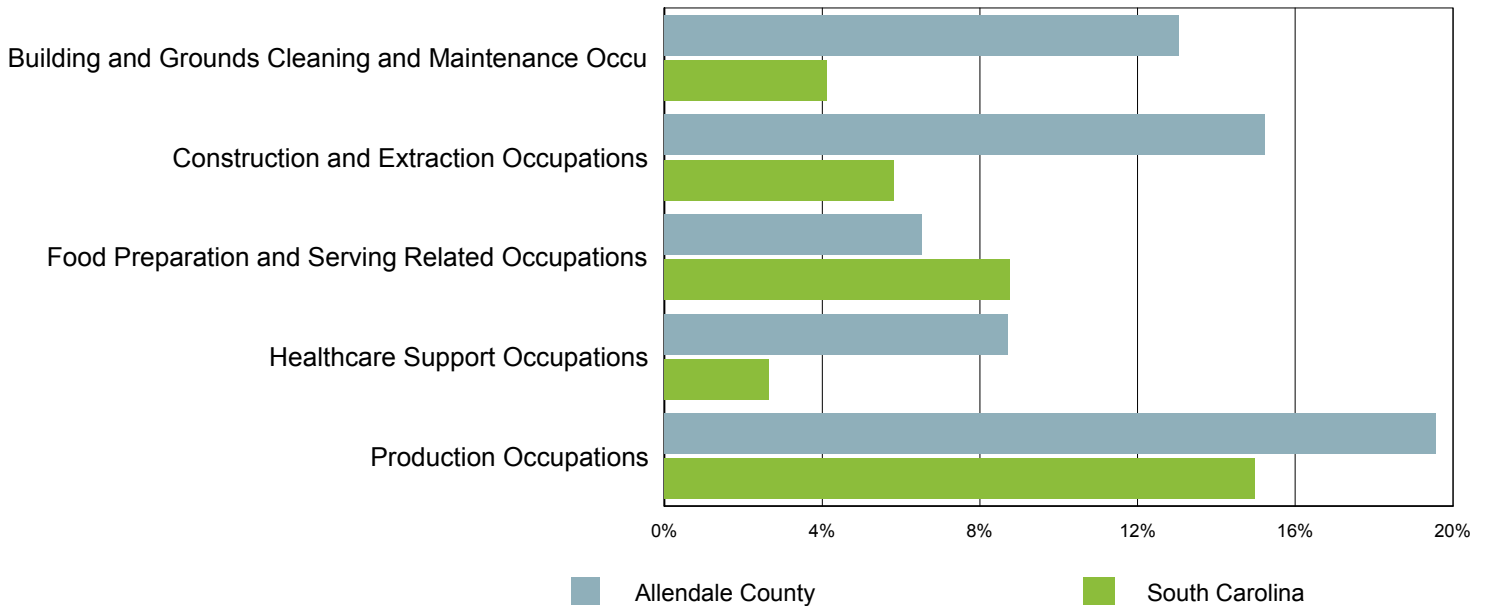

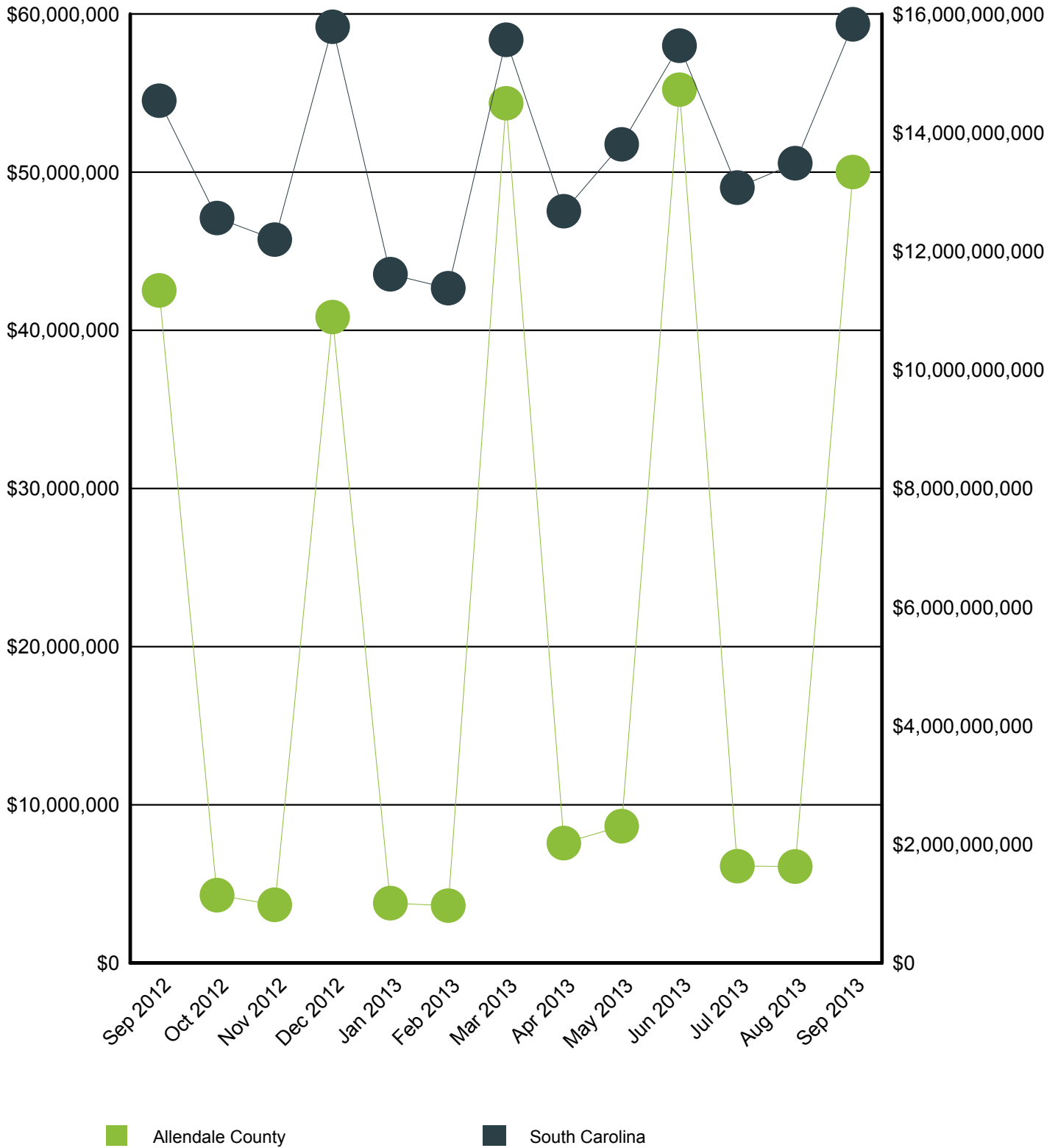

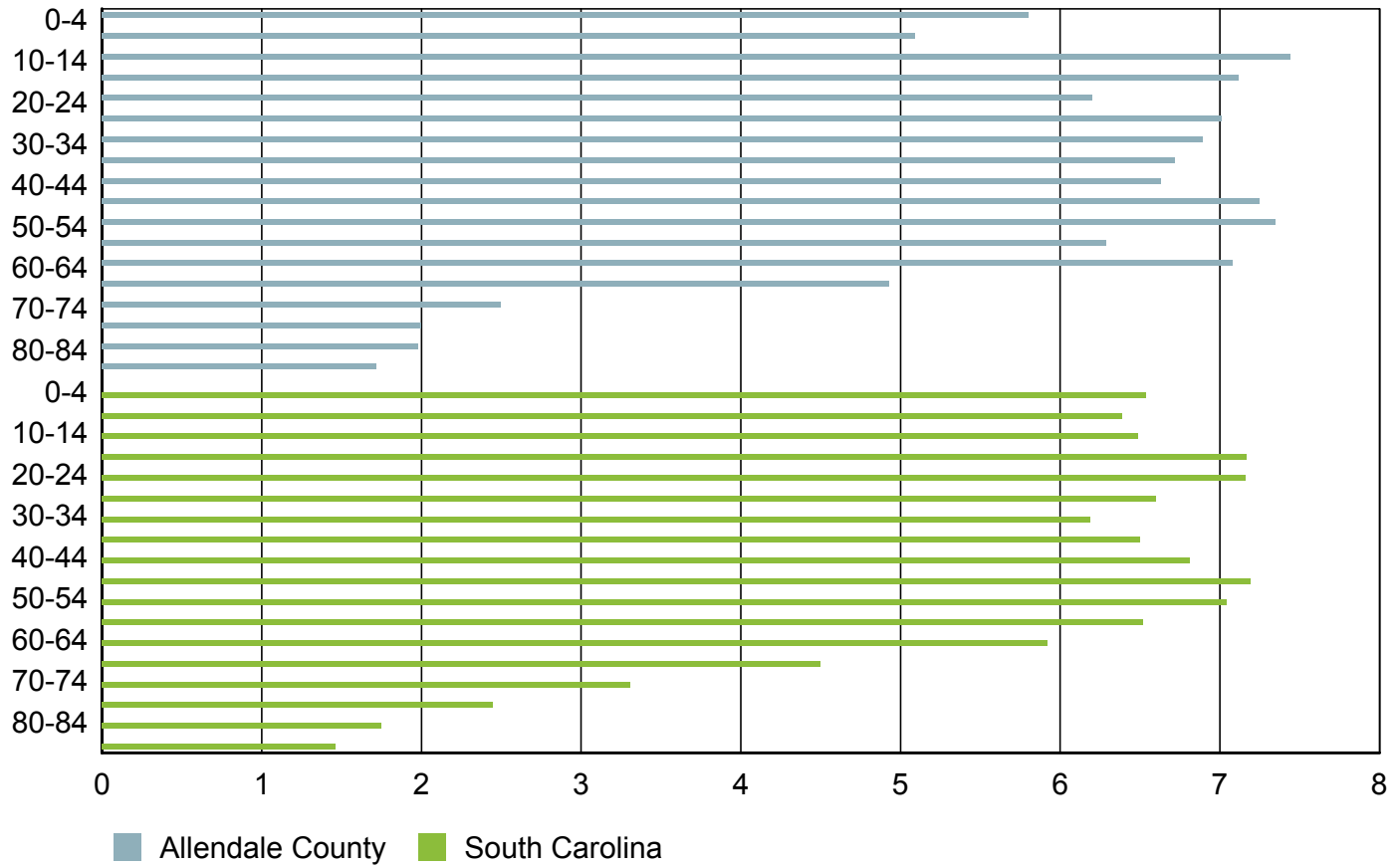

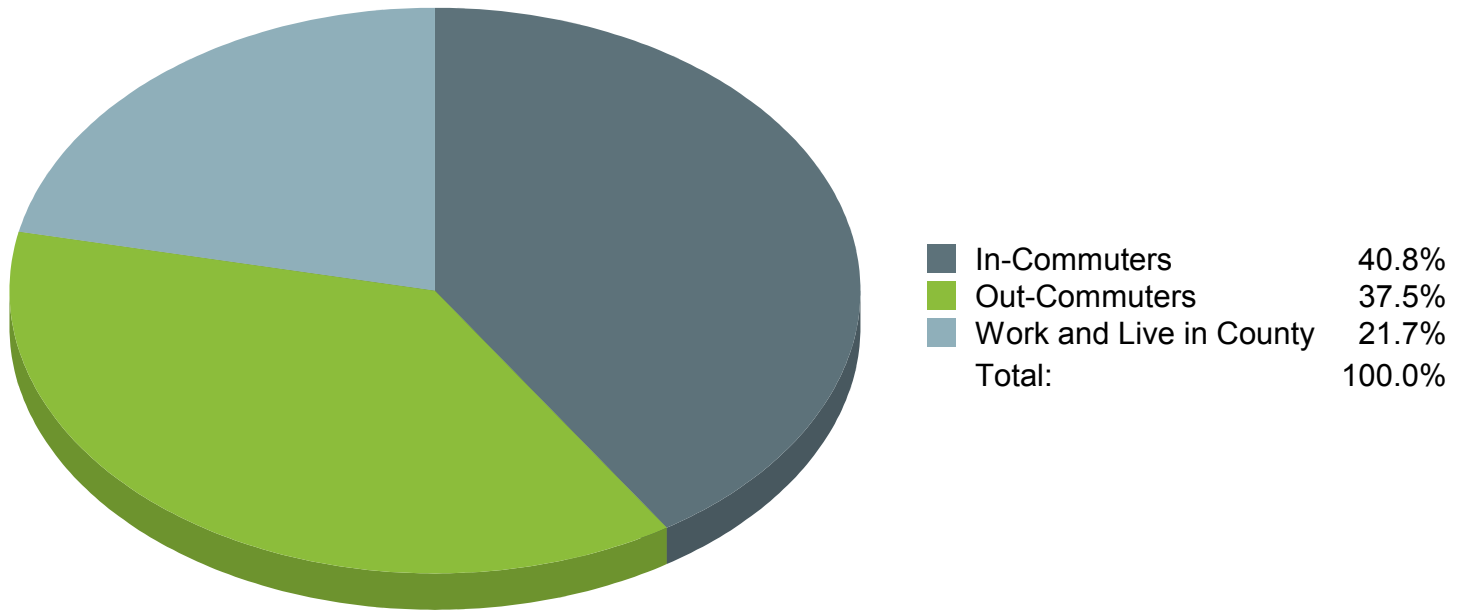

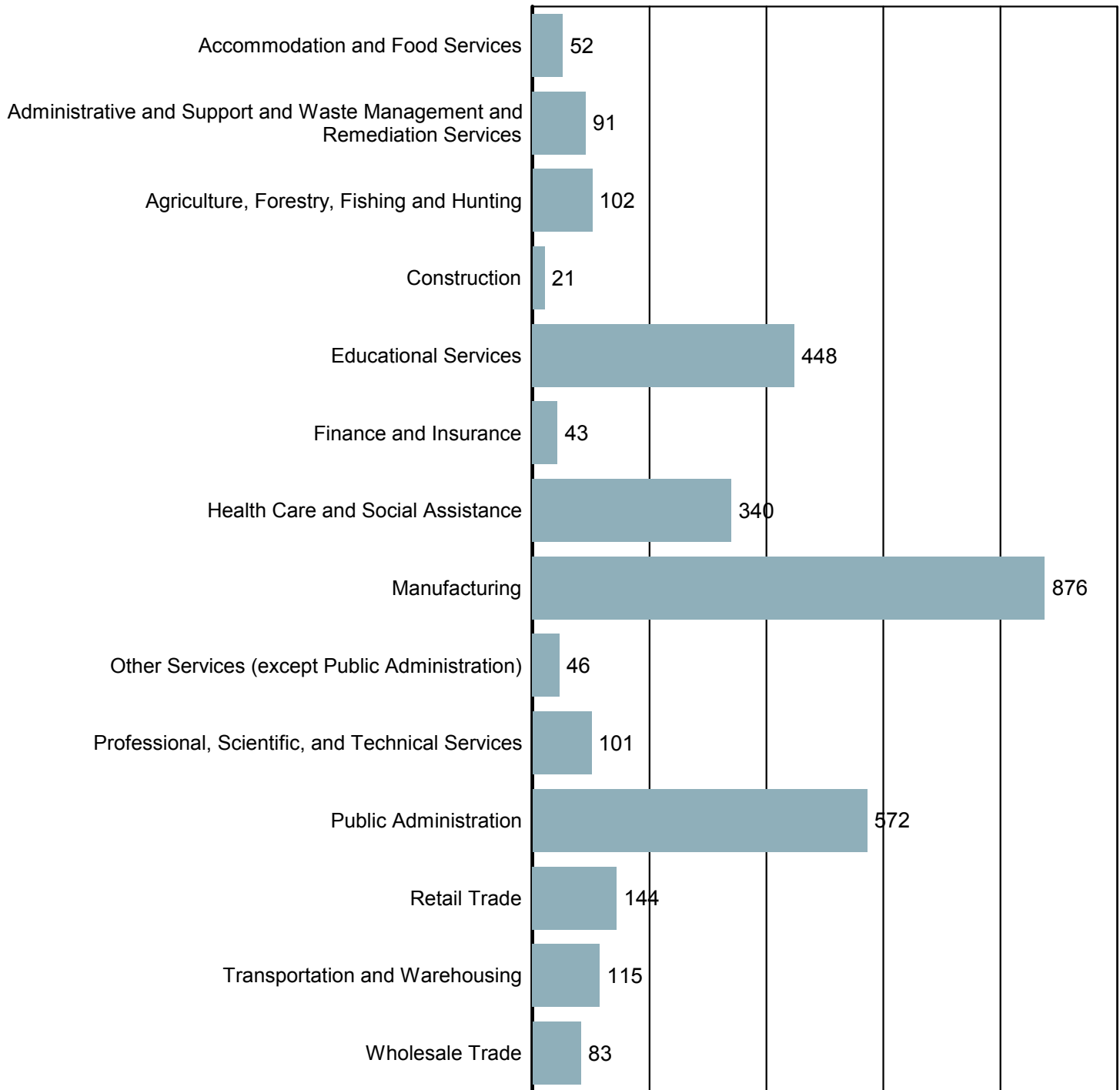

Employment by Industry

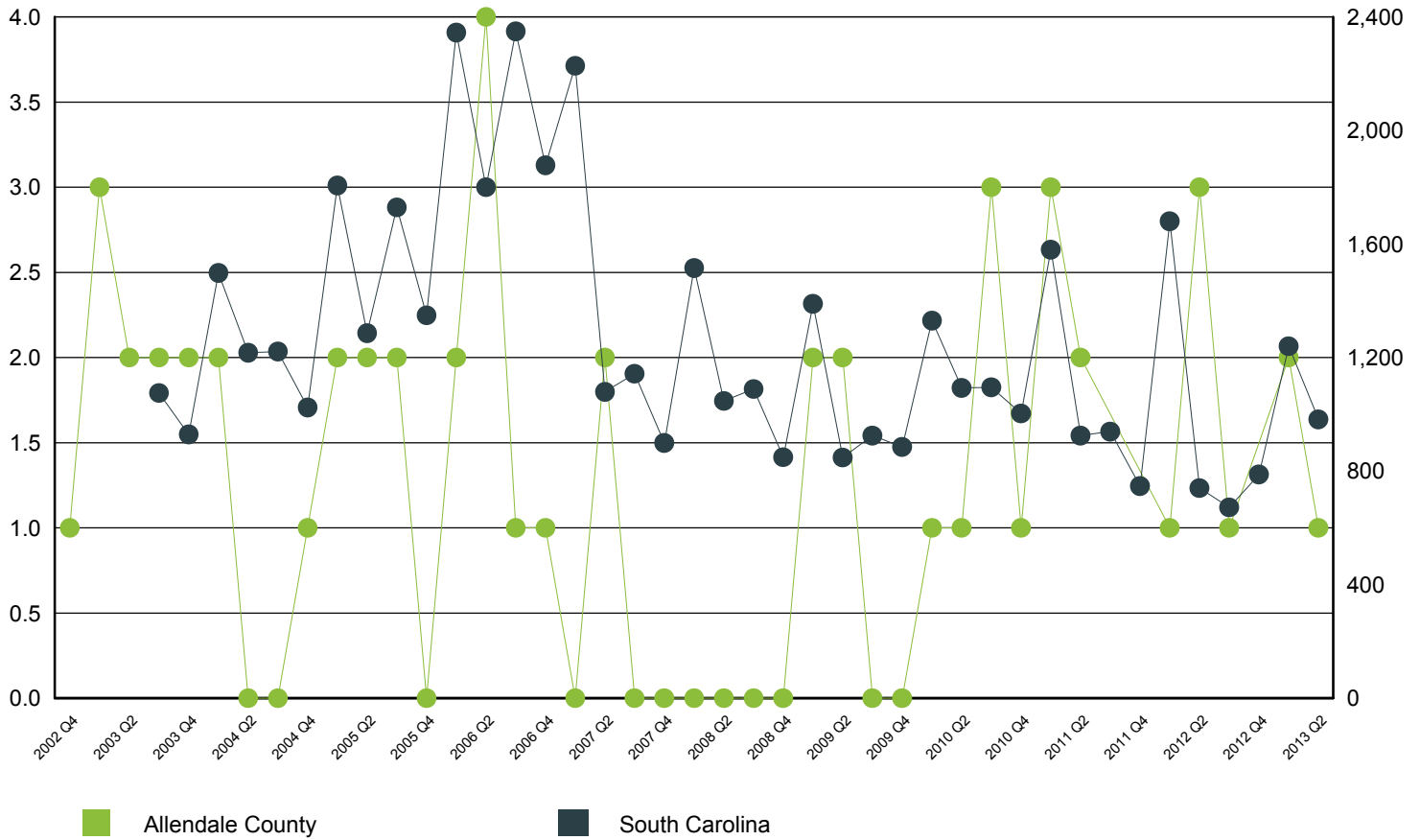

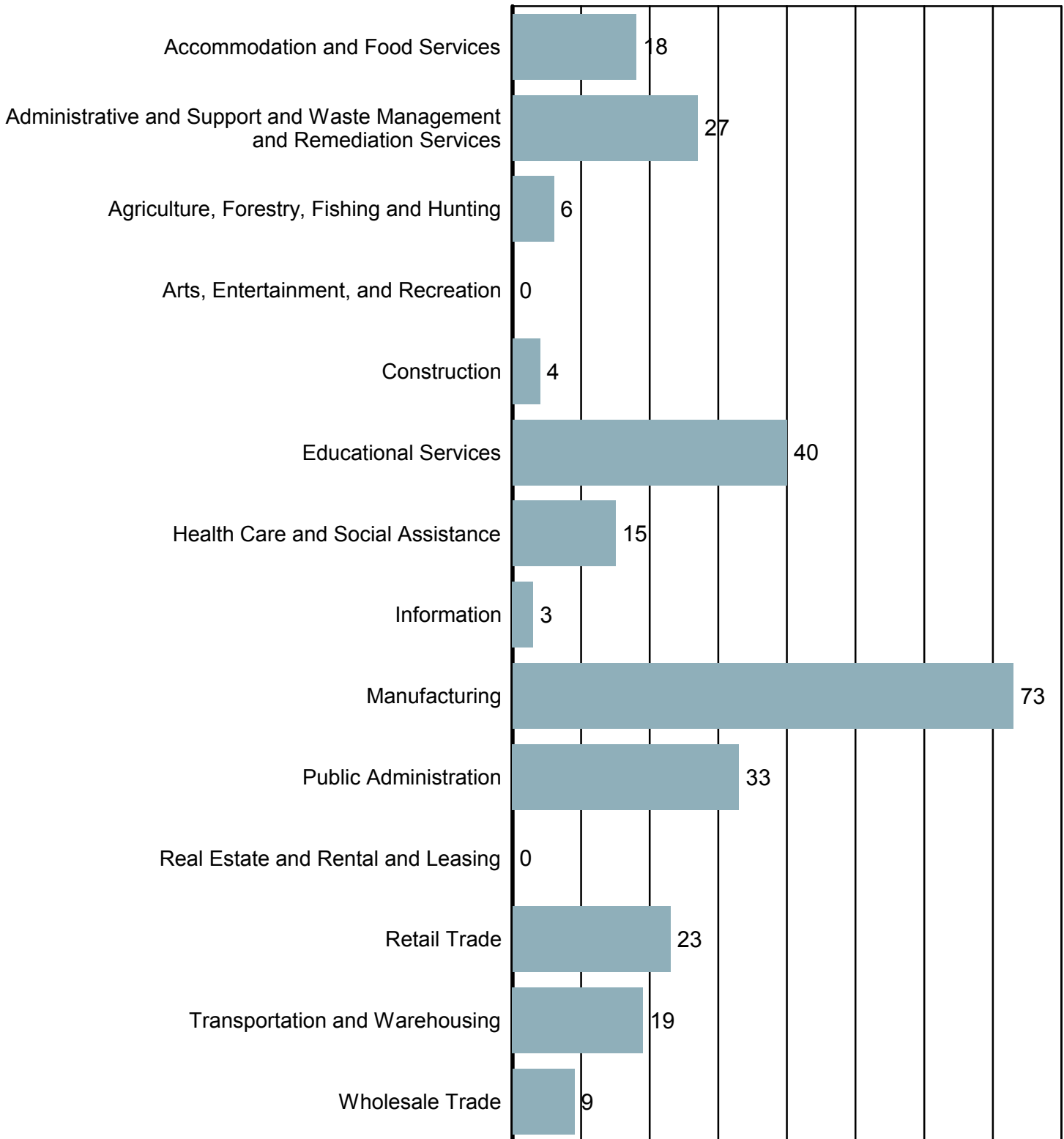

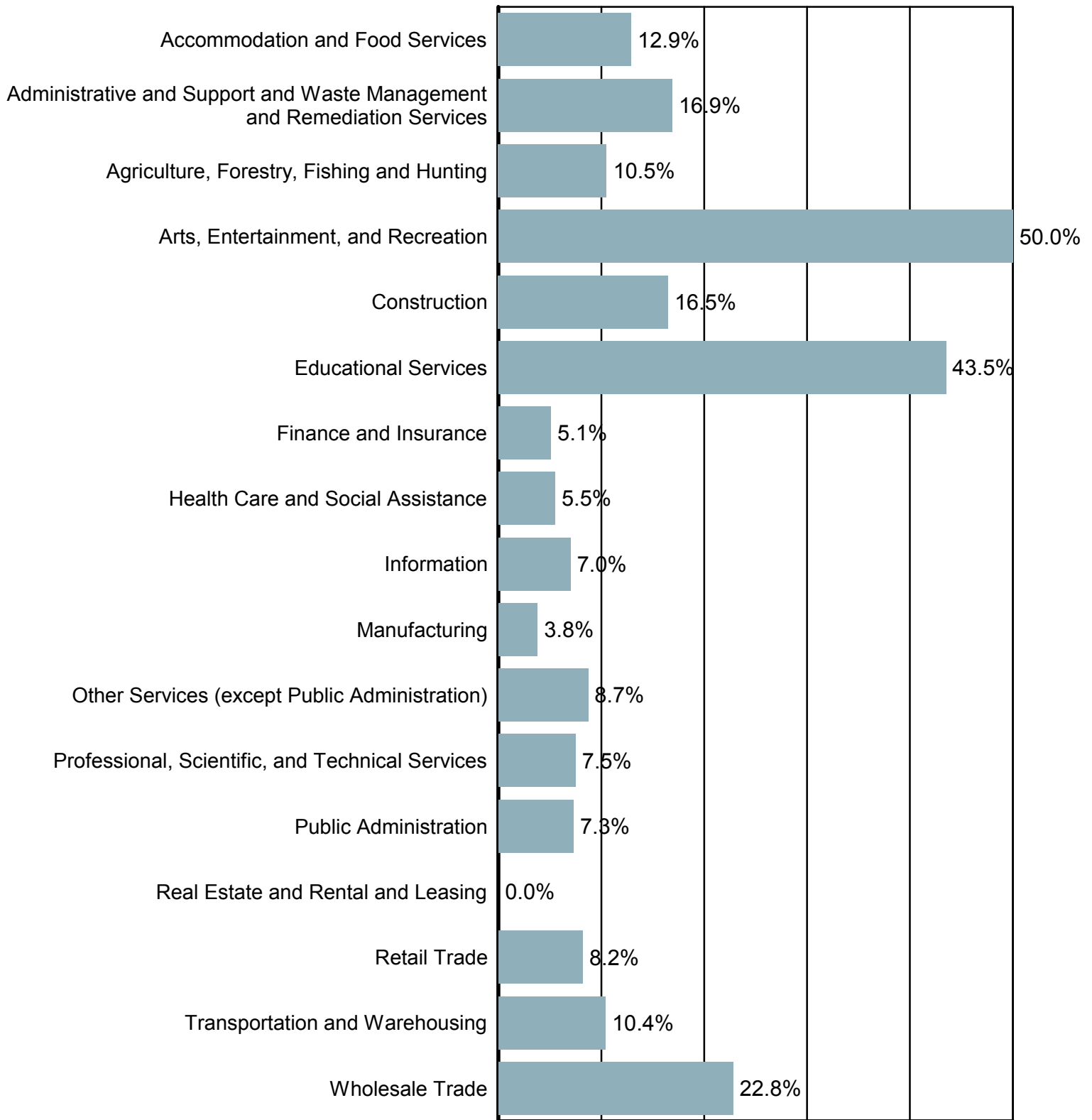

New Hires by Industry



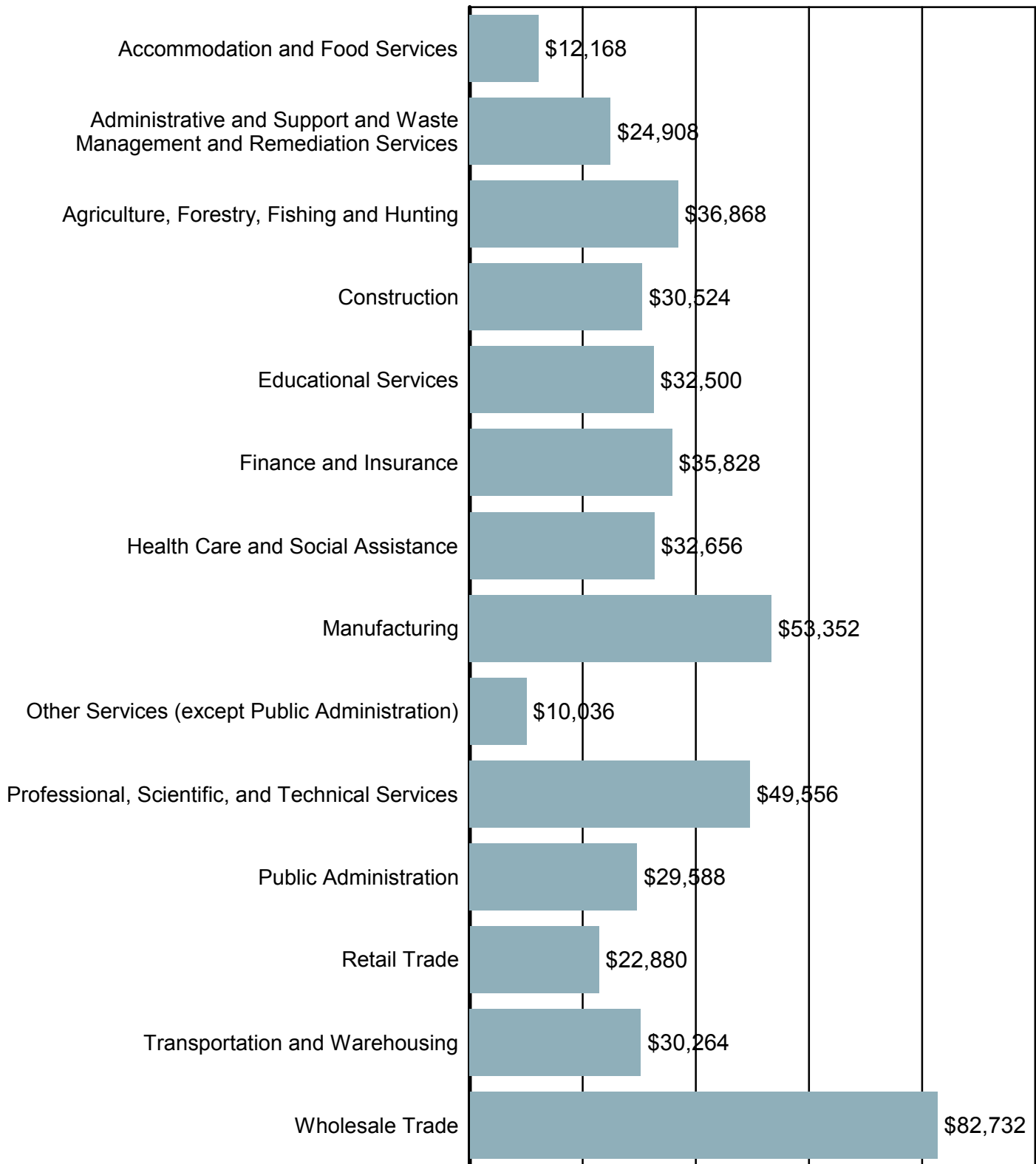

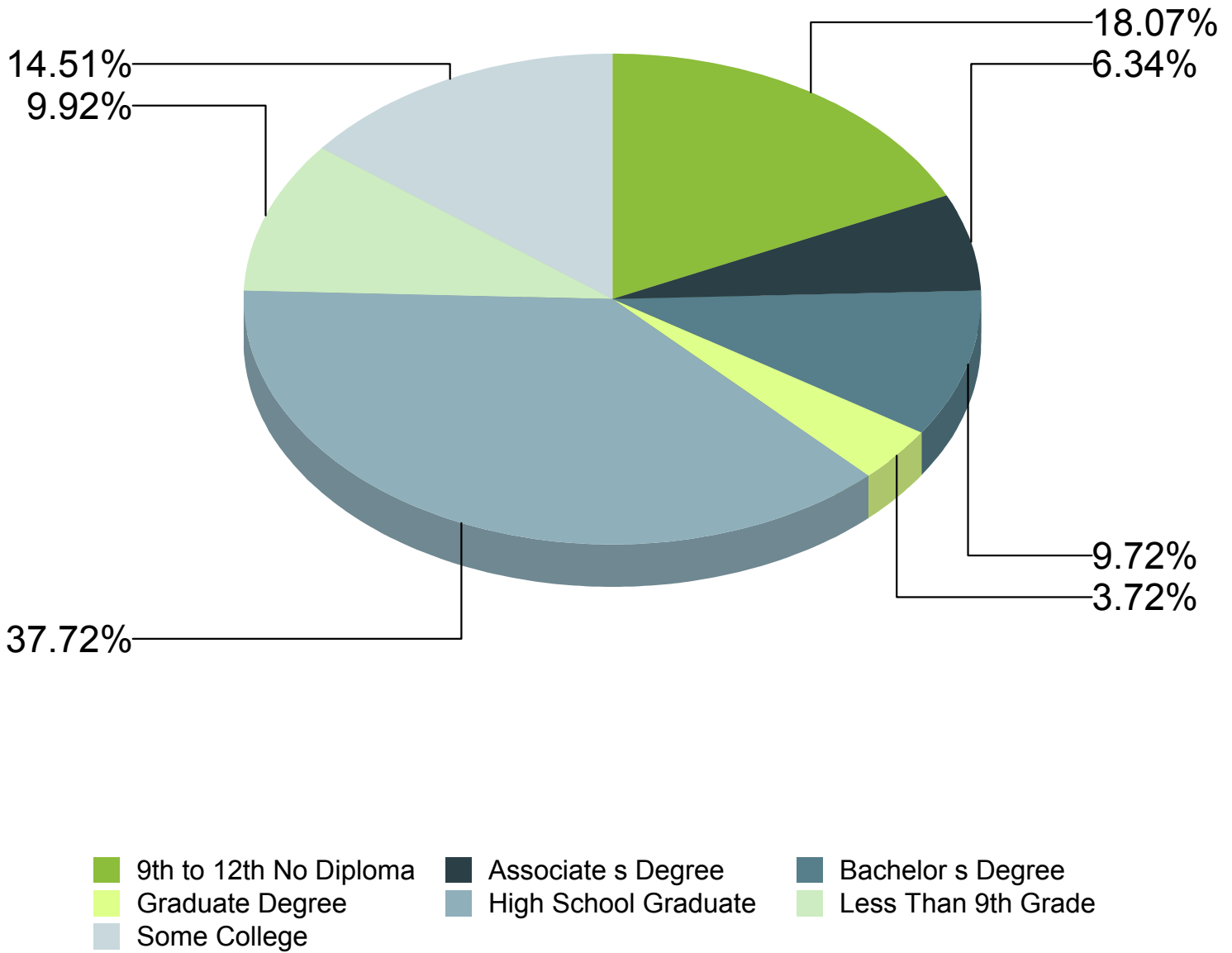
