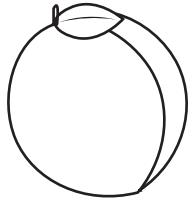
South Carolina State Vegetable



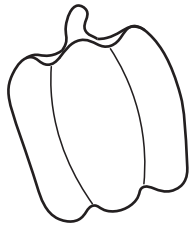
-  Collard Greens are the State Vegetable.

-  Lexington County produces the most collard greens in the state.



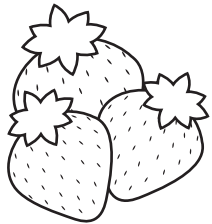

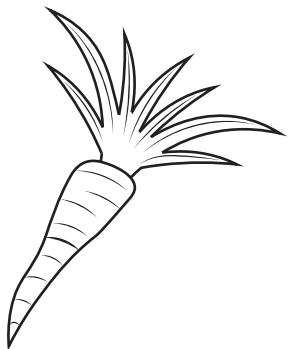
Strawberries



Carrot

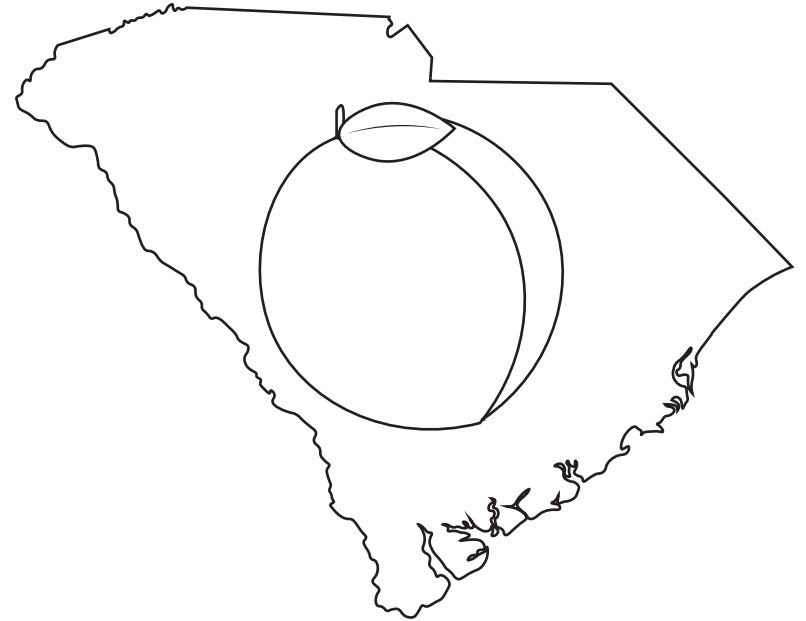

South Carolina State Fruit



- Peach is the State Fruit.
- It was designated as the official State Fruit by Act Number 360 of 1984.
- South Carolina has over 18,000 acres of peach farms across the state.
- South Carolina produces more peaches annually than Georgia.
