On **August 17th** Jim Rex, State Superintendent of Education, invited audience participation and questions about funding public education in our state during this special broadcast at the beginning of the school year. - **In Our Schools – Palmetto Gold & Silver Award and Positive Behavior in Schools**

On **September 21st** the focus was on improved student performance as we visited two schools that were honored with the Palmetto Gold and Silver Award 2008. Created by the Education Accountability Act of 1998, this award is presented to schools that have improved student performance. ETV cameras visited Lugoff-Elgin Middle School in the Kershaw County School District and Lake View High School in Florence School District One to talk to educators and parents about how students have achieved success. All schools work hard to find effective ways to increase student achievement. At Chestnut Oaks Middle School in Sumter School District 17, they have implemented the PBIS process (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) and their own BEP (Behavior Education Program) program. As we see in this segment, when expectations and consequences are established, agreed upon and communicated, students experience success.

The Big Picture Presents: Ready to Vote 2008 LIVE Special for SC Students October 9 at 1:00 p.m.

A special edition of **The Big Picture Presents: Ready to Vote 2008** will air October 9, 1:00–2:00 p.m. for schools. For the critical 2008 presidential election season, ETV is focusing on programming by, for and about young voters. This special studio program with an accompanying Web site, will bring together young people from all over the state to engage in a lively dialogue about issues important to them and their peers. This project is a combined effort of ETV's News and Public Affairs Department, four regional stations, and the network's youth civic engagement project, **Ready To Vote**.

With the active participation of the regional stations, we will bring together young people from all over the state to engage in a lively dialogue about issues important to them and their peers. **Craig Melvin**, who was host of the **Ready to Vote Teen Forum 2004**, will return to Columbia from his new position at NBC News in Washington, DC to host this year's program. In addition, the most vocal student participants from the **Ready to Vote Teen Forum 2004** will come back to share with the audience the ways in which their political views have developed, and possibly changed, over the past four years.

The program will air LIVE during school hours in the ITV schedule so students can watch and send in questions via email and text messaging. It will be rebroadcast during prime time on ETV. The entire show will stream on the Ready To Vote Web site and clips will be uploaded to teen social networking sites.

ETV will also partner with the Media Arts Department of the University of South Carolina, the Apple Education Division and Panasonic Education to extend our election initiative to cell phones and iPods. USC Media Arts students will mentor students in selected high schools around the state in the production of videos on election issues, for delivery on iTunes and mobile devices. These student-produced mobile media reports will also be featured on the RTV Web site, and the video produced will be made available on the Web site for the Election Mash-up.

The Big Picture Presents: /Ready to Vote 2008 will be presented LIVE to schools October 9, 1:00–2:00 p.m. It will take place in the ETV studios in Columbia, Spartanburg, Beaufort and Sumter. The program will repeat statewide on ETV open circuit October 16, 7:00–8:00 p.m.

Ready to Vote is ETV's civic engagement outreach project that strives to get young people involved in politics. **The Big Picture** is ETV's weekly news show with a focus on vital issues in South Carolina. **The Big Picture Presents: Ready to Vote 2008** will be the first time these two programs have collaborated. With young people in the spotlight during this election year, it promises to be a very exciting show!

Please make sure your middle and high school teachers know about this program, especially your American Government classes. This program is being designed just for South Carolina students!

Primary Citizenship

The Constitution Through History (SL)

Almost Painless Guide to American Civics (SL)

Guerrilla Guide to Politics (SL)

Designed for grades 4–6. These six lessons tell the story of a boy who wants to be accepted by his friends who are tempting him to try drugs and alcohol. Hosted by Lou Gossett, Jr.

Middle/High School Level Recommendations: (SL indicates availability in StreamlineSC.)

* **Think Twice (SL)** – This lesson airs Oct. 7, 1:10–1:32 p.m. (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 6–12. This realistic program introduces youth to three teenagers who are actually incarcerated in South Carolina's juvenile prisons. These teens offer striking depictions of their loss of freedom, while reliving the events and choices that brought them to life behind bars. Their message: Things may have been different for them had they taken the time to "think twice."

* **Open Lines** – Lesson 7 airs Oct. 7, 1:38–2:34 p.m. (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 7–12. Lesson 7 in this series, the *Teen Survival Week* program, features teens from around the state talking about diverse subjects such as school safety, dating, dress codes, and the environment. Dr. Glen Walter, an educator and psychologist, hosts the program with teens.

* **Talking It Over: Teen Issues** – Lesson 2 airs Oct. 7, 2:40–3:11 p.m. (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 9–12. **Keep It Real; Grave Decisions; SC Youth Gang Documentary; MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime and Consequences; Teens and Booze; Blurred Lines; DLNETS: College 101: Depression and Suicide; and two DLNETS: Peers Influence Peers** programs show the harsh realities of risk-taking behaviors such as not wearing seat belts, speeding, drinking and driving, and gang life. **MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime, And Consequences** has three parts that are good for grades 4–8 also. **NOTE:** Teachers should preview before use.

* **Forgotten Son (SL)** – This lesson airs Oct. 9, 10:10–10:23 a.m. (Unlimited rights)

Designed for grades 4–12. The realities of methamphetamine abuse hit home in this moving program about a teen boy's life turned upside down by his mother's addiction. **NOTE:** Teachers should preview before use.



Curriculum and Content Corner...What's new from ITV in etvStreamlineSC... with Dianne L. Gregory

Accessing our ITV programming has become a smorgasbord of opportunity with many more programs available in *StreamlineSC*. If you are looking for some school-wide educational resources for your news program, check out **Character Minutes**. These minute long clips focus on positive character traits, such as work ethic, perseverance, fortitude, and the ability to work as part of a team. Each clip features a prominent person in the community, including Charles Duke and Charles Bolden, astronauts; Jack Leggett, baseball coach for Clemson University; Patti Just, former anchor at WJWJ-TV; and

Charles Austin, former chief of police now city manager in Columbia, SC. The short, concise programs, each exactly one minute in duration, contain valuable content that could be used in a weekly school news program, as a writing activity in a language arts class or as a discussion topic.

Inquiring Safely: Critical Points About Laboratory Safety That Every Teacher Should Know, Part 1 and 2, is an important resource for every science teacher. With the increasing emphasis on science standards and active learning in the science class, it is important for teachers to be as knowledgeable as possible about science safety. The purpose of this two-part series that was coordinated by Linda Sinclair, SCDE K-12 Science Consultant, is to inform and assist teachers in providing a safe environment for engaging students in standards-based inquiry. Safety is everyone's responsibility and duty. Knowledge can prevent accidents and allow our schools to avoid unnecessary legal problems. According to the National Science Teachers Association, laboratory experience is so integral to the nature of science that it must be included in every science program for every student. "Inquiring Safely" will support teachers in providing a safe, secure environment for hands on learning.

For the **Social Studies teacher, 20th Century Turning Points in US History** is an eight-part series designed to provide a clear overview of the people and events that distinguished the 20th century at specific points in time. Significant pivotal events in American History are highlighted in this series. Rare archival footage and photographs, authentic recordings, and other primary source documents bring history to life, while stunning graphics and engaging narration lend context and clarity to the subject. This program is inspiring, engaging and enriching for all South Carolinians.

Media Specialists, don't miss **In the Year 2008-09: ITV/ETV Edition**. This special program was produced by ITV for the DES Conference and the August Library Media Specialists Town Meeting. Designed to give educators a quick overview of what's new with instructional resources provided FREE from ITV and ETV, this short program provides important information on OnePlaceSC and the transition with the new delivery systems and DES centers. Included are highlights of new ITV series and you may recognize familiar ETV, ITV and DES faces even though they may look "out of this world!" Please record this program to share with your teachers.

Deskercise – Includes Citizenship Topic...Plan Ahead!

For block feed schedule for the rest of this school year, see grid listed below. Tape them for your teachers! This series is NOT available in *StreamlineSC*.

Each 10-minute **Deskercise** program is built around a weekly theme. ITV will block feed the entire month's programs (usually 4 weeks or 20 programs) during the middle of each month PRIOR to when they are recommended for use according to the weekly themes. For example, all the programs designed with themes for November use will air October 10. (See list below)

November's theme for the first week is Election Day. The five programs, each 10 minutes, for this week all contain the same core exercise segment that relates information on the importance of participating in the election process.

The program presents this information in a fun, informative manner that is right on target for elementary age students. The students learn about running for political office, the major political parties and how important it is to exercise their rights and responsibilities by voting.

Each of the five programs with the Election Day theme begins with a different warm-up segment about a place in a different state and ends with a different short health tip, but the core exercise-at-your-desk segment is the same the entire week.

The programs are designed to be used while students move right at their desks, but they can be used in other ways. Some schools are using them at the beginning of the school day, others use them during PE classes and others use them in after-school programs.

The series was developed in cooperation with the American Association for Health Education (AAHE).

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips 2008–09

First Program October 16 – Jefferson Explains Elections

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play the roles of historical figures. ITV offers one scholarship for each program.

It's not too late to plan for using the 2008–09 Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips! SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. The October 16th program is a NEW program entitled *The Will of the People*. Thomas Jefferson explains how negative campaigning was even part of politics in his time.

2008–09 Schedule:

- Oct. 16, 2008 *The Will of the People* (premiere) – One of the most bitter presidential campaigns in U.S. history is part of a surprising lesson for a 21st-century student. Thomas Jefferson explains how negative campaigning, partisan politics and contested elections have been part of our political system since the earliest days of the republic.
- Nov. 13, 2008 *Yorktown* – Explore the story of the key turning point in the Revolutionary War. Follow the people who converged on the village of York in October 1781: the military leaders, common soldiers, and civilians whose lives were changed forever by the siege. Learn why Yorktown was the place where American independence was finally secured.
- Dec. 11, 2008 *Making History Live* (premiere) – What makes history come alive? Take a behind-the-scenes look at how historical African American character portrayals are created for Colonial Williamsburg's Historic Area. From research through performance, experienced museum interpreters share their techniques for bringing the past to life.
- Jan. 15, 2009 *In Pursuit of Science* – Enter the exciting world of early American scientists and their discoveries. Follow a young colonial boy in his exploration of science and the world around him. Discover the important scientific exploration that took place in the early years of America.
- Feb. 19, 2009 *Freedom Bound* (premiere) – Choice, hope and escape from slavery are highlighted in stories spanning three centuries. Examine the options for slaves willing to risk their lives for freedom. Where could they run? Whom could they trust? Learn how these answers changed over time, from the American colonies' first slave laws to the Underground Railroad before the Civil War.
- Mar. 26, 2009 *Remember the Ladies* – In 1776, Abigail Adams requested that her husband, future president John Adams, "remember the ladies" when establishing the government and laws of the new nation. Examine the roles, responsibilities and daily activities of early American women.
- Apr. 23, 2009 *Soldier of Liberty* – Enlist in the 2nd Virginia Regiment with young recruit Nathaniel Hutcheson and experience the everyday life of a soldier during the American Revolution. March into battle with Nathaniel as he encounters for the first time the noise, confusion and horror of war.

***RIGHTS: SC schools may view with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and erased/destroyed within 45 days.) Prince William Network (PWN) Kennedy Center Performing Arts Series

MonarchLIVE Kickoff

Oct. 10, 12:00 noon–1:00 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

The first of six programs that follow the magical migration of monarchs, this program that is designed for grades 4–8 will provide a review of monarch biology, citizen science programs and the importance of stewardship. Every year millions of monarchs migrate thousands of miles from Canada and the United States to overwinter in the mountain peaks in Mexico. The magical journey is dependent on conservation of habitats in three North American countries – United State, Canada and Mexico. Other programs February 17 and 19, and May 19, 21 and 28, 2009.

Allan Harris: *Cross That River*

Carol Boston Weatherford's love for writing developed at an early age. The author composed her first poem in the first grade and soon after she began publishing her poems with the help of her father, a printing teacher. In her most recent stories, *BIRMINGHAM, 1963* and *Moses: When Harriet Tubman Led Her People to Freedom*, Weatherford brings the pages of history alive and in this discussion she tells us how she found her own unique voice both as a poet and author through the celebration of family stories, fading traditions and forgotten struggles. (Next month on Nov. 6: **Our White House: Looking In, Looking Out** – program for grades 5–8 and offers a view of American History as seen through the eyes of the White House.)

Oct. 14, 8:00–10:40 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record rights, but no duplication)

Recommended for elementary students, this series has fact-filled, education content covering social studies, language arts, health, science, math, civics, character education, and environmental issues. There is one program for each day identified by the date that uses music, archival visuals, artwork, photos, and animation to keep the format fast and interesting for young students.
