To celebrate Career Development Month, this special *In Our Schools* program is Part 1 of a two-part series that looks at how Forestbrook Middle School in Horry County has created a world-class career exploration program that prepares students for high skill, high wage and big demand careers. In addition, we'll meet the National and State Career Specialist of the Year 2011 to learn about best practices and the role of career and technology education in workforce development.

In Our Schools - Outstanding Career Guidance in Middle School, Part 2

A strong career exploration program is essential in middle school to prepare students for career and technology (CTE) course selections in high school. In Part 2, we'll see how Forestbrook Middle School in Horry County works with parents and businesses to enhance work-based learning and classroom guidance for students. Also, we'll hear about their successful transition process as students matriculate from elementary to middle school and then to high school or career centers.

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NEW Project Discovery – Life at Lemmon Hill Plantation, Part 1 ... November 27 at 1:00 p.m. on ETV and IMC

This special **Project Discovery** program, produced by the South Carolina Department of Education's eMedia team with SCETV, will take students to Lemmon Hill Plantation near Winnsboro to explore a historic home with remnants of authentic indigo paint and an unusual decorated ceiling in a bedroom that now holds the bed belonging to an important South Carolinian! We'll discuss what we can learn about life long ago from visiting this midlands home and why it is important to preserve these hallmarks of our South Carolina history. This program is recommended for students in grades 3-12.

Join hosts eMedia's Bette Jamison, SCDE Social Studies Consultant Lewis Huffman and Katie Mixon to learn why settlers living in our coastal areas made their way inland to build working plantations as we take a look at life during the 1790's and early 1800's in the piedmont region of our state. We'll see how Lemmon Hill Plantation, rescued and restored over the last few years to its original beauty, is an example of the refined living that was rather unique to what was the back country at that time. During this period of our history, western Fairfield county was a bastion of extreme wealth with cotton and indigo grown abundantly in the fertile fields and beautiful, blue granite mined in nearby quarries.

This program is Part 1 of two **Project Discovery** programs produced at Lemmon Hill Plantation, each approximately 27 minutes in duration. Part 2 will air in February and focus on the contributions of the African Americans who helped South Carolina plantations prosper. As craftsmen they built fine and useful furnishings, some of which we'll get to see in this program. Special thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Chuck Corley, owners of Lemmon Hill Plantation, for working with eMedia and SCETV to produce this interesting program that allows South Carolina students to go back in time to see what life was like over 200 years ago in this area of our state! Please alert your social studies teachers to this special.

Project Discovery – Honoring the Role of SC Veterans in Our History aired last November from the SC State Museum to honor South Carolinians who served our country, highlighting famous and unknown heroes as we discover how our state has played a significant role in our nation's military history from the time of the Revolutionary War through present day. This program is appropriate for 3rd grade through high school students, supporting the revised 2011 Social Studies Academic Standards.

The SC State Museum has a featured exhibit on the Civil War. In this program, **Project Discovery** explores military life during this period, looks at *The Hunley* and talks about little known heroes not only of this era, but also World War I. We also honor Revolutionary War heroes, including women such as Dicey Langston, as we move through history to present day, learning about the role of African Americans at Camp Jackson and the Fort growing to the major training facility it is today.

Special guests with eMedia's Bette Jamison and co-host Lewis Huffman, SCDE Social Studies consultant, include Tom Falvey, SC State Museum; Joe Long, SC Confederate Relic Room and Military Museum; and Kevin Shwedo, Retired U.S. Army, plus a message about Veteran's Day from our State Superintendent of Education Mick Zais.

- Nov. 8, 2012 ***Emissaries of Peace*** – During the French and Indian War, Cherokee people struggles to preserve their independence. Follow Cherokee leader Ostenaco and Virginian Henry Timberlake on their 1762 journey in search of a lasting peace.
- Dec. 13, 2012 ***Colonial Idol (premiere)*** – Vote for outstanding musical performances in Colonial Idol! This exciting talent showcase features 18th c. music, including Native American songs, military tunes, enslaved people’s work songs, and much more. We’ll discover how music can influence individuals, shape public opinion and even change history.
- Jan. 17, 2013 ***Research Rescue Squad (premiere)*** – Someone is stealing books and removing footnotes. The Research Rescue Squad will save the day to defeat the evil “Dubious Sources,” helping students do solid research using the library, Internet and museums.
- Feb. 14, 2013 ***The Slave Trade*** – This program explores the U.S. Law of 1807 that abolished the transatlantic slave trade. Meet the people involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains and crew, government officials, navy officers, and antislavery activists.
- Mar. 14, 2013 ***The Global Economy (premiere)*** – Join Maggie, an adventurous rat, as she boards ships using international trade routes to make her way home from England to the American colonies. Along the way, discover the inner workings of an 18th c. mercantile system.
- Apr. 11, 2013 ***The Industrious Tradesmen*** – Follow the lives of several journeymen fresh from their apprenticeships in trades and business as they learn how skill and opportunity will impact their careers. Who will achieve their dreams and become masters of their own shops?

RIGHTS: SC schools may view with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but program must be used within ten days and erased/destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that get a scholarship through eMedia OR pay CWEFT to participate can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape/DVD, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

Each 10-minute **Deskercise** program is built around a weekly theme. eMedia will block feed the entire month's programs (usually 4 weeks or 20 programs) during the middle of each month PRIOR to when they are recommended for use according to the weekly themes. For example, all the programs designed with themes for December use will air November 9 and 16. eMedia repeats several November topics the first of this month so you can access them if you have not yet! November's theme for the third week is "Children's Book Week." The five programs, each 10 minutes, for this week all contain the same core exercise segment that relates information on the importance of reading. Each of the five programs with the "Children's Book Week" theme begins with a different warm-up segment about a place in a different state and ends with a different short health tip, but the core exercise-at-your-desk segment is the same the entire week.

The series was developed in cooperation with the American Association for Health Education (AAHE) and provided by the State Department of Education through eMedia.

To help SC schools meet the Constitution Day requirements, The **SC Chapter of the American Board of Trial Advocates** (ABOTA) sponsors the Annual **James Otis Lecture** series at the SC State House in observance of National Constitution Day.

By federal law, all schools that receive federal assistance are required to have a program about the Constitution on or around the anniversary date of the signing of the Constitution on September 17, 1787. James Otis was a prominent Boston lawyer in the colonial era credited by John Adams as igniting the spark that led to the Declaration of Independence and the American Revolution. ABOTA nationally developed the James Otis Lecture Series to help schools comply.

Constitution Day 2012 focused on privacy and first amendment rights in the age of social media, examining doctrines from the past applied in the context of today's ever-changing technology and its implications for individual rights as well as freedom of speech. The keynote speaker was Furman University President Rodney Smolla.

Recommended for middle and high school students, this program takes students to Hollywood, California and to ICAR at Clemson University. In Hollywood for program one, we visit with **Billy Brooks**, who is a Senior Lighter in animation at fabulous DreamWorks, the home of *Kung Fu Panda*, *Shrek* and *Puss in Boots*. Mr. Brooks takes South Carolina students on a journey behind the scenes of the DreamWorks “campus” where we learn about the fascinating 21st century work environment and what a career in animation is like in a highly creative setting with cutting edge technology. Students learn how co-founder Steven Spielberg developed a work place that fosters creativity. And video game-obsessed students can set their sights on “careers in animation.”

Then coming back to South Carolina in program two we meet **Dr. Imtiaz Haque** who is Executive Director of the Carroll A. Campbell Graduate Engineering Center, Founding Chair of the Department of Automotive Engineering and past chair of the Department of Mechanical Engineering at Clemson University. His teaching and research interests lie in the general areas of dynamics, vibrations, mechanisms and machines, and manufacturing process simulation. He has been involved with the design, modeling and simulation of mechanical systems including vehicles and transmissions since 1975 and led the development of the Graduate Program in Automotive Engineering at CUICAR.

SC's Military Career Pathways 101 Initiative (MCP101)

Recommended for grades 5–12, these four programs allow students to evaluate both sides, look at military strategies and experience the turmoil during this period to understand why the war occurred.

- **America's Iliad: The Siege of Charleston (SL)** Repeats Nov. 8, 2:00–3:55 p.m. IMC

Recommended for grades 8–12, this documentary depicts political events, personalities, military campaigns, participation of African Americans, and the upheaval of this period in Charleston, SC.

- **Charleston Forts (SL)** Repeats Nov. 9, 8:00–8:57 a.m. IMC

Recommended for grades 3–8, this **Project Discovery** program features forts of the Charleston area – Fort Moultrie, Fort Johnson and Fort Sumter. History between the Revolution and Civil War is discussed.

- **Gettysburg National Military Park (SL)** Repeats Nov. 5, 10:10 a.m.–2:25 p.m. IMC

Recommended for grades 4–12, this series of four hour-long programs brings the history to life as we visit this historic site to look at the battles, the soldiers and their stories of courage and the area now.

- **Ironclads in the Harbor (SL)** Repeats Nov. 15, 1:50–2:00 p.m. IMC

Recommended for grades 4–12, this program tells the history of the Naval Battle for Charleston as it relates to the story of J.M. Emanuel who was assigned to the experimental ironclad, *The Keokuk*.

- **(NEW) Complete History of the United States Wars (1700-2004), Program 4: The Civil War**

Recommended for grades 7–12, this program looks at the period from 1846 to 1865 when the two wars America fought in could not have been more different. The Mexican American War of 1846 was a brief and almost light-hearted campaign that brought vast new territory to the nation. Fifteen years later, the ultimate pain of war fell directly on the country for the first time when America turned new, more lethal weapons on each other in the Civil War. NEW – Complete History of United States Wars 1700-2004

Access online in *StreamlineSC* Broadcast again in February 2013 (announced in Feb. Update)
(This series has **LIMITED rights**, which means eMedia can only broadcast it twice in this school year – once in September and once in February. It can be accessed anytime in *StreamlineSC*.)

Designed for grades 7–12 this NEW eMedia series features eight programs each @30 minutes in duration that are hosted by George Kennedy and tell the 300-year saga of United States Wars. From the time the first colonists set foot upon North America's shores, they were in conflict with the Native inhabitants. One hundred years later the colonies found themselves an extension of the conflicts in Europe. Less than a century later, the Revolutionary War freed the fledgling United States from the British. America grew in strength and power until at the beginning of the 21st century it was the foremost military power in the world. The programs use visuals, animated maps, film clips, reenactments, period paintings, and location shots with narration to examine the origins and outcomes of each conflict. Below are titles/descriptions followed by year/name of engagements.

Program One: Wars for the Continent

At the beginning of the 18th-century two factors shaped the colonial approach to war: First early colonists found themselves isolated in hostile territory so in order to survive they had to develop tactics and strategies similar to native populations they were fighting. It was the beginning of the self-reliant character that would define America. Secondly, the colonists participated in the dramatic change taking place in European weaponry that came with the introduction of gunpowder. Their isolation ended when the French, English, Spanish, and Native Americans all vied for control of the North American continent.

Program Two: The Revolutionary War

The colonists, having rid themselves of the French and Native Americans, found a new threat – their own mother country. Britain moved rapidly to put the rebellion down and the colonists learned their militia units could not stand up to the European style of fighting so they adopted the Native American strategy of fighting from concealment.

Program Three: Manifest Destiny Wars

The fifty years between the Revolutionary War and the Alamo saw the beginning of the push westward . . . what would ultimately be called the Manifest Destiny.

Program Four: The Civil War

From 1846 to 1865 the two wars America fought in could not have been more different. The Mexican American War of 1846 was a brief and almost light-hearted campaign that brought vast new territory to the nation. Fifteen years later, the ultimate pain of war fell directly on the country for the first time when America turned new, more lethal weapons on each other in the Civil War.

Program Five: The Imperial Wars

In the years after the Civil War from 1868-1918, the call of Manifest Destiny turned Americans westward once more and quickly the United States became engaged in its longest running war, The Plains Indians War from 1868-1890. Then our nation, for the first time, took its growing military might onto the world stage in the Spanish-America War and then again in World War One.

Program Six: The Global Wars

After WWI, the 19th-century's old balance of power vanished and once more world domination through military conquest loomed. In the years 1939-1953 America spreads its military across half the planet and took command of the fight against totalitarianism in World War II and communism in the Korean War.

Program Seven: The Cold War

By the middle of the 20th-century, a new kind of war emerged. It was a war whose battles did not allow for direct confrontation between the two major combatants – the United States and the Soviet Union. This was because direct confrontation with atomic weapons would have led to total annihilation of both adversaries.

Program Eight: The Police Wars

As the Vietnam War drew to a close, it became clear that the American military had experienced a defeat to a communist adversary. Ironically, at the same time the danger from the greater nemesis of global communism was on decline. During these years, our military would reach an all-time low only to reemerge as the world's single superpower with a new role as the world's policeman.

The law provides requirements and prohibitions related to pregnancy prevention, sexually transmitted disease prevention including HIV, and reproductive health. The CHE Act also requires districts to maintain a local Comprehensive Health Education Advisory Committee comprised of students, teachers, health professionals, clergy, parents, and community members with the responsibility of reviewing and approving all sexual risk reduction materials before being used in schools. This overview will enhance the ability of superintendents, principals, and teachers to maintain compliance with the South Carolina Comprehensive Health Education Act. - **Making the Case for Comprehensive Tobacco-Free School Policies in South Carolina**

One in three high school students in South Carolina use some form of tobacco product. While all school districts prohibit students from using tobacco on school property, many districts still allow tobacco use by faculty, staff or visitors in certain locations.
