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

Dear Mr. Gaines,

Here is our twenty-sixth monthly report regarding the expenditures of the COVID-19 funding we received March 1, 2021. The current month expenditures are for the time period April 1 - April 31, 2023. MUSC has incurred \$44,203,479 of expenditures related to COVID-19 in total. Below you will find a summary of expenditures for the current reporting period. These expenses have been either paid or in the process for payment by MUSC. Please note, under the "Supplies Category and General Operations," the total expenditures include community testing purchases from a prior period in which MUSC was not reimbursed.
