Oklahoma National Stockyards Weekly Cattle Summary									
Compared to last week: Feeder steers steady to 3.00 higher. Feeder heifers traded unevenly steady. Steer calves 500-600 lbs steady to 2.00 higher, lighter weights not tested. Heifer calves not well tested. Quality plain to average. Demand moderate to good for feeder cattle, moderate for calves. Demand limited for short weaned or un-weaned calves. Temperatures remain very warm for the last day of September but a cold front is in the forecast for late in the week. Farmers continue to plant wheat pasture while some wheat is already up. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (58% Steers, 39% Heifers, 3% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 69%. Compared to last week: Breaker and Boner cows lightly tested with a steady to firm undertone noted. Lean cows 1.00 lower. Slaughter bulls sold steady. Demand moderate to good. Quality plain to average with a handful of attractive bred cattle on offer. A total of 301 cows and bulls with 60% going to packers. The estimated dressed cost at the Oklahoma National Stockyards: Lean Cows 117.97; Boners 120.64; Breakers 120.28; Light Weight Cows 109.83; Bulls 147.96. Supply included: 66% Slaughter Cattle (91% Cows, 9% Bulls); 34% Replacement Cattle (94% Bred Cows, 7% Cow-Calf Pairs).
