Fiscal Impact Summary

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on January 22, 2019

State Expenditure

This bill makes changes to the grounds upon which the Board of Physical Therapists (board) may restrict or refuse licensure or licensure renewal. Currently, the board may refuse or restrict licensure of a person if they provide physical therapy services beyond thirty days after the initial evaluation and/or treatment date, unless the patient has been referred by a licensed medical doctor or dentist or the physical therapist or physical therapist assistant refers the patient to a licensed medical doctor or dentist. This bill removes this condition as a grounds for restriction of licensure. The board is under the regulation of LLR. LLR indicates that this bill neither adds to nor takes away from the responsibilities of the board. Therefore, this bill will have no expenditure impact.
