This film is about what he saw that day and the days that followed. There are no pictures of the towers falling, only “snapshots” with Jason's narration that provide a point of view of this event that is worth watching and also helps us remember. Recommended for upper elementary through high school.

IMPORTANT: K–12 Instructional Media Channel (IMC)

The ETV satellite service ended July 2011. South Carolina schools and districts are able to access ETV and eMedia (ITV's new name!) programs/series through OnePlaceSC TV Guide on the NEW K–12 Instructional Media Channel (IMC). These programs/series were previously provided through digital satellite channels 1 and 2.

So...through OnePlaceSC and *StreamlineSC*, South Carolina educators will continue to have access to FREE video-based programs to support teaching and learning. These quality resources for K–12 students and professional development offerings for educators - provided in partnership from ETV and the SC Department of Education - will still be “at your fingertips!”

Here's how this NEW delivery works!

To Access the K–12 Instructional Media Channel (IMC) with ETV and eMedia programs:

- ❖ Go to OnePlaceSC.org – <http://oneplacesc.org>
- ❖ Use the **SAME** user name/password that you use to access **StreamlineSC**
- ❖ See Universal Search list and select “eMedia and ETV programs” to search
- ❖ Then in “Universal Search” box, type in your query and click “go” (Results for programs eMedia and ETV will be found)
- ❖ Or to see what is currently airing on all channels, click “ETV TV Guide” at top right of page that will take you to the grid (SCC-ch.1, ETV World-ch.2, ETV-HD-ch.3, K–12 IMC-ch.4, and ETV Radio channels)
- ❖ View in real time through your “IP TV Guide” (box on right side of main page) or contact your media specialist or local district Digital Education Service (DES) personnel to record
- ❖ A DES link with all contact information can be found under the “ETV TV Guide” at the top of the OnePlaceSC page <http://www.scetv.org/education/des/contacts.cfm>. These great folks are your link to this technology and they can let you know how to get the program(s) to your classroom.

NEW K-12 eMedia Series for 2011–12

New resources were reviewed by educators and approved by the State Board of Education to be used in South Carolina schools as supplemental resources to support the curriculum.

***These series, EXCEPT where indicated, have UNLIMITED rights. Four have LIMITED rights** (meaning they air only 2 times during this school year - see "SPLASH Weeks Schedule" pages 25-27 in this *eMedia Update*). **ALL available in StreamlineSC (SL).**

Bullying and Cyber Safety (HRM) (LIMITED rights – will air in SPLASH Weeks)

Grades 5–12 3 lessons 20–25 minutes Character Education/Safety
This series contains three programs that each address an important topic for today's youth: texting, Internet safety and bullying situations. *B Careful when U Txt* gives students a primer on the Do's and Don'ts of text messaging. *Think Before You Click* provides smart online strategies to stay safe and *Bully Bystanders* sets the tone for refusing to accept hostile behavior, offering effective ways to deal with bullying.

Constitution Day at the SC State House - James Otis Lecture

Grades 9–12 2 lessons 90 minutes Social Studies
Produced from the SC House of Representatives and sponsored by the SC Chapter of the American Trail Advocates, this program was named in honor of James Otis, a prominent attorney from colonial times. Schools that receive federal assistance must study the Constitution on or near the anniversary of the signing. These two programs are from 2009 and 2010. (A new third program will be broadcast September 16, 2011.)

Creating a Career with the Arts in Mind - BIOS

Grades 6–12 8 lessons 12–20 minutes Career Guidance/Arts
SC arts-career professionals – forensic art, arts administration, interior design, printing, art therapy, painting, landscape art, graphic art – are individually featured, providing information about their background, education and work as well as giving advice to students who might be interested in his or her career.

diSCovering Science

Grades 6–12 24 lessons (10 added August 2011) 5 minutes Science
This series features interviews with scientists and researchers from SC colleges and universities. They explain the societal impacts of their work and describe their jobs. Produced by EPSCoR/IDeA with ETV, the series focuses on a range of scientific subjects: biology, chemistry, physics, plus bioengineering and nanotechnology.

Environmental Ed (second group lessons 12-20 added! See flyer in this eMedia Update)

Grades 2–6 9 lessons added 7–9 minutes Science/Environmental Ed.
The second group of "EE" programs challenges students with facts, stories, investigations, questions, and Eco-quests to "leave no friend inside and carefully walk upon the earth." Topics include sustainable energy, nature thought of it first, the food chain, rocks and minerals, spiders, and exploring ecosystems.

Fairfax Network - Aerospace Academy

Grades K–8 2 lessons 60 minutes Science
Program 1 *We Can Fly* is designed for K–3 and Program 2 *Paper Airplane Design* is for grades 3–8. This is a series of learning labs where students become test pilots with paper airplanes, observe the forces of flight with boomerangs and examine the concepts of space exploration. Hands-on, inquiry-based demos are used.

Forgotten Founder – The Story of Charles Pinckney

Grades 3–12 1 lesson 60 minutes Social Studies
This program in the Carolina Stories series produced by ETV is a visualization of the biography of Charles Pinckney, a South Carolinian whose contributions to the birth of our nation and state were largely unsung until lately. He had many important jobs serving his state and nation and made contributions to our U.S. Constitution.

K–12 IMC Fall Previews & “SPLASH Weeks” Schedule

SC schools and districts will access programs/series that have been traditionally provided in the ITV schedule though ETV’s digital satellite by IP delivery through **OnePlaceSC** on the **NEW K–12 Instructional Media Channel (IMC)** since ETV’s satellite service ended July 2011. You’ll find **IMC** listed as the channel now . . . instead of channel 1, channel 2 or the old 301, 302!

Beginning August 15 eMedia started repeating popular programs/series and then NEW additions to the schedule will start September 19. (This is later than previously announced.)

To see what is on the IMC now – repeats and new - go to **www.emedia.scetv.org** to find the “Fall Preview Schedule and SPLASH Weeks schedule.” Look in left column where the *eMedia Link* and *eMedia Update* are accessed – you’ll find this too!

REMINDER – The NEW K-12 IMC works the same as the satellite in terms of media specialists and DES personnel being able to request a series to repeat. We have space in the IMC schedule to repeat as requested (except when we cannot repeat due to rights). Project Discovery – NEW Program October or November

Look in the next edition of the *eMedia Update* and on the eMedia Web site **www.emedia.scetv.org** for info about this new program that will air October or November! Our interactive field trip will commemorate the Civil War, but the LIVE air date for this ETV production has not been determined.

IMPORTANT: Block Feeds of Series with “Limited” Rights

The following series have “limited broadcast/off-air record rights and no duplication rights,” which means that eMedia is limited to the number of times we can broadcast these series. We cannot repeat these series again until February 2012. All broadcast on IMC. These series are also available online in *StreamlineSC*.

- **20th Century Turning Points in US History** (Grades 7–12, 8 lessons) – This series is designed to provide a clear overview of the people and events that distinguished the 20th century. **Repeats Oct. 5, 9:00–11:43 a.m. (Lessons 1–5) and Oct. 6, 9:00–10:36 a.m. (Lessons 6–8).**
- **America’s Quest for Freedom** (Grades 5–12, 9 lessons) – This series focuses on America’s struggle for freedom for all, dramatizing common history and showing events that increased freedom. **Repeats Sept. 26, 9:30 a.m.–12:50 p.m.**
- **Becoming a Better Me** (Grades K–5, 8 lessons) – This series helps students build self confidence, responsibility, self esteem, and self control. **Repeats Sept. 20, 9:00–11:31 a.m.**
- **Becoming Successful in Middle School - 1 and 2** (Grades 4–8, 16 lessons) – These address important concerns that young teens deal with peer pressure, decision-making, study skills, rules of common courtesy. **Repeats Sept. 21, 10:55 a.m.–2:51 p.m. (Lessons 1–9) and Sept. 22, 9:00–11:43 a.m. (Lessons 10–16).**
- **(NEW) Bullying and Cyber Safety (HRM)** (Grades 5–12, 3 lessons) - This series contains three programs that each address an important topic for today’s youth: texting, Internet safety and bullying situations. **Airs Sept. 27, 9:00–10:13 a.m.**
- **Connect with Kids At-Risk** (Grades 6–12, 6 lessons) – This series features true stories and real kids in peer-to-peer format that focuses on at-risk issues that teens face everyday. **Repeats Oct. 4, 1:05–3:18 p.m.**
- **Exploring Healthy Choices** (Grades 6–12, 6 lessons) – This series teaches students vital information concerning key areas of their health, including proper nutrition and suicide prevention. **Repeats Sept. 28, 9:00–11:38 a.m.**
- **Great Campaigns of the Civil War** (Grades 6–12, 4 lessons) – This series uses realistic reenactments of the pivotal battles in the Civil War, along with letters, speeches and diaries to humanize the struggle. **Repeats Oct. 3, 9:30–11:28 a.m.**
- **(NEW) History of Black Achievement in America, A** (Grades 6–12, 8 lessons) - This series documents Black Achievement in American history, its defining role in the growth of the country, and its influence on events by highlighting contributions of Black Americans that have over 350 years influenced our culture, enriched our society with their achievements, and shaped the history of the U.S. **Airs Sept. 28, 11:45 a.m.–4:27 p.m.**
- **(NEW) History of Hispanic Achievement in America, A** (Grades 6–12, 8 lessons) - History of Hispanic Achievement in America began 500 years ago when Columbus stepped ashore in the new world. The contributions of Hispanics to the development and success of America are key to our history. **Airs Sept. 29, 9:00 a.m.–1:42 p.m.**
- **History of Women’s Achievement in America, A** (Grades 5–12, 8 lessons) – This series celebrates women’s contributions to American history from the 17th century to present day. **Repeats Oct. 10, 9:50–11:57 a.m. (Lessons 1–4) and Oct. 12, 10:55 a.m.–12:59 p.m. (Lessons 5–8).**
- **Nutrition Basics: Why Food Matters** (Grades 4–12, 7 lessons) – This series covers nutrition from A to Z and includes the food pyramid, which focuses on the importance of physical activity. **Repeats Sept. 22, 11:50 a.m.–2:59 p.m.**
- **Primary Citizens** (Grades 1–3, 7 lessons) – This series told by a primary child, gives children the major ideas and experiences that they should acquire to be effective citizens. **Repeats Sept. 20, 11:45 a.m.–12:54 p.m.**
- **Technology and Architecture in Ancient Civilizations** (Grades 7–12, 3 lessons) – This series shows how to look at technology and architecture to find out what an ancient civilization was like. **Repeats Sept. 30, 11:05 a.m.–12:43 p.m.**
- **U.S. History Field Trips** (Grades 4–8, 8 lessons) – This series covers some of the most widely taught, standards-based topics in elementary-middle school American history and geography, making them come to life. **Repeats Sept. 19, 11:15 a.m.–2:55 p.m.**
- **What’s Up in Finance** (Grades 7–12, 1 Lesson) – This program features young people developing their money smarts and workplace skills they need to achieve their goals. **Repeats Oct. 3, 11:45 a.m.–12:10 p.m.**
- **(NEW) Wise Owl Bully Stopper** (Grades K–3, 3 lessons) - These live-action videos are hosted by a likeable cartoon character, Wise Owl, who encourages young viewers to learn more about what bullying is and how it can be stopped. Helpful vignettes play out common situations that appeal to young viewers and ask them to think about what they would do in each situation. **Airs Sept. 27, 11:05–11:50 a.m.**

Constitution Day – James Otis Lecture from State House

Constitution Day Special from SC State House – James Otis Lecture

Sept. 16, 11:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. * IMC *approx. ending time; planned for 2 hours

Repeats Sept. 23, 11:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. * IMC (Unlimited rights)

To help SC schools meet the Constitution Day requirements, The **SC Chapter of the American Board of Trial Advocates** (ABOTA) will host its **Third Annual James Otis Lecture Series** at the SC State House in observance of National Constitution Day. ETV will broadcast the program LIVE through OnePlaceSC on the IMC and it will be archived for later use online in *StreamlineSC*.

By federal law, all schools that receive federal assistance are required to have a program about the Constitution on or around the anniversary date of the signing of the Constitution on September 17, 1787. James Otis was a prominent Boston lawyer in the colonial era credited by John Adams as igniting the spark that led to the Declaration of Independence and the American Revolution. ABOTA nationally developed the James Otis Lecture Series to help schools comply.

This year's James Otis Lecture Series will focus on **South Carolina's role in drafting the United States Constitution**. Every high school in SC has been invited to send two outstanding history or social studies students as a "James Otis Scholar" to this event, but the opportunity to take part virtually will be possible for all students through IP delivery in OnePlaceSC via the K–12 IMC. Other Programs about Constitution & Citizenship

SC Student Filmmaking Competition - Please Share Info Educator Input is Wanted as First-time Project Evolves!

The **SC Student Filmmaking Competition** is a joint endeavor between the SC Film Commission, the SC Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism, and Trident Technical College. The purpose of the program is for SC high school students to create media projects related to the SCPRT's State Park system, introducing them to the joys of media arts and filmmaking.

SC high school students are encouraged to create a short film, using SCPRT's State Park system as a thematic element. Students must submit the film by a to-be-determined due date (Spring 2012) through a contest page on *SchoolTube*, which is a participating sponsor.

All entries must follow the following parameters:

- 1) Must be at least 45 seconds and no longer than 2 minutes, 30 seconds in duration.
- 2) The storyline or concept must relate to the contest theme: *Come Out and Play*. The prescribed theme is purposefully vague with students expected to use creativity in their interpretation.
- 3) At least one scene must be shot at a SC State Park with a shot of the SC State Park signage lasting at least 3 seconds in the film. (This can be anything with the park logo or name of park on it.) There are 45 state parks across our state. Participating students will be granted access free of charge to the park they choose in order to shoot the footage.

Once the Top Ten finalists are selected by a panel of independent filmmakers, educators, and PRT/Film Commission staff, these films will be shared across the state and nation with the public voting function being combined with judges' scores to select winners: First Prize - \$250, Second Prize - \$150, Third Prize - \$100.
