Compared to last week's light test: Feeder steers 5.00-8.00 higher, Feeder heifers steady to 5.00 higher than last week's limited offerings. Steer and heifer calves 4.00-10.00 higher. Demand good for feeder cattle, especially heavier weights. Grain prices have slowly moved higher making cost of gains higher, thus buyers more interested in buying the heavier weight cattle. Demand very good for calves. Rainfall from two weeks ago followed by fall sunshine has improved wheat pastures greatly and some producers beginning to turn cattle out on wheat. Quality average to attractive, end plain. Supply included: 100% Feeder Cattle (53% Steers, 45% heifers, 0% Cows, 2% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 48%.							
Compared to last week: Slaughter cows sold 1.00-5.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 4.00-5.00 lower on a light test. Demand moderate. A total of 706 cows and bulls sold with 48 percent going to packers. Supply included: 46% Feeder Cattle (100% Steers); 25% Slaughter Cattle (96% Cows, 4% Bulls); 28% Replacement Cattle (79% Bred Cows, 21% Cow-Calf Pairs). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 0%.
