Celebrate America on ETV Features SC School Choirs

March 14, 6:00–8:00 p.m., March 17, 4:00–6:00 p.m. and March 20, 3:00–5:00 p.m. SC Channel (SCC) (Limited rights – Schools can access and keep for one year from broadcast date. No ITV broadcast.*)

Choirs from 12 South Carolina high schools will have the opportunity to perform with nationally acclaimed composer Tim Janis in a new musical special entitled **Celebrate America**, which premieres on ETV March 8. Janis, well known for his “music with a mission” has worked on many philanthropic projects with artists such as Paul McCartney, Billy Joel, Ray Charles, and The New York Philharmonic. He has also produced fundraising programs for PBS with George Clooney and James Earl Jones.

His latest venture has him working with high school choirs from across South Carolina as a way to spotlight our nation's youth and pull communities together in a celebration of music that inspires. The two-hour concert features such uplifting songs as "America, the Beautiful," "Danny Boy," and "I'll Fly Away," and will air as part of ETV's March pledge drive.

SC schools that participated in **Celebrate America** at ETV: **Summerville High School, Orangeburg – Wilkinson High School, Belton-Honea High School, York Comprehensive High School, Dorman High School, South Pointe High School, Gilbert High School, Waccamaw High School, Clover High School, Northwestern High School, The Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities, and Hammond High School.**

Celebrate America was taped at ETV in October 2009, as buses rolled in from across the state, pulling together over 500 students from South Carolina high school music programs. Arriving well prepared, each choir was brought into the studio to record their performance for the broadcast.

"Not only does it give these students a life-changing opportunity to sing before a statewide television audience, it also teaches them the importance of using their talents to give back to their communities. ETV really put a lot of effort into creating this special. It takes a lot of 'behind the scenes' effort to bring this great opportunity for students together," said Janis. "I believe the fabric of our nation is the strength found in our local communities. We need to stay connected and committed with a spirit of serving one another to the best of our abilities."

Programs on Study Skills for Middle School Students

Programs 8 and 9 in *Becoming Successful in Middle School* are entitled *Developing Good Study Skills, Part One and Two*. These two programs instruct middle school students on tried and true methods that will help them study more effectively and achieve higher grades. The six basic skills highlighted are: how to prioritize and manage your time; how to use the library to your best advantage; how to study using textbooks; how to take better notes; how to listen effectively; and how to take tests. Part One (lesson 8) begins with critical in-class skills, moves on to techniques for studying at home and then covers effective test preparation (19:31 in duration). Part Two (lesson 9) explores how to be more efficient in writing research papers and using the library or Internet appropriately (17:53 in duration).

NEW Lessons in Idella Bodie's SC Women Series Great for Women's History Month!

Modjeska Simkins (NEW)

Produced by ITV and ETV and directed by ETV's Pat Henry, the stories in this NEW series are being adapted with permission and input from author Idella Bodie. They are dramatizations of the stories from her book *South Carolina Women*. Recommended to support social studies standards for South Carolina history for elementary and middle grade students, the programs are also good for use during Women's History Month with students in grades 3–12. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped South Carolina history and politics. And, the stories have been produced at historical sites and homes. These two additional lessons on ***Modjeska Simkins*** and ***Mary Gordon Ellis*** show how each woman dealt with the issue of equality.

Program Seven (NEW) – ***Modjeska Simkins***

This is the story of an African American girl born to a half-white, half-black brick mason who came from relative wealth and married into wealth, but she dedicated her life to helping the disadvantaged to be treated equally. She was one of the organizers of the Supreme Court Case Briggs Vs. Elliott, which was the first filed of the four cases that later became combined Brown vs. Board of Education.

Program Eight (NEW) – ***Mary Gordon Ellis***

Mary Gordon Ellis was the first female to be elected to the South Carolina Legislature. This drama depicts her life from the challenges of being the school superintendent of Jasper County Schools, where she made bold changes to impact education, to her time in office as an elected official until her untimely death at an early age.

Other Programs in the Series:

Program One - ***Grace and Rachel Martin***

This is the story of two sisters-in-law living alone in the South Carolina back country who waylaid a British Courier with valuable papers by dressing up as colonial men. They risked their lives to stop the flow of information. Taped on location with historical costumes and artifacts, it takes place in the cabin considered to be the oldest frontier house still standing in SC.

Program Two – ***Emily Geiger***

Emily is a young girl who risked her life by serving as a messenger for the Colonial army during the Revolutionary War. Captured by the British and interrogated as a spy, she managed to trick Lord Rawdon into believing she was innocent, outwitting her captors in a most unique manner. Taped in part at the actual location where the interrogation took place, this drama covers the story of Emily's journey from her assignment with General Greene to her release by Lord Rawdon.

Program Three - ***Mary Chesnut***

Mary kept a diary during the turbulent times of the Civil War. This drama portrays various events in the life of the South Carolina heroine prior to and during the Civil War. The events dramatized are actual happenings that occurred to Mary and most of the words come straight from her diary. Mary actually spent time at Kensington Plantation, the location of the drama.

Program Four - ***The Grimké Sisters***

Sarah Moore Grimké (1792-1873) and Angelina Emily Grimké (1805-1879), followed a similar path, speaking out about what they believed and leaving their home to join the fight for the causes of the abolition of slavery and equal rights for women. Today women are leaders in the community and in the business world, working along side their male counterparts in voicing and making their decisions, but it was not the same in the 1800's. These two South Carolina sisters helped lead the way to change the course of history in both our state and in the United States. We see from a young age how both stood up for what they believed were the wrongs of society. They spoke out against slavery and found the courage to fight for their right as women to have a voice.

Program Five – ***Wil Lou Gray***

Tells the story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray who began the South Carolina Opportunity School. The program follows her from the time that she was a young girl struggling with the loss of her dear mother through Dr. Gray's valiant efforts to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Through reenactment of scenes in her life and interviews taped with Dr. Gray by ETV in the 1980's, we hear in Dr. Gray's own words her passion to help others to learn while we learn about what life was like during the early 1900's for many South Carolinians.

Program Six – ***Mary McLeod Bethune***

This is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and her students. The drama begins with Mary as a young child growing up in Mayesville, South Carolina, and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. Through the scenes we see the struggle that Mary encountered just to be given the chance to learn to read and then to teach others, including being threatened with bodily harm. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up being an advisor to a United States President!

History of Women's Achievement – ITV Series

This new series was added to the ITV schedule last year and has limited rights for ITV to broadcast, but is available online in *StreamlineSC*. Check with your DES personnel to see if they have it on tape if you need it that way. ITV will not be able to repeat this series until August or September 2010 due to our rights to broadcast, but you have access online anytime!

A History of Women's Achievement in America celebrates women's contributions to our history from the 17th century to present day by using archival photographs and footage to look at their inspiring accomplishments and victories. From Phyllis Wheatley to Maria Mitchell, from Susan B. Anthony to Nellie Bly, from Nancy Lopez to Oprah Winfrey – key women over a 400-year period are featured.

Carolina Stories – Two Programs Feature Special Women

- **Modjeska Monteith Simkins – Makin' A Way Out of No Way**

Repeats March 2, 10:30–11:28 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Modjeska Monteith Simkins (1899–1992) was one South Carolina's great women. Entitled **Modjeska Monteith Simkins – Makin' A Way Out of No Way**, this program paints an interesting profile of the civil rights matriarch and human rights activist and was produced by ETV's Beryl Dakers. Born in Columbia, Modjeska graduated from Benedict College in 1921 and taught school before she was married in 1929. She had to quit her job because at that time SC schools could not employ married women, but she continued to work at different jobs to make a difference by representing the needs of the African-American community. In the 1940s and 1950s, she helped create over a hundred branches of the NAACP around our state. She believed that the best way to make change was to vote so she made sure people knew about their voting rights and participated in elections. For the rest of her life, she dedicated herself to the idea of civil rights and opportunity for all people.

- **This is Brookgreen Gardens**

Repeats March 2, 11:33 a.m.–12:30 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

This ETV program that aired for the first time in February 2008 explores one of the state's most beloved landmarks! A distinctive collection of American figurative sculpture, education programs, dazzling gardens, rare natural habitats, and a long, fascinating history make Brookgreen Gardens a unique treasure. The program highlights artist and philanthropist Anna Hyatt Huntington's life and works, outlining the path that she and her equally famous husband took to create Brookgreen Gardens and populate the coastal plantation with art, not only created by Mrs. Huntington, but by artists from throughout the world. Their home, the gardens and the sculpture are the focus of the program as we learn about the Huntington's dream of sharing the art in this historic, natural setting and helping to develop the Murrell's Inlet area of the low country by providing services and jobs for the residents.

More ITV Broadcasts for Women’s History Month

- **Patti Just** – Program 2 in **Conversations on Character**
Repeats March 4, 8:00–8:15 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)
This series is provided “By Request” and only broadcast when requested, but SC schools have rights to use it. Former television producer/host Patti Just, who worked for many years at the Sumter Regional ETV Station, is featured in this program. Ms. Just talks to students about perseverance, telling them how she worked hard to overcome her physical challenges to be successful.
- **Women in Engineering** – Program 5 in **Career Encounters**
Repeats March 4, 8:20–8:49 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)
This program is part of the ITV series that explores some of today’s most challenging and rewarding career fields. Cameras visit workplaces to talk with professionals and technicians about what they do, how they got where they are and why they find their work rewarding.
- **Female Athletes, Part 1 & 2** – Programs in **XPress: Character in Sports**
Repeats March 4, 8:55–9:49 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)
This series, produced by ITV in 2003 features USC Track and Field Coach Fry and several of his outstanding female athletes talking with a group of middle and high school girls about important issues that affect them in the area of their educational growth.
- **Mary McLeod Bethune, Part 1 & 2** – Programs 32 and 33 in **The Palmetto Special**
Repeats March 4, 9:55–10:34 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)
Lessons in this series help students understand SC History and appreciate our state. The series uses dramatizations, visuals and historic photographs to explore our state’s history.
- **Susan Leigh Still, Part 1 & 2** – Programs 8 and 9 in **Conversations with Scientists and Astronauts**
Repeats March 4, 10:40–11:15 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)
These two programs feature NASA astronaut Susan Still discussing her education and training. She talks about teamwork, work ethic and fortitude as she describes her life and work.

Science Splash – Good Resource for Women’s Month

Repeats March 4, 11:20–11:47 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Science Splash: A Girl’s Odyssey was designed to encourage middle school girls to consider careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math. This thirty-minute program highlights the women speakers and activities from the 2005 Science Splash event. Meet women who have successful careers in male-dominated fields of work. This ETV project received a NETA Outreach Award in 2007.

- Angie H. Webb, Mechanical Engineer and South Carolina native from Edgefield, works as Business Manager of Gas Operations at South Carolina Electric & Gas (SCE&G), a SCANA company.
- Patty Hamilton, is a research chemist and health and safety expert for the University of South Carolina; she is also a licensed pilot who has built her own plane.
- Michelle James, is Bridge Project Coordinator for the South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT). She manages bridge replacement projects for thirteen counties within the state. In her spare time Michelle is a ballet instructor.
- Gayatri Kharel, is a civil engineer and a native of India. She has designed residential buildings, hotel structures and shopping mall facilities. Apart from her love for technical work, she enjoys music and sings Indian songs. She also acted in an Indian movie when she was a child.
- Lynn Cornfoot, is a media artist and native of South Carolina. She grew up in Myrtle Beach and is currently an Electronic Field Production Specialist at ETV. Lynn is the first female videographer for the network. As a freelance artist she has worked on feature films, commercials and television productions.
- Dana L. Broughton, is currently a doctoral chemistry student at the University of South Carolina. She is in her third year of graduate study where she is working on the development of bio-sensors. Dana received her undergraduate degree from Clemson University and is a graduate of Timberland High School.

Women's History Month - Take a Look at *StreamlineSC*

StreamlineSC offers several programs and clips to highlight the impact women had on the progression of history. Search "Women in History" in *StreamlineSC* to find resources to use during Women's History Month. There are many series, programs and video clips to support your curriculum.

"Lady Edisons" of the 21st Century – Special Repeat

Repeats March 4, 11:55 a.m.–12:24 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Fairfax Network presents **She's Got It! Women and Their Inspirations**, which features women who appeared in the Smithsonian Institution's Innovative Lives series. Designed for grades 4–8, this program allows students to explore the interdisciplinary world of invention, learn about the invention process, and meet the "Lady Edisons" of the 21st century. Included in this showcase of creative women are Ann Moore, the inventor of the Snugli Baby Carrier and Sally Fox, creator of FoxFibres. Students will meet young women who have won invention awards and prizes. This program aired for the first time in 2007.

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2009–10 The Rights of Youth – Premieres March 11

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. March 11, 2010 ***The Rights of Youth (premiere)*** – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.

April 22, 2010 ***Treasure Keepers*** – You have seen their work in every museum, but what do conservators really do? Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by "agents of destruction." Explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.

RIGHTS REMINDER: SC schools may view the programs with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and then tape erased or destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that receive a scholarship through ITV for one program OR schools that pay Colonial Williamsburg to participate either in single lessons or in the entire series can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.



Curriculum and Content Corner... highlighting Music in our Schools Month and Women's History Month.....with *Dianne L. Gregory*

March is Music in our Schools Month featuring the theme “*Music! Just Imagine...*” celebrating the importance of music education. **ITV** has many programs offered to reinforce the importance of music education in our schools. **Clemson Collection** includes performing arts specials for South Carolina students including musical productions and theatre works. **French Folktales: African Drum and Dance Ensemble** highlights the Logan Leopard West African Drum and Dance Ensemble playing music of the Mande people of West Africa. Demonstrations of various drums and dance movements are included along with group performances. **The Magical Theater of Music** is based on Domenico Cimarosa’s *The Secret Marriage*. The programs, available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*, cover the elements of the operatic performance: drama, music, set design, lighting, costume, and make-up. The final program is a presentation of the opera and ties all lessons together. This is an excellent means of exposing your students to the magnificence of the opera experience. Also available on *SL*, **Mia’s Music** features Mia who is writing her first musical composition with the help of well-known composers and songwriters. She finds out that there is much to learn about writing musical compositions. Another *SL* and **ITV** program is **Music (Fairfax Network)**. Students learn about various aspects of music and hear discussions between artists and students on interesting topics from listening to the classical works of Mozart and Bach to the electric guitar. Four lessons through **ITV** and *SL* entitled **Music to My Ears** encourages the viewer to become an active listener who employs careful observation and critical thinking in the art of listening. Each program explores a musical idea through performances, conversations and demonstrations. **The Stories Behind the Carols**, through **ITV** and *SL*, features South Carolina school choirs performing well-known carols providing the history behind the carols. There are a multitude of assets in *StreamlineSC* correlated to music content including 370 full videos, 118 images, 187 articles, 41 songs, 138 sound effects, quizzes, and much more.

Recommended to support the South Carolina Social Studies Academic Standards in grades 3–8, the programs are suitable for grades 3–12 and are available through our **ITV** broadcast schedule and *StreamlineSC*. Two **NEW** programs are being added to the schedule **Modjeska Simkins** and **Mary Gordon Ellis**. **Modjeska Simkins** is the story of an African American girl born to a half-white, half-black brick mason who came from relative wealth and married into wealth, but she dedicated her life to helping the disadvantaged achieve equality. She was one of the organizers of the Supreme Court Case *Briggs vs. Elliott*, which was the first filed of the four cases that later became combined *Brown vs. Board of Education*. **Mary Gordon Ellis** was the first female to be elected to the South Carolina Legislature. This drama depicts her life from the challenges of being the school superintendent of Jasper County Schools where she made bold changes to impact education, to her time in office as an elected official, until her untimely death at an early age. Other programs in the series include the following: **Grace and Rachel Martin**, **Emily Geiger**, **Mary Chesnut**, **The Grimké Sisters**, **Wil Lou Gray**, and **Mary McLeod Bethune**.

Recommended for use in school news programs on all levels, these short segments were developed by ITV and ETV working with SC Healthy Schools, DHEC, the USC School of Medicine, and the ESMMSC Coalition to promote the Eat Smart Move More SC messages in an effort to address childhood obesity by providing information on healthy eating habits and physical activity in a humorous manner. (Added to the ITV schedule in fall 2009.)

- **Taking Charge in Meadowland**

Designed for grades K–3, this resource encourages the young student to “take charge of their health.” Focusing on a healthy lifestyle, the first program challenges students to eat nutritional foods combined with daily exercise. This ITV series, produced in 2009, features **Mrs. United States 2008** who is a native of Batesburg-Leesville and currently a fellow in psychiatry at Palmetto Health Richland Memorial Hospital. **Dr. Gariane Gunter** talks with teens about eating healthy, thinking about what they drink, being more active, and eating disorders. These four programs are excellent for guidance and health professionals to use with students in grades 5–12 to start discussion on key health-related topics, including eating disorders.

Included in each 27-minute program are short videos produced by South Carolina students who were selected as winners in First Lady Jenny Sanford's in partnership with Dr. Jim Rex Healthy SC Schools Video Project. These short clips set up the discussion between Dr. Gunter and the teens. Then a health educator or physician is the special guest to provide more information on the topics!

Funded with Federal funds from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the video provides success stories on how to make breakfast in the classroom work. Also, educators discuss the academic and behavioral success of students who participate in the program. Plan to access if you don't already have it in your inventory.

Deskercise – National Nutrition Month Theme for March and April Themes to Plan Ahead Repeated This Month

Just for elementary students, this new ITV series designed for students to exercise right at their desks has theme-based programs for many special events, holidays and celebrations. For example, the five 10-minute programs for the week's theme each have a different informational highlight about a state during the warm-up introductory section and then the same core exercise-at-your-desk component. Auntie Karen's Place – Features Sickle Cell Segment

Repeats March 8, 1:10–1:37 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) *SL*

Added to the ITV schedule in 2009, this program for grades Pre K–5th focuses on life skills using music and puppets. Topics include: **Jazz Music; Sickle Cell Awareness; Financial Literacy; and Emergency Preparedness.** The Auntie Karen Foundation partnered with ETV, Palmetto Health Children's Hospital and the USC School of Music to create this innovative pilot. Students are introduced to Auntie Karen characters: Olivia the Octopus, Bull and Bear and The Jamaican Yams. Auntie Karen, Inc. created the international characters and funding was provided by the SC Competitive Grants Program, Ronald McDonald House Charities and Auntie Karen Foundation www.auntiekaren.org.

Components of program:

What is Jazz?

This segment is designed to introduce the viewer to the concept of recognizing jazz music. Auntie Karen Character Olivia the Octopus and her friends teach the concept of recognizing jazz music by sharing what is not. Olivia the Octopus is an international jazz diva. She travels the world sharing a message of love through hugs and music.

When Cousin Zetta Comes to Visit - A Sickle Cell Story (The Jamaican Yams Story)

This segment is designed to assist sickle cell patients, teachers, students, and providers with tools to prevent a pain crisis, manage a mild pain crisis and provide age appropriate education about the signs of a pain crisis. Auntie Karen characters, The Jamaican Yams are used to teach this concept. Auntie Karen's The Jamaican Yams consists of: Yusef (Dad), Yolanda (Mom), Whipper (Son), Mya (Daughter), Gordon (Friend), and Cousin Zetta. Cousin Zetta has sickle cell disease.

Save or Spend?

This segment is designed to help the viewer understand the consequences of spending versus saving. Auntie Karen characters Bull and Bear are used to teach this concept. Bull & Bear consists of: Dblack the Bull, a corporate guy by day and a singer by night and Big Red the Bear, a blues singer.

There's A Hurricane Coming

This segment is designed to teach the viewer what is needed to prepare for an emergency. Auntie Karen characters, The Jamaican Yams, prepare an emergency preparedness kit in anticipation of the Hurricane. The Jamaican Yams consists of: Yusef (Dad), Yolanda (Mom), Whipper (Son), Mya (Daughter), Gordon (Friend), and Miles the dog.

The World's Largest Concert 2010 "Goes Green" March 11

March 11, 1:00–1:30 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

The World's Largest Concert has been a highlight since 1985 and this year the concert "Goes Green!" "The Green Anthem" will be included in the 2010 program. As a sing-along concert that links students around the world through music, the WLC reaches an estimated 6 million students, teachers and music supports each year. Meet the Author – Cokie Roberts

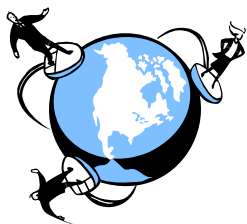
Designed for grades 9-12, this LIVE program gives students the opportunity to talk to the authors about their latest books, the writing process and becoming a writer. Cokie Roberts is a political commentator for ABC News. In addition to her appearances on the airwaves, she has written several best sellers including *Founding Mothers* and *Ladies of Liberty*.

The Curious Mr. Catesby – Added to *StreamlineSC!*

In 1722, Mark Catesby, an English artist and naturalist, visited the American wilderness. For four years, he explored the natural world of the southeast colonies and the Bahamas. He returned to England and spent the next 20 years writing, engraving, coloring, and publishing his two-volume *Natural History of Carolina, Florida & the Bahama Islands*. It was the first fully illustrated study of the natural history of North America and the most comprehensive to date. Although first edition copies of the *Natural History* are extremely rare, two can be found in South Carolina. One is located at Middleton Place Plantation near Charleston and another at Thomas Cooper Library in Columbia. As South Carolinians, we are especially interested in Catesby’s work in the Lowcountry and Piedmont areas of our state. He documented species in his drawings that we will never see again – the Carolina Parakeet, the Ivory-billed Woodpecker and the Passenger Pigeon. As an artist, he was the first to draw sketches from life as opposed to dead, posed specimens. He also depicted plants and animals in the context of their natural habitats. As a scientist and acute observer, he proposed the theory of bird migration; and he was probably the first to recognize how natural and man-made destruction of a species’ habitat leads to extinction. His influence can be seen in the works of Audubon and other noted naturalists who followed in his footsteps. Catesby realized a life-long goal when he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society in London.

The documentary film, **The Curious Mr. Catesby**, tells the fascinating story of Mark Catesby and how his work changed the world of science and art. Based on research that shows strong correlations between PSAT/NMSQT scores and AP Exam results, AP Potential is designed to help you increase access to AP and to ensure that no student who has the chance of succeeding in AP is overlooked.
- **Advanced Placement: Summary of Answers and Skills (SOAS)** – The PSAT/NMSQT Summary of Answers and Skills (SOAS) is provided free-of-charge to every school that tested at least 25 students in a single grade. The report allows users to analyze, aggregate test question information and to examine students’ academic skill level at the time they took the test. The analyses include comparisons with the nation’s performance, your state’s performance, and a comparable group’s performance. SOAS keeps the focus on student skills as answers are analyzed across each grade level, providing insight into how well students understand and apply the skills taught in your curriculum.


