## Governor's Proclamation

**WHEREAS,** sickle cell disease is an inherited blood disorder causing medical problems including clogged blood vessels, anemia, pain, and organ damage; and

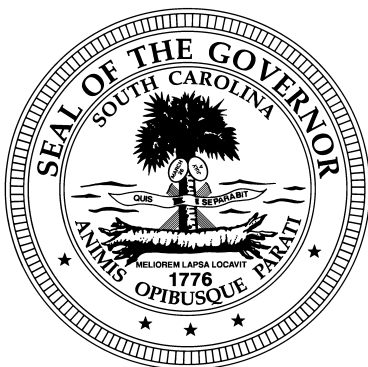
**WHEREAS,** one of the severe chronic diseases affecting children in the Palmetto State, sickle cell disease is present in one out of every 400 African American newborns, with ten percent of African Americans carrying the sickle cell trait gene; and

**WHEREAS,** unfortunately, no cure for sickle cell disease exists today, but quality disease management, treatment options and preventive services can alleviate suffering and deaths.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Mark Sanford, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim September 2004 as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to work together to raise public awareness of the treatment options and prevention services available for those who suffer or are at risk of suffering from sickle cell disease.
