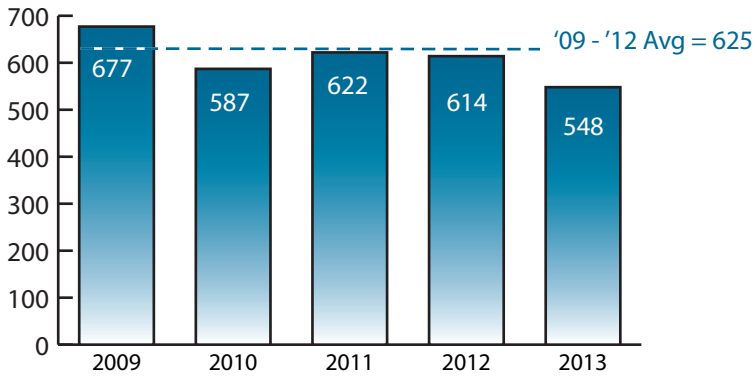


SOUTH CAROLINA TRAFFIC FATALITY REPORT FOR 2013

Statistics through September 2013

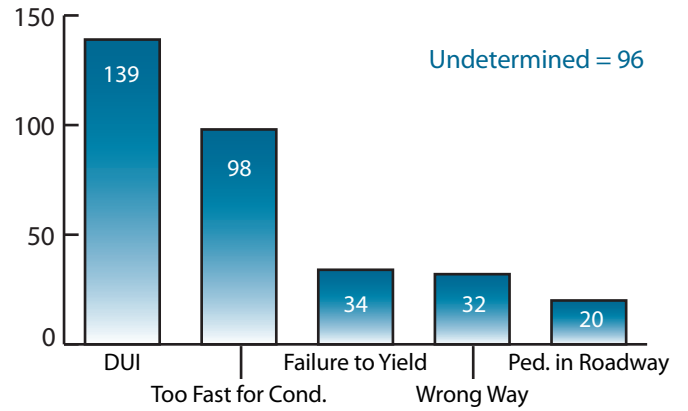

2009 - 2013 Fatality Comparison through September



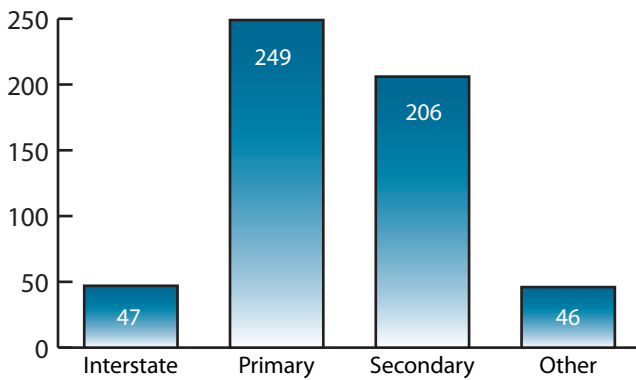
Traffic fatalities through September 2013 are 11% below 2012 and 12% below the previous four-year average.

Top Probable Causes



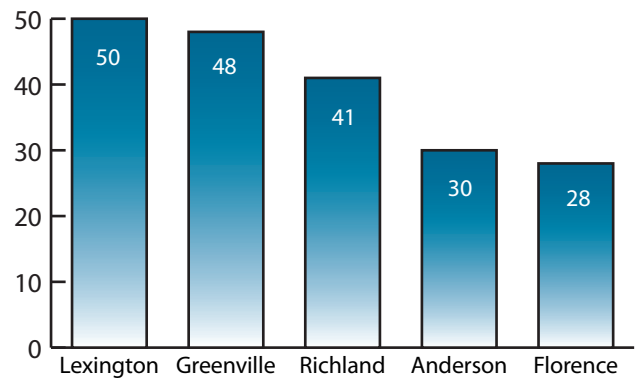
Fatalities caused by driver's failure to yield are down 20 from 2012 and 10 less than 2011. Fatalities caused by DUI and travelling too fast for conditions remain nearly unchanged over each of the last two years.

Fatalities by Route Category



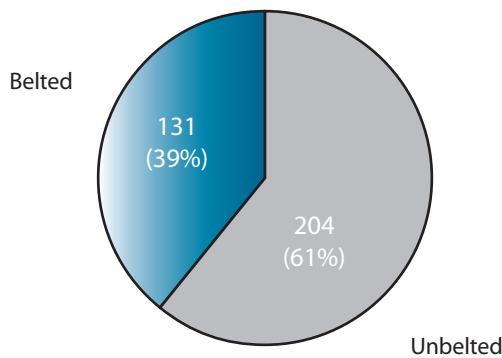
Fatalities on Interstates are 19 below 2012 and 41 less than in 2011. Fatalities on Primary roads have experienced similar reductions, while those on Secondaries have remained fairly constant over the past 3 years.

Top Fatality Counties



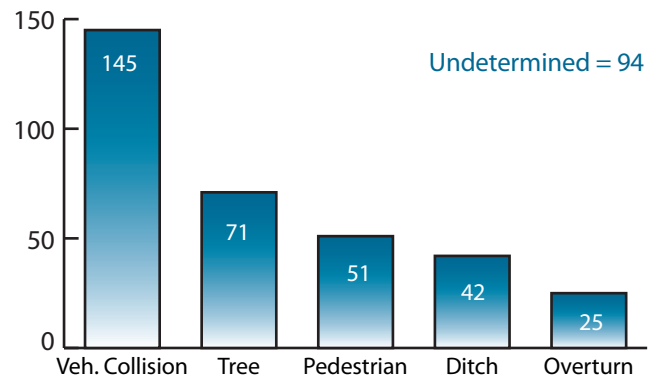
Edgefield remains the only county without a traffic fatality in 2013. Over the past 3 years, they have averaged over 5 by this time of the year. Anderson and Spartanburg have seen the greatest decline compared to the past 3 years.

Fatalities by Restraint Usage



This graphic does not include 213 people (pedestrians, motorcyclists and others) who were killed and did not have access to restraints.

Top Crash Events



Pedestrian deaths are down 19 compared to this time last year. Nearly 20% of all fatalities involve vehicles hitting trees along the roadway.
