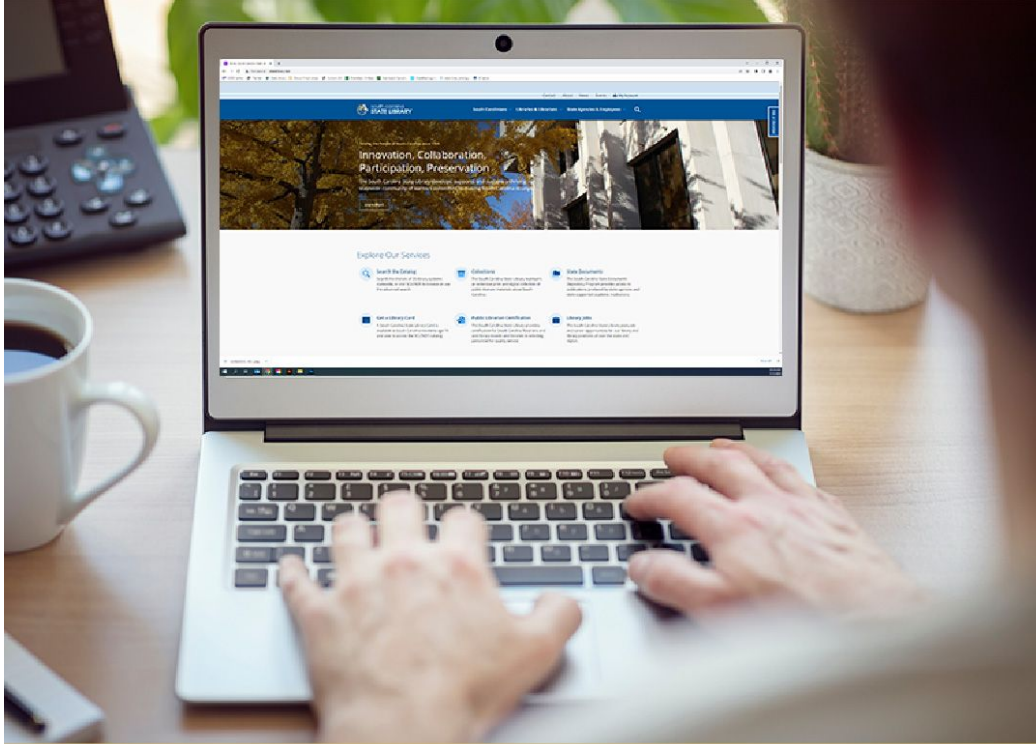
## June 2023 State Documents
