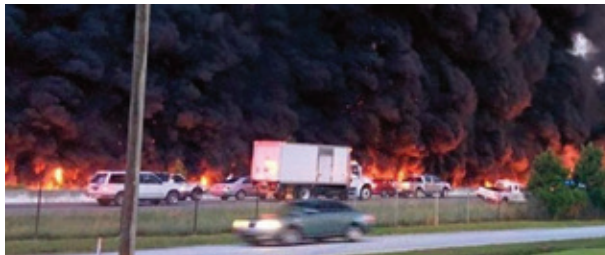
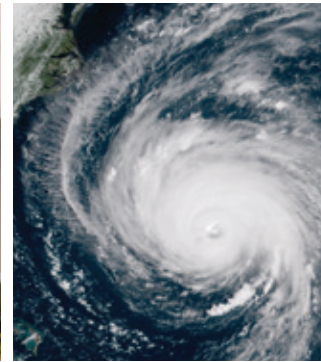

# Environmental Response

## Nuclear Response

- Maintain a 24/7 field response capability for radiological emergencies
- Recommend protective actions for the public during nuclear power plant emergencies
- Conduct environmental surveillance during an emergency at a fixed nuclear facility
- Train first responders on radiological emergency response
- Provide technical assistance in response to incidents involving radioactive materials
- Maintain ongoing communication with the fixed nuclear facilities throughout the state



## Oil & Chemical Response

- Coordinate the response of DHEC and other agencies in responding to spills and releases of petroleum and hazardous chemicals
- Train DHEC personnel in response safety, hazard awareness, and containment/removal technologies
- Manage the 24-hour reporting line for chemical releases/oil spills and fish kills
- Serve as a central point of coordination for conducting release incident response operations
- Maintain a variety of resources to support operations conducted by regional Environmental Response Teams

**Develop and coordinate Agency response plans with other Federal, State, and Local government responders.**
