## Governor's Proclamation

**WHEREAS,** mental illnesses, including depression, panic, eating, and other disorders, and schizophrenia, are treatable medical conditions that interfere with a person's ability to relate to others and cope with life; and

**WHEREAS,** people of all ages, races, and socioeconomic backgrounds are affected by mental disorders, with approximately one in five South Carolinians suffering from a diagnosable mental illness; and

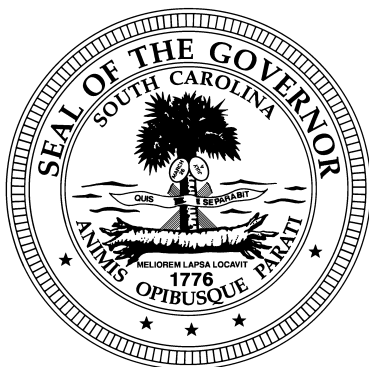
**WHEREAS,** early identification and proper treatment, including medication, counseling, self-help groups, and community services, are vital to the recovery of these patients; and

**WHEREAS,** mental health centers and private hospitals across the Palmetto State offer free depression screening for our residents on October 7, 2004.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Mark Sanford, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 4 - 10, 2004, as
