

## **CDC Approved Cruise Operations Protocol – Port of Call**

### Terminal Cleaning (Port Authority)

- The Port Authority has contracted with a vendor that applies a disinfecting fogging agent to disinfect large areas. The vendor will disinfect the Passenger Terminal and gangway prior to every vessel arrival.
- While a vessel is at the dock, a disinfection team will continuously disinfect the high touch areas (handrails, doorknobs, etc.).
- Facial masks will be required to be worn by all staff, guests and crew.
- Social distancing will be as required by CDC guidelines.
- Hand sanitizing stations are located throughout the terminal, high traffic areas, near the elevator, and near doorways.

### Cruise Ship Line (CSL)

#### Reporting

- If an infectious disease case is suspected or diagnosed, the Senior Doctor/Doctor will notify the responsible Senior Officers.
- The Master shall notify the CSL Corporate Office, as per reporting policy.
- Reporting to shoreside Authorities is done after a full evaluation has been completed (not to exceed 24 hours from a confirmed positive case).
- When all information and data is available and has been evaluated, CSL Corporate Medical, in cooperation with the vessel's Medical Team will notify SCDHEC, the Port Authority, and Port Agent.

#### Hospitalization and Transportation

- CSL has selected a local partner hospital and transportation service provider to manage the transportation and treatment of guests and crew in the event of an incident.
