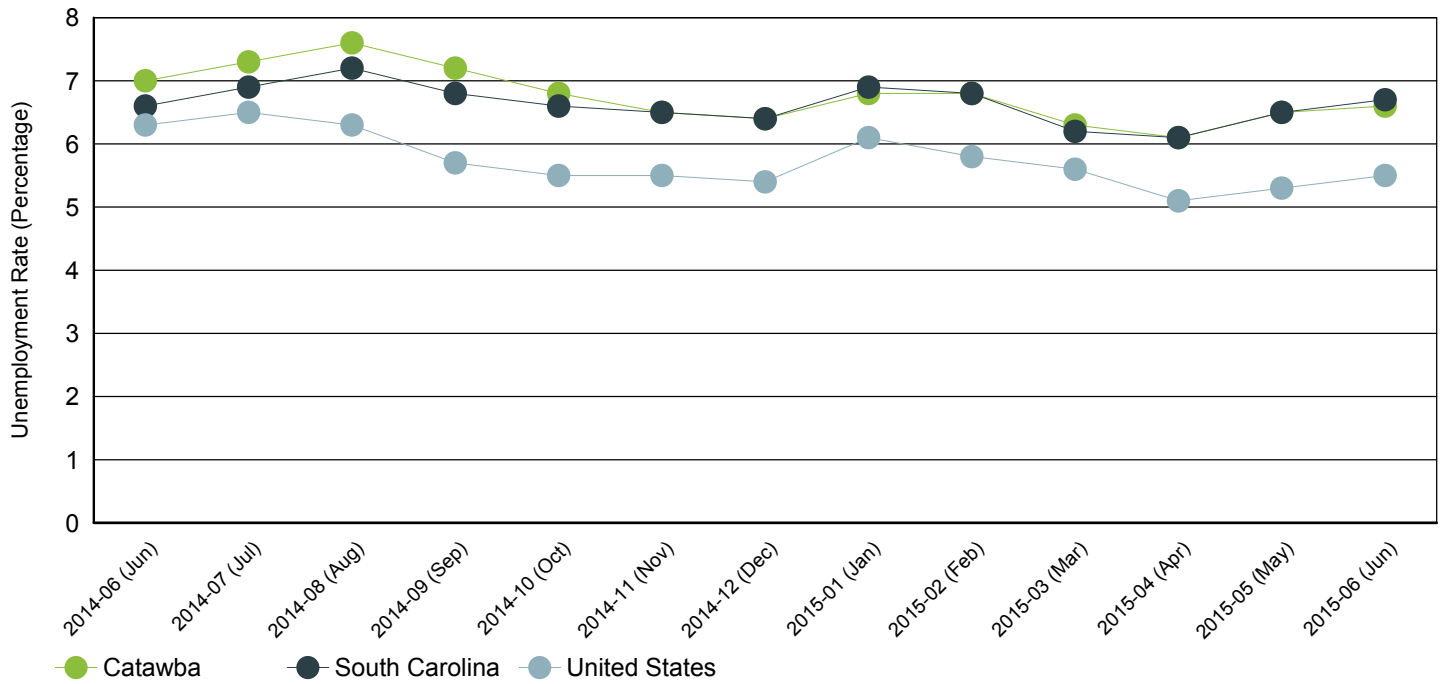

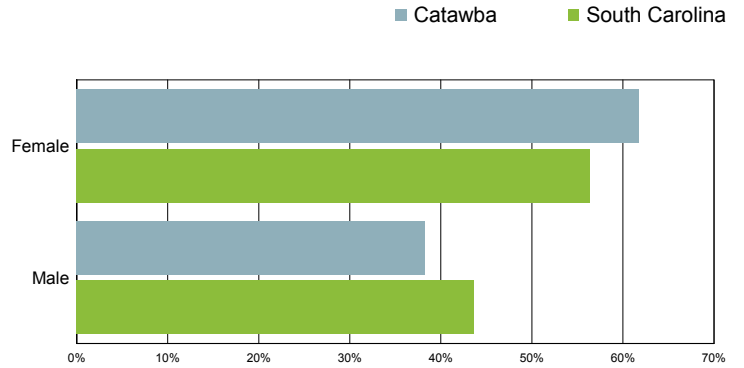

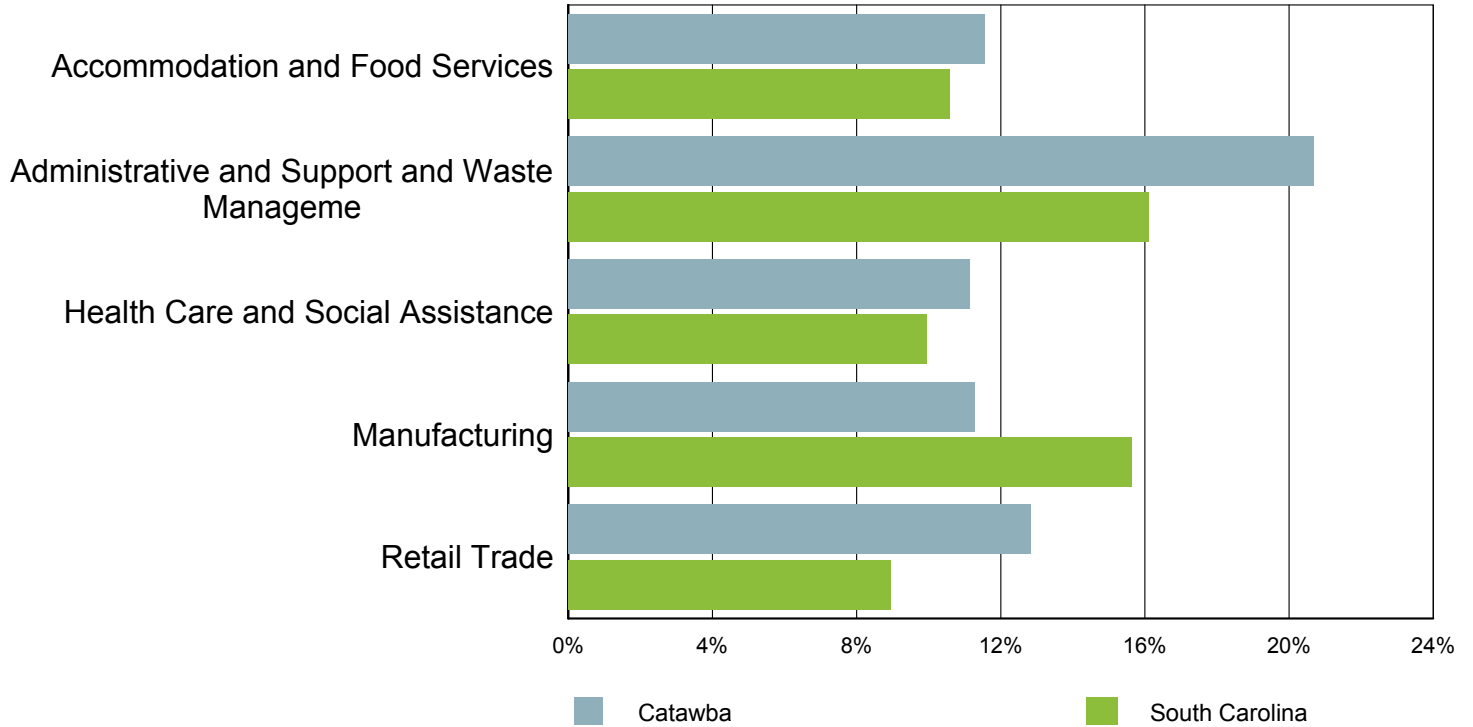

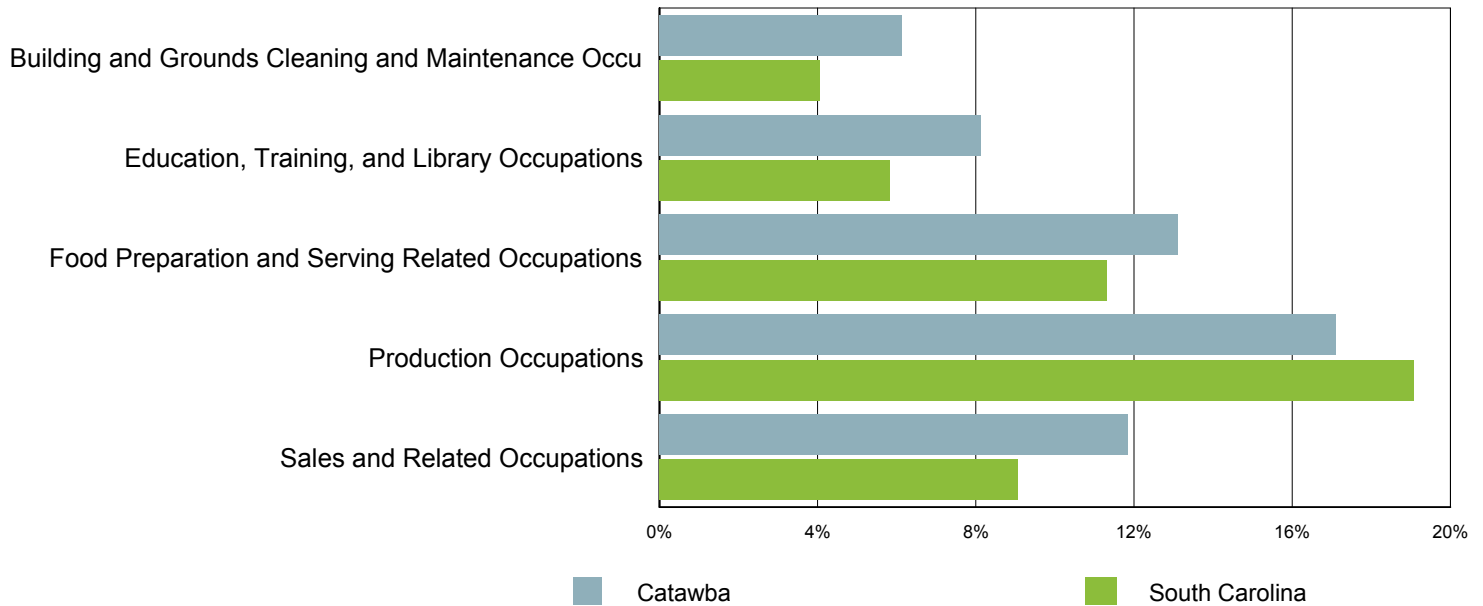

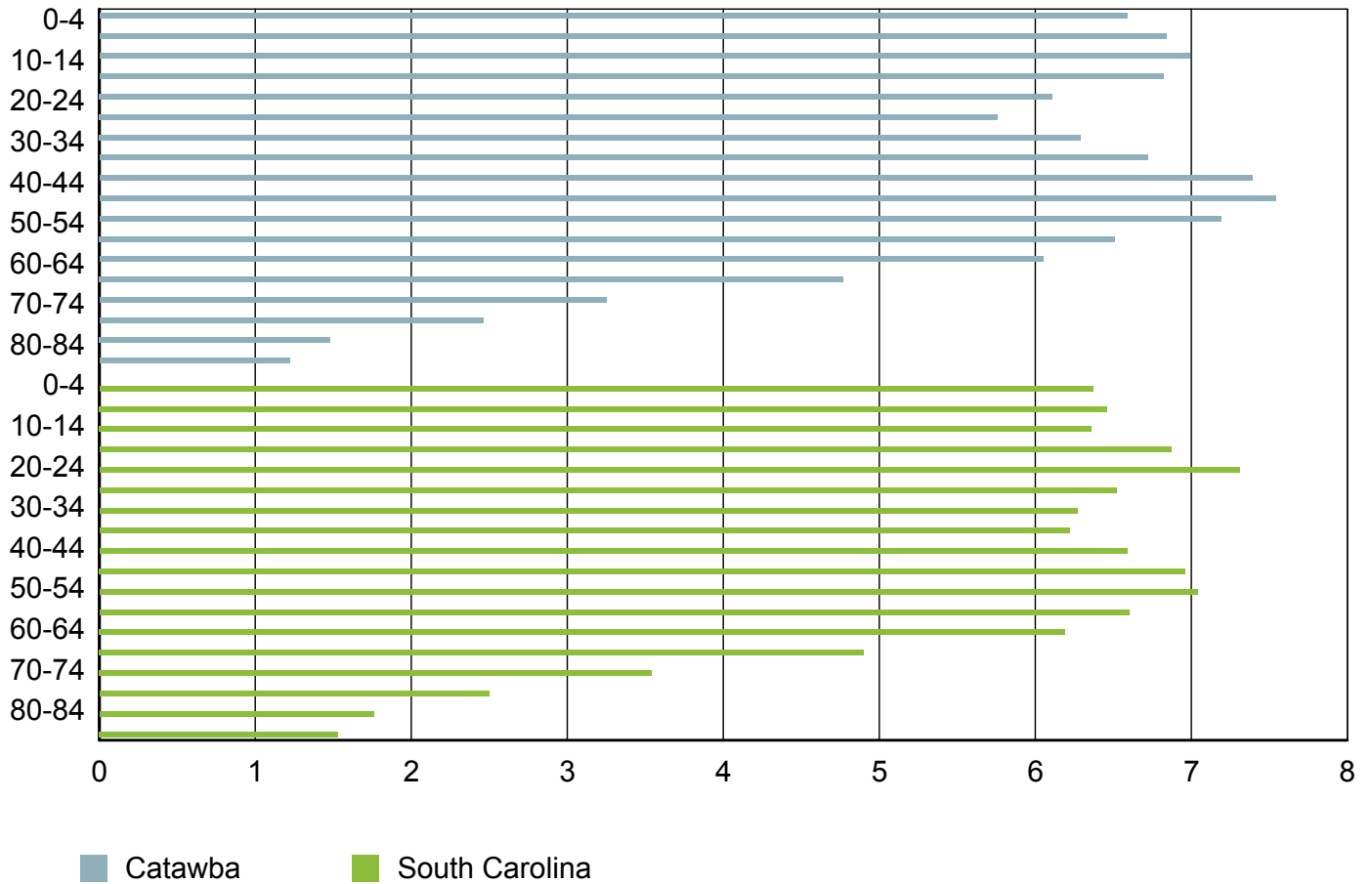

Population by Age



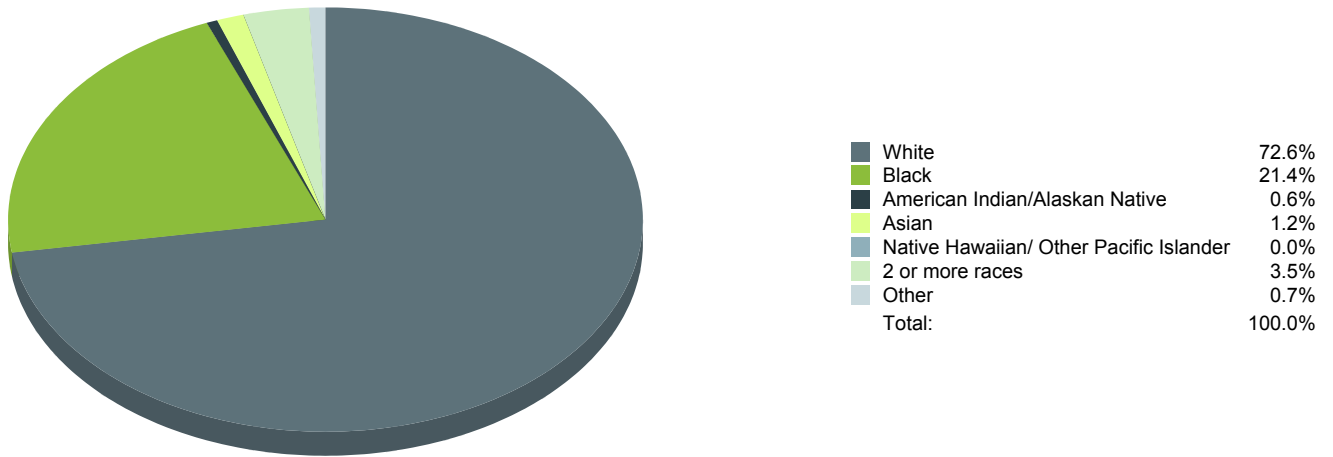

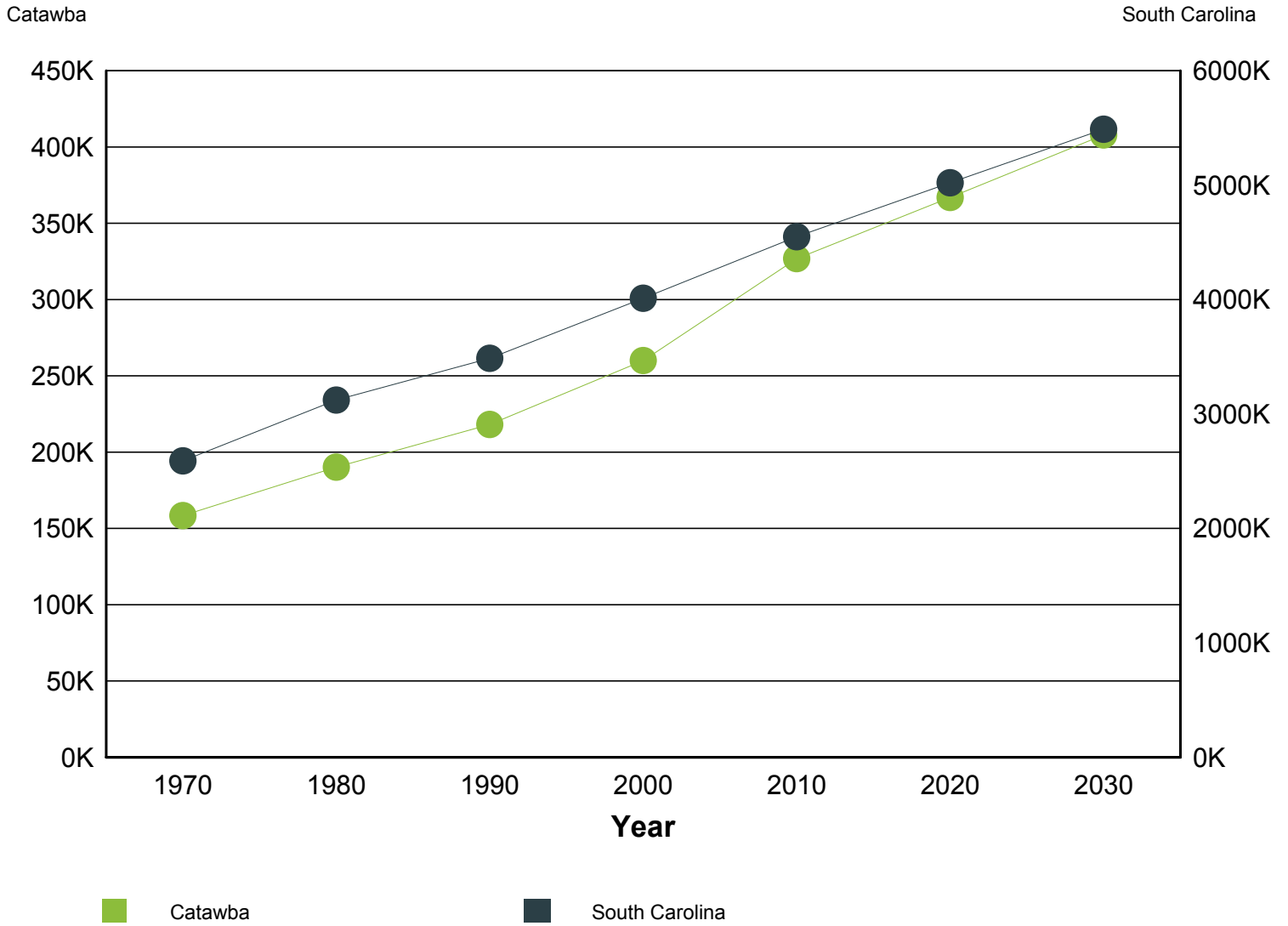
Population by Gender

Population Change

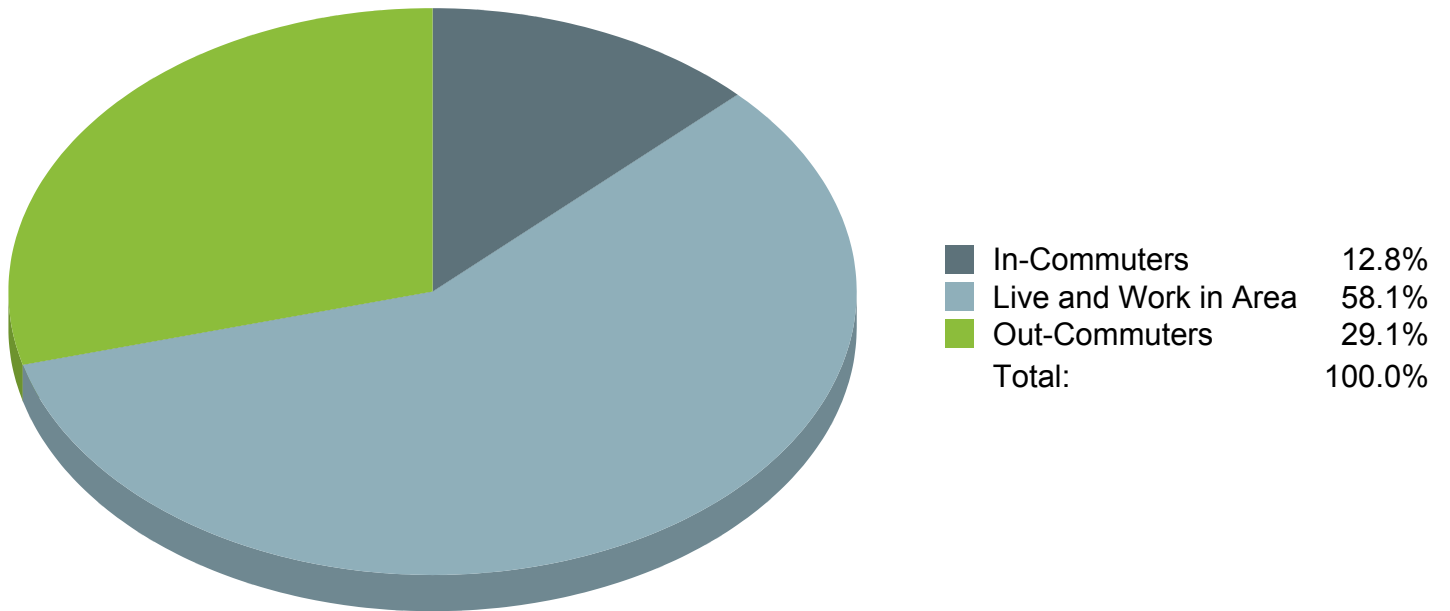

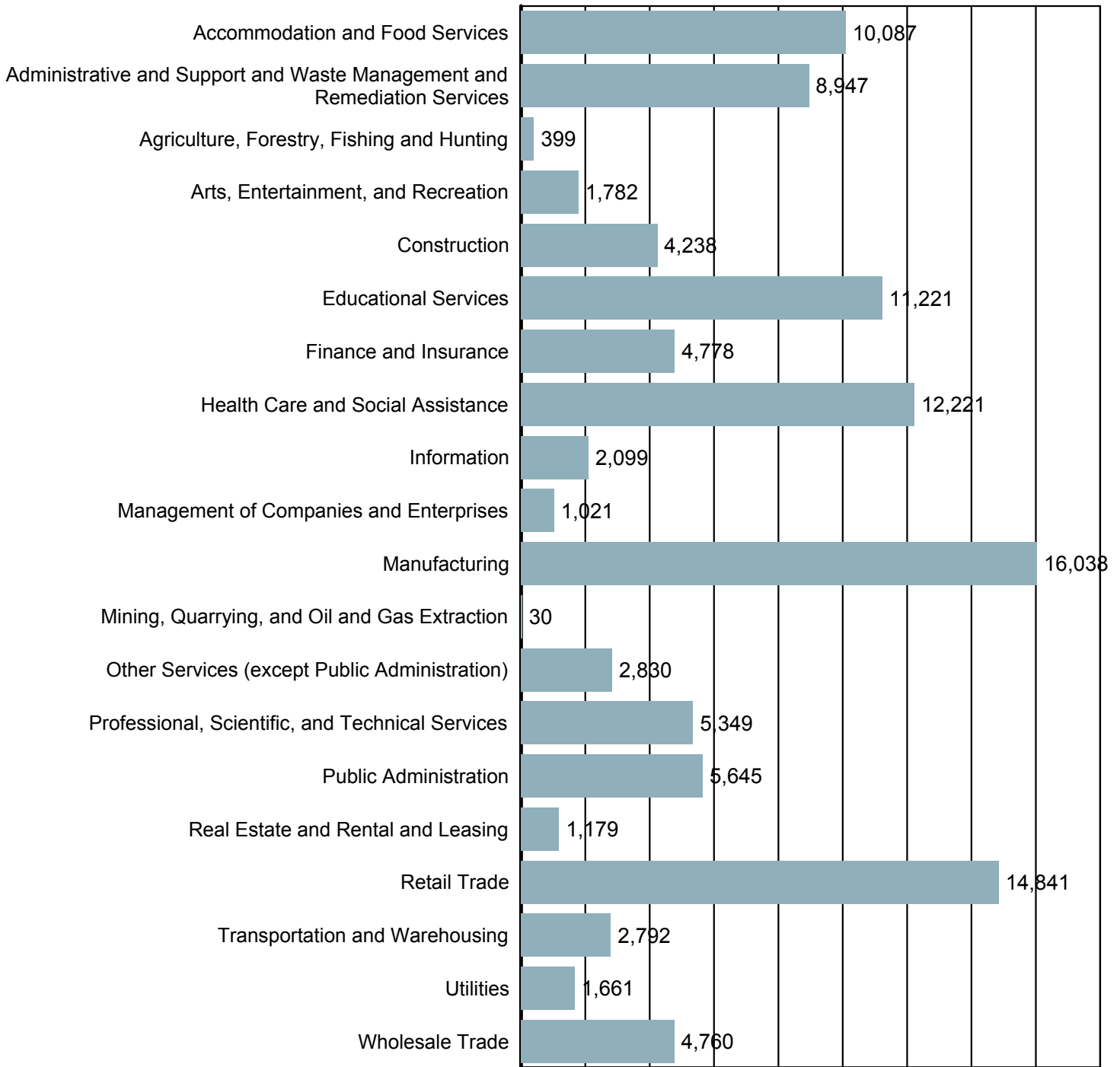

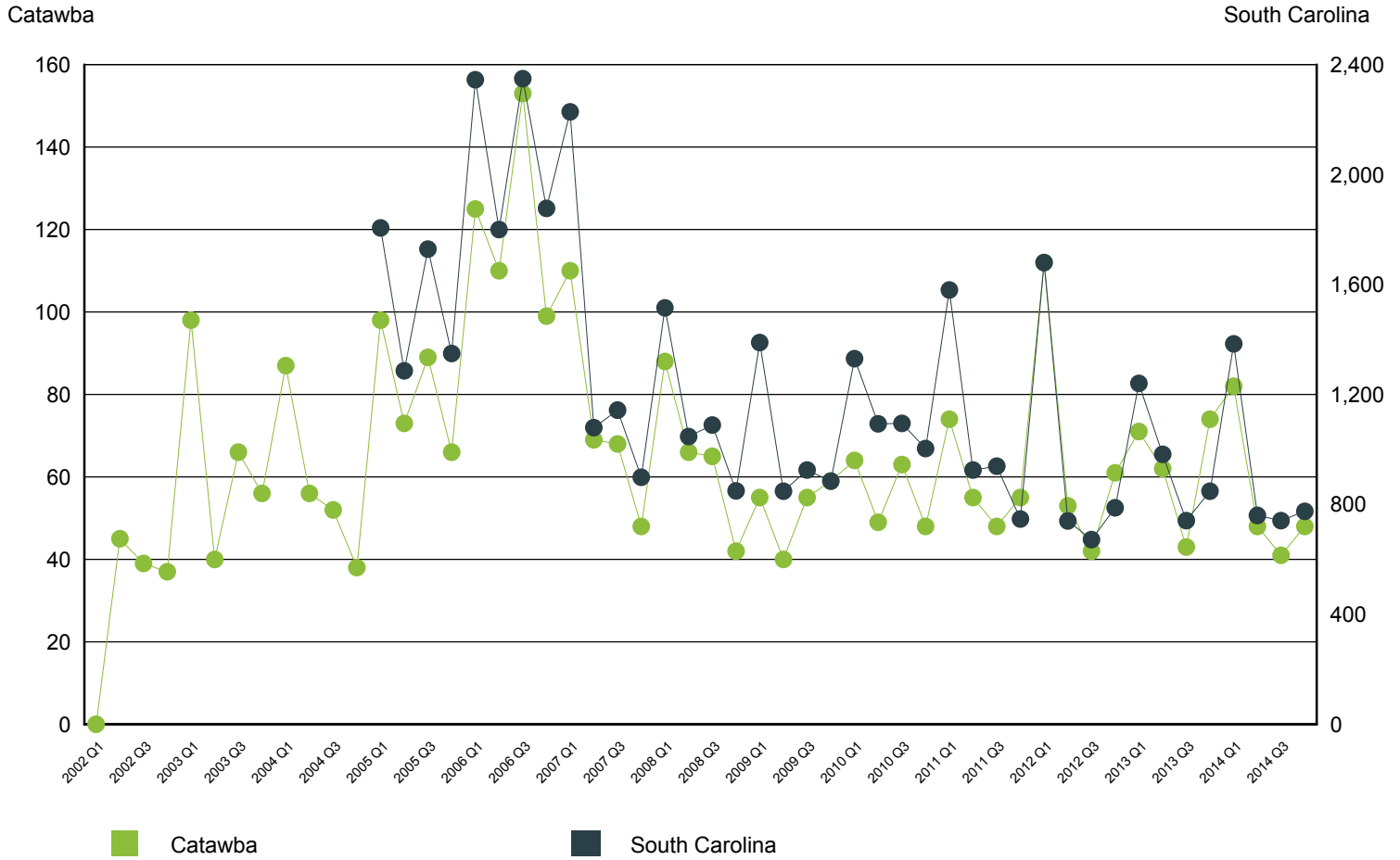

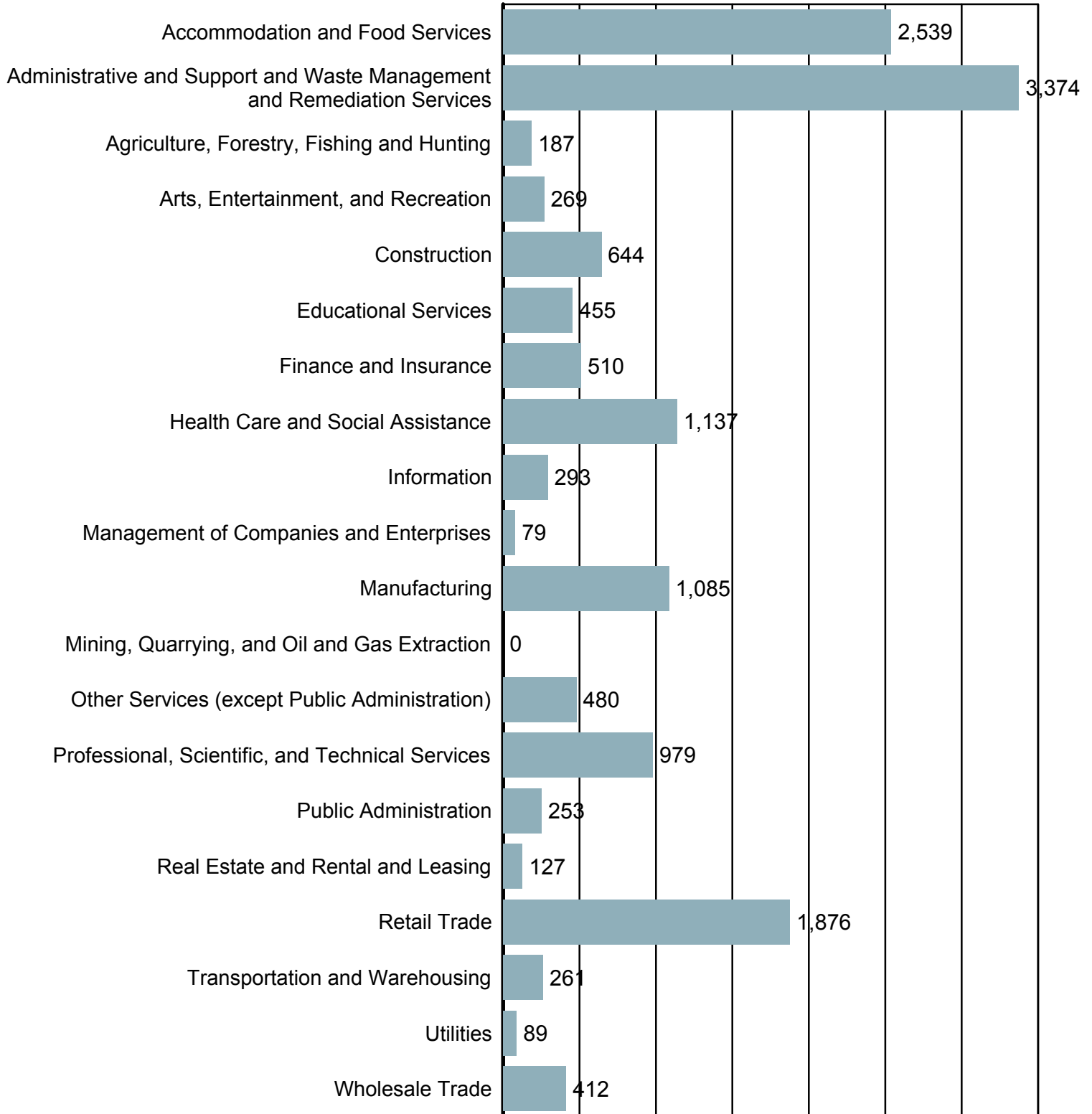

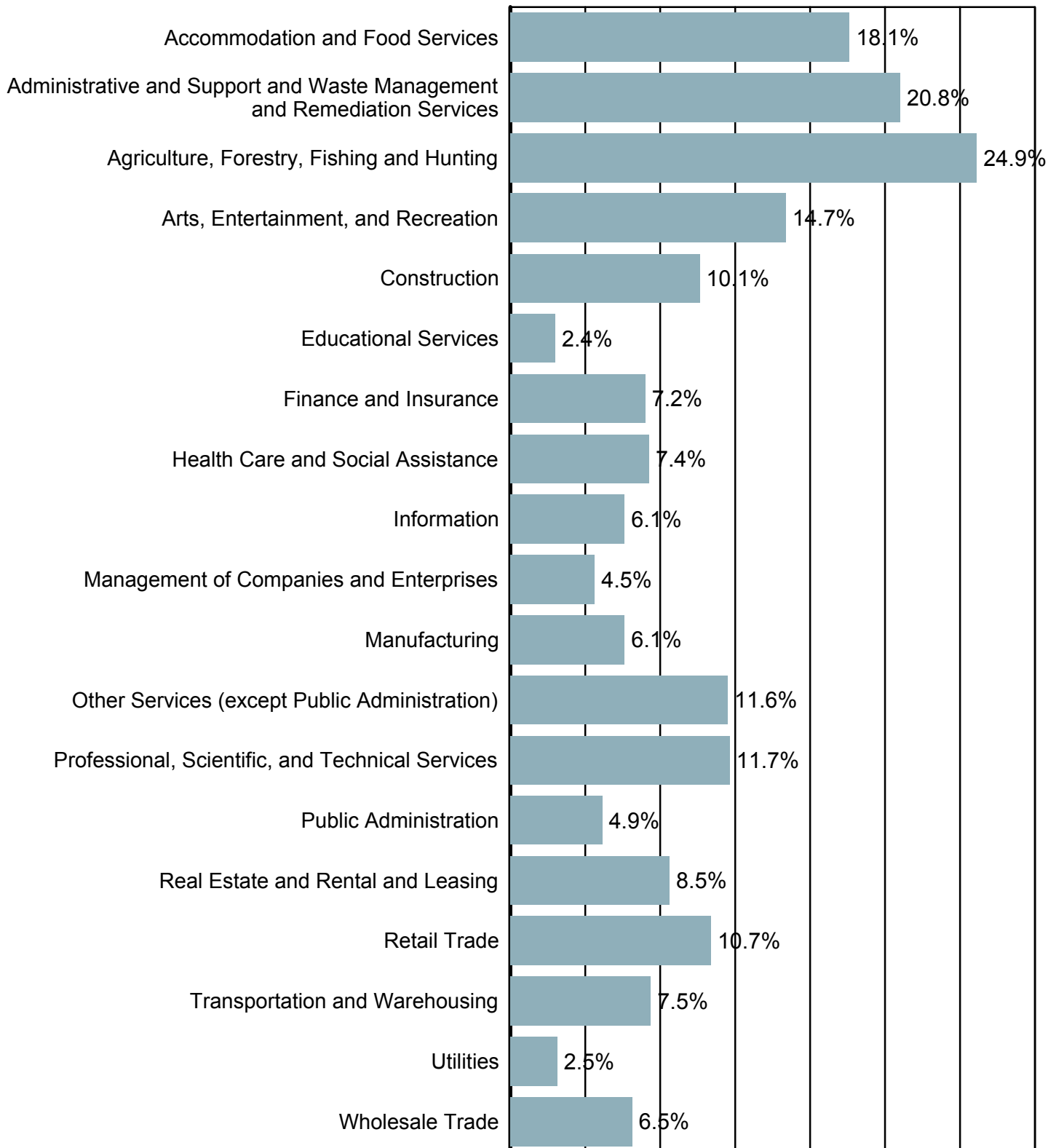

New Hires by Industry



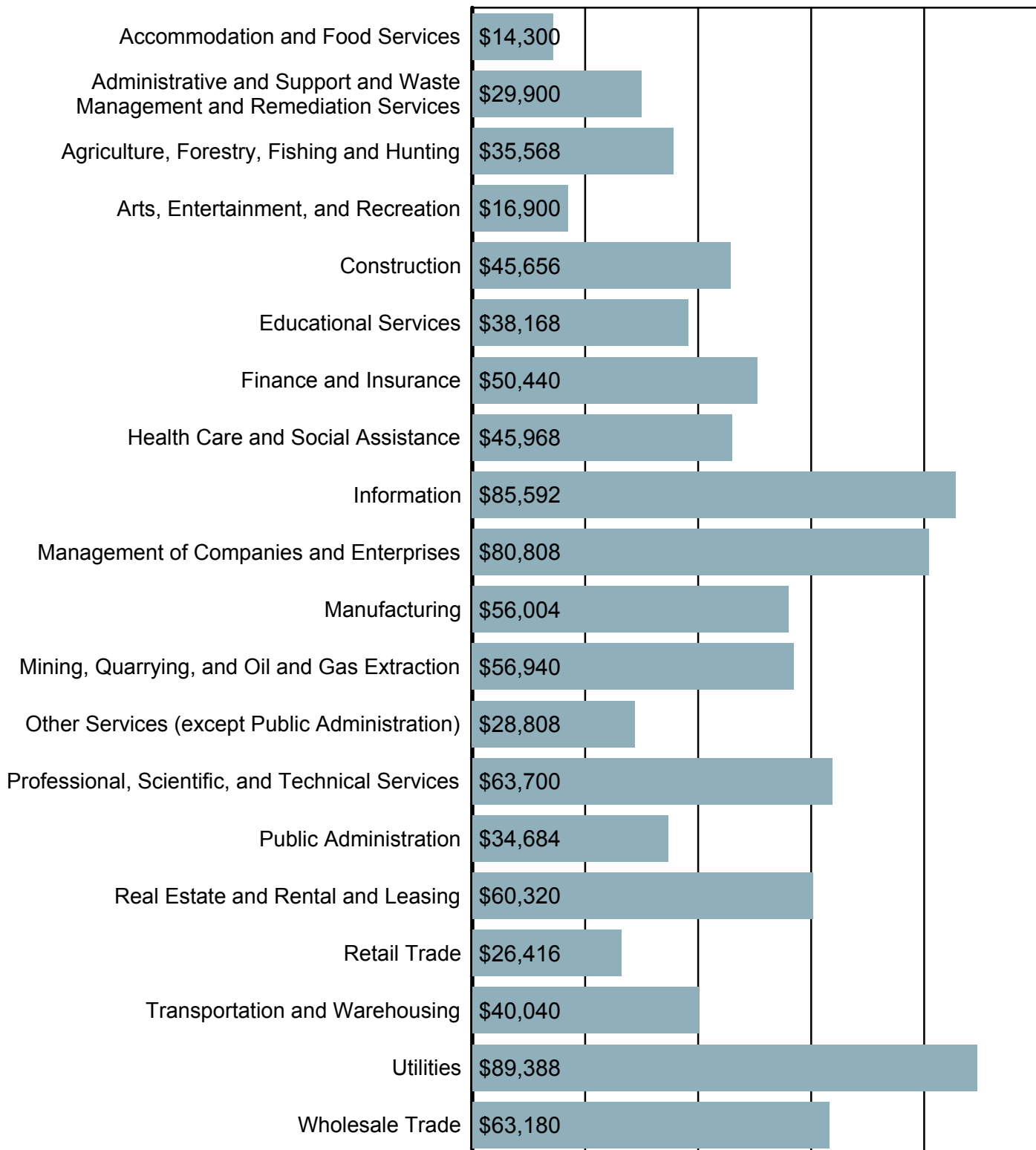

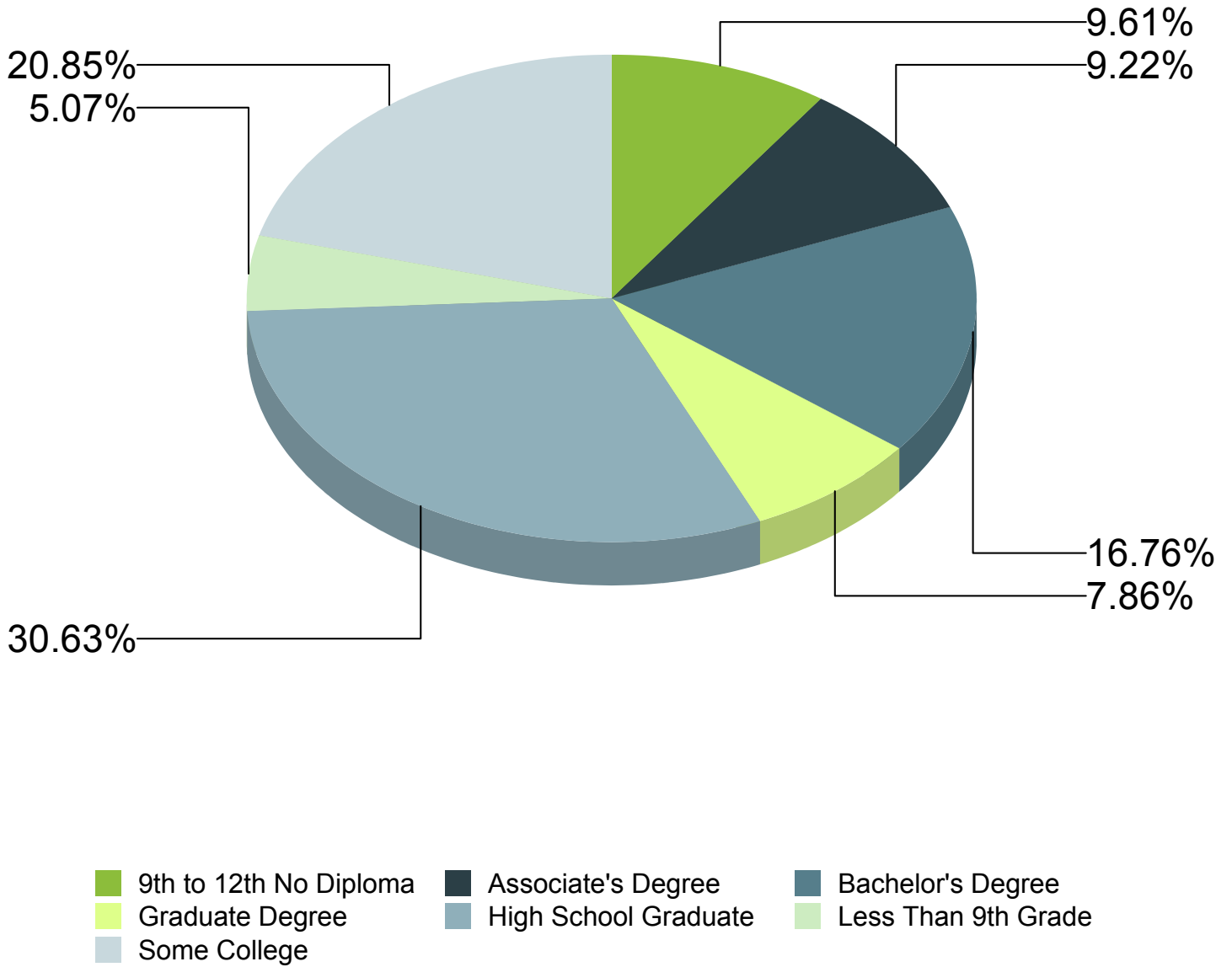

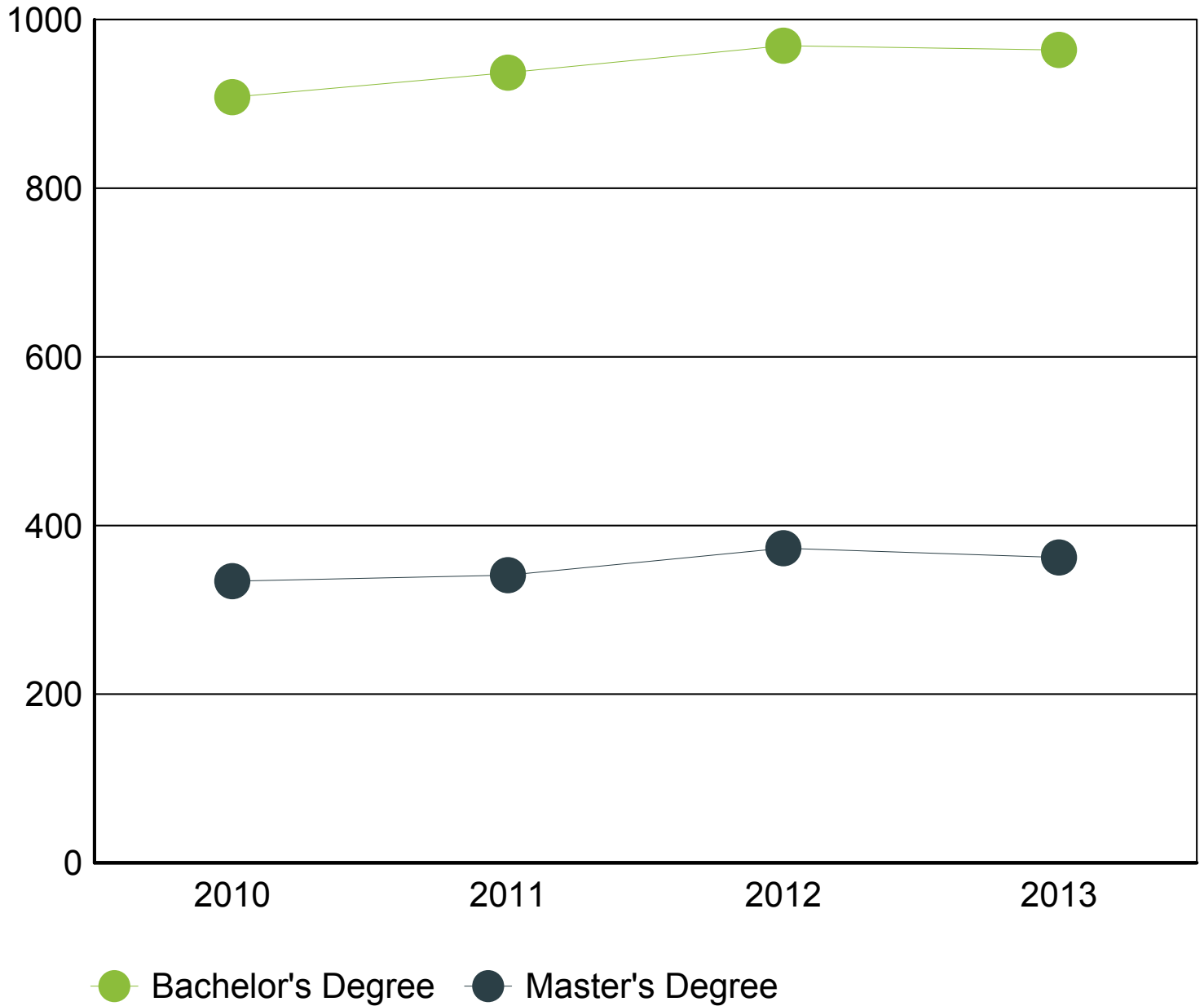
