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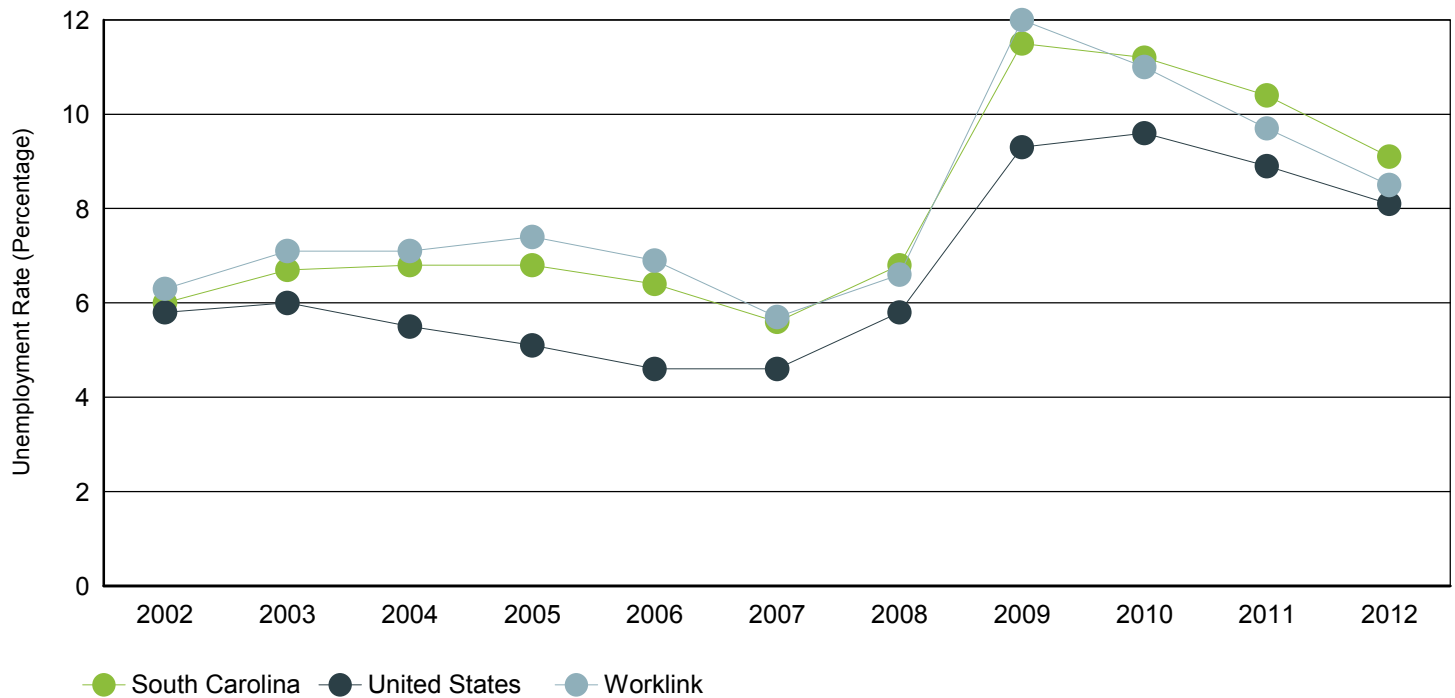

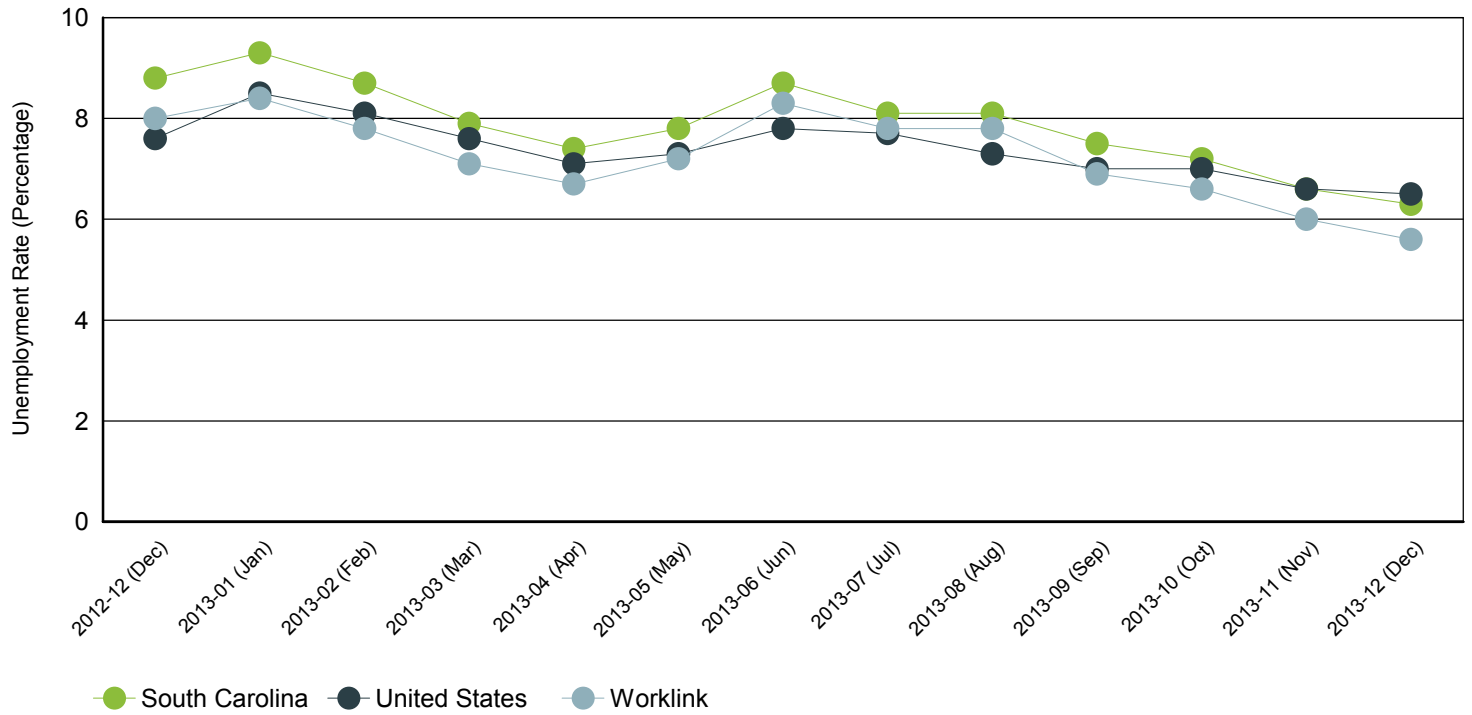

Past 13 Months



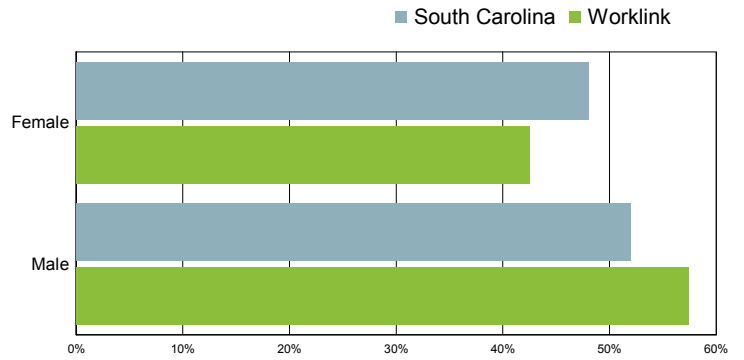

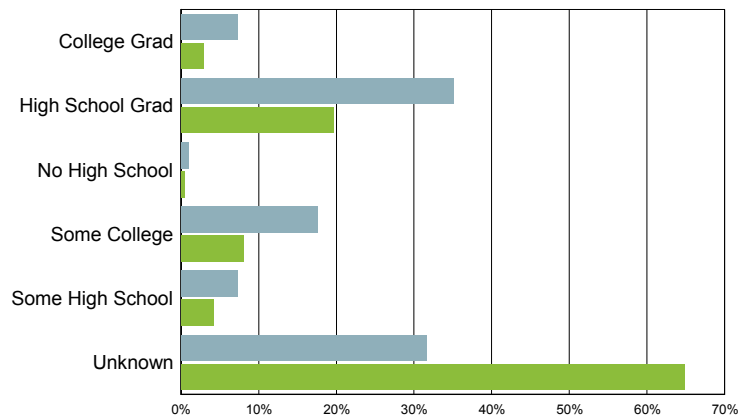

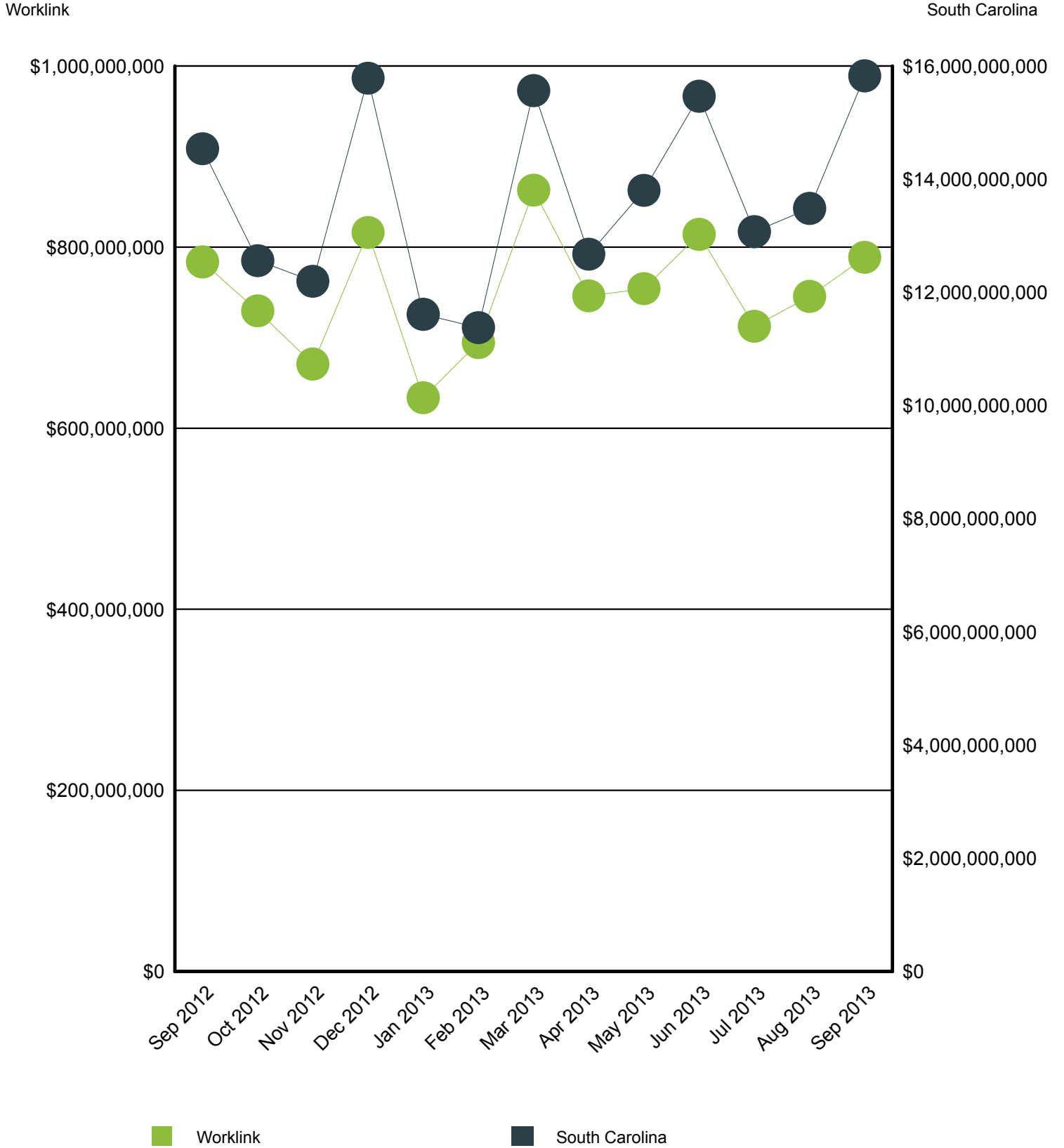

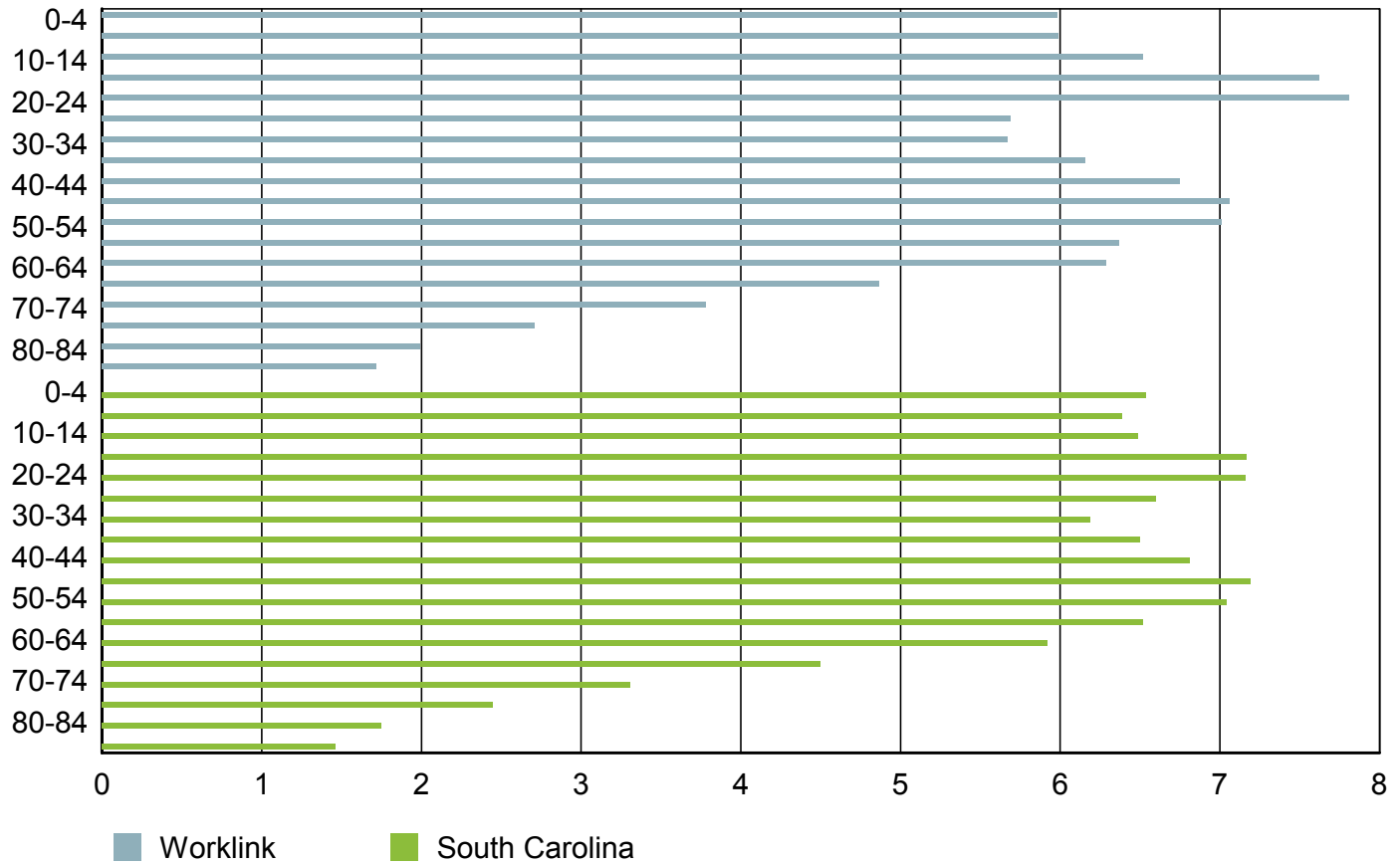

Population by Age



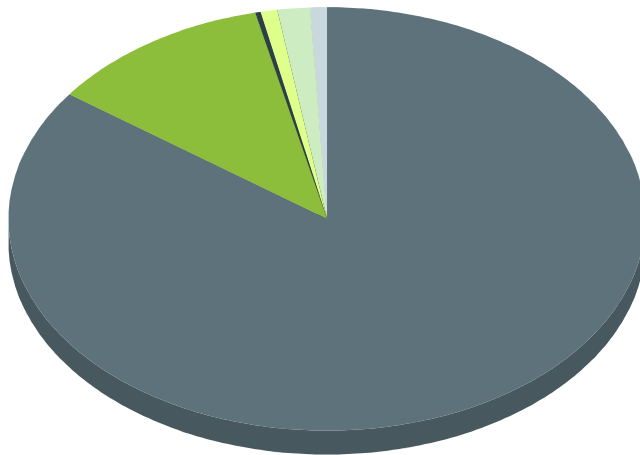

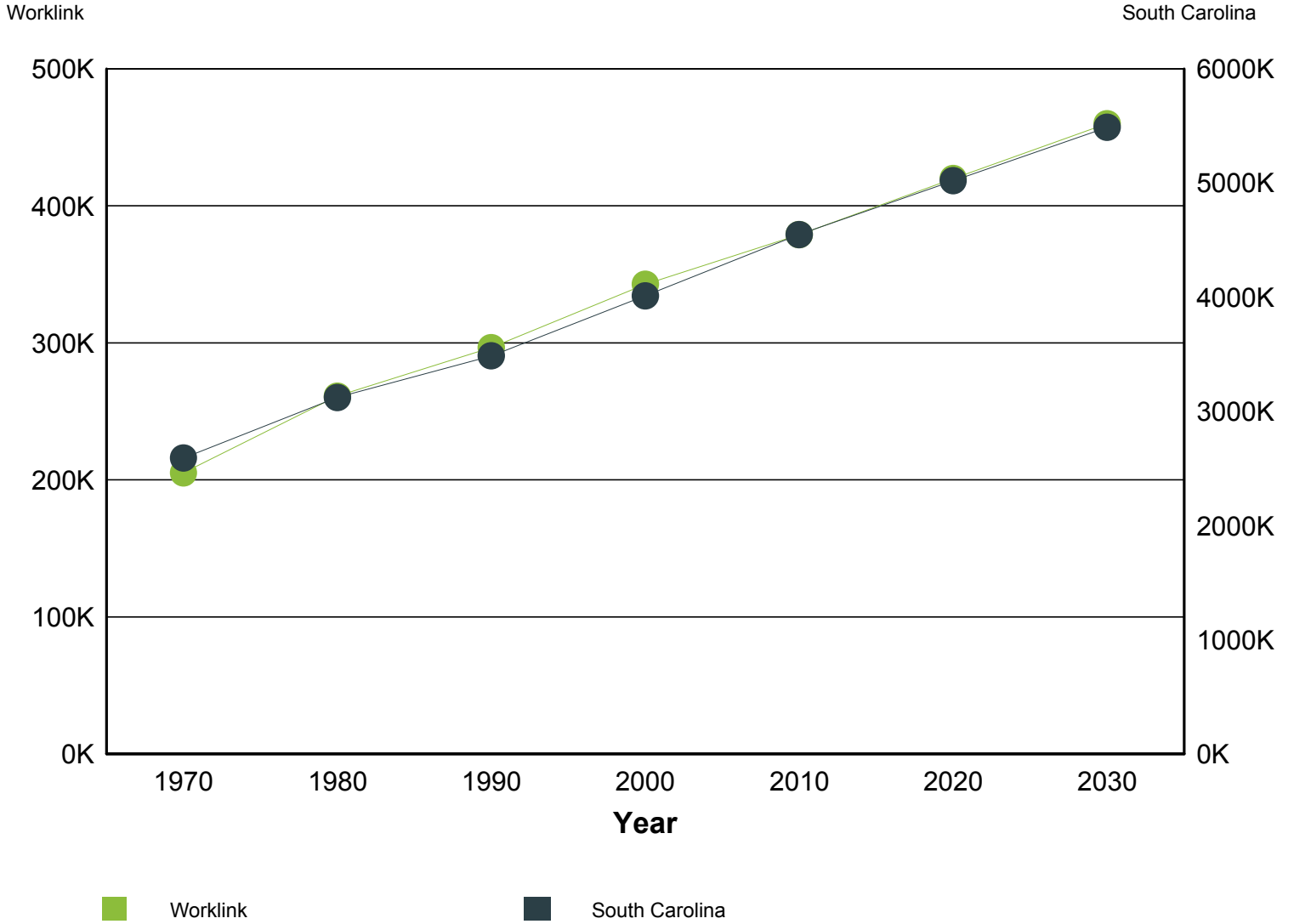

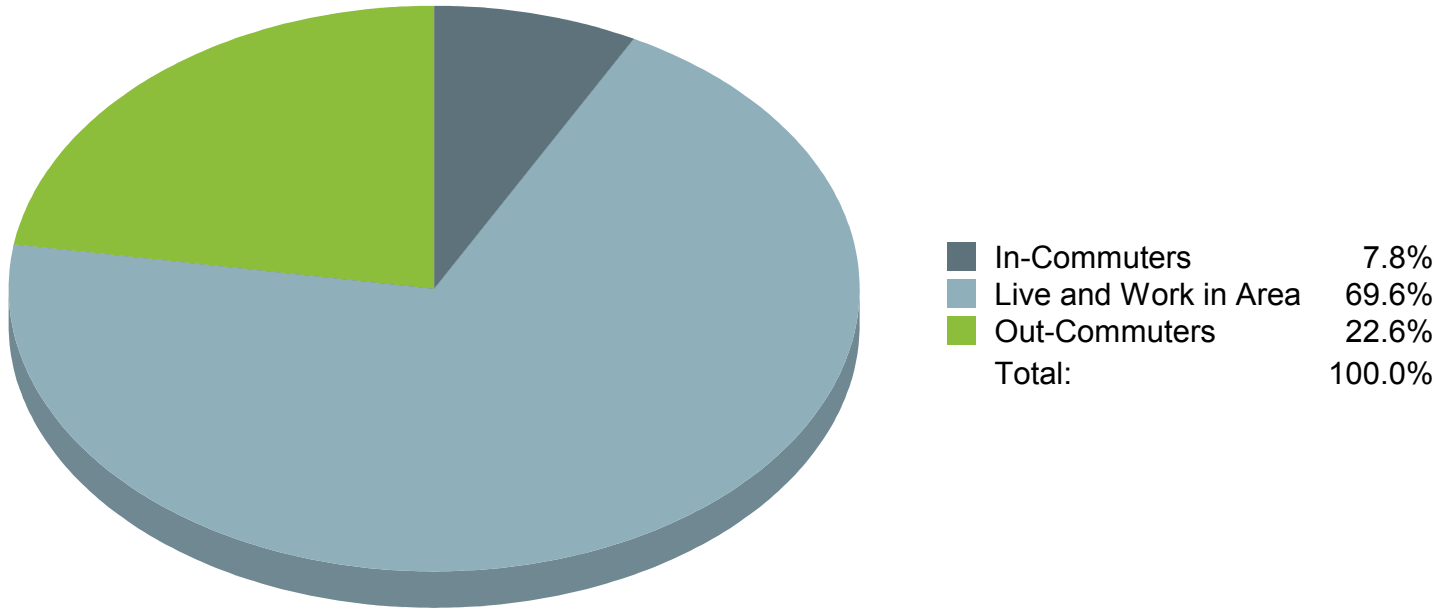

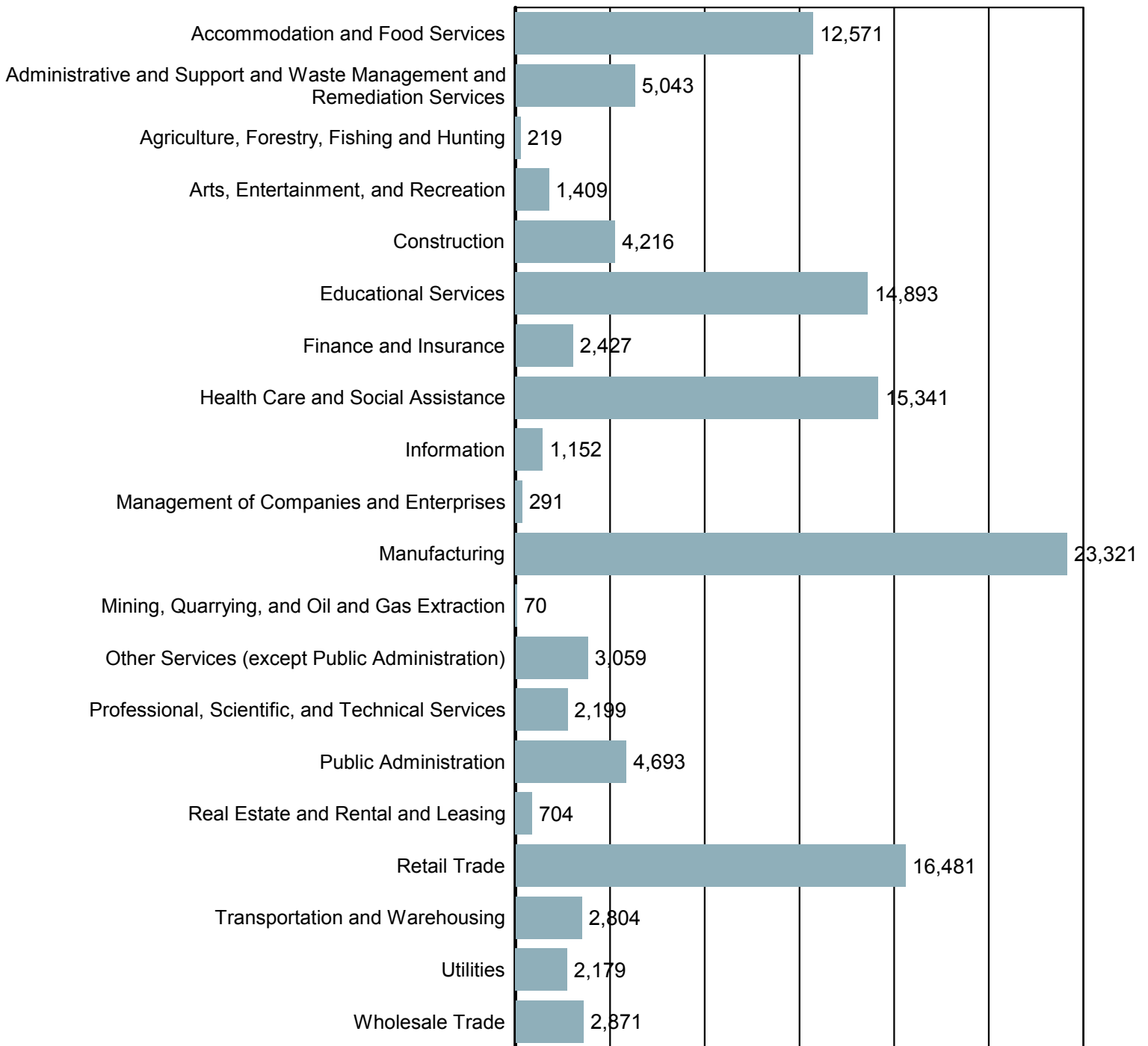

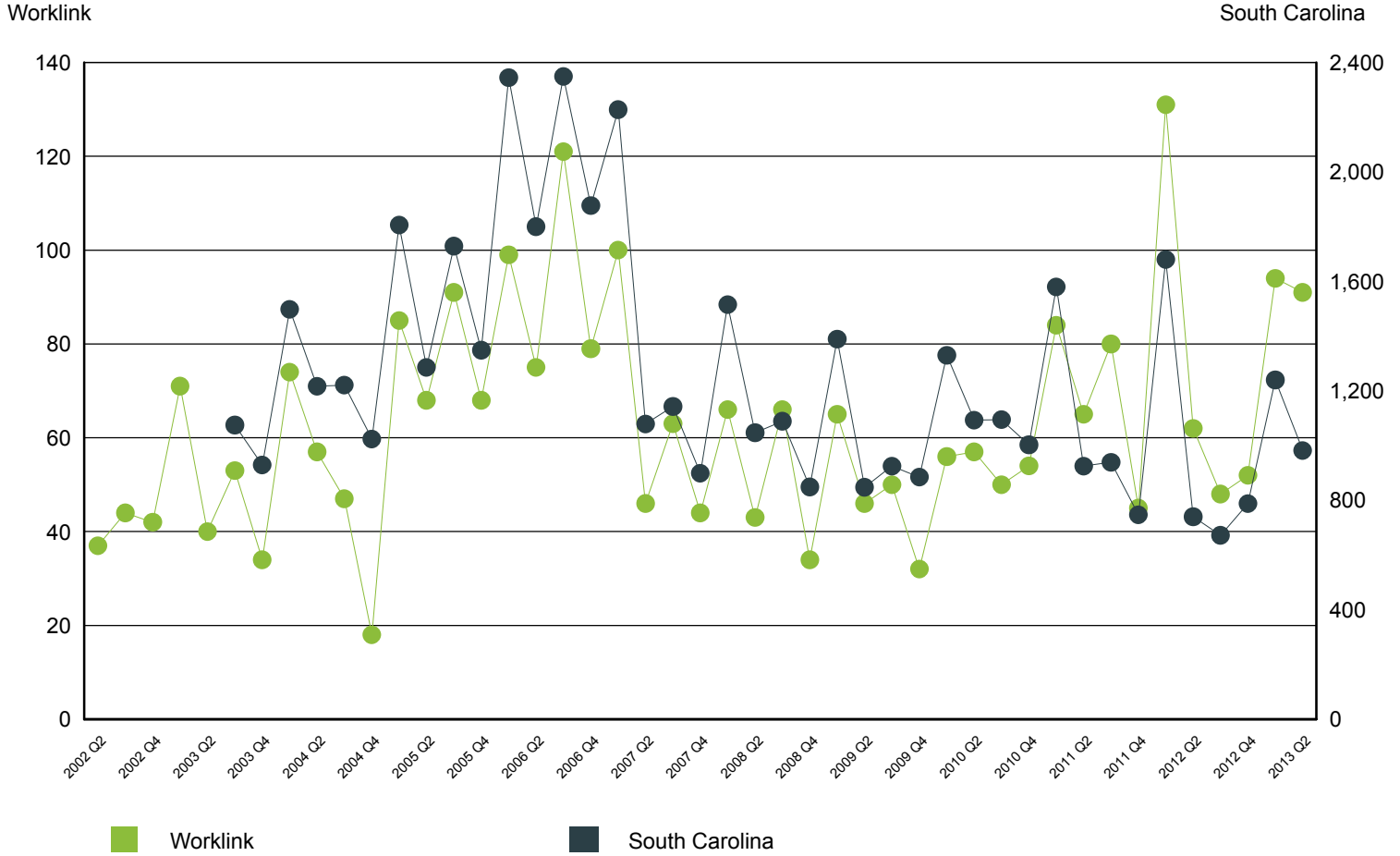

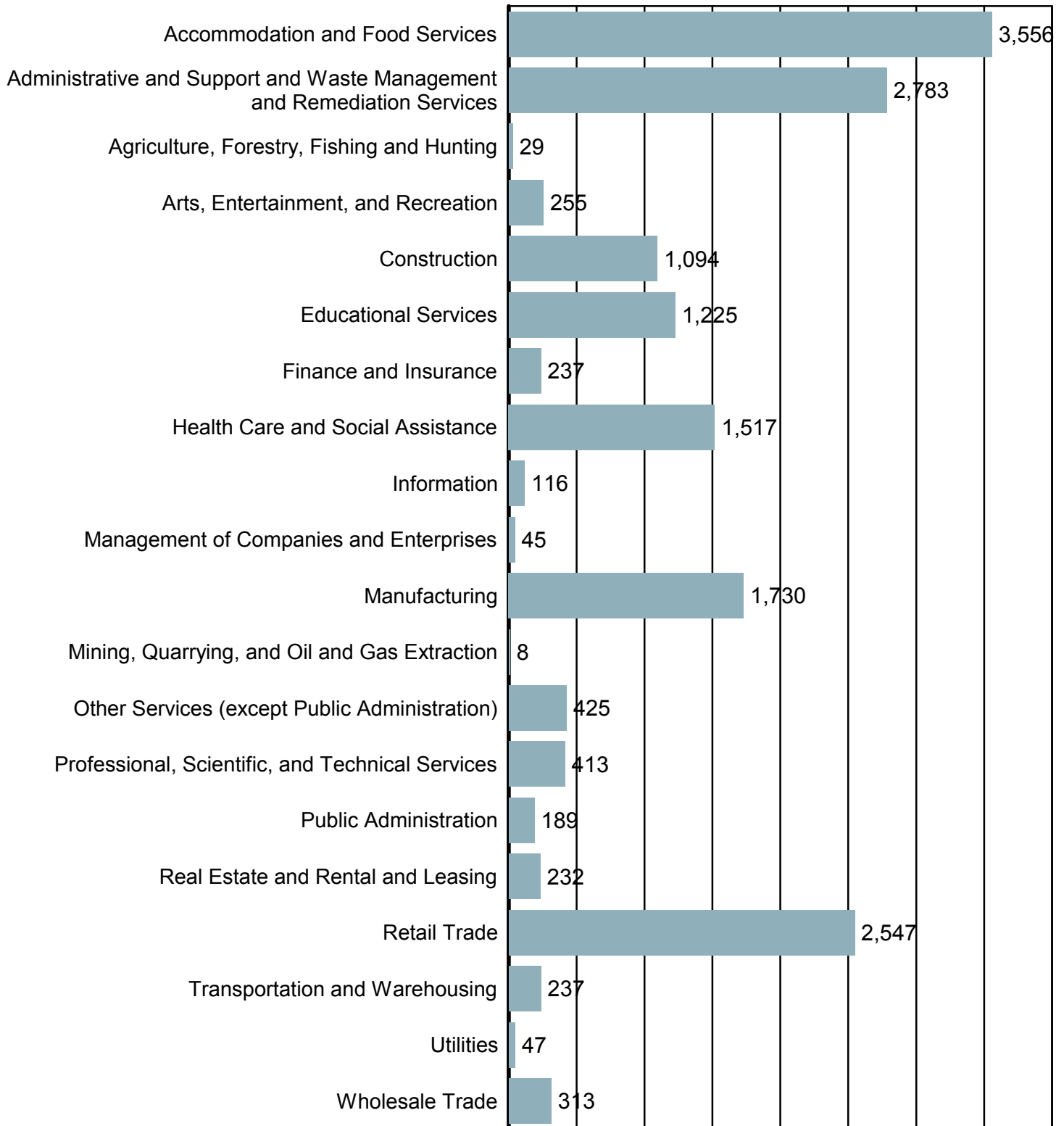

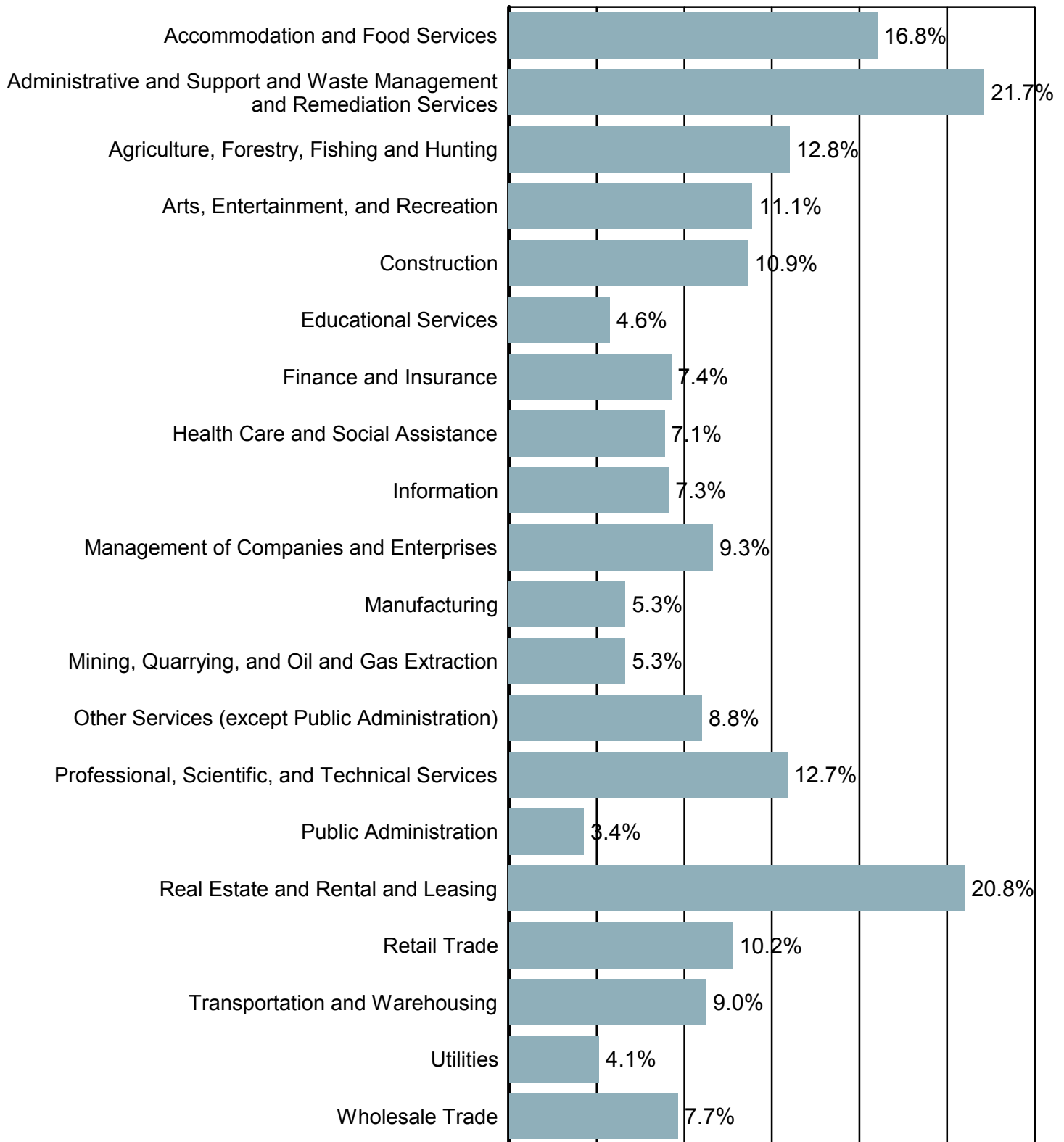

New Hires by Industry



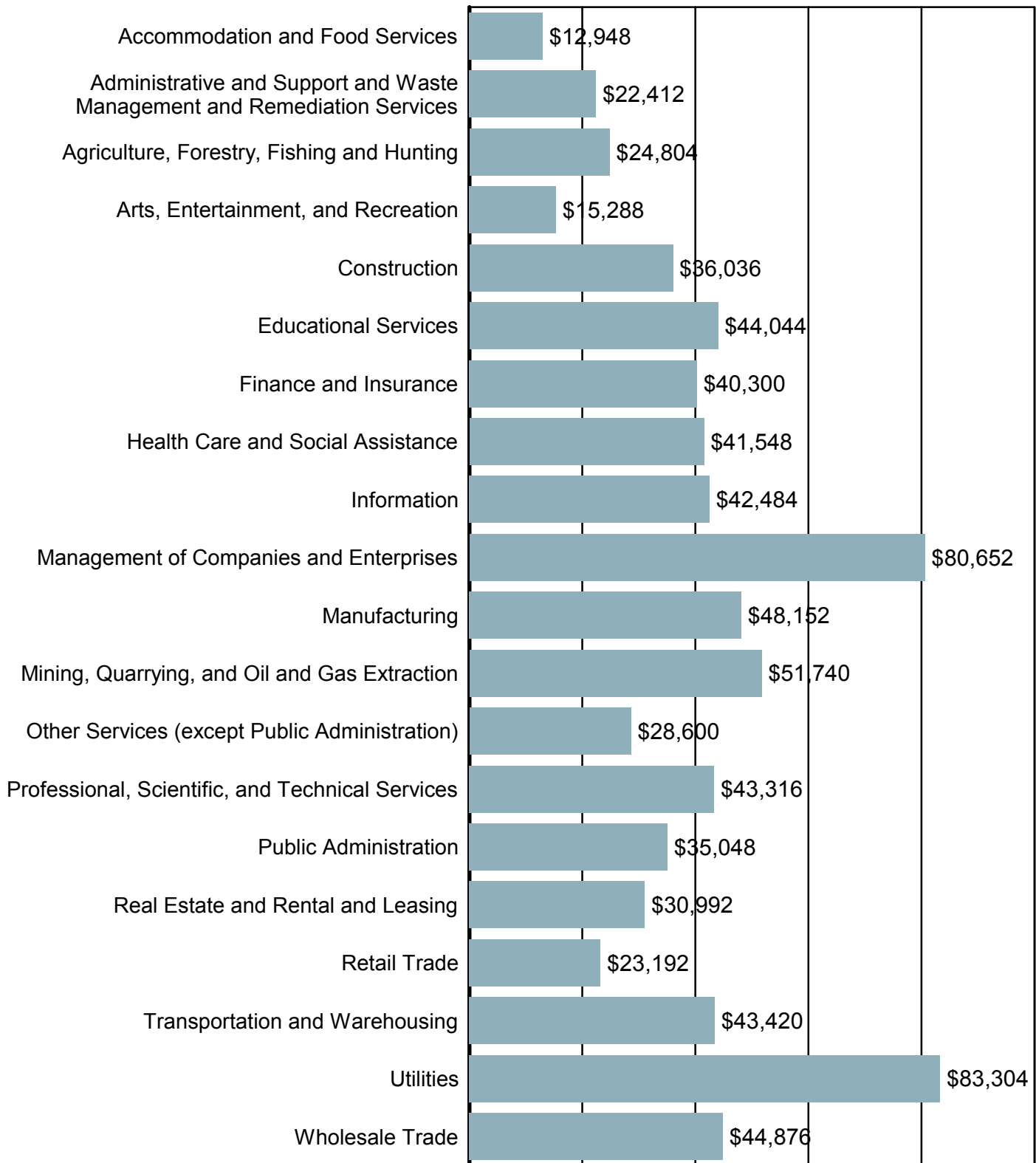

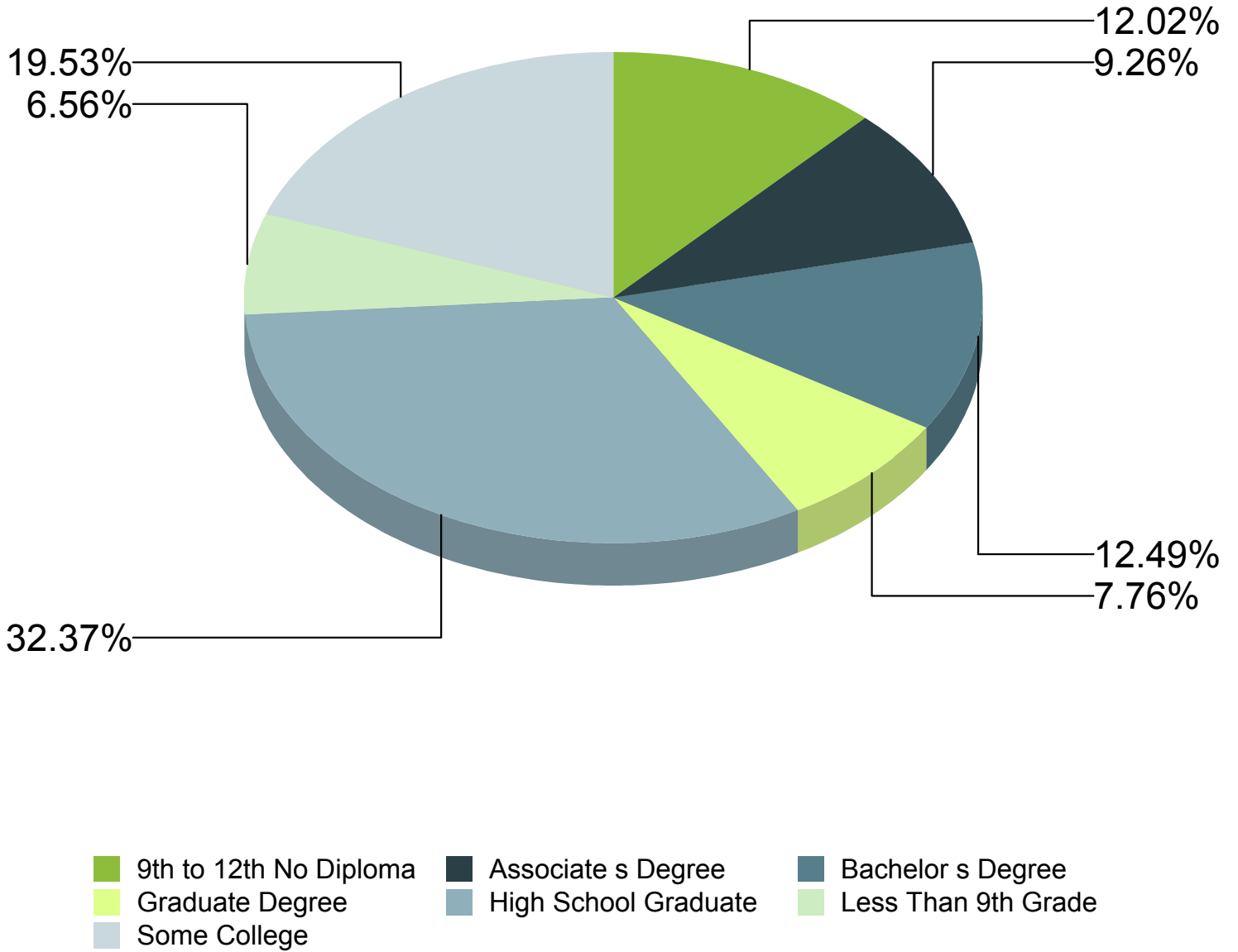

Educational Attainment

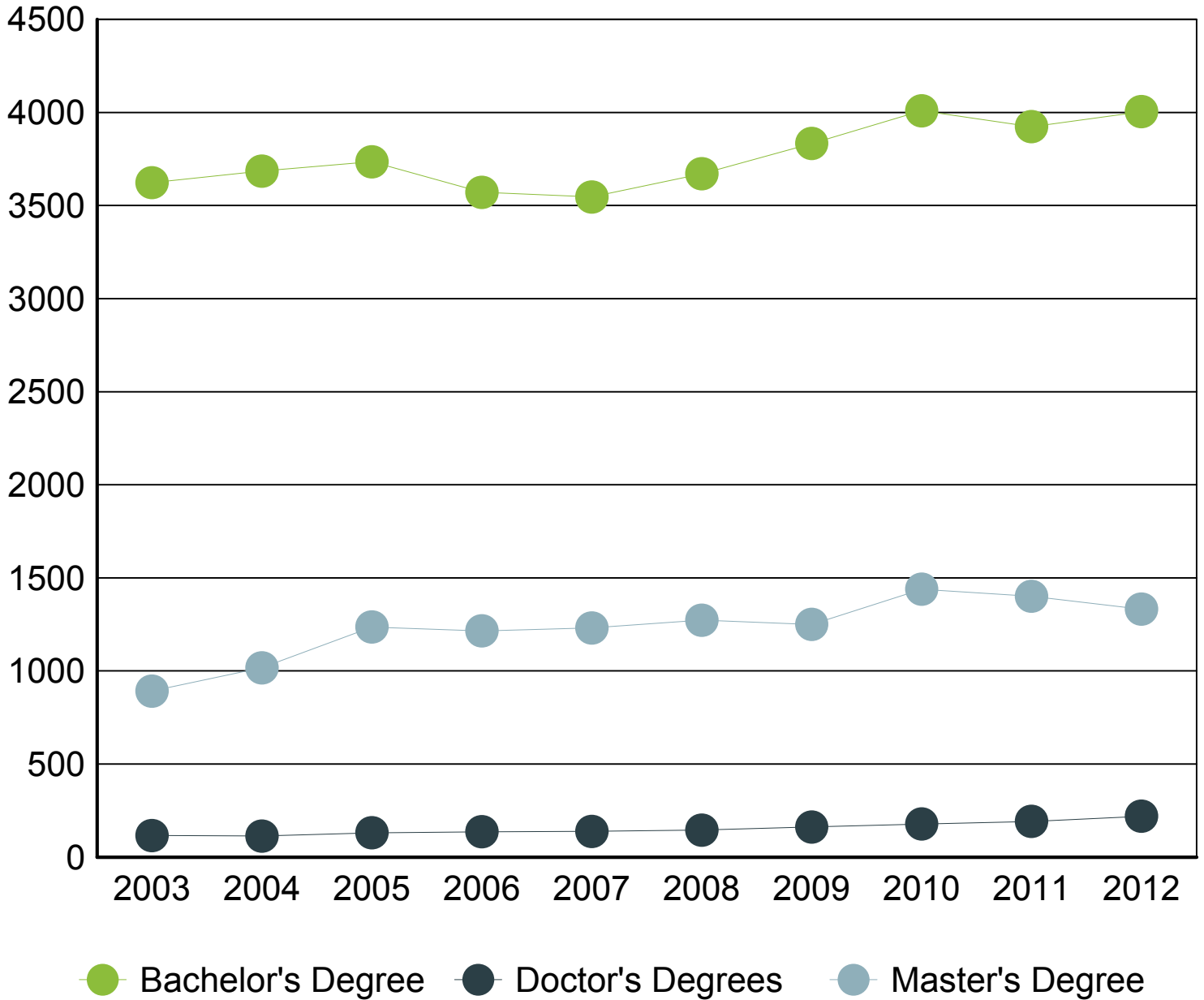
(Population 25 Years and Older)
